October 6 is the date, and the scene for the Fall Specialty is the G. Harrison Frazier, Jr. estate at Gwynedd Valley, Pennsylvania. Mrs. Ruth Johnson will judge the Sweepstakes and Mr. Robert Graham will judge the Classes. To begin with, John Murphy will go over the head, and he will also give his interpretation of desirable expression. Frank Brumby will discuss the body, including height, weight, muscles and bones. Blanche Reeg will then cover the tail, general appearance, temperament and showmanship.
