The President called the Meeting to order at 2:25 P.M. Those in attendance were:

President, Mrs. Catherine Ridgley; Vice-President, Mrs. Mariam Stamm; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Kathleen Brown; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Marjorie Cohen; Delegate to A.K.C., Dr. T. Allen Kirk, Jr.; Immediate Past President, Mr. John R. Sheehan. Directors: Mr. Ronald Giese, Mr. Robert Marshall, Mrs. Betty McArthur, Mrs. Danalee Saar and Mrs. Jackie Seelbach.

Motion by Robert Marshall, seconded by Dr. Kirk, to dispense with reading the minutes of the April 11, 1981 Meeting. ## **MINUTES OF REGIONAL CLUBS REPRESENTATIVES COMMITTEE JUNE 12, 1981 PALATINE, ILL.**

The Regional Clubs Representative Committee meeting was called to order at 3:40 p.m. on June 12, 1981 by Alan Riga, Chairman. The minutes of the October 2, 1981 meeting were reviewed and approved. The Regional Clubs mailing list was updated by those present. Members in attendance were: Kathi Brown (STCNE,\*); Nancy Fingerhut, Anne Goodell, and Ursala McManus (STCC); Margaret Brokaw and Margaret MacDonald (HASTC); Miriam Stamm (STCM,\*); Cass Ridgley (STCGD,\*); Marjorie Cohen (GMSTC,\*); Nancy Reese (RMSTC); Judy Riga (STCNO), Bob Marshall (\*); John DeSaye and Evelyn Morrow (STCM); Debby Fowler (GDSTC); Danalee Saar (STCGA,\*); Bob Saar (STCGA); Janice Merritt and Mary Severson (STCGH); R. Harley (STCD); Jackie and Dick Seelbach (STCGNY,\*); Ann Woodriddle and Betty McArthur (SFBSTC,\*); Elaine Walburn (guest, Austin, TX) and Alan Riga (RCRC, chairman).

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **Health Committee (Judy Riga)**

Canine Immunization Programs by Peter Felsburg, VMD, PhD was discussed: canine distemper, Measles, hepatitis, canine laryngotracheitis, parainfluenza, rabies, leptospirosis, bordetella bronchiseptica and canine parovirus. (Handout available).

Barbara Dunham, Burbank, CA submitted a questionnaire to the Health Committee. BD to JR, 4/5/81 "A problem - not just in Scotties - is beginning to surface in breeding programs which should be of concern to us re: breeding misses and the parvo vaccine - is there a connection? There may be no connection at all. On the other hand, some CA veterinarians are now suggesting that owners of bitches to be bred, not vaccinate them immediately prior to breeding." Copies of the questionnaire were circulated. (JR) A representative of Nordeen Labs recently reported that there is no correlation between bitches missing and the vaccine. He recommended that you not give a modified live virus to a bitch that is pregnant, problems have been noted for this case. If it is imperative to vaccinate a pregnant bitch then use the killed vaccine.

In a recent letter from Hawaii there have been a number of cases of unusual litters: mummified puppies, malformations, and dead litters (M. Stamm). There is only circumstantial not statistical evidence of a correlation. The questionnaire is good if you are evaluating one bitch, but if you are talking about a kennel, then you run into trouble with one bitch you have had problems and another not. You have to fill out this questionnaire for each dog and bitch in your kennel. We should duplicate this questionnaire, circulate it and then determine from the response any trends (AR). I suggest you fill out a questionnaire for each active breeding bitch in your kennel. Conclusions based on this kind of biased sampling will not be straight forward. However, good information can be derived from this survey, in a negative sense if we get little data back in demonstrating a relationship then we will know there is probably not a problem of any magnitude. If a great deal of data is returned with a "relationship" then it will suggest a trend and further investigation. (Bob Marshall). Another thing this survey will do is to alert people who are breeding that there may be a problem for them to investigate. (K. Brown).

The questionnaire should be redone to avoid any ambiguities. We should include

questions which will give us some quantitative information, e.g., when was the bitch vaccinated and bred? (B. Marshall). The questionnaire will be rewritten by B. Marshall, submitted to the RCRC and will be distributed to the RC representatives. There is a new vaccine in New England to inoculate young puppies for parvo, could we add a question concerning the puppies reaction at a given age? (KB). A canine parvo vaccine will be available in the near future from Nordeen (JR).

The bibliography on Canine Health problems prepared by B. Marshall is still available from the RCRC.

