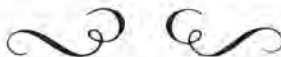

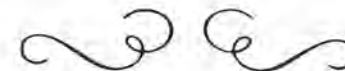

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we start this new year it is appropriate for us to take stock of STCA and to consider our direction and goals for the future. Just what should STCA be doing in 1984? The possibilities, though numerous, are limited somewhat by available time and resources — and most seriously, by available funds. Therefore, some priorities must be established. It is in this area of priorities that I solicit some input and dialogue with our membership.

Naturally, we intend to continue basic services in 1984. These include hosting National and Rotating Specialty Shows, publication of *The Bagpiper*, presentation of annual trophies and awards, sponsorship of grooming and educational seminars, and distribution of our literature on various aspects of The Scottish Terrier. Beyond these areas, there are many questions about what STCA should be doing for both members and the breed. Should we undertake some organized educational program for judges? Should we make any revisions in the current standard for the breed? Should we develop more programs and materials for our non-exhibiting members? In view of the expanded format, content and quality of *The Bagpiper*, do we really need a new Handbook?

All of these matters are currently under consideration by your Board. I personally favor STCA action on each point — if the financial and human resources can be found. Undoubtedly, some of you will have differing views. For example, many at the Annual Meeting voiced opposition to any revision of the standard for the breed. My point, once again, is that your Board wants to know your feelings on these and other matters. Indifference on your part will simply not suffice. Decision making in SWTCA is little different from that in government or other organized areas of society. As your elected representatives, the STCA Board exercises its best collective judgment tempered by suggestions and opinions from the membership. If we do not hear from you, we still must make the decisions. Indifference only means your view may not be represented.

Three amendments to the STCA By-laws have been approved by the Board and are being submitted to the membership for a vote. The first is to increase annual dues by five dollars per year for both individual and family memberships. The second is to establish a fifteen dollar initiation fee for **new** members (not existing members). These measures, together with certain cost cutting initiatives already being implemented, should insure future fiscal stability and viability for STCA. If these amendments are not approved, we are going to have trouble maintaining basic services and the odds against any new programs or publications will be great. The third proposed amendment will increase the number of members required to sign a petition for nominations of officers or directors. Currently only five members are required to sign such a petition. Your Board feels that in view of the growth of STCA over the years and the national geographic distribution of our membership, at least twenty-five members should be required to petition for a nominee. We also feel that anyone interested in serving should have no trouble in obtaining twenty-five signatures on a nominating petition.

The materials forthcoming with your ballots will contain comparative text of the affected By-law provisions and the proposed amendments. I hope each of you will take the time to vote as these matters are of crucial importance to the future role of STCA.

Membership by October 1984. **This can be done, and will be done if every Regional Club puts forth a one hundred per cent effort.** If every Member of the S.T.C.A. **HELPS** to enroll **ONE GOOD MEMBER**, our goal will be completed...

For this Membership Drive our mission is not limited to exhibitors and breeders but to our **good** pet owners as well. We all should realize that many of the pet owners of today are the professionals of tomorrow!!...Please read **The President's Message** in the November 1983 issue of the Bagpiper.

Selectively we need to increase our Membership in order to spread our message about the breed. We need to reinforce the value of the S.T.C.A. Membership in the minds of existing Members. To this end, we are supplying each Regional Club with a "MEMBERSHIP CHALLENGE KIT" which will include Membership Packets and challenge the Regional Clubs to: (1) Increase the per centage of S.T.C.A. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE: Chairman John DeSaye has contacted all regional clubs by letter as published in another section of the Bagpiper.

BAGPIPER: Editor Sandi Hach reported that as of this issue, (Winter—stud issue) the Bagpiper is now showing in the BLACK and wishes to thank the members that are so generously supporting our publication. At the October 8, 1983 meeting, the Editor was instructed by the Board to poll the judges who WISHED to continue receiving the Bagpiper and drop from our mailing those who do not wish to receive our publication. The response of the judges who want to receive the Bagpiper was over 50% (some of the comments made are published in another section of the Bagpiper). SILVER SERVICE MEDALLIONS: Motion by McArthur / Seelbach to accept S.S. Medallion Guidelines for A—Type of Service, B—Length of Service and C—Previous Awards if any. Motion passed. Committee will present nominees to the Board at the Montgomery County Meeting. Committee consists of Helen Prince, Betty Cooper and Ed Ingram.

