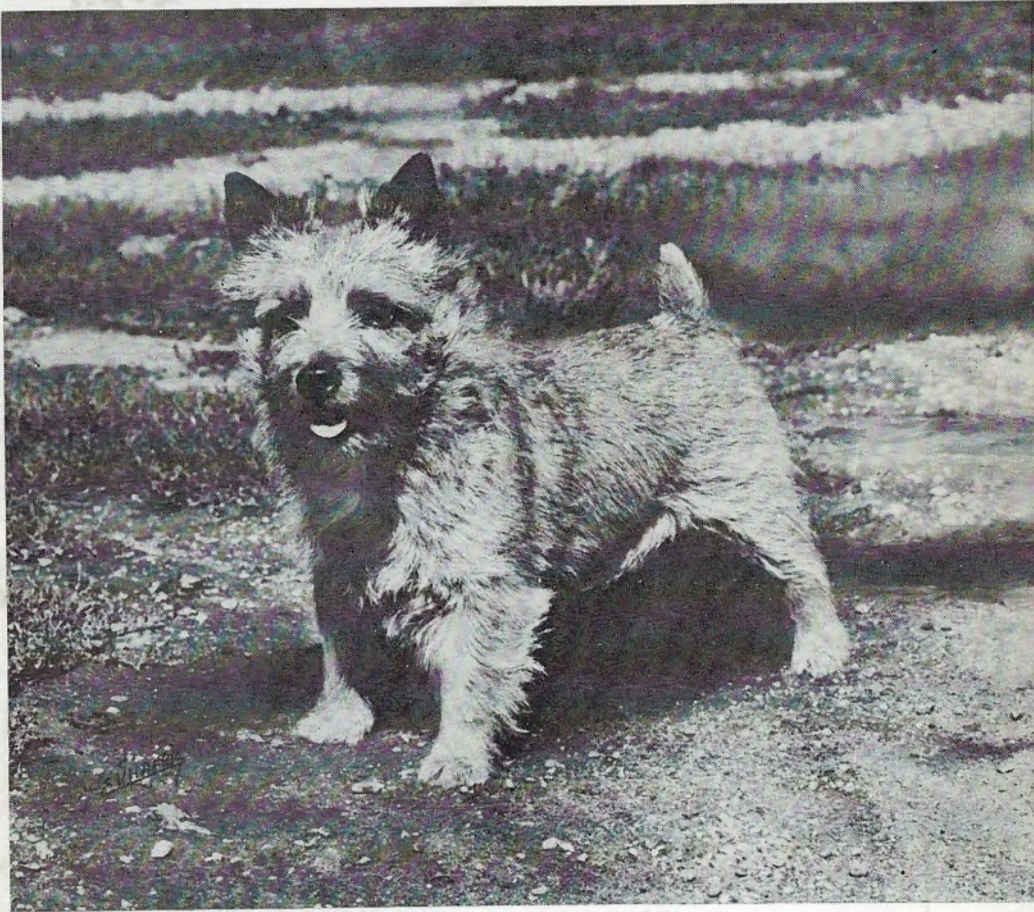

Again, HELP, when and however you can . . . WE NEED IT!

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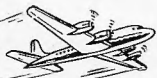
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SUCCESS

What is it?

The very fact that you have gone beyond the title and are presently reading these words is evidence enough that you have not attained the success or reached the goals you have set for yourself and your dogs. Anyone who admits anything to the contrary . . . well, perhaps he should be introducing this series instead of me.

Most of us who have maintained an interest in the breeding of dogs often find ourselves reflecting about progress, and more often . . . failure. Thinking about the subject usually involves some attempt at analyzing the "whys" and then the "hows" which will make our efforts more rewarding than they have been. No one wants to admit anything but forward movement towards our own established goals, but by the same token, no one can objectively and honestly say that this has not happened at some time. Otherwise, we would all have to claim the "Garden" win each year, or the "Top Producers" list on a continual basis. It can't be done! But what can be? And how do those of us who are on the first step ever move up that ladder?

Often the uninvolved "outsider" finds himself in a better position to analyze conditions, situations, progress and failure. This is evidenced by the fact that in most fields, the CRITIC is more often than not, someone who is uninvolved. Most theater critics have never written a play. Few art critics are artists in themselves, and few book reviews are ever

written by established authors. It seems that "The Sound and the Fury" is more easily criticized by the conscientious observer, not the involved pursuer. If I weren't sincere in expressing the above views, I would not be attempting what is to follow. Admittedly, I fall into the same category expressed above. Like the average art critic who is not an established painter, I am not an established breeder, so if you want to stop now. . . .

Over the past years I, like all of you, have had ample opportunity to watch the progress and failures which are evidenced in the show ring, and have tried to analyze why some exhibitors seem to be more successful in continually gathering in the top awards, while others seem to remain at the other end of the line. Since analyzing individual breeding programs cannot be done with generalizations, the remaining comments, which will be ex-

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tended into a series of articles, will be restricted to that which CAN be analyzed . . . that which occurs preparing for, preceding and in the show ring.

The immediate generalization which each of us can readily make is that success in the show ring is dependent upon a combination of four essentials: quality, training, handling and presentation. Apart from the first which objectively should carry the most weight, and receive the major portion of our individual consideration either as breeder or judge, I would not attempt to put the other three in any particular order, as I think they all are equally important.

It is universally agreed that QUALITY is foremost, and each of us feels we are showing the very best dog possible. It is useless to think that you can cover up an unsound, poor quality specimen by exquisite presentation, superb handling and excellent training. Although there are those who may feel this is happening, objectively, it can't be done! But conversely, a good dog, teeming with quality, seldom gets to the top in this day and

age if poorly presented, indifferently handled, or exhibiting poor training or ring manners. Some will say, "you can't keep a good dog down," but YOU CAN! How many times have you heard it said, "the greatest Poodle in the world would go unnoticed in the hands of a Novice?" This is particularly true in the case of any breed which requires a great deal of background in proper conditioning and grooming of coats.

However, if you have a good dog, you are probably half way there. Perhaps 10 or 20 years ago you would have gone further, even all the way, despite yourself. It seldom happens now! Today, with a good one, you have the choice of dropping into obscurity because you have not the necessary energy or enthusiasm to go further, or you can begin on the endless road which must be followed in overcoming the remaining three attributes to complete his picture, AND produce the winning dog.

The series which is to follow will, I hope, help many of you to overcome the last three of the four attributes stated.

Miriam Stamm of Anstamm Kennels, Kalamazoo, Michigan, writes that their import, Eng. CH. BARDENE BOY BLUE,

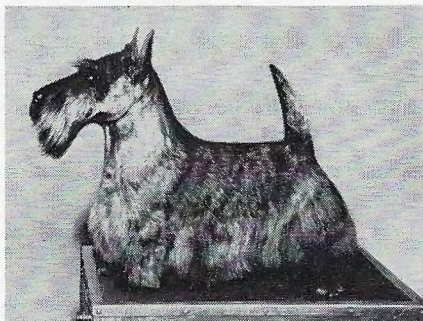

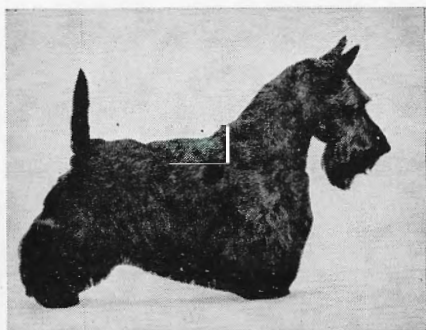
