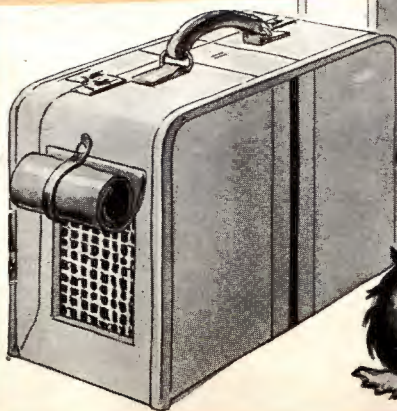

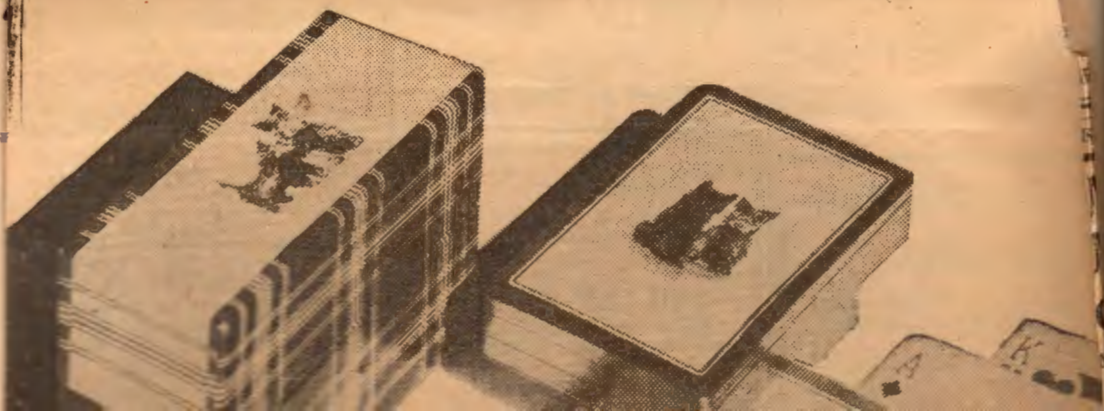

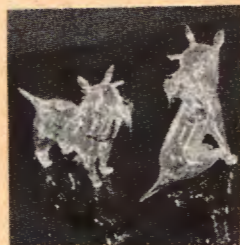

Flett, Wright, etc.; and at the recently held Sheffield Ch. Show Mr. W. L. McCandlish awarded him first, etc., prizes. His latest wins are six first prizes and ch. certificate at the recent Royal "Vet." Show, under no less an authority than Colonel J. Jackson. So much for his wins. 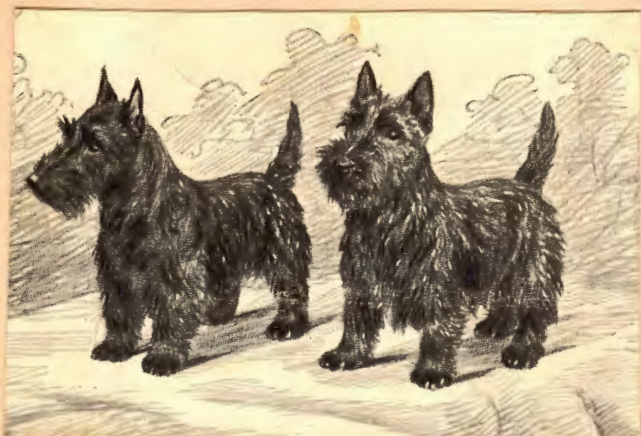

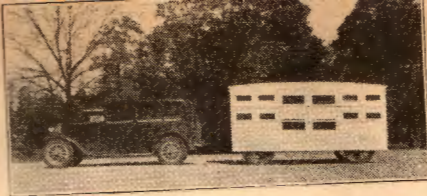

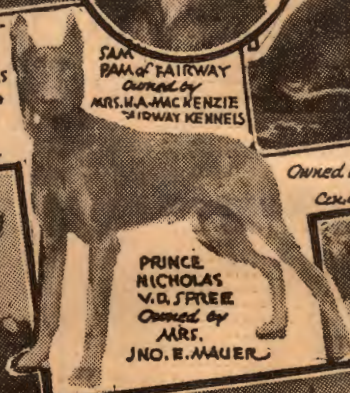

ONE of our most outstanding American-bred Scottish Terriers, Heather Gold Finder Babe began winning as a junior puppy at Holyoke and Atlantic City, later being awarded Best Puppy at the Scottish Terrier Club's American-bred show, Westport, Conn. Another remarkable win came at the Grand Central Palace, New York City, when he headed the American-bred class of eighteen of the finest Scotties on exhibition at the Club's annual specialty show. Connoisseurs of the breed concede him to be one of the few American-breds that can with distinction compete with recent importations. He is sired by Ch. Heather Gold Finder ex Barley May.

