SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE S.T.C.A. BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING — SEATTLE, WASHINGTON, JUNE 11, 1982

The Vice-President called the Meeting to order at 9:15 A.M.

Those present were: J. Edward Ingram, Vice-President; Mrs. Kathi Brown, Corresponding Secretary; Mrs. Marjorie Cohen, Recording Secretary; Mr. Robert Marshall, Treasurer; Mrs. Nancy Fingerhut, Mr. Bill Justus, Mrs. Betty McArthur, Mrs. Helen Prince, Dr. Alan Riga and Mrs. Jackie Seelbach.

Mr. Marshall moved, seconded by Betty McArthur, to dispense with reading the Minutes of the February 6, 1982 Meeting. Motion carried and the Minutes were approved with the correction regarding rechecking the points for the award of the Annual Trophies.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: the 1982 Roster was mailed to all members in March.

Results of the Ballot on three proposed changes to the By-Laws were as follows. On or before May 3, 1982, four hundred and nine (409) ballots were voted and returned to the Recording Secretary.

PROPOSAL NUMBER 1 - INCREASE IN DUES - DID NOT PASS

Votes cast in favor: 228 Against: 179 Invalid: 2

PROPOSAL NUMBER 2 - REMOVAL OF OFFICERS FOR DERELICTION OF DUTY - PASSED

Votes cast in favor: 392 Against: 16 Abstained: 1

PROPOSAL NUMBER 3 - NOMINATING COMMITTEE PERMITTED TO MEET IN TOTO - PASSED

Votes cast in favor: 374 Against: 33 Abstained: 2

The Slate proposed by the Nominating Committee for the 1982-83 Officers and Directors was mailed to all members on June 4th.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: A list of the correspondence sent and received since the last Meeting was distributed. The following action was taken:

POTOMAC SKYE CLUB: Mrs. Sandi Hach will make a patch work square to represent S.T.C.A. on the quilt to be assembled and raffled by this club. Our Regional Clubs can receive refunds for their Club tickets they sell.

PET SHOP ADVERTISING: Members' attention will be called to types of advertising being distributed by certain pet shops. Mention of this will be made in THE BAGPIPER.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Marshall reported that, as of June 6, 1982, the Club's unrestricted funds totaled \$10,498.58. Activities, other than those planned for in the budget must be curtailed or postponed until more funds are available.

REGIONAL CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVES: Chairman, Alan Riga, mentioned that Dr. Kenneth Myers is relocating from Washington State and will probably discontinue his work on Scottie Cramp. He also mentioned that Dr. Clemmons at the University of Florida needs funds to continue his research on this subject.

A TEACHING TECHNIQUE DESERVING OF MENTION

The Scottish Terrier Club of New England recently held a day long grooming workshop and Fun Match. This years instructor and judge was Kathi Brown, (Blueberry Hill).

Kathi began by explaining that since she worked a dogs coat so slowly, (using only fingers to pluck) she developed a presentation which would allow her to cover the subject in the time allotted and hopefully enable everyone to see each aspect discussed. An overhead projector enlarged Kathi's transparencies and overlays onto a wall creating a series of giant Scots.

Kathi did not jump right in by explaining grooming techniques. She feels that many consider grooming an isolated topic, however, it is more often dependent upon an understanding of the Scottish Terrier Standard, purpose, and structure. Her first drawing projected was to show that skeletal make up of our breed and at the same time she showed a blown-up poster of the Standard and went over the dog section by section, listing and explaining each part of the animal with the use of an overlay with labels for the dogs parts. She emphasized that the animals standard is mainly based upon an ideal dog, designed for a specific purpose and she felt this type of display would assist one on grooming an animal especially for emphasizing strengths or camouflaging faults.

Next she overlayed the above drawing with hair which depicted a totally ungroomed Scot. This effectively showed even the most perfect of animals would be hard to find under its blown and unkempt coat.

Correct grooming serves 3 major purposes according to Ms. Brown -

1. It is essential to the health and maintenance of the animal.
2. It enables a proud breed to feel good when it looks good.
3. It allows an exhibitor to display the Scottie in its best possible light.

Section by section, Kathi removed the jacket of the Scottie until it was tight, hard and straight. It was especially useful to visualize the stripping in the manor presented because one could see where each section started and stippled. For example: the point of elbow to which one strips was clearly identifiable to all. Each section removed was color coded.

Front, rear and head grooming were presented on other transparencies and explained by Kathi in such a way to be easily understood by all, utilizing the same system.

