Many advertisers were disappointed last year by the way their dogs photos turned out. In order to alleviate this problem we will **ONLY** accept **BLACK & WHITE PHOTOS**, (dogs only). Colored photos are much to difficult to reproduce satisfactorily for a black & white publication. Any color above light blue, on the color scale, will reproduce light for black and white. Any color from blue, down the color scale will reproduce dark or black when used for black and white. Even if you have a beautiful photo of your dog and he stands out, if he is against a background of brown, green or red, it will reproduce dark or black — and your dog will be lost in the background.

So camera buffs, get busy. Put your stud dog against a light blue or white background and start snapping those pictures. If you have "the" perfect photo of your dog but the background is dark . . . carefully cut your dogs picture out and paste it on a white sheet of paper and use that for your ad.

Due to the chore of having to re-typing the pedigrees, the **DEADLINE** is **JANUARY 1ST, 1983**. First come first served. All photos will be returned.

Send your black & white photo, dogs only, a 3 generation pedigree, a 35 word caption, owner or agent's name, address and telephone number to Editor; a check, made payable "STCA" for \$36.00 per ad. There will be two stud ads per page. The issue should be out by late February.

# SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE S.T.C.A. BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING WEST CHESTER, PA. OCTOBER 8, 1982

The President called the Meeting to order at 1:16 P.M.

Those present were: Mrs. Catherine Ridgley, President; Mr. J. Edward Ingram, Vice-President; Mrs. Kathi Brown, Corresponding Secretary; Mrs. Marjorie Cohen, Recording Secretary; Mr. Robert Marshall, Treasurer; Dr. T. Allen Kirk, Delegate to AKC; Mrs. Nancy Fingerhut, Mrs. Sandi Hach, Mr. Bill Justus, Mrs. Betty McArthur, Mrs. Helen Prince, Dr. Alan Riga, Mrs. Danalee Saar and Mrs. Jackie Seelbach.

Those present to observe were: Mr. Fouad Ferris and Mrs. Claudia Leffler.

Dr. Kirk moved, seconded by Robert Marshall, to dispense with reading the minutes of the June 11, 1982 Meeting. Carried unanimously and the Minutes were approved as distributed.

**RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:** She stated that at the June 11, 1982 Meeting she reported that the members had approved, by their written vote, the proposed Amendment to Article III of the By-Laws Removal of Officers For Dereliction of Duty. The vote was 392 in favor of the Amendment, 16 against with 1 abstaining. However, the American Kennel Club would not approve this change in the By-Laws. Dr. Kirk reported that he had a meeting with the Chairman and several members of the AKC Committee in September, 1982, but the Committee declined to approve the change before presenting it to their Board, suggesting instead that the disciplinary provision now in the By-Laws be utilized.

Dr. Kirk moved, seconded by Nancy Fingerhut, that the STCA Board take no further action on this. Carried unaniously.

The Recording Secretary also reported that the ballot for the election of 1982-83 Class II Directors was mailed to the members on or about August 1, 1982, and the sealed letter, from the Accounting firm which counted the ballots, stating the results is in her possession.

The 1983 Rotating Specialty to be held in Michigan on May 22, 1983 has received AKC approval.

**MONTGOMERY COUNTY, 1983:** Mr. T. Howard Snethen has accepted the

invitation to judge the Regular Classes and Mrs. Ann Wooldridge has accepted the invitation to judge Sweepstakes at Montgomery County, 1983.

**BREED PUBLICATION COMPETITION:** Robert Marshall moved, seconded by Kathi Brown, that STCA submit **THE BAGPIPER** in the category of Breed Publications of a National Club in the annual competition of the Dog Writers' Association of America, Inc. Carried unanimously. Three issues published between November 1, 1981 and October 31, 1982 will be submitted.

**ROTATING SPECIALTIES:** The Policy that Rotating Specialties must be held prior to June 30th each year was restated.

**REGIONAL CLUB BY-LAWS:** The S.T.C. of Greater Houston filed a copy of its amended Constitution and By-Laws.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** The Treasurer submitted his written Report for the period October 1, 1981 to September 30, 1982. It reflected a cash balance of \$21,177.13 which includes the \$10,000 Stalter bequest which is a restricted fund. He also submitted his projected budget for the fiscal year ending 1983 which indicates there may be a deficit of approximately \$3,500 next year.

Dr. Kirk moved, seconded by Alan Riga, that it be left to the discretion of the Treasurer and the incoming President to designate a new Resident Agent in the State of our incorporation, New Jersey. This will entail a lesser fee than has been paid in the past to the legal counsel who has been acting in that capacity. Carried unanimously.

The Treasurer will seek the assistance of a non-Board member of the Club who will have time and the inclination to assist in reconciling Treasurer's records from prior years.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**TROPHY CHAIRMAN:** The Chairman, Judy Hughes, submitted a written Report showing that trophy donations for the year 1982 totaled \$1,827.50 broken down to \$840 for 1982 Rotating Specialty and \$987.50 for Montgomery County, 1982.