THE *Albourne* is without doubt one of the best known in the world. He has an long when last standing in length of

six *Albourne* champions, and he has that on both sire and dam's side. Ch. *Albourne Arthur* is by Ch. *Albourne Young Lochinvar*, by Ch. *Albourne Andy*, by

Ch. *Albourne Beetle*. That is another direct line of four *Albourne* champions. He goes back to Ch. *Albourne Beetle* twelve times, yet he is a dead game, vigorous dog, and has no sign of nerves.

Since he came into the possession of his present owners he has been unbeaten by any Scottish Terrier. He has, up to the time of writing, won twenty firsts and a championship (under such a good judge as Mr. Robt. Chapman), and he has been twice best in show.

He is standing at stud to approved bitches at 5 guineas, and this will be raised in 1932 to 6 guineas.

Messrs. Major Emil Ilgner arrived in New York on the *S. S. Ballin* Friday, May 13th. He has come at the invitation of the Greenwich Kennel Club, sponsored by the Dachshund Club of America to judge Dachshunde at the specialty to be held in connection with the Greenwich show June 18th. Major Ilgner was one of the founders of the German Teckel Klub, the Hessian Hunting Club and the Swedish Dachshund Club. He is now an honorary member of these clubs and also of the English Rough-Coated Dachshund Club and others. Major Ilgner, a judge with an international reputation, is the first judge to come

from the homeland of the Teckel especially to judge the breed here. The Dachshund Club is to be congratulated on obtaining the services of so well known an authority. It is expected that all owners and breeders of Dachshunde will be represented at Greenwich to have their dogs passed on by one of the pioneers in breeding and judging the Teckel.

Ever since purchasing his first Dachs in 1880 Major Ilgner has been an enthusiastic and devoted admirer of the breed, accepting judging invitations all over Europe where his services are always in demand. His kennel, Erdmannsheim, was one of the best known in Germany in its day, and during its existence won more than a hundred blue ribbons and medals from the Federal Government. Since its discontinuance Major Ilgner's interests have concentrated particularly in writing a number of books on the Teckel and other breeds. The last one, published a few years ago, contains his memoirs as breeder and judge.

Many old-timers will remember George Semler, who owned years ago probably the largest kennel of Dachshunde we have ever had in this country, and will be interested to know that after reading a book on the breed by Major Ilgner he purchased a good dog from him to found his famous Lichtenstein strain.

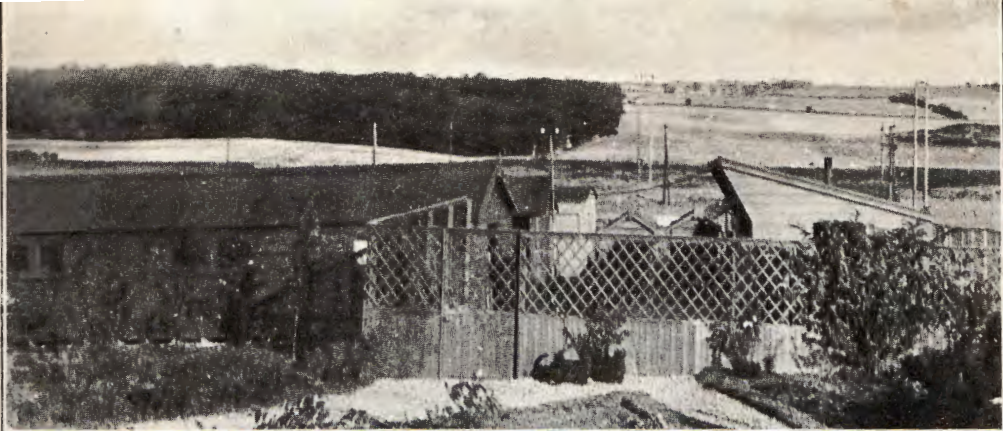

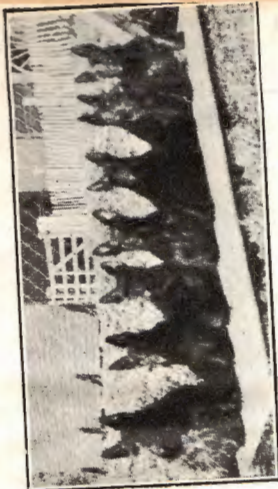
