AMERICAN and CANADIAN CH. BALACHAN AGITATOR

When our **Ch. Fran-Jean's Bridie Mollie** presented us with her first litter, March 3, 1956, we anticipated with excitement their future potential since they were sired by the outstanding producer, **Ch. Cantie Captivator**.

Within a few weeks, two little males stood out, and for strangely different reasons. One was normally aggressive, and typical in character. The other we called a stuffed shirt, as a youngster, because he never portrayed the irresponsible puppy. Perfectly willing to be friendly, he wouldn't stoop to wild demonstrations of affection. We didn't understand him too well at first . . . we were so inexperienced. But we admired and respected him, and mutual understanding grew until we could accept his judgement over our own.

In the beginning however, all efforts were placed on his brother, now **Ch. Balachan Aggressor**, until their first show at 6 months. There, barely lead broken and tidied up at the last minute, the little stuffed shirt, who we called "**Simon**", came forth with such style and natural showmanship, he won a three-point major and his first Best of Breed. In six weeks he won the Puppy class at five straight shows, picked up four points as Winners Dog at Rock Creek, Maryland, won the Junior Puppy Sweepstakes at the Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky Specialty, and was Best of Breed for four more points at

Minneapolis. He finished his championship in short order, and in relatively few shows.

Campaigning this dog was an experience I wouldn't have missed for anything in the world. During his outstanding show career, which included annexing his Canadian title, **Am. & Can. Ch. Balachan Agitator** earned 46 Bests of Breed, going on to win 4 Terrier Group First, 13 Seconds, 9 Thirds and 5 Fourths, all owner handled. In addition to this, he placed Best Opposite Sex at 20 shows, including two Specialties.

His behavior in and out of the ring was truly an inspiration to those who knew him. Many described him simply as an "honest" Scottie. We take this as a great compliment, for therein lies the clue to his innate character.

Although "**Simon**" has not been used extensively as a stud, he has already sired 8 champions, among which are some notable breed winners: **Ch. Woodhart Wideawake**, **Ch. Balachan Galaxie**, **Ch. Balachan Gregor**, **Ch. Balachan Gambit**, **Ch. Bobjack's Sassy Brat**, **Ch. Balachan Cassandra Suzanna**, **Ch. Balachan Hosea Bayor**, and **Ch. Balachan Happy Birthday**.

With both majors already held by two more of his kids, and one major by additional ones, one of whom has already a Canadian Championship, he has assured himself a place among the greats, not only on the bench, but as a stud.

Some of you doubtless remember seeing the then Senator John F. Kennedy as an interester spectator at the Del Monte Kennel Club Show a few years ago. You will also recall the unforgettable photo that adorned a cover of the "Ladies Home Journal" of Jacqueline Kennedy, at an early age, with her pet, a Scotty. Charlie, the Welsh Terrier, late of the White House, was widely publicized, altho lately his illicit relationship with Pushinka has been criticized.

These are a few reminder that we who love dogs, aside from our great National loss, have lost also one of our own.

Temperers are short these days — we hear orations proclaiming that we must eliminate the hate and prejudice that is poisoning us, and we in the fancy can certainly do our part, as it is here that hate-mongers flourish. True, no national tragedy is affected because one exhibitor maliciously attacks another, but the world of fanciers is small and the vitriol and venom cannot help but seep out where it can infect others.

We are reminded of the utter lack of respect for authority prevalent in our country — Where is this better illustrated than at a dog show? I have heard judges accused of everything. When the exhibitor enters his dog he is asking for the opinion of the judge — but he expects it to confirm his own, and, when it doesn't, the accusations begin. The exhibitor never really wanted the opinion in the first place — that is too often obvious. The judge is undoubtedly a person who knows dogs and has spent a good many years officiating at shows. Certainly, his qualifications and authority demand respect, even though one may not agree with him.

However, how can the fancy learn respect and consideration, when the powers that be allowed at least one dog show to be held on that black Sunday, Nov. 24, the day preceding the funeral of our President — the day when a quarter of a million other Americans were going to view his bier and pay him respect. Surely, one dog show was not that important.