The last few transparencies were especially useful to those of us that groom to show. She illustrated heads, fronts and rears which were incorrect, and with a special pencil she was able to add hair where needed so that the fault was diminished. Kathi suggested we draw our dogs with their faults and then with a pencil and eraser add and remove hair on said drawing which will enable us to see what to do before removing it from the dog.

After all of the above discussions she brought out one of her pups and translated the lesson to the dog on the table. She made special mention to the importance of working the coat, pulling all stray hairs, and raking the coat to keep the undercoat under control.

A coffee break was taken and then everyone commenced to grooming their Scots, ably assisted by Kathi and other STCNE member who went table to table instructing the participants.

An afternoon match followed the seminar and was capably judged by Kathi.

Kathi certainly utilized her talents as a teacher to get across this difficult subject and most felt a good deal more secure in the process of making our Scotties look like a Scottie should.

DISCUSSION OF OPTIONAL TREATMENT FOR CANINE PYOMETRA

By Richard W. Nelson, D.V.M. and Edward C. Feldman, D.V.M.

(The following article is the "discussion" section of the paper "Treatment of Canine Pyometra with Prostaglandin F_{2a}," given at the 31st Gaines Veterinary Symposium, held October 28, 1981 in cooperation with the School of Veterinary Medicine, Louisiana State University.)

While ovariectomy is the preferred treatment for pyometra, prostaglandin F_{2a} (PGF_{2a}, 20-carbon carboxylic acid derived from the fatty acid, arachidonic acid; widely distributed in mammalian tissues) appears to offer the owner of a valuable breeding bitch a viable alternative treatment. Short-term resolution of the pyometra or postpartum endometritis was obtained in 9 of 10 bitches treated with daily subcutaneous injection of PGF_{2a}. Response to the therapy including disappearance of the signs observed by the owners (vaginal discharge, depression, anorexia, polyuria/polydipsia). In addition, a reduction in the diameter of the uterus, a decrease in the circulating progesterone concentration, and the return of a normal white blood cell count were documented. A similar response was observed regardless of the size of PGF_{2a}, but the number of injections required to obtain this response was variable.

POST-TREATMENT CYCLES

The ability of the fertilized ova to be successfully carried to term in a PGF_{2a} treated bitch was demonstrated in five of the dogs. However, as illustrated by one bitch, recurrence of pyometra in subsequent estrous cycles may occur. Therefore, we suggest that owners attempt to have their bitches bred during the next estrus. Subjectively, owners have not reported any behavioral changes in their bitches. However, several owners have commented that the first estrous cycle following PGF_{2a} therapy came one to two months earlier than anticipated. Owners of bitches treated with PGF_{2a} are now told to anticipate an early onset of the next estrous cycle.

The daily subcutaneous injection of PGF_{2a} at a dose of 0.10 mg/kg, 0.25 mg/kg, or 0.50 mg/kg did result in transient reactions. However, these reac-

tions were not considered dangerous. The higher dose (0.50 mg/kg) was associated with an increased frequency of these reactions. Uterine evacuation secondary to myometrial contraction was observed occasionally. Theoretically, contraction of the uterus around potentially infected uterine luminal contents could predispose the animal to a bacteremia. However, this was not found to be a problem in these animals. Blood cultures obtained during PGF_{2a} therapy did not grow bacteria in any of the dogs in which they were performed, including several bitches with positive vaginal cultures. All the dogs clinically improved without concomitant use of antibiotics.

CAUTIONS TO OBSERVE

At the dose and route utilized in this study, a clinical response was not observed for at least 48 hours after instituting daily PGF_{2a} injections. While PGF_{2a} therapy is viable for treating healthy bitches with pyometra or postpartum endometritis, it should be used with reservation in severely ill animals in which immediate treatment, specifically ovariohysterectomy, is required. Care should also be used with using PGF_{2a} in a closed pyometra bitch. Prostaglandin F_{2a} should cause cervical relaxation at or prior to causing uterine myometrial contractions, allowing expulsion of uterine exudate through the cervix and into the vagina. If the cervix fails to relax but uterine myometrial contractions occur, uterine luminal contents could be expelled through the fallopian tubes and into the peritoneal cavity, causing peritonitis. Careful monitoring of the patient and serial abdominal radiographs are recommended when treating closed cervix pyometra with PGF_{2a} especially when a vaginal discharge is not observed by the third and fourth injection.