ROTATING SPECIALTY—1985: Pending notification and approval, judges were selected for the rotating specialty to be held in Atlanta, Georgia in 1985.

MINI-WORKSHOP: Motion made and carried to increase monies for two more additional workshops to be held this year.

WAY BACK WHEN By Robert C. Graham

Many of you may well wonder what the STCA and our breed were doing in the distant past. As one who has been around a few years, I can assure you that the situation was "alive and well". In many respects, it wasn't a whole lot different from 1984.

For example, during the early 1950's there was no STCA publication similar to our present day Bagpiper. In its place, the S.T.C.A. issued quite infrequently an abbreviated bulletin, newsletter, or Year Book. However, any short comings in this department were more than offset by a monthly commercial publication called DIEHARD DOPE as prepared by a long time Scottie breeder, fancier, and judge named R. D. Linton of Nanuet, New York. This very newsy 12 inch by 9 inch black and white tabloid cost 25 cents per copy, contained about 12 or more pages, many breed advertisements, and was profusely illustrated. What made it especially interesting was the editor's unusual comments and policy of telling it "like it was". This made it a popular item within the fancy — so much so, that at TODHILL we have preserved copies of the more interesting and controversial issues. Even today, these stories could have a certain interest or appeal to many of you, so perhaps appropriate excerpts from Diehard Dope may appear in future issues of the Bagpiper.

As a trial in this direction, I have selected the following exact copy from the April 1951 issue of Diehard Dope:

Mrs. Warburton Comments on Entries That Came Before Her at STCA Show

Mrs. Emmett Warburton, Newton Centre, Mass., widow of one of the most noted professional handlers and a handler herself, whose A. A. Kennels is one of the veterans among Diehards, judged the winter specialty of the Scottish Terrier Club of America the day before Westminster. She wrote the following comment Feb. 14 on the dogs that came under her, exclusively for Diehard Dope:

BY JANE A. WARBURTON

Each of you, no doubt, has his own version of the placings; here are my observations: First, my deep and sincere gratitude to all exhibitors who entrusted their Scottish Terriers to me at the Associated Terrier Show of 1951.

It may be that one who works year in and year out doing the manual labor incident to "making" terriers of various breeds, finds more than shows up on the surface.

Distance lends enchantment, and many a beautiful picture, from the ring-side, does not quite fulfill the promise of a first glance.

Through the years I have been somewhat resentful of the camouflage and remodelling which is often designated as being "modern" or the "latest style" and so forth.

A Scottish Terrier is sufficient unto himself and a good one need not apologize for his style to any breed on earth. His style is the Scottish Terrier, why make him look like anything he is not supposed to be?

Coats have been sacrificed to the trends in hair-do's. The Scottish Terrier has all too often been divested of his good old homespun kilt to become adorned with the flowing robes of uncertain use or quality.

Being a trimmer, it is no trouble at all to wonder why when coat is or is not in certain places. Coat is a really valuable advantage and should be cherished as such, but the mowed-down appearance of heads, necks and shoulders adds nothing to the true character of the breed. Eyebrows of unusual length and bushiness can not conceal large, light or soft eyes beneath them, if one takes the trouble to look.

At the moment, ears are really disturbing, there is an increasing tendency to ears growing out of the side of the head and in some cases, in otherwise good dogs, their size is almost appalling.

Queerly enough, these too large ears are often emphasized by the bush and fuzz around them, and the cockatoo crests are the most offensive of all; we are privileged to show an animal just as the good Lord made it, yet we do unholy things to change its appearance.

Personally, I much prefer a Scottish Terrier with a good middle piece. A slab-sided dog, no matter how generously adorned with hair, is still a flat-sided dog, hence the need of a thorough examination on the part of the judge.

A good bone structure with a rugged coat, such as in the earlier days was known as a "broken coat" can be joy to behold.

There is nothing more gruesome than the human skeleton, but through the processes of adornment, it manages to get around in polite society.

Do not misunderstand me—trimming is all important, but do let us keep within requirements and avoid the excesses.

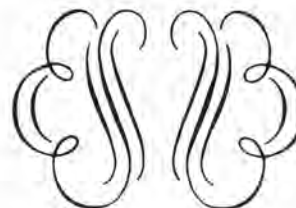
The clipper has always been my pet hate. The clipper, my husband contended, proclaimed either laziness or the inability to trim.

In hand work you put so much more of yourself and the results are so very much more satisfactory.