The fancy is forever welcoming new members and seeing the last of old ones. No one stays too long in this game — and, if the truth be known, many people are just too hurt and disillusioned after attaining a measure of success to continue. Witnesses will bear me out that after the judge's decision at a very large Specialty show this year, a disgruntled exhibitor stood up in the stands and loudly discredited the judge and ruthlessly insulted the dog he had chosen, with such hate and venom in her face, that those seated nearby were shocked and dismayed. port, the owners of the winner will never again show her.

For the rededication we are asked for by President Johnson, the little old dog game will be a good place to start — and simply by showing respect for our fellow exhibitors and the judges, whose opinions we're asking for. Now is the time, when New Year's resolutions are in order, to remember that though we may think we prefer dogs, we are doomed to live in a world of humans.

With the New Year comes elections in various breed clubs. The S.T.C. of Greater Washington, D.C. announces their new slate: President, Margaret Pringle; Vice-President, Oscar Sells; Secretary, Dorothy Morris; Treasurer, David Smith, Jr. The outgoing President, Fred Freeman, was named as a member of the Board, as was Joe Allen.

The Washington State S.T.C. also forwarded us their new slate of officers: President, Elaine Young; Vice-President, John Stephens; Secretary, Beverly Moran; Treasurer, Annette Warde.

The initial activities of our "newest" breed club indicate that the Heart of America S.T. Club will be one heard from frequently. Carol Humphrey says that they "are well on the way" with constitution and by-laws, along with election of officers to be accomplished at their next meeting. One of their primary jobs will be to keep your col-

umnist posted on Club member doings . . . something I wish each Club would do. She has sent the results of several area shows, most of which could boast of major entries, due primarily to the combined efforts of the new club's members.

A five point entry was evident at the Enid, Okla. show for judge Anton Korbel, who selected as Best of Breed, **Ch. Lynbrier of Zelwyn** (Ch. Wyrebury Wrangler — Ch. Crescent Hill Lyra) owned by Zelwyn Kennels. Winners Dog and BW, capturing his third major, was **Brymstone Bottom Dollar** (Ch. Blanart Bottom's Up—Ch. Siegel's Bon Spitfire). "Tommy" owned by Jean and Gordon Craft, needs but two points to finish. Winners Bitch and BOS to complete her championship was **Zelwyns Lyk** (Ch. Wychworth Wizard—Ch. Lycee of Zelwyn) also owned by Zelma Lungwitz of Zelwyn Kennels. Both Reserves were the Second in Open entries with RD going to Chuck Boyles' **Lynhaven Commander** (Ch. Lynbrier of Zalwyn—Odd-Me-Dodd Tartan Doll), and RB to the Wheaten, **Misty Hills Sas-safras** (Clinton Mt. Master—Misty Hills Clinch) owned by Jean Reasor.

Two Nebraska shows, Lincoln and Omaha, saw identical winners taking the points and the Breed. Math Rauen's acquired **Ch. Stedplane Summertan** (Reanda Blackmoor Stedplane — Reanda

Rainette) scored BOB both days. WD and BW was Chuck Doyle's **Lynhaven Commander**, with RD going to Mr. and Mrs. Edward Baker's **Blackacres Blackstone** (Ch. Lynbrier of Zelwyn—Lynhaven Margie). WB and BOS to Mr. and Mrs. Eldon Windsor's **Dorcas of Zelwyn** (Ch. Cantie Captivator—Ch. Lycee of Zelwyn).

At Norman, Okla. another major show, with "Lynbrier" scoring the BOB, and "Commander" repeating as WD. WB and BW went to **Zelwyn's Candance Windsor**, also owned by Zelwyn Kennels, and Reserve went to her little sister, "Dorcas". Reserve in Dogs went to **Leather's Cantie's Son** (Ch. Cantie Captivator — Brymstone Bittersweet) owned by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Leathers.

