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mostly . . . SCOTTIES

Letters from breeders in all areas of the country stress the need for some sort of breeders' forum, where in the complex problems that occasionally beset all of us can be aired. The breed clubs fall far short where breeders' problems are concerned.

"Scottie Cramp," the name given a nervous disorder described as similar to epilepsy, which is peculiar to the breed and asserts itself usually in six to eight week old pups, has been described to me by correspondents in diverse areas. Never having seen it, though some reference has been made to it in British articles, we contacted the University of California Veterinary Research College at Davis, hoping to find an answer. They replied that they were familiar with it, had seen many cases, and were convinced that it was merely the manifestation of a recessive gene. They knew of no known cure and recommended treatment with a tranquillizing drug until the seizures became intolerable, when euthanasia was recommended.

It is unlikely that the original carrier of this gene can ever be traced,

as we have no way of knowing how many of these cases have occurred. Breeders are apt to destroy the afflicted pups in a litter and never mention it, for fear the stud might be condemned. If the truth were known, it could be that all Scots are carriers, but only certain matings awaken the latent gene in both parents. of course, nothing is learned by exterminating pups with this affliction as the scientists are completely in the dark, as to whether the con-

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dition improves with age or can be eventually outgrown.

Some breeders just chalk it off to too much close family breeding, a process that undoubtedly produces better stock but can certainly introduce congenital faults. However, in the cases brought to our attention, the pups were from two unrelated lines.

After all, although there are several breeding "families," they all fundamentally had the same forebearers. A latent gene, one of Nature's leprechauns, can awaken to find a mate in any union and no stud or bitch can be blamed.

Richard and Jane Van Istendal's homebred, **Van Istendal's Wee Willie**, at 17 months of age, had a very exciting win . . . Best of Breed and a Group Second at the Perkiomen Valley K. C., Aug. 23rd under judge, Edwin Goodwin . . . and all this from the Bred by Exhibitor class.

An entry of 18 Scottish Terriers in the classes and three Specials were on hand at the Salinas Valley K. C. show when Mr. William Pym began judging, August 15th. Best of Breed and Group Second went to Mr. & Mrs. Anthony Stamm's **Ch. Anstamm Dark Venture** (Ch. Bardene Boy Blue — Anstamm Paragon) aptly handled by Lena Kardos. Winners Bitch, BW and OS went to Doris Johnson's **Crescent Hill Shela** (Ch. Crescent Hill Indian Scout — Miss Meg), while WD went to **HaydenHill's Skeam Dhu** (Crescent Hill Doublet — Crescent Hill Sequel) owned by Haydenhill Kennels, and handled by Fred Young. Reserve in Dogs went to Florence Wolman's **Ayrloch Roust About** (Ch. Lynnbrrier of Zelwyn — Ch. Cambria's Doll), and in Bitches

to Celia Desmond's **Ballantine's Fashion Model** (Ch. Taggard's Toddy Torpedo — Ballantine's Miracle Girl) shown by Mildred Charves.

On Sunday, August 16th, Mr. Derek Rayne judged an entry of 8 dogs, 9 bitches and 3 Specials, again placing "Dark Venture" as BOB. "Fashion Model" won the major in bitches, going on to BW and BOS, while the Dog points went to "Roust About." Reserve in Dogs to "Skeam Dhu," and in Bitches to **Anstamm Blue Jeans** (Ch. Bardene Boy Blue — Anstamm Christmas Jingles) owned by the Stamms.

On the same weekend, but in the East, Helen Gaither's **Ch. Gaidoune Grin and Bear It** (Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear — Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussey) won the Group at Annapolis, handled by Nancy Lenfestey. Winners Dog and BW went to **Hil-Ray's Smoke Signal** (Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear — Hil-Ray's Silver Bella) owned by Mrs. Hilda Bigelow for a major win.

Three shows in the Mid-west . . . Massillon, Revenna and Chargin, August 21 thru 23rd, all in Ohio. **Ch. Matscot Roger Ringleader** (Ch. Gill-sie Roger Right — Ch. Lochearn

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Miss Twinkle) owned by Math Rauen and handled by Jack Funk, scored BOB at all three, and was Group Second at Ravenna, and Group Fourth at Massillon. Winners Dog at both Chargin and Ravenna went to **Tartan Stewart** (Haycliff Harbor Light—Haycliff Bonnie Omen II) owned by Theodore & Marie Buell; BW at the latter. Winners Bitch at Chargin (BW and BOS) went to **Gayscot Enchantress** (Sheiling's Tribute — Sheiling's Image) owned by Mr. & Mrs. John Little. Unfortunately, these were the only wins reported to us.

Still in the Mid-west, but earlier in August, Jackson & Battle Creek, Michigan on August 1 & 2. Best of Breed and Group First at both (from the Open Bitch class) to Mr. & Mrs. Anthony Stamm's **Bardene Be Wonderful**, to become the first American champion sired by **Eng. Ch. Bardene Bingo**. She finished at just 14 months of age, and with four Group Firsts . . . quite a record! Winners

Dog and BOS at Battle Creek under Percy Roberts went to Mrs. Amy Johnson's **Roy Lou's Lucky Token** (Haycliff Handsome Troubador—Roy Lou's Highlander Maiden). Reserve in Dogs to **Walker Gaylord McDuffie** (Ch. Anstamm Rob Roy — Eadie's Highland Thistle) owned by Dorothy Walker, and in Bitches to **Blanart Belle of Markeelyn** (Ch. Blanart Barcee's Duke — Ch. Blanart Bewitching) owned by J. & B. Whisler. Dr. T. Allen Kirk judged the next day at Jackson, placing them similarly, but giving the dog points to "McDuffie" and Reserve to "Lucky Token" and "Belle."