In a show of such proportions there are of necessity many good dogs a judge can not place. One opinion, if not permitted to become propaganda, can neither make nor break a dog and it is the differences of opinion which send the exhibitors in quest of a place in the sun and maintains our shows.

Once again, my gratitude to every exhibitor and to Mr. Charles H. Werber Jr., and Mr. Emerson Latting for their kindly and efficient attentions as stewards. It was a wonderful, educational and revealing experience, and one to be remembered with pleasure.

Mother's oft repeated admonition that my sins would find me out still chases me around, so I fully expect the panning and joshing pursuant to the public expression of opinion, but the fun I had will be well worth the price. I loved every minute of it.

LEST WE FORGET By Barbara Kingsbury

In 1929 Helen Stalter purchased a puppy named Diehard Robin from William McBain as a Christmas present for her husband Charles. Robin developed well, and at the urging of friends, they decided to enter him at the Englewood Kennel Club Show of 1930. He won a strong puppy class, emerging with a trophy offered by S. S. Van Dine, and his owners went home with a severe illness known as "dog show syndrome". Robin did not mature well enough to finish his championship, so in 1932 the Stalters purchased another male puppy, Diehard Reveller from Mr. McBain. He was sired by Ch. Heather Reveller, out of an imported bitch named Glenisla Grizelda. First shown as a puppy late in 1932, he finished his championship in July of 1933. At this point the Stalters decided to start their own breeding program. They imported a bitch, Caenmohr Cora, who, when bred to Ch. Diehard Reveller, produced their first homebred champion, BARBERRY KNOWE REVELLER. Two more imports followed soon after, Heather Glory, and Walsing Whirlwind, and the string of champions began. Some of the more well known dogs of that era were: CH. BARBERRY KNOWE KILTIE, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE LARKSPUR, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE BARBICAN, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE WYNDOLA, and CH. BARBERRY KNOWE WAGER.

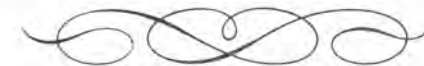
It is impossible to write about the Stalters without mentioning other people, we do not learn alone. From the beginning of the kennel until 1960 the Prentice family, William, Phil, and Florence handled and guided the breeding program. Then, John Murphy took over these chores. About this time, the Stalters imported Walsing Wild Winter from Mr. Singleton. This was when I became sucked into the mad scene. I innocently purchased a dog and ended up helping out on weekends. One of the first animals I combed out at a show was CH. CAR-MICHAEL'S FANFARE, a bitch the Stalters had purchased from Ruth Johnson. "Mamie", a daughter of CH. BARBERRY KNOWE MERRYMAKER, finished her career in real style by going Best In Show at Westminster in 1965. I was lucky enough to be there, and it was a grand night for the Stalters, Ruth Johnson, and John Murphy, all devoted Scottie people who loved the breed.

Some of the dogs shown after that by John Murphy were: CH. BARBERRY KNOWE BLIZZARD, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE BINGO, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE WILDFIRE, and CH. BARBERRY KNOWE POLLYANNA. Charles Stalter died in 1968, and the same year Mr. Murphy retired. From 1968 until Helen Stalter's death in 1975, Steve Shaw and I handled such animals as: CH. BARBERRY KNOWE WILDFIRE, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE CONDUCTOR, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE SPITFIRE, CH. BALACHAN NAUGHTY GAL, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE BANDLEADER, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE MUSIC MAN, and CH. BARBERRY KNOWE MY FAIR LADY. In 1979 I had the honor of finishing the last dog bred by Helen Stalter, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE BRIMSTONE, their **105th** Scottie champion!

I must also mention that for a short period of time, through Mrs. Werner Josten, the Stalters raised Sealyham Terriers. They finished seven of them, one of whom, CH. BARBERRY KNOWE CYCLAMEN, was one of the finest Sealyhams that I have ever seen.

Last but not least, I must mention a breed that Mrs. Stalter fell madly in love with in the late 1950's, the Dachshund. Mr. Stalter loved them as house pets, and tolerated them in the show ring. Through the guidance of their handlers, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hardy, 35 dogs finished their titles. Two of these were Ch. Crosswynds Crackerjack, who won the hound group at Westminster in 1968 and 1969, and Ch. Dunkledorf's Falcon Forester. These animals were grand dogs and have left their mark in Dachshunds forever.