RESPONSE TO DOSAGE

There was a dramatic reduction in the circulating progesterone concentration within three days of the onset of PGF_{2a} therapy. This may reflect decreased steroidogenesis within the corpora lutea. In those bitches requiring five or fewer injections of PGF_{2a}, the progesterone concentration was less than 0.5 ng/ml by the two-week re-examination. However, in the two bitches that did not respond to the first five injections, the progesterone concentrations were greater than 1.0 ng/ml at the two-week examination. The progesterone concentration decreased below 0.5 ng/ml in both dogs after the second series of PGF_{2a} injections. Decreased PGF_{2a} concentrations correlated well with response to the treatment. Progesterone concentrations greater than 1 ng/ml may be sufficiently elevated to stimulate the endometrium and allow persistence of pyometra.

The correct dose of PGF_{2a} to use in the treatment of canine pyometra remains to be determined. All three doses used in this study were effective in correcting the clinical signs and physical abnormalities to the existing pyometra or postpartum endometritis. Additional experience and cases should help to determine the proper dose of PGF_{2a}.

"Usually there was an owner complaint of hacking cough, gagging, and vomiting of foam and mucus with occasional food and water...Now, when I treat for tonsillitis and sore throat, the grass-eating stops."

Or, if possible, spray the animal gently with cool water from a garden hose and place ice packs on the head and neck and under the tail. It's important to cool the animal as quickly as possible and get them to a veterinarian.

Never, but NEVER, under any circumstances leave your pet in a locked car during the hot weather, even with windows partly open!!

DR. JOHN ROSS, veterinary dentist, spoke at the recent meeting of the STCH. It is DR. ROSS'S opinion that level bites should NOT be acceptable. He stated that a level bite is but a mild version of either an overbite or an underbite, and could produce one or the other if mated to a dog that does not come from a strong scissor bite line.

A well-formed scissor bite can be detected by the relationship of the lower fourth molar to the upper third and fourth molars. In a good scissor bite the lower fourth molar will be centered between the upper third and fourth molars.

DR. ROSS advised members to clean their dogs teeth at least twice a week with a mixture of equal parts of salt and soda. DR. ROSS suggested using a soft tooth brush. Others have suggested using a rough cloth.

Why not lift your dog with your hand under the belly or if you must, with the tail and your hand under the chest.

CANADIAN COMMENT

The summer issue of "THE SCAMPER" and "SCOTTIE STEPS" were combined. Barbara reported that they held a very successful Sanctioned show with an entry of around 10 Scotties. Winners Dog and Winners Bitch were both owned by Morley Thornton.

Barbara reported that KENNY WHENT is continuing to show his late wife's "TUBBY" (CH. MAYSON MY FAIR LADY). Many tributes to LOUISE WHENT were received and published in this combination newsletter.

Barbara wrote a very interesting article on WHEATENS in Canada, but warns "I do caution breeders who may feel that it would be a novel thing to have a couple of wheatens and breed them. Wheatens are NOT for everyone and those wishing to breed them must be serious and dedicated and willing to breed for the betterment of the Scottish Terrier, i.e. conformation, pigmentation and coat color and texture. Breeding indiscriminately for color leads to liver colored noses and flews, poor conformation and almost white coats with no hint of the true wheaten color."

WHEATENS IN CANADA

By Barbara Dominski

In 1982 the C.K.C. published Vol. I of its Stud Book and 5 Scottish Terriers were listed, 2 dogs and 3 bitches. None was black! One brindle, two silver, 1

grey-brindle and one. . . a wheaten., number 1551, NELLIE, whelped October 22nd, 1887, wheaten, by BRAITE out of NELLIE I. Owner: G. M. Gibbs, Galt, Ontario. Breeder: DAN O'SHEA, London, Ontario. Whether Nellie produced any offspring of that color, or any offspring at all, I do not know, but she certainly has her rightful place in any article on wheaten Scotties in this country as being the first registered of that color.

More recently this color has been brought into Canada by a few breeders who imported either from Britain or the U.S.A. In Ontario, HARRIS-SHIRE KENNELS imported their first in August or September of 1954 from IRENE ROBERTSON'S GLAD MAC KENNEL, Clarkston, Washington. Among the many over the years were: GLAD-MAC'S TROUBADOR, G-M'S DRESDEN DOLL, litter mates G-M'S GORGEOUS GEORGE. Troubador was not a wheaten but was by the great AM. CAN. CH. CEDAR ROOTES GAYDES GOLD and he produced wheatens, LUCILLE and her late husband JACK HARRIS bred a number of good wheatens including their CH. HARRIS-SHIRE GOLD PENNY. More recently, Lucille, now MRS. WESTLAKE, has imported two wheatens, GLAD-MAC'S RIGH AT HARRIS-SHIRE, a young male, and CLINCH MT. TAM O'SHANTER HIGHLAND FLING (B), and together with carefully chosen additional imports, including AM. CH. GLAD-MAC'S JOHNNY BY GOOD, will again be breeding that color.

