CH. GAIDOUNE GREAT BEAR

Featured on our Cover this month is a young Scottish Terrier, **Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear**, who in less than a year's showing has more than fulfilled the expectations of the sound breeding program which has produced him.

"Maz" is a combination of the finest English and American bloodlines, being a son of the top producing Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear, out of the all-time top producing bitch, Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussy. "Hussy," in just three litters, has set a record for the breed, having produced a total of 13 puppies by three different sires, with 11 of these having completed their championships. "Maz" was the ninth, and all in his litter of four are now finished. "Hussy's" dam is Ch. Glendoune Gaibonnie, who was imported by Miss Gaither in 1956 as a foundation bitch. Behind her are some of England's top winners and producers, which is clearly evidenced by the fact that **Gaidoune**, in the intervening years, has finished eighteen champions. The pride of ownership is compounded, I am sure, by the fact that each of these champions and current winners has been bred and raised in the home kennel.

Gaidoune Great Bear was whelped October 13, 1960, and was not shown until he was eighteen months old, and then only twice, one of these resulting in a Terrier Group First, the other also awarding him a major win. Shown again at just under two years of age, "**Maz**" went from the classes through to **Best in Show**, giving him his third major. Shown next at the **Scottish Terrier Club of America Specialty** at Montgomery County, he went, still from the classes, on to capture the **Best of Breed** honors over a quality packed entry of 85, under judge **George Hartman**. This five-point major finished him.

Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear began his Specials career immediately, and on his very first time out he gained the **Best of Breed** award over an entry of 55 at the **Scottish Terrier Club of Northern Ohio Specialty**. Since then he has been a consistent winner. His record to date includes 7 **Bests in Show**, 27 **Group Firsts** and the above-mentioned two **Specialty Bests**.

"**Maz**" has been handled exclusively by **Dr. Nancy C. Lenfestey**, who has shown an obvious pride in the young campaigner.

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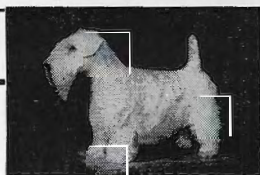

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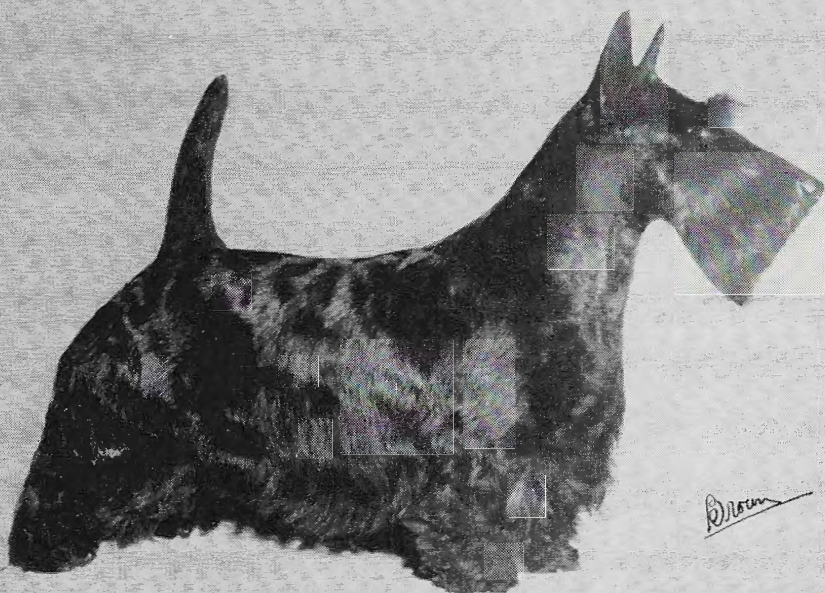

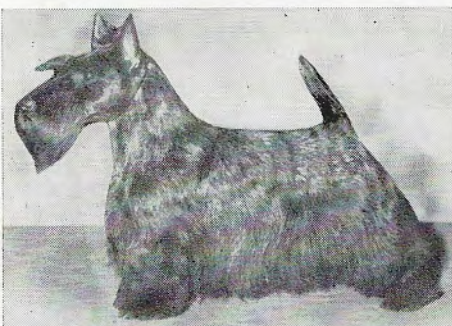

dog's quality is determined by his or her winning in the ring, while a bull that loses may be a real winner when it comes to producing an extra pound or two of gain per day in his calves. It's the extra dollars of income that count with cattlemen.

"Probably another reason for a greater display of sportsmanship by livestock show people is the fact that a handler of cattle can do little to influence his animal's showing ability or conformation, while a skilled dog handler can do much with trimming and show-ring handling. Animation is not important to a man showing a bull ... but it is to a Terrier handler."

Mrs. Humphrey also indicates that plans are afoot for the organization of a new breed club in the Kansas City area.
