It was received and first offered at the Scottish Terrier Club of Greater New York show in February. The **Grooming Manual** is the consummate information source for grooming our breed and every member should have one. The grooming symposia of the parent and regional clubs have produced a marked improvement in the presentation of our breed in recent years. We hope with the introduction of the **Grooming Manual** that the trend of recent years can be perpetuated. On behalf of the Board and the Club, I extend our great thanks to Mr. Merle Taylor for his excellent work in drafting, editing and illustrating this new working tool for the Club and the Breed.

April marks our trip to Atlanta for the 1985 National Rotating Specialty. Our host club, the Scottish Terrier Club of Greater Atlanta, has been working hard to make this the most memorable mid-year event yet. All members and exhibitors will be pleased to know that Black and White Scotch will be actively participating in the Rotating by offering major cash awards to the winners and premiums for each exhibitor. Additionally, cash awards will be available once again for all placements in the Bred-By-Exhibitor Bitch Class thanks to Mr. Lehmann Byck. For the first time, cash awards will also be available for all placements in the Bred-By-Exhibitor Dog Class thanks to the generosity of Mr. Alan Novick prior to his untimely death. Our sympathies are extended to Alan's family and friends in the fancy.

The work on the new **Handbook** is now fully under way with Mike Cook leading the troops toward scheduled completion late this year. Mike graciously agreed to take over as editor when Miriam Stamm advised that her schedule would not permit her to meet the short deadlines we had established. Because we are now looking to a late fall publication, the deadline for reserving advertisements at the discounted rate has been extended to April 30, 1985. **A note for all Regional Clubs** — Bill Berry's work on forms and explanations of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code is nearing completion. Bill is attempting to compile (in a logical and understandable way) information on tax exempt corporation status. Some clubs have already achieved this status. Others have never considered it. Those that are currently tax-exempt should study Bill's work carefully to insure that their status continues. Those clubs that are not currently tax-exempt should seriously consider this as an advantageous vehicle for enhanced fund raising as well as tax savings. Any club that has not obtained a tax identification number should do so immediately. Otherwise, all investment earnings including interest on checking accounts will be subject to Backup Withholdings Taxes by your bank or depository institution. Any persons or clubs having questions or problems of this nature should contact Bill Berry, Chairman of the Regional Clubs Representatives' Committee.

We hope to see you all in Atlanta in April.

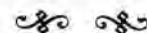

My BOB is a great bitch** and a super showman, and I was delighted to see her go on to the BIS. The Best of Oposite Sex was good, sound, put together dog, tiring a bit but still showing. - e. Dunbar Replacement Trophy - Letter from Michael and Christine Cook offering the replacement for an unlimited time. Motion Roszman/DeSaye to accept. Motion carried. The Trophy will now be called "Bar-None Trophy".
- f. Sandissy Trophy - Marily Meador advising of revisions in the tabulation for this award (retroactive as of 1-85) motion Roszman/McArthur to accept proposal subject to minor revisions. Details will be published in the next issue of the *2Bagpiper*.

## Cruft Trip – 1985

It all began in the summer of '83 when Evy and I heard that Archie MacLaren was to judge at Cruft's in '85. Immediately, we decided that, cold weather or not, we'd go over and kibitz. We just couldn't miss this opportunity to see him in action. And, besides, we had not been to Cruft's since its move to Earl's Court. The old site, the Olympia, was the largest building imaginable, being two enormous quonset-type edifices joined together. The lighting was bad, it was cold, birds flew overhead; we were really curious to see what Earl's Court had to offer, and if there was another building that size in the middle of London.

So, we signed up for Ollie and Bill Moore's tour which had us staying at the Mount Royal Hotel, conveniently located just off Oxford Street. Convenient for shopping and sight-seeing, not for Earl's Court!