Still another Major for the area came with the Arkansas K.C. show, judged by Ed McQuown. "Summertan" gained the Breed here, with WD going to **Beal's Rough Roger MacShane** (Scotvale Angus—Beal's Tammy MacShane) owned by Mrs. Mildred Beal. RD to "Cantie's Son". WB and BW to **Leather's Heather Posie** (Ch. Lynbrier of Zelwyn—Wendy's Denty Leddy) owned by the Leathers, with Reserve to their **Brymstone Bittersweet** (Ch. Lynbrier of Zelwyn—Ch. Siegel's Bon Imptomatic).

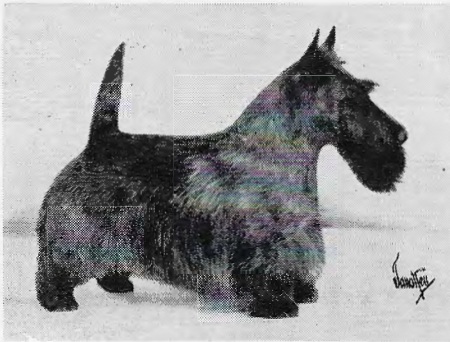

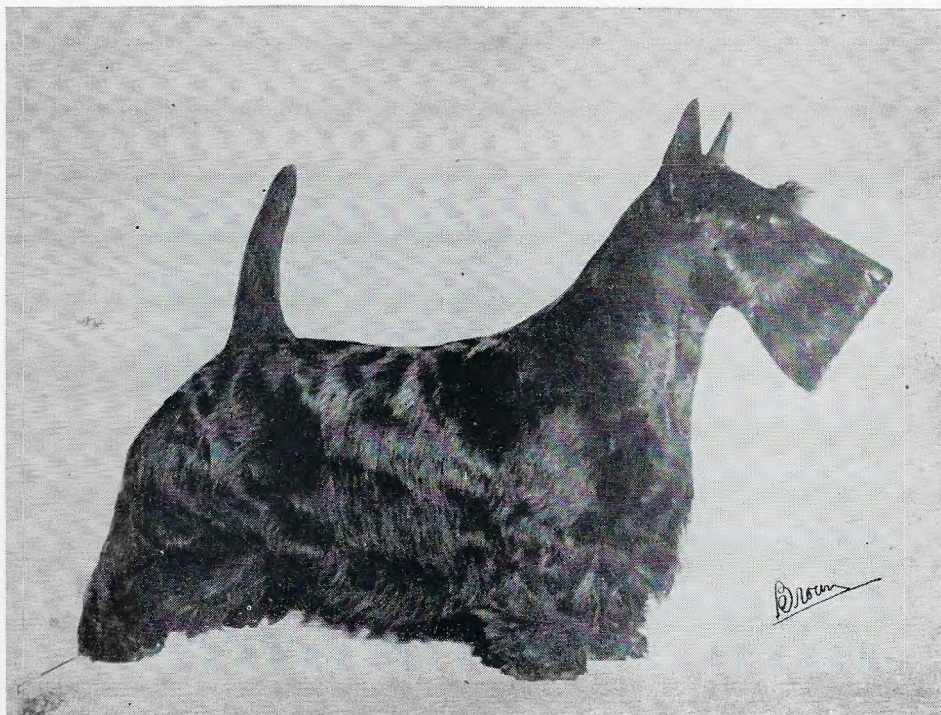

CH. BLANART BARCAROLLE

Usually, a prolonged and profound influence on a breed is impressed only by the occasional prepotent stud. Rarely, a brood bitch comes along whose influence is as great as that of the most influential stud. Such a noteworthy star in the Scottish Terrier firmament was **Champion Blanart Barcarolle**. Dam of 10 champions by 6 studs, **Barcarolle** is found in the pedigree of no less than 119 of the champions finished in the past 12 years, almost 16% of all Scottish Terriers to become champions during this time. And her progeny still win.