Dr. K. Meyers speech on "Scotty Cramp" presented to the STCA at our national meeting, October, 1980 was transcribed and is in the spring **Bagpiper**.

A summary of VWD clinics: Atlanta (D. Saar) - most people have had their dogs tested. We need 20 dogs to be tested and there are not enough in our area. STCNE (KB) We have no problems since we are close to Dr. Dodd's lab our members on an individual basis have their dogs tested. STCC (N. Fingerhut) Dr. Dodd was in Chicago for a talk and we and an all breed club ran a clinic. (M. Stamm) Dr. Dodd will be in Hawaii in September and agreed to assist with a clinic. STCM (E. Morrow) We still have periodic clinics and test dogs with "high" parents so they can have their own certificate. (MS) I recommend to all of my pet owners that they test their dogs and they have complied. (E. Morrow) We can eliminate or minimize the VWD problem by testing and breeding only with dogs with normal to high values. (M. Cohen) The STCGW had a good symposium where Dr. Clemmons and Dr. Dodd spoke on Scotty cramp and VWD, respectively. A tape of that symposium would be good for the Regional Clubs. Judy Riga will acquire a tape of that meeting and get it copied for distribution through the RCRC. (C. Ridgley) All dogs in the STCGD have been tested for VWD.


Dr. Ken Meyers is preparing a movie on "Scotty Cramp" and is accepting donations to support this effort (J. Riga). Send tax deductible donations to the Canine Cramp Fund, c/o Dr. K. Meyers, VCAPP College of Veterinarian Medicine, Washington State Univ., Pullman, WA 99164. M. Stamm moved to support this project, passed. CR received correspondence from Dr. Meyers thanking the STCA for its support and cooperation.

K. Brown will write the American Veterinarian Association asking them to consider changing the name "Scotty Cramp" to "Canine Cramp."

K. Brown wrote 18 Vet Schools concerning the status of cancer in Scotties. Colorado State U. responded and suggested we contact a Dr. Wm Prester, National Cancer Institute, Bethesda, MD, since he specialized in Tumors in Domestic animals. It is recommended to this committee that if any school of VM or hospital that is studying cancer in dogs, to please pass the name of the DVM or researcher to K. Brown. The STCGNY is having a program on Cancer in Dogs in September, 1981 and requests that if you have any questions please submit them in advance. (M. MacDonald) Please contact Dr. Jacob Mosier, DVM, Kansas State U., Manhattan, KS concerning cancer in dogs. He is the President-elect of the American Veterinarian Association.

A number of dogs in our area are being tested for thyroid problems. We have noticed the dogs to be lethargic, they have lost their appetite, and coat, and the skin has been very bad (J. Merritt). Some DVMs at TX A and M have correlated thyroid problems with allergies. (D. Saar) I have a bitch with a normal T4, but only recently had her checked for a T3 which was very low and after medication within 60 days she is

greatly improved. The DVM predicts with a new medication to increase the size of her litter. (KB) I had a thyroid deficient bitch with good coat with small litters. She had a lot T3 which was improved by medication and had a litter of 5. Her puppies did not have low T3 values. It appears to me that this is not a hereditary problem. (J. Riga) Our DVM has related thyroid problems with dog food. There has been a push to get the food manufactures to be more open about the ingredients in the food. (M. MacDonald). Dr. Mosier has had an on going fight with the dog food companies concerning the protein they add. Animal protein is far superior to soya protein in dog food. You must have animal protein in your dogs diet. (KB) Use A.N.F. (chicken protein) and you will see good results in younger dogs, however dogs 6-7 years should use A.N.F. 24 (KB, AW, JM). (M. Brokaw) There is no commercial dog food which is sufficient with out added animal protein, a small amount of cottage cheese or liver.

(M. Cohen) **Standard Operating Manual** is being developed and by the next meeting we should have something for you.

### INSURANCE

The GDSTC, F. Simmons, does carry insurance under a blanket policy with an associated Terrier Club at a cost of \$32/year, covering \$300,000 for bodily injury and \$50,000 property damage. The STCNO for \$132 has \$1 million dollars of coverage for bodily injury and property damage. (D. Saar) The STCGA has insurance for \$185/year for \$80,000, 30/50 and we have the host liquor liability coverage, but had great difficulty finding a company. We use St. Paul Fire and Marine, there was no one in our area who would write the policy. The STCGM has coverage of about \$1 Million for \$150/year. The STCGD has coverage of \$1 million for \$132/year. The SFBSTC uses the Firemens Fund Insurance for about a \$1 million.