Louis Murr judged the major entry at Michigan City, Indiana, August 9th, and awarded BOB (also Group Second under McQuown) to the Stamms' **Ch. Anstamm Ebony** (Ch. Bardene Boy Blue — Aldon's Angela of Anstamm). while BOS went to previously mentioned "Roger Ring-leader." Winners Dog went to Allan Cartwright's **Camydnas Sky Rocket**

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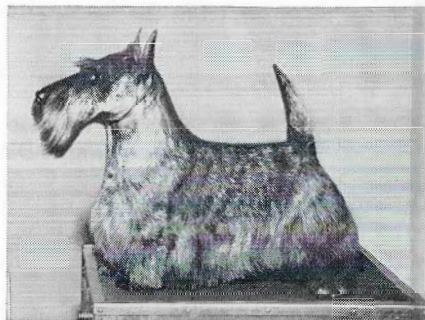
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(Ch. Gilkey's Johnny Come Lately — Shieling's Divine), while Reserve went to Jean Tait's **Benscot Gay Blade** (Ch. Sandbark Gay Blade — Viewpark Vesta). Winners Bitch and BW to Mr. & Mrs. Ralph Krueger's **Anstamm Blue Charm** (Ch. Bardene Boy Blue — Ch. Sandoone Lady Thalia), and Reserve to Cartwright's Camydna's Island Queen (Ch. Anstamm Rob Roy — Camydna's Thistle).

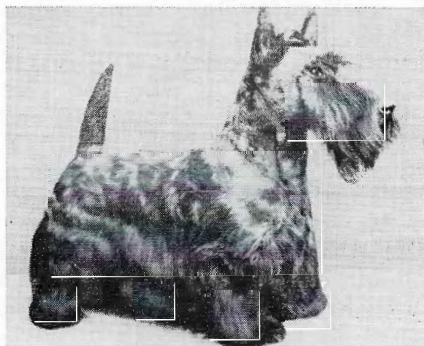
At Flint, Michigan, Edwin Pickhardt judged an entry of 3 dogs, 5 bitches and 2 Specials, with "Ebony" again scoring as BOB, and "Roger Ringleander" as BOS. "Blue Charm" was again BW, to finish for the title defeated only once within her sex. Winners Dog to Sylvia Patton's **Scot's Rill Black Friday** (Ch. Bardene Boy Blue — Black Cinder of Anstamm). Reserves went to "McDuffie" in Dogs, and in Bitches to the Stamms' **Anstamm Gold Nugget** (Ch. Middlemount Red Sun — Ch. Anstamm Golden Legend).

From the "Heart of America" we have a report of this club's first Match. The Match was held June 14th, and with an entry of 24 was a huge success. Frank Crawford placed the entry as follows: First in a class of six 3-6 Dogs went to **Siegel's MacIntosh** (Ch. Siegel's Rawhide — Siegel's Sunbonnet Sue) owned by Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Aschman. No 6-9 entries, and the singleton in 9-12 Dogs was **Mac George's Busy Barrister** (Ch. Balachan Avant Garde — MacGeorge's Winsome Wendy) owned by Edna Konomos. An entry of 3 in 12-18 Dogs, with first and **Best in Match** to Mr. & Mrs. Gordon Craft's **Leathers' Skean Dhu** (Ch. Special Edition — Ch. Brymstone Bittersweet). In Bitches, 5 in the 3-6 class, with first to **Leathers' Fascinating Edition** (Ch. Special Edition—Leathers' Cantie Fascinating) owned and bred by Mr. & Mrs. Robert Leathers. The singleton in 6-9 was **Stratherick's Evening Star** (Ch. Gaidoune

Great Bear — Gaywyn Baroness) owned by Mr. & Mrs. Vernon Stuart. First in the class of three in 9-12 was **Banquo's Beaufort Exeter** (Ch. Lynhaven Commander — Banquo's Blue Mist) bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. Hugh Kellogg. First in a class of 2 in 12-18, and on to BOS was **Siegel's Sae Sonsie** (Ch. Siegel's Bon Hobart — Bonny of Coral Heights) bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. Elmer Siegel. Best Novice was **Leathers' Cantie Taen** (Ch. Cantie Captivator — Ch. Brymstone Bittersweet) bred and owned by the Leathers.

Members of this ambitious club can boast of two more new champions finished so far in 1964. It is now **Ch. Brymstone Bottom Dollar** (Ch. Blanart Bottoms Up — Ch. Siegel's Bon Spitfire) bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. Craft, who finished by going BW at Grand Island, Nebr. Their other new champion is **Ch. Leathers' Seannachie** (Ch. 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& Mrs. Robert Leathers, and handled by Dora Lee Wilson. He finished with several outstanding wins, mostly majors, and including a Group First from the classes.

Random Thoughts . . .

What constitutes Terrier Spirit? Our standard cautions judges against putting to winners or BOB any Scottish Terriers "not showing real Terrier character in the ring." Is, in the context of this statement, the connotation of character and spirit synonymous; does this mean an aggressive showman that carries his tail well up, his ears alert, a voice threat to the stranger next in line? A willingness to "have at it" if permitted? I wonder! The breadth of interpretation that many of our present judges use on this important part of the standard raises a question as to whether it should be clarified or at least have the STCA go on record in a more specific manner.