Alan Riga moved, Helen Prince seconded, that the Trophy Chairman be authorized to sell for the benefit of the Parent Club, at not less than their cost, all trophies which have been purchased but not used — this sale to be held at the Rotating Specialty in Michigan in May, 1983.

**STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES MANUAL:** The Coordinator, Marjorie Cohen, reported that the completed copy had been submitted to the Board for final approval.

Jackie Seelbach moved, seconded by Ed Ingram, that, after revisions approved at this Meeting are incorporated into this Manual of Guidelines, Marjorie Cohen shall have copies printed and distributed to the Regional Clubs. Carried unanimously.

**WAYS AND MEANS:** Ed Ingram moved, seconded by Kathi Brown, that the Ways and Means Committee be continued for the coming year to be comprised of three (3) members, one from each geographic region that we have utilized in determining where the Rotating Specialties are going to be held; that the Committee will have Chairman to be selected by the Board of Directors of STCA and that the Chairman will coordinate the activities of the Committee, and the Committee will meet by telephone and at such other times as they are together, such as when we have Board Meetings, and that they will recommend to the Board from time to time projects that they think are beneficial to the Club, to the Scottish Terrier, for fund raising activities. (Note: this Committee is not be limited to Board Members). Carried unanimously.

The means of raising fund through this Committee was tabled until the January, 1983 Meeting.

## **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

### **REVISED DESCRIPTION FOR CLASS I AND CLASS II DIRECTORS:**

Marjorie Cohen reported on suggested, alternate terms to describe the members of the Board now called "Class I" and "Class II" Directors. Robert Marshall moved, Betty McArthur seconded, that we change the designation of Directors from the present "Class I" and "Class II" to "Director, Class of ('82-'83)" or "Class of" (and specify the term) in conformance to the way the AKC handles this. Motion carried by a majority vote, Marjorie Cohen and Helen Prince abstaining.

**100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SHOW AT WINDSOR, ENGLAND:** Plans are being explored for interested terrier people to charter a plane for attendance at this Show in June, 1983.

Robert Marshall moved that the STCA endorse a trip to England which is to be put on by a group of individuals, independent of the Club, and that the STCA financial liability and obligation be limited to donating a page in The Bagpiper to advise our membership of this proposed trip. Ed Ingram seconded. Carried unanimously.

Marjorie Cohen moved, seconded by Ed Ingram, that the STCA contribute a minimum of \$100 to be added to any private contribution received, and that Mr. Armando Perez-Gili be authorized to purchase an engraved trophy in England as the Club's Trophy Donation for the 100th Anniversary Show at Windsor, England. Carried unanimously.

Alan Riga moved, seconded by Betty McArthur, that STCA place an advertisement in the English Club's Yearbook at a cost of \$50.00 or less per page. Carried unanimously.

## AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 5:

The following was taken from a letter received by **DR. T. A. KIRK, STCA DELEGATE TO THE AKC**, from **HOWARD COHEN**, Executive Staff, By-Laws Committee of the AKC. This is in reference to **REMOVAL OF OFFICERS FOR DERELICATION OF DUTY**.

... "with regard to Article III, Section 5, in as much as the STCA Officers and Directors serve one-year terms, our committee questions the need for adding this section.

"Removal from office for any reason less serious than would justify disciplinary action under procedures described in Article VI, would violate the individuals civil rights, and would open a door to usurpation of the members' right to elect their representatives to the Board.

"If the STCA is determined to keep this basic provision, it definitely needs to include (e.g. at the end of the first sentence) wording such as, 'under procedures described in Article VI; and to add, at the end of the second sentence, wording to make it clear that mere, lack of ability will not justify such ouster.'"

The STCA Board felt there was no need to persue this amendment any further.

TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA — WEST CHESTER, PA.  
OCTOBER 9, 1982

The President, Catherine Ridgley, called the meeting to order at 9:25 p.m., welcoming the members and guests.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the Annual Meeting on October 2, 1981.

## CRITIQUE OF 1982 MONTGOMERY COUNTY SWEEPSTAKES — OCTOBER 10 BY JOAN EAGLE, JUDGE

First of all I want to thank everyone who made it possible for me to judge the Sweeps at Montgomery County. It has been a dream of mine for a very long time and it was just as thrilling an experience as I thought it would be; a day to remember always.

Overall the quality was good. The bitches were decidedly stronger than the dogs in the choices, and the bitch classes more clear cut than in the dog classes.

Most were well conditioned and of proper size and moved well. However, there were too many large round eyes with ears placed wide and carried to the side. This was more prevalent in the dogs than in the bitches, and something to think about in future litters.

My most outstanding dog was my 6 - 9 mos. second placement. He was a lovely, balanced young dog with plenty of bone, keen expression and sound movement. He would not stand for examination, so I couldn't do anything for him. When he gets used to being handled, he will be one to watch, most definitely.

My 6 - 9 mos. division winner, a puppy bitch, had a lovely head and expression, was nicely balanced and in grand condition. She should do well as should all the first and second choices in all the classes.

