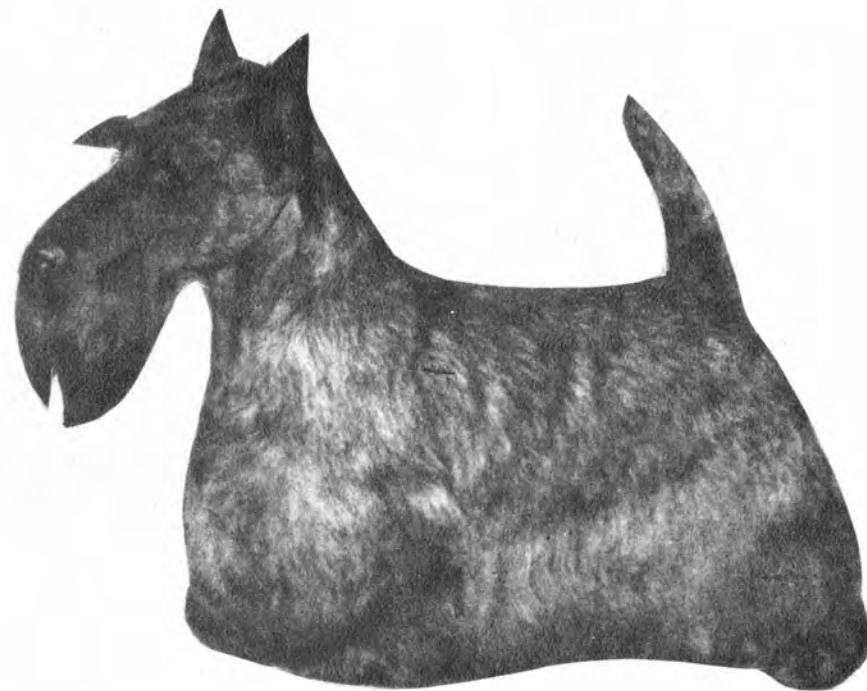

HOW TO FIND A SPECIALIST (Veterinarian)

If your dog has a particular health problem which doesn't seem to improve under the care of your local veterinarian, it's probably time to seek the help of a specialist. The following information has been compiled with the cooperation of the American Animal Hospital Association and the American Veterinary Medical Association.

When writing these groups, say where you live, indicate the closest metropolitan area, include description of your dog (sex, age, etc.).

The members of the most groups that follow include board-certified veterinarians and those with experience and education in a particular field.

SKIN AND HAIR/COAT PROBLEMS: Write to the American Academy of Veterinary Dermatology, c/o Dr. Danny Scott, Secretary, New York State College of Veterinary Medicine, Cornell University, Ithaca, NY 14853

ALLERGIES, Including skin/hair disorders caused by allergies: Write to the Academy of Veterinary Allergy, c/o Dr. Gail Kunkle, Secretary, Rural Route 1, Box 113E, Williston, FL 32696

HEART DISEASES AND DISORDERS: Write to the Academy of Veterinary Cardiology, c/o Dr. Larry Tilley, Secretary, Cardiopet, Inc., 6183 Strickland Ave., Brooklyn, NY 11234. Another alternative is to have your local vet treat your dog with the help of a new network called Cardiopet. This system makes it possible for your pet's heart to be monitored via a phone-line hookup. Then your vet can consult directly with a board-certified cardiologist. If your vet doesn't participate in this system, suggest that he or she write to Cardiopet at the above address (or call 800/221-6944) for the name of the nearest Cardiopet practitioner.

SURGERY: Send a self-addressed, stamped envelope to the American College of Veterinary Surgeon, c/o Dr. Alfred G. Shiller, Executive Secretary, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of IL, SAC, No. 1008 West Hazelwood, Urbana, IL 61801. Include information about the kind of pet you have and his problem so a veterinarian specializing in the type of surgery required can be recommended.

INTERNAL MEDICINE: Write to the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine, 805 Horseshoe Lane, Blacksburg, VA 24060. (Be sure to ask for an internist since, technically, this board also certifies other specialists.)

KIDNEY AND URINARY TRACT PROBLEMS: Write to the Society of Veterinary Urology c/o Dr. Carol Osborne, President, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Minnesota, St. Paul, MN 55108.