### DOG LEGISLATION

(J. Merritt) If you own 5 or more breedable bitches over the age of 6 months you must have a kennel license as stated in a TX state bill. The Houston KC lawyer is working with the state legislators to rewrite this bill. (KB) In MA, 3 or more dogs constitutes a kennel, or if you breed one litter you must have a kennel permit, but it is not being enforced. (UN) The state law on kennels in Illinois is being enforced, but depends on the county. (J. Riga) In Ohio we contact the American Dog Owners Association and the Pure Bred Dog Fanciers Association for assistance with dog legislation problems. The STCNO has made donations to these organizations to help them in their fight against dog legislation.

### MEMBERSHIP TECHNIQUES

The SFBSTC/Marge Meeder is preparing a brochure on the Scottish Terrier for distribution to the Regional Clubs and their new members. The RCRC thanks Marge for putting this brochure together and encourages the regional clubs and individuals to write M. Meeder or Betty McArthur with information concerning our breed, or flyers used by the clubs in promoting the Scottish Terrier.

The STCNO is encouraging membership in the STCA at each meeting by describing our national meetings and what we are accomplishing at the RCRC meetings. (KB) disseminated STCA membership applications to all the regional clubs present.

## PROGRAMMING AND ACTIVITIES

The STCNO distributed a Certificate of Achievement, written in old English for those members who achieve an obedience title or conformation championship (J. Riga).

What is the best program your club has had to-date?

(AW) The best program we had last year was the mini-symposium sponsored by the STCA. Now the SFBSTC this July is putting on the same program with Jerry Rozman. The program includes handling and grooming.

(KB) The STCNE also has a 2 day mini-symposium on grooming and handling about 12 weeks prior to our specialty. Jean Ferris and Kathi Ferris, artist, presented grooming with overlays which was well received by the membership.

(MM) The HASTC held a grooming seminar with Ron Giese on the first day and handling on the second day.

the dog, and mail them back to B. Marshall. The purpose of this pretest is: can people fill out this survey, is it clear enough, is the coding proper, and is it complete. If there are any questions or if you want anything else in the survey please contact B. Marshall. The information should result in data of interest to the breed. Once we get this pretest questionnaire back we will redesign the questionnaire, attain STCA board approval, and go to the AKC to obtain a randomly selected list of Scottish Terrier owners.

**Recommendation to the STCA Board for Action:** Assign someone to compile the Specialty Judge Assignments, with the judge being selected at least one year in advance. (KB) The Regional Clubs should follow certain procedures in obtaining a specialty judge "Are you judging in the area? If you accept this assignment will you agree to: not judging another specialty within 500 miles for 6 months, not judge at all breed shows in the area, ets." (KB, BM) The hiring of a judge for your specialty show is the responsibility of the club, not the RCRC or the STCA. (B. Marshall) A confirming letter must make some stipulations, particularly with a specialty show, about a possible conflict, ie., another specialty within 500 miles. (NF) The clubs in OH, IL, and MI should discuss informally their judge selections. (JR) Let's share a sample letter from our clubs to specialty judges. We can exchange them at our next meeting. A standardized letter would be good (AW, JR, KB).

(KB) Please send a list of your new officers to the STCA secretary. Also in your Standard Operating Manual add the need to send in your new officers each year to the STCA along with your date for your specialty show.

(JS) Please ask your club editors to send a copy of your newsletter to the **Bagpiper**.

#### NEW BUSINESS

(D. Saar) Discussed Canine Temperment Testing.

The next meeting of the RCRC will be in October, 1981. The meeting was adjourned at 5:38 PM.

"There were nice Scotties in every age division and I feel my three finalists showed the quality and competition that was there. The overall quality belonged to the bitches on the day.

"My Best In Sweeps had balance, with nice expression and movement, and she showed well as did many of the entries. She was pushed hard and my decision was made pleasingly difficult by the quality of the other two finalists. ## TYPEY SCOTTIES By Evelyn Kirk

Having watched Scotties in the ring at the last few shows where I was not a participant, I find two thoughts rising to the surface.

The first is the "picky" attitude of some judges. Why dump a truly typey dog because of a tooth out of line, or a coat that is a wee bit past prime?

If the quality of coat is there, is apparent, and the rest of the dog is superior to the competition, then - put him up. One crooked tooth doesn't make a bad mouth. So - put him up.