"Chuck" and Helen Stalter were complete opposites. He was very outgoing, she was very shy. One of the common grounds they shared was their love for their animals. All of them, the great, and the not so great, had the best of care throughout their lives, and were never put to sleep without good reason. I fondly remember the day Al Ayers introduced the Stalters to a client by saying, "They have more dogs in their kitchen, than you have in your kennel".

OBEDIENCE By Ruth Tryon

With the President's message in the last issue of the Bagpiper in mind, how can we in Obedience effectively respond? We, in Obedience, have a genuine opportunity to serve our Scottish Terrier in many ways.

For those in the Conformation world, Scotties in Obedience are constant reminders that Mac is just not, nor should he be, little ears, good tail set, super mover with great front and rear but rather he is a warm, living companion (albeit an independent thinking one!) and his relationship with his owner is of far greater importance to him than all the points and ribbons of which his owner is so proud. Mac may aid our ego but he has his own sense of values.

For those in the Obedience world, we have discovered that man working with his dog develops a rapport between them that is both unique and deep. Mac and his owner are companions in the real sense of the word. Scores and ribbons are great fun but it is the companionship and the understanding which develops between the two that is the true value of the relationship.

We must recognize our responsibility towards all Scotties. Even though our STCA breeders have beautiful litters and all are, of course, potential champions, what really does happen to these litters? In spite of a breeder's encouragement and claims of successes to come, in reality, and with good luck only one or two of the puppies from each litter will actually be shown by the new owners for any length of time. All the best of intentions vanish in the hectic pace of everyday life and somehow the puppy is never shown and becomes, instead of a great show dog, a great family companion. This should not be a disappointment to either the breeder or owner for there is no greater accomplishment a dog can attain than to be a beloved, loyal and devoted companion. Dog has been man's companion and friend and worked beside him for centuries — long before any point system or Obedience routine was ever thought of.

The December issue of the Gazette reports 399 Scotties were registered with the A.K.C. in October '83 alone, yet the percent of those Scotties ever showing in a ring is very small. What becomes of the others? They are our companion Scotties. Obviously only a relatively small number of these puppies are bred by STCA members and the future owners of these will have guidance from the members but what about all the others? How can we reach them and help them? It is bound to be a long, slow process but gradually we can touch their lives.

How can we in Obedience do this? We see Scotties in neighborhood areas, in training classes and we encourage them but do we also tell them about Obedience clubs and the Regional Scottish club and the STCA? Even though they may never plan to show the Scottie in an Obedience Trial, do we tell them about Matches and nearby shows where they can watch both Conformation and Obedience trained Scotties compete? Do we tell them about Tracking, about Working Terrier Trials and find out where these activities take place and encourage them to at least go and watch? Do we inform them of Obedience Clinics in the area? While these Clinics are directed at eventually entering competition, so many valuable training suggestions and information is available, owners of companion Scotties will find it all worth the cost and time even if they never put foot in a ring. Do we invite them to club meetings and introduce them to other members? Scottie people have a special bond and almost always are delighted and interested in meeting other Scottie owners. Once they come to a meeting are we careful not to push them towards competing but rather try and help them with grooming their Mac to keep him neat and tidy and comfortable — and which will also lessen the shedding problem about his home. Let's help them with suggestions born of years of experience with any problems they might have with Mac and with which we can be of assistance. Above all, it is hoped they are not encouraged and at times almost pushed to purchase another Scottie — a puppy who is to be shown in Conformation with the resulting displacement to a second place citizen of the Scot who brought them to us. This unfortunately happens all too often, and frequently the puppy who is to be the great winning show dog does not materialize into such a dog and the owner is then discouraged and drops out of all dog activities. Let's, instead, help the owner with the Scottie he has and later, if he initiates the idea, help him to find a Scottie to show in Breed as well as Obedience. But for the present, encourage Mac and his owner to continue in Obedience, praise their efforts and if they do enter Trials, go and watch them! We should never forget Mac is number one in their hearts — a blue ribbon boy. Let's keep it that way and help the team all we can.

Along with encouraging those already in Obedience, we should also encourage those who presently show in Conformation only to train their Scotties in at least basic Obedience. It does not "ruin" the Scottie for the show ring as so often predicted but it does give the Scot assurance in the ring, his handler control and the judge ease in examination and observing the dog's gait, all pluses. Nor does the Scottie lose any of his alertness or the use of his ears! His terrier spirit is still there but the wild, aggressive, futile flights into mid-air cease. He is now all terrier, poised and confident.