EYE DISEASES AND DISORDERS: Write to the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists, c/o Dr. Robert M. Gwin, Secretary-Treasurer, Dean McGee Eye Institute, 608 Stanton L. Young Drive, Oklahoma City, OK 73104.

NERVOUS SYSTEM DISORDERS: Write to the American Veterinary Neurology Society, c/o Dr. Robert Selcer, Department of Urban Practice, Un. of Tennessee, College of Veterinary Medicine, Box 1071, Knoxville, TN 37901.

BONE AND JOINT PROBLEMS: Write to the Veterinary Orthopedic Society, Box 6129, Salt Lake City, UT 84106.

For a second opinion about a bone or joint problem — say, to have an X-ray read — you or your veterinarian can consult the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals, University of Missouri, Columbia, MO 65211.

ANIMAL BEHAVIOR PROBLEMS: Write to the American Society of Veterinary Ethology c/o Dr. Thomas L. Wolfe, President, Building 31, Room 4D30, National Institute of Health, Bethesda, MD 20205. Briefly explain your pet's problem so you can be put in touch with an expert who's knowledgeable about that particular behavior.

TEETH AND GUM PROBLEMS: Write to the American Veterinary Dental Society, c/o Dr. Ben Colmery, 60011 Jackson Rd., Ann Arbor, MI 48103.

REPRODUCTION PROBLEMS: Contact the Society for Theriogenology, Association Building, 9th and Minnesota, Hastings, NE 68901. Though this organization was chartered by veterinarians who treat reproductive problems in livestock, some members are experts in small animals or treat small animals in their practices. Be sure to mention the type of pet you have.

CANCER: Write to the Veterinary Cancer Society, c/o Dr. Edward Gillette, President, Comparative Oncology Unit, Colorado State University, Fort Collins, CO 80523. Indicate the kind of pet you have, the general type of tumor, and its location, if possible.

HEARTWORM: Ask your veterinarian to contact the executive secretary of the **American Heartworm Society, at Auburn, Alabama.** If there isn't a veterinarian near you who specializes in treating this disease, the society can direct your vet to those who will consult by phone or supply up-to-date research about treatment.

JOTTINGS AND TRIMMINGS

By John Marvin

While registration figures do not show any definite trend downward for our breed, there seems to be a general decline in show entries around the country. Before fanciers take me to task, let it be said that many shows have good support but others appear to suffer smaller entries, not just in **Scottish Terriers**, but in most other Terrier breeds as well. This is not a healthy trend for **Scottish Terriers** or for Terriers in general. The Terrier group, as a whole, is already "low man on the totem pole" with only 9% of the total entry at all breed events. This compares with 10% for the Toy group and 11% for Non Sporting, in spite of the fact that these groups have only 15 and 11 breeds, respectively, vs 23 breeds in the Terrier conclave, a difficult condition to reconcile. Surely, Terriers in general need more support from breeders and owners if "the Terrier" is to continue to be recognized as the great show dog that it is. Actually, through the years and, I believe, even today, Terriers capture most best in show awards than do the breeds in many other larger groups, registration-wise, which in-

dicates that the quality is still high even though the numbers are not.

The lack of support for Terriers at the average all breed event is not understood completely. Possibly it is caused by the requirements for conditioning which are both lengthy and demanding in many of the Terrier breeds **BUT** the rewards should be sufficient to give full satisfaction. There isn't a more "classy" looking dog than a well groomed Terrier — further, because of showmanship that seems to be a hallmark of most Terriers, the dogs of this group always stand out among the finalists at the shows. Surely, these dividends should be sufficient to cause Terrier owners to support the show and improve the numbers in competitions. I am not advocating "loading" entries for numbers sake only but for exhibitors to offer greater support generally rather than merely entering a "special" dog. In retrospect, class dogs are the "backbone" of every entry. "Specials" dogs gain acclaim because they appear most frequently in the group where fanciers of other breeds see them and must compete against them with their dogs. The many excellent specimens that are in the breed are seldom seen by the majority of show-goers, yet they are the "backbone" of the breed **AND**, I may add, will often become the "specials dogs" of tomorrow.

What I am suggesting is stronger support in the classes at coming shows. Too many "no point" and "one point" entries are turning up that hurt the breed and which, if continued, will cause a general down-turn in support because of low point ratings that always result in a lessening of overall interest. Today, specialty events still gain strong support with excellent entries. It is the average show with no specialty backing that needs help — do your part and help make the Scottish Terrier breed entry-wise at these shows. It will surely result in improved quality and support.