We wanted to leave from Dulles airport, but instead, we left from Washington National on TWA, driving up to Northern Virginia to catch flight 704. Hearing adverse weather reports the afternoon before we planned to leave, we quickly finished packing, loaded the car and drove up to Culpeper that night, putting us 150 miles nearer our destination. Next day, as we pulled into my sister's driveway (where we left the car) the snow/sleet/freezing rain began to coat the roads. The weather man was right on the mark that time!

Aboard flight 704, we waited for over two hours at the gate while luggage was loaded, watched the plane being de-iced twice as the snow accumulated. (we heard later that the real delay was caused by one of the luggage bins falling from the dolly into the snow, breaking open, spilling people's suitcases into the snow, in turn breaking some of them open. Can't you see the baggage handlers retrieving undies from the snow and stuffing them back into bags? Some of our group found snow in their luggage when we got to London.) Our gutsey pilot finally took off into the snow storm, but those who flew from Dulles didn't get out until the next day.

Leaving late and not making up much time worked to our advantage, as there wasn't the usual wait for rooms. That is the bad thing about arriving early in the morning...you have to wait for guests to check out and for rooms to be made ready for new occupants.

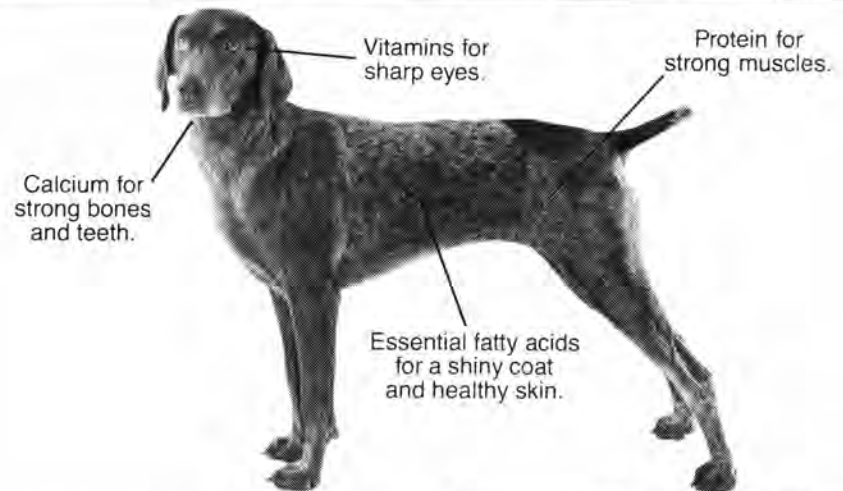
Earl's Court did not disappoint us. This new site for Cruft's is huge; you could fit a football field into the main floor. A ring the size of a basketball court and carpeted in green is marked off in the center, surrounded by bleachers on all sides. This is used for obedience during the day, for the groups at night. Around this are about 20 "small" rings, perhaps 80' to 100' square (Bergit Coady was using binoculars), interspersed with blocks of benching and of stalls selling art prints, paintings, dog food, books, etc. Out side of this are more stalls all around the outside walls of the building. Escalators to the upper floor are to be found in cubbyholes between the stalls, and out beside the "big ring". Upstairs, the center is open as a gallery, the rails of which were lined with spectators all day and all evening. Surrounding this, about 20 more rings, benching, and more stalls. Each breed is benched adjacent to the ring it will be shown in.

Despite all this room, the place was packed each of the 3 days. It was impossible to move from one ring to another to watch more than one ring at a time, unless the ones you're interested in happen to be side by side. Your judging schedule doesn't tell you when the breed you want to watch will be shown, unless, by chance, it's the first breed to be shown in that ring. All you know is that breed X is in at 10:00 a.m., followed by breed Y. You have to guess how long breed X will take.

On the first day, Evy and Marily Meador, who met us enroute stopped to look at some old prints while I went looking for a book stall. We couldn't find each other again til around 5 p.m. Then we were reunited in the Overseas Visitors Lounge, where Evy had left a message on the board, "Tom, where are you?"