From the original HARRIS-SHIRE stock, HAL-HOPE KENNELS of the late MR. AND MRS. H.E. THOMAS, also of London, Canada, developed their wheaten line and most the wheatens in Ontario came from this basic stock. MRS. GLORIA RENAUD, BAGPIPE KENNELS, Windsor, purchased GAYCLAN GOLDEN NUGGET and added YANKEE PRIDE lines to produce some truly lovely wheatens. This writer has long been interested in the color and had owned five, most of whom went back to ENG. CAN., AM., CH. GLENDOUNE GAUNTLET, the line we breed to, but which is not a wheaten producing line in itself, so GLENTADBAR had not until recently bred any wheatens. However through a careful blanding of lines we have managed to keep to a breeding schedule and at the same time pick up GLAD-MAC wheaten lines 5 generations back and British lines even further, and have finally produced two little wheaten lasses.

Turning now to the west coast, the other wheaten stronghold, where KILDORAN and MORPHET are the names synonymous with that color. Here I stand to be corrected, but I believe DOROTHY and TED RICHARDSON pioneered the color in British Columbia by a number of selected British imports. Dorothy adds that in the late 40's or early 50's, CARNATION FARMS (USA) were showing wheatens, in particular CH. CARNATION GOLDEN GIRL and there may have been some Canadian owned ones. Dorothy does believe that she and her late husband were the first to have any number of wheatens and also breed any. Their KILDORAN KENNEL housed among others MILWARD MARZIPAN bred by GLADYS YATES (Gr. Britain) and a double grandson of DOROTHY CASPERZ TURFIELD BUCKWHEAT, who was by ENG. CH. BIDFIELD BIX the 5th English wheaten champion: JASCOT PRIMROSE, a daughter of TURFIELD BUCKWHEAT purchased from PEGGY PEAKE: PIPE MAJOR OF FIRTHE sired by TURFIELD BUCKWHEAT, out of LYDIA OF VEENA, bred by PEGGY LEONARD: CH. MEDWAL BUTTERSCOTCH C.D., who is behind a number of KILDORAN champions who were not wheatens but went on to produce them. CAPT. AND MRS. WATTON (Isleworth) imported an ENG. CH. KENNELGARTH VIKING son, CH. SCOTTISH EMIGRANT, who was also a descendant of ENG. CH. BIDFIELD BIX, and coupled with these lines

helped produce the GARTMORE wheatens of JOE AND GOERGIE CONNOLLY. There GARTMORE SLAN A GAEL was reportedly a beautiful red wheaten, the color of a 'red fox'.

To complete the circle out west, we have VI MORPHET'S WEE LADDY and WEE LASSIES KENNEL. Currently Vi is showing her homebred wheaten CH. MORPHET'S CALLIE WEE LASSIE. Vi developed her line through imports from GLAD-MAC'S KENNEL, GLAD-MAC'S LAURIE WEE LASSIE, an early one who was by young GLAD-MAC'S GORGEOUS GEORGE before he left to join HARRIS-SHIRE and become a Canadian champion. Laurie was bred to TORRENT OF COLDSTREAM, a son of the wheaten GLAD-MAC'S PIRATE GOLD III. Vi made the connection back to the KILDORAN line by later breeding their daughter, MORPHET'S HEATHER WEE LASSIE to GARTMORE MAC DUFF and from this mating emerged her top producing and group placing male, CH. MORPHET'S MAC PHERSON WEE LADDY, who is not a wheaten but sires them and is the sire of CALLIE. He also sired the late wheaten CH. MORPHET'S MARI GOLD WEE LASSIE who won Best of Breed under the internationally renowned Judge, NIGEL AUBREY-JONES. Vi has recently imported the wheaten male, GLAD-MAC'S ROBBIE WEE LADDY.

OBEDIENCE

By Ruth Tryon, Obedience Chairman

We have been concerning ourselves with Mac's progress and problems but it is time we look at some of our other Scotties. What about that lovely dog or bitch you just finished? "He is enjoying just being retired and doing nothing" you say. But is he really enjoying it? Once the center of attention, going to shows, being groomed, trained and occupying much of your time and thoughts, he is now relegated to being just a dog. He deserves more - and better. He still deserves your love, time and attention. He wants to be your special friend and companion. Isn't his retirement really a cop-out for you? It is so easy to say "Now he can stay home and just be a dog and enjoy life". Instead, why not do something with him - he is your friend, treat him like one! It takes time to have a dog in Tracking, Obedience or Working Terrier Trials-but it took time to bathe, strip, groom and go to show after show for those 15 points. He did not fail you. Can you do less for him now? There is a commitment in accepting his devotion and affection.