For my part, I would rather have a typey Scottie with a minor fault, I said *Minor*, than many others that you see, perfect or not.

The key word is "type", or "typey", which brings me to the other thing I want to say.

How can a Scottie be typey if he isn't displaying proper temperament? A Scottie *must* show - it says so in the standard. I don't mean snarling, snapping and pawing the earth. I mean a tail-up, fiery-eyed, bang-on attitude. The dog can stand still and do that. It isn't necessary to demonstrate that your dog would kill if you'd let him. He just has to prove that he is definitely not a sissy.

Remember what Percy Roberts used to tell novice judges: "First you look for type, then you look for soundness, then you apply a little forgiveness."

So, we're back to "type" again. What an important little word - and a four-letter one at that! But don't forget the last word . . . forgiveness. Remember - none of us is perfect.

**OBEDIENCE**

By Ruth Tryon, OB Chairman

Hardly seems true but Fall isn't too far away, bringing with it those delightful cool days and a great desire to take your Scot out to enjoy it all with you. What better time to start Mac tracking!

You say Scotties can't track. Nonsense. From the moment of birth, blind and deaf, his survival depends on his ability to track down that food supply and continue to find it as his dam moves about. It is his nose which tells him where to go and find his meal. As he grows older he tracks down other dogs' territory as well as staking out and locating the boundaries of his own. It is all part of nature's design for the dog's survival. To those of you who think a Scottie doesn't have a good nose - watch his reaction to a bitch in season, even one a good distance away! He knows when a bitch is coming in season long before you do! And observe his reaction in the yard or in the fields when he comes across the scent of a squirrel, rabbit or other animal that has crossed his path earlier. He has a natural ability to follow a scent and he demonstrates it constantly all his life.

Tracking will bring out a real togetherness between you and Mac. It is just the two of you together and all that open space. If Mac is a young puppy he will take to it at once and will amaze you with his ability to complete a track after a short period of training. If Mac is older he will love the extra time spent with you and the knowledge he hasn't been put on the shelf. It will take years off his age. The shy dog gains confidence and as for the aggressive dog, now he really has something to work at! So get Mac out in the fields be he young, old, stand-offish or a demon on wheels. He is going to love tracking for he works on his own!

You will help in the training periods, encouraging and directing him but in the last analysis, he does it himself and you must believe him. This is probably the hardest thing for a handler to do - to learn to read his dog out on the track and to realize the dog knows more about what he is doing than you! You must believe that when he is working the track he does know where it is and trust him and let him work it out himself. This cannot be stressed enough. The handler, imposing his idea as to where the track is instead of letting the dog work it out has probably slowed down the training of more tracking dogs than any other thing.

Happily, Tracking is an activity that does not demand a formal class. If you can join a Tracking group, fine, but if none are available you can still train the dog to track. For each dog you need a harness, 40 foot web or plastic clothes line lead, a glove or other leather object, 2 starting stakes and four turn stakes with highly visible material tied to them - and a loyal friend or member of your family. If the other person is interested in training his or her dog too, you will have an ideal situation.

Make sure your stakes are high enough to be easily seen in high grass or cover. Early morning is a fine time to track for there will be dew on the grass which will help hold the scent and the sun will not be too warm. Be sure you bring plenty of water for your dog and plenty of treats too. Work with as many people as you can encourage to help you so the dog will be used to constantly changing scents.

As to the actual training, probably the best guide is Glen R. Johnson's book "Tracking Dog" published by Arner Publications, Inc., P.O. Box 307, Graves Road,

Remember, no matter how quickly Mac catches on - and Scotties are good trackers - don't jump ahead in the method or you will be laying up problems for the future. L. Wilson Davis' "Go Find!" published by Howell Book House, Inc., 730 Fifth Ave., New York, N.Y. 10019 is also excellent.

Tracking is great FUN for you - and Mac too, as he is using skills and instincts nature has provided him with. It is a mysterious world to us but totally instinctive to him. Even if you have not had an opportunity to start Mac in formal obedience he can be started in Tracking. His progress will delight you and the rapport developed between the two of you will carry over into the Novice work and be of great assistance to you then.

The Tracking training will lead you and Mac to a regulation track which is 440 to 500 yards long, must have a least three turns in it and the dog cannot be put out on the track until at least 30 minutes have elapsed since it was laid by a tracklayer who drops a glove or other leather article at the end of the track. The day Mac follows this regulation track and finds the glove will be one of the bright, happy days of your life and his. It is in your futures! Happy tracking!