All Scotties should have basic Obedience training, starting the puppy in Puppy Kindergarten Training if it is available. The Scottie should be trained from the very beginning to walk with the handler, not leading the handler. This need not be a stern, exacting activity but one that both the dog and his master enjoy, but always with the master in command. The Scottie should learn to sit and stay regardless of distractions and in situations other than just at home. He should go to the down position directly on command whether he is moving or standing still. This control could well save the Scottie's life should he be running into danger. He should also stand quietly while he is being admired or petted by people other than his family. What a joy to have him quiet and well behaved at the Veterinarian's when, on occasion, things must be done to him that are not comfortable. The dog should, in other words, be under the control and guidance of his master at all times and under all circumstances.

The best public relations for a breed is a well behaved dog and one of the best ways to attain that is by Obedience training. Not necessarily the precision worked for by those competing at Obedience Trials but a dog who is a joy to be with and under reasonable control. There are many people who love dogs and will give them wonderful homes but have never been or ever will be interested in showing a dog in Obedience or Conformation. This, however, does not preclude the necessity of basic Obedience training.

There is much Obedience people can do to help the companion Scot!

It is a pleasure to report several Scotties have earned qualifying scores this fall and there is keen competition developing in the Open B Class. Titles have been earned also, including Bob and Marylee Zubaly's Merrily Dusty Miller, C.D.'s Championship and Raymond and Sue Pazzdior's Ch. Kyscot Matchless Ginger Boy's C.D. Congratulations to both! Our Obedience dogs are busy and doing well.

Next time we will gather together "Training Tips". In the meantime, happy training and good luck competing!

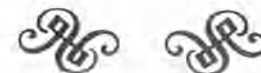

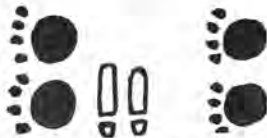

TRIBUTE TO MILDRED CHARVES By Claudia Leffler with contributions from Barbara Dunham

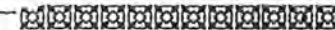
With great sadness I report the passing of an avid fancier of our breed. Mildred Charves died after a long illness on November 28, 1983 in Fairfield, California at the home of her friend Virginia Twowey.

Mildred had been interested in Scotties since the late 50's. The Charves purchased their foundation bitch and beloved companion CH. BALACHAN GAMBIT lovingly called "Middle" from Dr. & Mrs. T. A. Kirk, Jr. through Lena Kardos. Champions spanning at least seven generations were produced. The mark that the Charves breeding program has made on our breed is evident in the large number of champions today containing Charves dogs in their pedigrees. Charves dogs have become the foundation stock for many successful kennels today. Her more recent kennel name Rocbriar has reflected her long time interest in wheateans. Her last champion was ROCBRIAR RISQUE ROMANCE, a lovely wheaton bitch owned and handled by Marlene Deal. Of the four dogs that have received Working Terrier Certificates, two of them are Rocbriar dogs owned by the Deals.

In reflecting on her contribution to our breed I feel she was a true guardian of the Scottish Terrier. She practiced the objects of our national club constitution and urged other fanciers to do the same. Mildred devoted herself to learning all she could about our breed through its history, pedigrees and her breeding program. A great deal of her time was spent sharing her knowledge with others and with breed club activities. She was a charter member of the San Francisco Bay STC. She was a member of the Greater Miami STC and editor of their newsletter the Scotch Piper for several years. She also wrote a column for the national magazine Popular Dogs.

I will remember her for her dedication to helping the novice, taking the time, not only by selling a novice a show prospect but then nurturing that interest along by sharing her expertise. Her only payment was to ask that they pass on their knowledge to others. She firmly believed and encouraged others to look at the good points of every dog. This philosophy which she practiced I feel was the key to the successful breeding program for the Charves and Rocbriar Kennels.

Her passing is a loss to our breed. She will be missed by many of us.

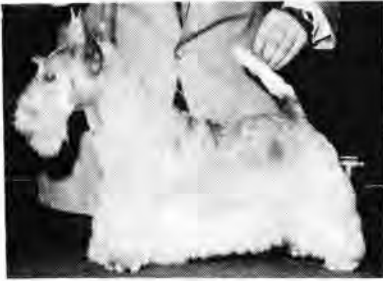

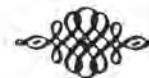