Scotties are just as capable of doing good Obedience work as any other dog. Granted he may not be as precise as a Golden, Sheltie or German Shepherd. A Scot is bred to work independently but he has a good mind and he can quickly learn what you expect of him. It is how you handle him. Any Obedience instructor will tell you he has more problems with the handlers than the dogs! The dogs are usually great - it is the handlers who have two left feet and so often seem to leave their wits at home! So if you have started some Obedience work and are about to or have given up - where did you go wrong?

First, were you or are you really clear in letting him know exactly what you want? A dog can develop a remarkable vocabulary, but you must make clear the exact thing you mean by each word. For example, Down is just that - the down position. It is not get off the sofa, stop jumping on people, get out of the chair, etc. The command for that is Off. You will be surprised how quickly your Scot learns the difference once you are consistent. The chain collar is a marvelous training device by which you can get your corrections of his behavior across to him - not by constant jerking and pulling and keeping the lead tight, but rather by a strong jerk, a quick release followed by great praise. Which were you doing?

Even the most stubborn Scot quickly learns that only way to avoid trouble is to do what you have in mind - not what he had in his mind! And it surely can be different with his built in independent thinking. But in the end, the correction and the praise bring him around. Did you praise him enough - and mean it? Volumes have been written about praise in training dogs but somehow it takes all of us a while to realize the tremendous value and importance of praise.

Scots have a great way of doing things well and then suddenly adding variations to the exercise, which variations are rarely what you want. Maybe you have been practicing too long on that particular phase of training and your Scottie just decided to make it more "interesting". Did you forget to vary your routine? Terriers can get bored very easily so don't give them the chance -keep them alert and watching you.

Observe constantly not only what your dog is doing but also how you are handling him. Genuine enthusiasm is an essential ingredient in training and it shows up very quickly in the quality of work your Scottie is doing. So once again, we are back to the handler, not the dog!

If you have stopped training, go back and give yourself and your Scottie another chance. He deserves it. If you are discouraged - have heart. Think more about what you are doing and he will do better. The rapport between a handler and a truly well trained dog is a unique relationship but it is given only to those who earn it. Once you have experienced that rapport you will never again permit that Champion or house pet to just retire to doing nothing and just being a dog. The Scot's respect for you, his love and devotion are his gifts to you. They must be acknowledged.

We haven't forgotten Mac - we hope he is doing well and those Qualifying Scores are bringing home those lovely green ribbons.

A note to Breeders - Are you recommending Obedience Training at some point in their lives for all the Scotties you place? Are you helping the new owners to find Obedience Classes and are you checking on their progress. The new owner will appreciate your continued interest in the well being of "your" Scots.

The following Home Remedies were taken from the STCA 1922 Year Book:

"A teaspoon of Epsom salts, dry on the tongue before the first meal of the day, is good for skin problems." Mr. Mayhew

"For a little 'wet patch eczema' I use one-third sulphur, one-third bicarbonate soda and one-third boric acid powder." M. Brigham

"To puppies who have swallowed foreign objects, feed solid food, raw meat, etc. and follow by a warm water enema. Do not dose!" Marguerite Kirmse, Tobermory Kennels.

"When a dog is 'off feed', and nothing will tempt him, try canned salmon."

"Dogs suffering from diarrhea; Spread a thin coating of raw meat on both sides of a piece of bread, and toast the whole through and feed warm." Dr. Miller

"As an external treatment for eczema, learned experience with horses, comes the following: Wash and dry (affect area) and apply baking soda, only once a day if case does well, if badly, add an application of zinc ointment. Wash and dry every second day. I have cured obstinate and severe cases. Dr. Hannah Morris.

BITS & PIECES

ELISA: NEW ANSWER TO HEARTWORM DETECTION: Extensive field tests have shown the enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA), developed at the University of Pennsylvania of Veterinary Medicine, to be extremely accurate in detecting heartworm. The test is based on detecting antibodies to heartworm, rather than the presence of microfilariae in the bloodstream -which may not exist, either because the mature parasites are too old, infertile, or of the same sex, or because the dog's immune response kills the embryos without damaging the adult worms. Drugs that prevent heartworm infection can agitate undetected heartworms, causing further injury or even death to the host dog. Other medications for intestinal parasites can also damage or dislodge the heartworms to the detriment of the dog. Dr. Robert Grieve of the school's Department of Pathobiology headed the team that designed the test. In it, chemically purified heartworm antigens are combined with a sample of the dog's serum. If heartworms are present in the animal, the final assay changes color. The degree of color change also indicated the amount of heartworm antibody in the animal tested.