This general problem is not of importance at English shows which always enjoy strong support and this is because of their system. In England, most breeds have only twenty to twenty-four all-breed shows per year that offer challenge certificated (it takes three of these for the title). Of course, there are additional specialty events in each and every breed that merit equal rating. At an all-breed show which offers CC's it is incumbent upon the Club to have a good entry or the CC will be lost at subsequent shows and the support and rating will go to another club. This condition seems to insure support for most championship events although it is not unknown for a show to lose out in one or two breeds where support is lacking. This system generally insures a strong entry which in turn insures that top dogs will be in competition. In other words, good entries mean good dogs — the ultimate desire of most show-giving clubs.

Have You Paid Your Dues?

OBEDIENCE

A goodly number of Scotties have earned C.D.s during the past year and it is hoped they are now or about to be in Open training. If you sighed a sign of relief when Mac earned that third leg and had doubts about Open, put those doubts away! The dogs like Open. Going over jumps, retrieving, being off lead is lots more fun than the Novice work. So take heart, enroll Mac in Open. It is opening a new world to him and you will be glad you did.

There are several things we must consider when we enter the Open class and not the least among them is heeling. If Mac's heeling isn't exactly his strong suit then you must continue to work on it. While he is learning all those things that are more fun, don't neglect the heeling. Plan to spend a considerable amount of training time on this exercise until you feel secure with his heeling off lead. Remember, all Open work is done off lead and if you lose his attention during the heeling exercise you can even more easily lose his attention going from one exercise to another. Think of Open work as a group of interesting exercises for Mac all hung together with highly attentive and accurate heeling. Open is really one big exercise.

Get someone to observe you and Mac heeling so they can tell you where the trouble spots seem to be. Work on those until you feel you really have a polished performance. While all this theoretically was done in Novice training, it is by the time we are through Novice that we realize our problems! So work on that heeling and don't forget the straight sits. It is so easy to spend our training time on jumps, retrieving, etc. that we tend to neglect the heeling — don't.

In Novice Mac has gone to the down position from the sitting position and at your side, but things are different in Open. He must learn to go down while in motion so before you even get to that bit of training, make sure Mac's downs in place are done immediately upon your command — no gradual sinking or several commands but a real sharp drop on the first command. At home you can try moving away a bit from him and giving him the command "Down" but be ready to firmly correct any hesitancy to drop. As he moves about the house near you, you can practice the drop, followed by much praise. He may look strangely at you but if that pleases you so much then it is fine with him. Scots are quite philosophical about our peculiarities.

The dogs usually thoroughly enjoy the jumps and it takes very little encouragement to get them to go over and return. Scotties only have to jump their shoulder height on the high jump and, of course, twice that on the broad jump. This gives a jump of two boards which cover a jump from 16" to 28". A Scottie's jump is well within that range. Start your Scot at less than he has to jump until he had thoroughly caught on to the idea. Your enthusiasm will be catching and you will find you both enjoy those jumps!

Taking a dumbbell can sometimes be a problem but not an insurmountable one. There are many methods to teach a dog to take a dumbbell and fetch it and some are better than others. Koehler's method seems to be the best. It really works and amazingly you will find Mac will dash out for the dumbbell and bring it back promptly and with much tail wagging and joy. If you aren't sure how to do it or lack confidence to try it, then have an experienced person help you. Done properly it is an excellent solution to the problem. It has nice carry overs too — such as carrying things for you, fetching things and being a happy worker. So — get help if you feel you need it but don't hesitate to use that system.

Sits and Downs with the handler out of sight should not be too much of a problem for Mac. Scotties are not usually given to whining and wiggling when left. They are more likely to get bored and decide to get up and investigate the area or change position. If this happens, be sure to correct Mac very quickly all the way back to the place where he was left and leave him again but without a second command. He will learn that when you give him a command once you mean it and he had better obey.

If you do not have a copy of "The Koehler Method of Open Obedience for Ring, Home and Field" by William R. Koehler and published by Howell Book House, get one. Acquire it along with Mac's dumbbell for you will want to refer to it constantly. It will be of tremendous help to you in training Mac and if you are training alone it could be indispensable. It is also good reading!

In all training, as one problem is solved another one turns up. You will wonder once you are in Open why on earth you ever thought Novice was hard! But it is fun. It is great for Mac so stay with it. That C.D.X. is in Mac's future.