Barcarolle came about at a time when her breeder, after 15 years of struggle, was about to give up. Sympathetic friends advised Mrs. Reeg to breed her Christmas present bitch, Hi-Scott's Clipper, to Kenneth McBain's young stud, Cabrach Caliper. From this breeding arose the real foundation of the Blanart line. It is to the long, carefully planned breeding program of the McBain's, father and son, that Mrs. Reeg assigns her success.

Barcarolle was a large black bitch with a straight, hard coat, a beautiful head, and excellent quarters, eyes, ears and expression. Though fearless of dog or man, she became bored easily and was said to be lazy. Despite this, she finished easily, handled by her breeder-owner in the "hottest" competition, and this at a time when neither women nor amateurs had much chance in the ring.

Line bred twice to the McBain bred stud, Diehard Toby, **Barcarolle** produced four champions; Ch. Blanart Barrister, himself a prepotent stud and sire of 14 champions, Ch. Blanart Black Queen who produced two champions, Ch. Blanart Ballad, and Ch. Blanart Bingle of Greenvail who sired 4 champions. Showmen all, these 4 were their dam's type; large, husky dogs with beautiful heads.

She was next outcrossed to Ch. Deephaven Warspite in hopes of producing a smaller neater Scottie. Ch. Blanart Blue Wave, the result, was of **Barcarolle's** quality, but of her sire's type.

Hoping to produce a better shoulder, shorter back, and better ears, **Barcarolle** was next bred to Ch. Goldfinder's Admiral. Ch. Blanart Bartender, who embodied these modifications, was sire of 6 champions.

Barcarolle's greatest producing son, Ch. Blanart Bolero, came from a breeding to Ch. Barberry Knowe Rascal, to whom she was bred for refinement and "class". Bolero was his sire's type, of excellent quality, a great sire, with 17 champions to his credit.

Knowing that inbreeding to her son would offer little chance of improvement, but that it would fix **Barcarolle's** type in her puppies and provide greater solidity for a foundation, Mrs. Reeg next bred **Barcarolle** to Ch. Blanart Barrister. The result was worth the risk, as Ch. Blanart Baraye (dam of Ch. Blanart Beacon) appeared. Better still, however, this breeding produced Blanart Barcee, not a champion herself, due to an ear injury, but the dam of five champions. Barcee's champion offspring are replicas of **Barcarolle** in type and quality.

Barcarolle's last litter, by Ch. Kelti's Rogue produced Ch. Blanart Breakaway whom I feel was her best son. Unfortunately, he died young, before he had had a chance to sire many pups, and has but one champion to his credit.

For eleven consecutive years, **Barcarolle's** offspring or descendants have placed winners or better at the Westminster Kennel Club Show, beginning with Ch. Blanart Ballad in 1951 until Ch. Blanart Bewitching in 1961. Twice, Westminster's best of breed has been a **Barcarolle** descendent, Ch. Blanart Bewitching, in 1960 and 1961.

low countryman John Murphy joined us on this call and we spent several pleasant hours with Mr. and Mrs. Gee, who have just completed this new brick home on the outskirts of town.

The Glenview kennels are well-known to Scottie breeders in England and in this country. The operation here was considerably larger than we had expected and, I would guess, had at least 30 dogs kenneled in roomy stalls in large out-buildings behind the house. In addition to these, there were five or six youngsters and old timers in the house who joined us at tea time. Unfortunately, the Gee's have been unable to obtain kennel help for some time and have had to assume all kennel chores themselves. Because of this, many of the Scotties were in rough trim—a circumstance, however, which failed to hide the fact that many Scotties of quality live here. It was our pleasure to see Champions Glenview Golden Disc, G. Princess Pat, and G. Mary Princess in their home surroundings, as well as **Glenview Silver Gilt**, who was BB at

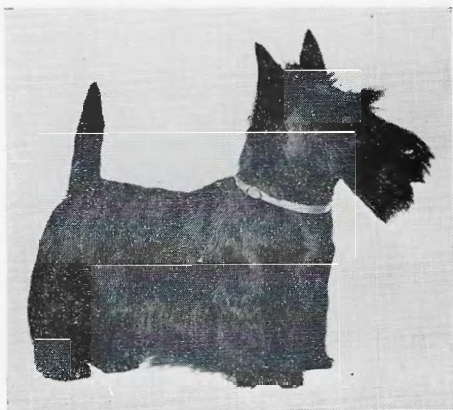

we had a car and had acquired a decided preference for the charms and comforts of the quaint, friendly, and inexpensive little inns and family-run hotels that are scattered over England, we elected to spend our last days in Hatfield, which is just outside London.