My Sweeps Winner was an outstanding young bitch and clearly the best all the way. She showed flawlessly, with a true Scottie expression, good overall structure and movement. It is always a thrill to find such a good one.

One subject I would like to touch on is the excessive use of liver. The practice of handfeeding from the time a dog enters the ring to the end of the class works against dog and handler. It is impossible to examine teeth with a mouth full of liver. And the habit some handlers have of stretching their charges heads skyward and away from the judge, while being fed, presents a distorted and unattractive picture. Whatever happened to the lovely arch of neck with the dog looking forward and slightly down? Dogs are photographed in that position, so why not presented that way in the ring? In fact liver has become such a crutch that some dogs won't show at all unless being fed. This was most evident when they were asked to face off in the center of the ring. Scotties should be able to stand and look at one another with all that marvelous tension that is distinctly terrier.

Again my thanks for the rare opportunity to do the Montgomery County Sweepstakes; What an honor!

## OBEDIENCE

By Ob Chairman Ruth Tryon

Scotties have chalked up another good year in Obedience. Each year sees not only a few more Scotties in the field but with better scores and placements in the ribbons. Seventeen degrees were earned and seven more may now already be completed. Our High Scoring C.D. winner is Angus MacTavish Brown who is eight years, so you can teach an old dog new tricks. One Scottie, Hopscotch the Shadow, earned both her C.D. and C.D.X. this year, an accomplishment of which both owner and her Scotties must be very proud. We understand when Robbie McBairn earned his 3rd leg towards his U.D. he received a jubilant ovation. Tansy Moodie was our dream girl — 6 scores in Open B above 190. Try it some time and you will understand why we say "dream".

We congratulate all those handlers whose Scotties have earned a coveted Obedience title. Lots of work went into the project but lots of pleasure too for the joy of having your dog work with you and developing that close rapport between you and your Scot is unique to Obedience.

The really best time to start any type of training is when Mac is a youngster. By that we mean taking him to Kindergarten at the age of two to six months. It is the greatest thing you can do for him whether you are interested in conformation and/or obedience showing. It is equally essential for those puppies who will not be shown in either field but will be a lifetime friend and companion, which is, after all, the finest compliment man and dog can show each other.

Studies have proved that very young puppies learn very rapidly and therefore, just as pre-school classes are of great importance and value in the development of children, so is Kindergarten training to our Mac. Socialization at home or in the kennel is fine but it cannot compare with group work. He may seem to be well adjusted to the noises of your house, kennel and friends coming and going. Unfortunately, other places, noises and people may not be so easily accepted. It is at Kindergarten he learns to play with other dogs, with other people and to accept new noises without fear. In fact, rather than frightening him, he will become curious and show real courage at times. By observing Mac you can learn much about him. You can praise him, encourage him and help him develop into the Scottie you will be proud of. He will become well socialized with people and other dogs.

That does not mean he will lose his terrier temperament or his terrier fire. It simply means he will learn to accept other dogs in the world, even if they, in his mind, need to be carefully watched. Unfortunately we have all heard of people questioning the Scottie temperament and the ability of Scottie puppies to adjust well to families. When we hear breeders describe Scottie puppies as "mean as a snake" or equally unattractive descriptions meaning brave, assertive and independent we can understand why the public may question the Scottie's disposition. In Kindergarten they will learn to play in a controlled fashion with other dogs and yet not lose their alertness and pride, the qualities we all love in them. Mac can only be a better dog for his experiences with the other puppies.

He will also learn to not only accept the leash but welcome it and eventually walk beside you at heel position. It does not mean he is going to be precise for he is too young, but rather he will be happy and willing to go with you rather than in all directions at once! Mac will learn to stand, sit and go down on command — and stay. These exercises could well save his life someday. For the kennel dog, a short training in going up and down stairs will help Mac adjust to different situations. His vocabulary will increase tremendously in this training

period and his future training will be simpler and more pleasurable for both of you. Bad habits will not develop to be overcome later.

Mac will graduate from Kindergarten a more confident, better adjusted, obedient and happier puppy — sure of himself, ready to take on the world but with a wiser head.

Don't forget, this basic training is for Conformation competition puppies as well as those Scotties headed for the Obedience ring or the back yard circuit. When a Scottie puppy is sold, we sincerely hope the breeder will not only encourage the new owner to take Mac to Kindergarten but help him with locating a school and suggesting helpful books.

Most Obedience clubs hold Kindergarten classes and they are usually excellent training groups. However, if this is not available, look about at the Obedience schools, check their records and reputation. Some Obedience trainers have very fine schools. Three books which would be of great value to the new owner are "Understanding Your Dog" by Dr. Michael Fox; "The New Knowledge of Dog Behavior" by Clarence Pfaffenberger and "The Pearsall Guide to Successful Dog Training" by Margaret E. Pearsall. If not schools are available to Pearsall book would be of the greatest value as it outlines a puppy training course which a novice could follow and it also includes training for AKC Obedience degrees. All the books will be helpful to the new owner in understanding his dog. Kindergarten Puppy Training (KPT) is one of the most important advances made in the training and development world of dogs. Let's not deny our breed the advantages of it.