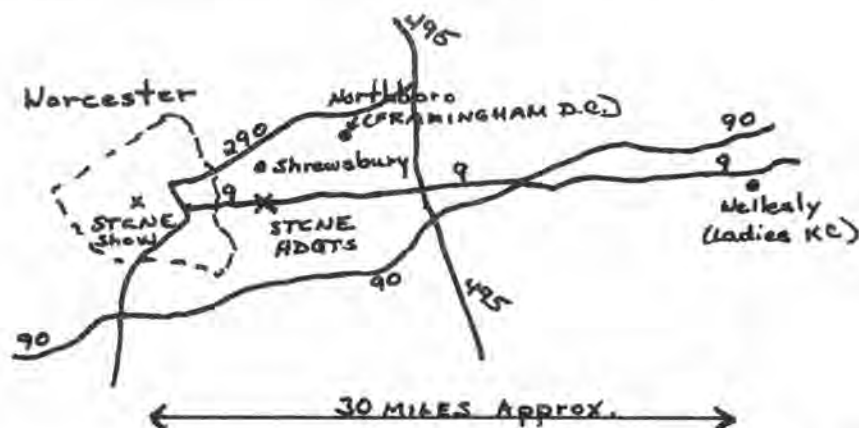

SUMMARY OF THE REGIONAL CLUB REGIONAL CLUB REPRESENTATIVES MEETING

WEST CHESTER, PA — OCTOBER 9, 1982

Chairman Dr. Alan Riga Called the meeting to order at 2:10.

Minutes of the 6/82 Seattle, WA meeting were distributed to those in attendance.

HEALTH COMMITTEE —

Judy Riga reported thyroid problems in dogs is believe to be related to soya meal in dog food.

Kathi Brown reported receiving an article from Un. of Pa. recommending not to mix parvo and distemper shots, but to give on alternating weeks. Puppies should be at least six weeks old before receiving their 1st parvo vaccination.

Carla LaCoe reported NORDEEN recommends at 6 weeks the pup receive the distemper/influenza vaccination. Eight weeks for the initial parvo vaccination and ten weeks for the 2nd parvo, the 4th vaccination at three months could be a combination injection. Again at sixteen weeks, which could be another combined injection.

Helen Prince reported Dr. J. Dodd recommends giving killed parvo virus till the dog has received a distemper titer, then give a modified live parvo injection.

Dr. Dorothy Greenhouse reported an investigator gave some pups distemper shots later exposed them to live parvo virus. The pups died of distemper. It appears modified live distemper vaccine becomes deadly when pups are exposed to live parvo virus.

The Committee recommended members get a copy of the article "Canine Parvo Virus Concerns for the Pet and Kennel Owner" by L. Glickman; read it and have your vet read it.

STANDARD OPERATION MANUAL: Guidelines for Officers and Committee Chairmen.

The manual has been complete under the chairmanship of past STCA Recording Secretary Marjorie Cohen. It is now available to regional clubs.

MEMBERSHIP: STCA and Regional Clubs.

STCA Corresponding Secretary Kathi Brown reported that 1/3 of STCA membership applications received by her have to be returned for - 1.) Incorrect amount for dues. (Dues are \$15.00 for individual; \$20.00 for family). 2.) Code of Ethics are not signed. 3.) Two letters of sponsorship are not included. RABIES, RABIES, RABIES. Please do have ALL your pets, farm animals or whatever, vaccinated yearly. Recently a Collie breeder/farmer/dog columnist noticed a fox by her fence line. She went out and shoo-ed it off. It didn't behave at all strangely and went. She had one adult and one young puppy outside behind secure chain-link fencing. A few days later the unprotected puppy came down with RABIES. The adult was quarantined and was alright. A young calf inside the barn later died of rabies. The fox had quietly done his damage.

He was later caught and proved rabid. The pup had only a very small scratch on its lip, possibly ran its mouth along the fence and picked up fresh saliva from the fox who at this point was carrying the virus while not actually showing clinical signs of the disease. Both owners took anti-rabies shots — not a pleasant experience. So please have all your pets vaccinated every year. Follow through on pups sold and see that new owners do the same. Do not allow your pets to roam, and keep a watch on them when let out at night, even in the garden, especially if you live near a city park or ravine or are out in the country.