Again, we were joined by Johnny Murphy and also by Cliff Hallmark, who required little persuasion to leave his plush London hotel upon learning of our plans to visit the above kennels.

Hatfield is also close to Essenden, which is the site of the **Gaywyn** kennels and the main reason for our choice of location. Muriel and "Chink" Owen are not only the proprietors of Gaywyn but also of the Rose and Crown public house in Essenden. The Owens opened wide their doors to us and acted as focal point for all of our activities in this area. Additionally, we are forever indebted to Muriel for the wonderful meals she served, for teaching me to make Yorkshire pudding (which we have at least once a week now), for the gallons of tea she made and served us at all hours, and for acting as our guide to the Reanda and Kennelgarth kennels.

The Gaywyn kennel is another all-family enterprise and the two Owen girls, Susan and Catherine, like their

Gaywyn Viscountess**, had regular house privileges; the others were housed in a large shed-type building, and all the dogs were allowed to run together in the large exercise yard and on the rose-bordered lawn in back of the Rose and Crown. Viscountess was the leading bitch CC winner in 1962 and **Ch.**

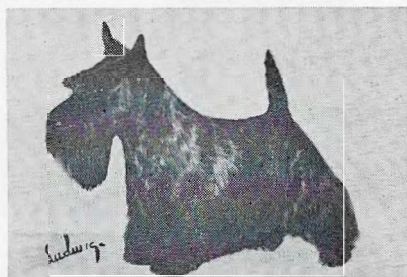
The **Reanda** kennels of Mrs. Elizabeth Meyer is the home of the renowned **Ch. Reanda Roger Rough**, now retired. We were privileged to go over this remarkable dog, who is one of the all-time top winners of the breed and who has established a record that will be hard to duplicate. Mrs. Meyer and her kennel girl brought out all the other members of the Reanda family for us to see. Included in this group were a substantial number of champions. All the dogs at Reanda were in very proper show trim and were neatly brushed and combed. The Reanda kennel is quite a compact affair, with a fair-sized fenced-in exercise area. Here, too, the dogs and bitches are permitted to run together and it was really remarkable to be able to see 15 to 20 Scots milling around so harmoniously.

Kennelgarth is fitted snugly but comfortably into a fashionable residential section of London and is owned and ably managed by the remarkable Miss Betty Penn Bull. I say "remarkable," because Miss Bull runs a very interesting and unusual operation at Kennelgarth. It is her full-time occupation and here one finds from 20 to 30 well-groomed, well-mannered Scotties, each one of which could enter the show ring on a moment's notice, living in special quarters provided for them in Miss Bull's home. Kennelgarth is surrounded by neighbors, yet in all the years it has been there, Betty has received no complaints on her dogs. All of them are trained to run together in the pack and are exercised in a large, fenced-in area adjacent to her neat, attractive backyard, which is bordered with graceful trees, shrubs, and flowers. Additionally, Miss Bull regularly walks as many as 11 or 12 dogs at a time to a nearby commons, where they are taken off lead and allowed a good romp. Unfortunately, we didn't get to see this, but we do have movies of Betty arriving at Ascot with quite a number of Scotties of both sexes on lead.

Betty entertained John Murphy, Cliff Hallmark, Muriel Owen, Tony and I at a very festive little tea in her lovely backyard garden, during which we had the opportunity of seeing 15 Scottish terriers (including 7 stud dogs and eight bitches) running together in the exercise yard. It was a lovely sight to see all these Scotties, so perfectly groomed, all wearing little red collars, and all maintaining such decorum and congeniality. Later, we were privileged to examine her dogs and to see her move several of her current winners on the lawn for us and stand them for examination, keeping them alert without touching lead or tail. We had first seen her demonstrate this at Ascot in the brace class.

Miss Bull is the columnist for the English magazine, **DOG WORLD**, and, like Mrs. Dewar, was quite interested in our impressions and opinions of what we had seen in England. Here, as everywhere else, time passed much too quickly and we said our good-byes with great reluctance.

Our last "port of call" was Bracknell, in Berkshire, just outside Windsor and about 30 miles from London. Here we were given a guided tour of Joe Cartledge's famous **Ryslip** terrier kennels. Joe, as many will know, is a former handler, who gave up the profession to devote his time to judging and to the grooming, boarding, breeding, and other operations of the Ryslip establishment. Additionally, Ryslip operates a sort of "college of dog husbandry" to which aspiring handlers come from all over England and even other parts of the world to learn the fundamentals of kennel management, particularly as it pertains to terriers, as well as the finer techniques of terrier trimming. They live at Ryslip and not only pay tuition but also assist in all the kennel chores as part of their training.

Joe is very ably assisted in this large and complex operation by Barbara Sedorski and Jane Miller, both of whom live at Ryslip but at the same time maintain separate identities for their two Scottish terrier kennels—**Cumnoch** and **Brio**, respectively. Miss Sedorski's most famous champion is **Cumnoch Clansman**, who was BB at Crufts in '62. Fortunately, we were able to see, admire, and examine this dog before time and the weather (again) ran out on us.

With further regard to the weather, I must add that not once did it let us down. I think it rained at every kennel stop we made. The showers were of short duration in most cases, however, and we were able to record all of our visits on movie film, which will help us relive these memorable moments many times.

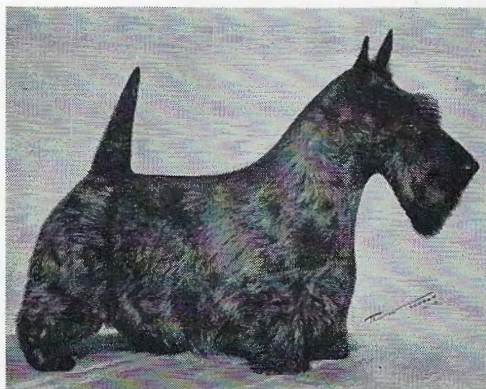
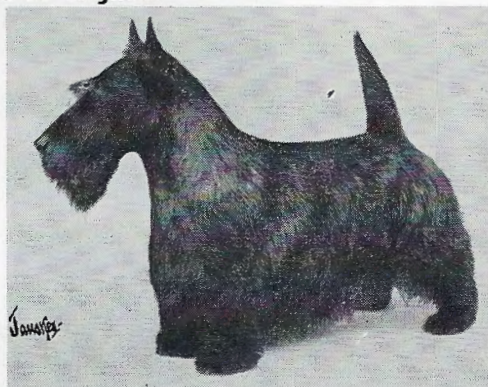

WALSING WIZARD

A LINE OF DESCENDENCY



Though denied the title of "champion" for himself, though his stud potential was barely realized thanks to the war, the name of **Walsing Wizard** has, by his prepotency, been elevated to pre-eminence among Scottish Terriers. No less than 332 post war champions, both British and American, trace back to him in tail male; and ten of the twenty top producing post war studs claim him as their male line ancestor. No other Scottie of his era can match this record.

During the present era, no single male line dominates the winners circle as did the line from **Ch. Dundee** before World War I, nor do a pair of distantly related lines take all the prizes as did those of **Champions Heather Necessity** and **Albourne Barty** before World War II. Many lines (though all tracing back to these latter two dogs) share the honors now, no one surpassing another, but through it all, the line from **Walsing Wizard** increases at a steady rate each year, and at the present time can claim a hundred more champions than its nearest rival.

When the record books are audited in year 1990, **Walsing Wizard** will take his place as a pillar of the breed, along with those other illustrious ones when lesser dogs, though champions they may be, are long forgotten.

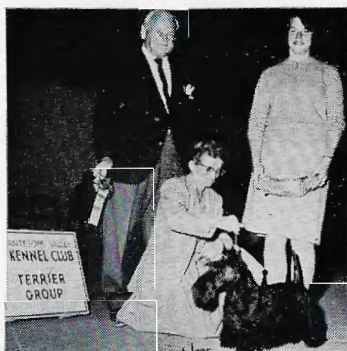

TOP PRODUCING SCOTTISH TERRIERS

By John T. Knight

CH. SPECIAL EDITION OF TODHILL, top producing sire of 11 champions, in addition to being one of the past decades top winners. He is one of 5 Todhill owned Scotties who have become top producers. Owned by Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Graham of Rome, New York.



(Editors note: The following very exceptional work represents hundreds of hours of work, and I'm sure the entire fancy will applaud Mr. Knight's efforts in preparing this for us. In the article that follows, all those sires who have produced five or more AKC champions are presented in bold capitals, and the list of top producing dams has been limited to those that have produced three or more AKC champions, this greater consideration being given since there producing opportunities are considerably more limited than that of a stud.)

It all started with **Bright**. Who's he? Well, he is the beginning of all our Scottish Terrier champions . . . the earliest dog to whom our present-day Scotties trace in tail-male. He was the sire of **Bonaccord**, who in turn sired **Rambler**. **Rambler** sired **Eng. Ch. Dundee** and **Eng. Ch. Alister**. Fourteen generations after **Dundee** came **ABERTAY SPORT**, his only descendant represented in our list of top sires. All the rest are descended from **Alister**.

Eng. Ch. Alister (**Rambler**—**Eng. Ch. Lorna Doone**) was the sire of the first American champion **Tiree**, who finished in 1898. **Ch. Tiree** did not carry on in tail-male line to any extent, but other sons of **Alister** did. Eight generations later, we find **ENG. CH. BAPTON NORMAN**, a son of **Eng. Ch. Claymore Defender**. **NORMAN'S** grandson, **CH. BELLSTANE LADDIE** is also in the list.

Bapton Noble (**Eng. Ch. Claymore Defender**—**Eng. Ch. Bonaccord Nora**), a full brother of **NORMAN**, founded what proved to be the line for United States champions. All others in the top sire list are descended from him. Continuing, six generations after **Bapton Noble** we find two sons of **Ch. Albourne Adair**: **Eng. Ch. Albourne Scot** and **Albourne MacAdair**. **Scot** was the sire of **ENG. CH. ALBOURNE BARTY**, who has two producing lines. One through **Eng. Ch. Albourne Brigand** of **Diehard** gives us **CH. ACTON HILLS INTERVENTIONIST**, **DIEHARD TOBY** and **CH. BLANART BARRISTER**. The other producing son was **Eng. Ch. Albourne Reveller**.

Reveller was the sire of **CH. HEATHER REVELLER OF SPORRAN**, sire of **Ch. Diehard Reveller**, who sired **CH. BARBERRY KNOWE REVIVAL**. Another son was **CH. HEATHER GOLD FINDER**, who sired **CH. GOLD FINDER'S KNOCKOUT**. His most noted line, however, was that through **Albourne Binge Results**.

Five generations after **Albourne Binge Results** came **CH. WALSING WINNING TRICK OF EDGERSTOUNE**, sire of **CH. EDGERSTOUNE TROUBADOUR** who is the top sire of the breed. **TROUBADOUR** sired, in turn, **CH. RANNOCH-DUNE ROYAL FLUSH** and **CH. TROJAN OF ELM HALL**.

Going back to **Albourne MacAdair**, his grandson **HEATHER NECESSITY** (**Harton Highlander**—**Skerne Scotch Lass**) was the sire of **ENG. CH. CRICH CERTAINTY OF DEEPHAVEN**. Through **Eng. Ch. Sandheys Silvertip**, **NECESSITY** was the grandsire of **CH. GAISGILL NOSEGAY**. Another son of **NECESSITY**, **Ch. Heather Essential of Hitofa**, produced **CH. HILLCOTE LADDIE**, the sire

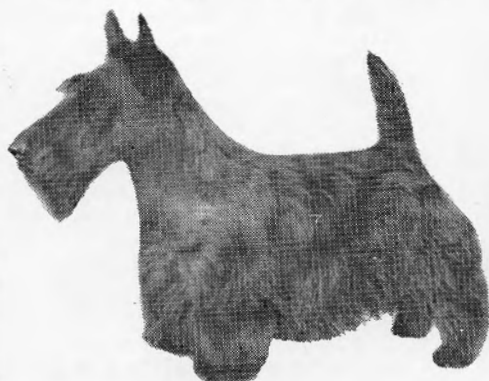
of **CH. DEEPHAVEN WARSPITE. NECESSITY** also produced **GLENISLA STERLING'S STYLIST** and his son **CH. SHIELING'S DESIGNER** are descendants of **NECESSITY** through **Ch. Drum Major of Docken**.

ENG. CH. HEATHER AMBITION was another strong son of **NECESSITY**. Through **ENG. CH. HEATHER BEAU IDEAL** we find **HEATHER ASSET, CH. KINCLAVEN CLASSIC** and **CH. KINCLAVEN CASANOVA**. From **Ortley Observer** are descended **CH. ORTLEY AMBASSADOR OF EDGERTOUNE, BRAMSHIRE BLAZE O'GLORY, CH. BOTHKENNAR SPITFIRE, CH. EDGERSTOUNE SPITFIRE** and **CH. EDGERSTOUNE PEPPER**. **Bradthorn Banker** is the sire of **CH. BRADTHORN BULLION**. Through **Ch. Catterthun Model**, we have **CH. SHEFFSCOT SELECTMAN**, and through **Ch. Heather Independence of Edgerstoune** came **CH. SHEILING'S SIGNATURE** and **CH. SHEILING'S MASTER KEY**.

Last, but not least of **HEATHER NECESSITY'S** sons, was **ENG. CH. HEATHER FASHION HINT**. Members of our list are descended from him through three lines. One son on the list, **CH. HALLCREST BLACK LANCER**, is not yet represented by any descendants. In the line through **Ch. Radical of Rookes**, we find **CH. GILLSIE DICTATOR, CH. RELGALF REBEL LEADER, CH. RELGALF REBEL DICTATOR** and **CH. MARYMAC'S POLLY JACK**. Through **Ch. Walsing Wallet**, we find **CH. LYNWOOD ANGUS**. It is through **ENG. CH. HEATHER REALISATION** that most of **FASHION HINT'S** progeny appear.

ENG. CH. HEATHER REALISATION is the ancestor through **Heather Herald**, of **ENG. CH. REANDA ROGER ROUGH**. Through **St. Margaret Subaltern** we get **CH. WALSING WHIRLWIND**. A third son, **ENG. CH. WALSING WARRANT OF MARLU**, through **Ch. Marlu Crusader**, gave us **CH. DEEPHAVEN JEFFREY** and **CH. DEEPHAVEN RED SEAL**. Descendants of **RED SEAL** include **CH. MARLORAIN DARK SEAL, CH. BLANART BOLERO, CH. MERRIE OAKS WINDJAMMER, CH. GOLD FINDER'S ADMIRAL, CH. BLANART BARTENDER, CH. FRIENDSHIP FARM DIPLOMAT** and **CH. TODHILL'S CINNAMON BEAR**.

REALISATION'S fourth son was **Heather Benefactor**. He sired **Walsing Watch Tower** and **Westpark Masterpiece**. In the line from **Watch Tower** we have **CH. GLENDOUNE GAY BOY** and **CH. WYREBURY WORTHWHILE**. From **Westpark Masterpiece** came **Eng. Ch. Reimill Radiator**, who sired **CH. GLAD MAC'S ROLLING STONE**. A second **Masterpiece** son started a "string" of four straight generations in the list. They are **ENG. CH. WESTPARK RIO GRANDE, CH.**