That day was for toys and Gundogs. I watched Poms and Chihuahuas (in back-to-back rings) and a couple of Peke classes. The English seem to like leggier Poms than we like here. I was amazed at the nice quality of Chihuahuas. Later, I had a grand time watching the Cavalier King Charles Spaniels, which Evy wants so badly; shuddered at the English Setters (those I had at the New England Specialty last fall were all better). I couldn't even find the Gordons or Irish Setters, nor any of the Spaniels. I did see a Gordon off the bench and I wish I hadn't.

If had snowed all day, was miserably cold when we went out and we refused to "queue" for a cab. We took the underground to the next stop and found a cab at once. Since it was such a filthy night, we decided not to return for the groups, so we had dinner just a block from the hotel in an Italian (a real one!) restaurant. What food!

Next day were the terriers and the working dogs (still including the hearing in England). Before judging time, we ran into a wolf-colored Corgi, found he was not a Corgi at all, but a Swedish Volhund. Then we saw a king-sized Dandie which turned out to be a Glen of Imaal

Terrier. We had to know more about them, so were flooded with fact, fiction, and brochures. Some were blue, some wheaten, terriers all. It is the only real working terrier in Britain, we were told. I can see where a dog like this could be ancestor to the Kerry, the Wheaten, the Irish with no need for cross-breeding, only selective breeding.

Scotties were second in ring 22, after the Sealys, so we found good seats and watched them. There was one strikingly beautiful bitch there. Bet she ends up over here.

In Scotties, the entry was nice, but with the exception of the best of breed, best of opposite and reserve dog, of lesser calibre than I had at the Centennial show in Philadelphia. Best of Breed was a young dog from the Yearling Class, a beautiful little guy, short-backed, great balance, a grand mover. I understand he acted the puppy and let down in the group, but I heard later that he'd left home in Scotland the day before, had been held up at the Forth Bridge because the wind had blown a van over the side into the water hundreds of feet below. He'd arrived in London just in time for final grooming before he went in the ring. He had to be exhausted; it's a wonder that he showed as well as he did.

We skipped the groups again to have dinner with Archie and his daughter, Sandra MacLachlan (Burnview). It was truly good to see them again and catch up on the news. A Kerry won the group and we heard he is coming over here.

Sunday, the hounds and non-sporting (utility) dogs were in. We arrived in time to see, and fall in love with, a Petit Basset Griffon Vendéen, and to look over his brethren, after which we went over to watch the Deerhound judging. They were a typey lot, and great movers. I wish we could get coats such as they had, over here. These "giant Scotties" made you proud you used to have one. They all seemed a bit smaller than those here.

We left early to avoid the rush and to deposit our purchases in our rooms. We returned in time to see the presentation of the junior showmanship trophy. This competition, Ric Chasoudian judging, was international in scope with a lovely Irish lass winning it. Last year the USA entry won. In the competition, which was held in the morning, the juniors were required to change dogs and that really separated the worthy from the unworthy, believe me.

Having procured three of the last four seats in the bleachers, we were high where we could see every movement of the dogs. In the groups, the little hairy basset stood out like a sore thumb, she and the pharaoh hound. Neither placed, though the former was pulled out, probably because it was the first time a CC had been offered for this breed and they were making much of it.

In the final, when the group winners came in the ring, the black standard Poodle and the Peke were obviously the best in the ring from the start. After the judge had gone over them, these were the two he pulled out. His decision must have been a hard one between these two. Finally he decided for the Standard Poodle, and the Pekingese was reserve. A lovely pair.

For the rest of the trip, like all good tourists, we visited the silver vaults (where Marilyn almost broke down to buy an \$800. salt and pepper shaker & Evy bought trophies for our next year's show), the Scotch Shops (a friend had asked us to find some items of highland wear), Simpson's (where most of their inventory had been hidden from the Americans with their favorable exchange rate), Piccadilly Circus (where Eros is missing during a refurbishing campaign), Buckingham Palace (where the cold wind de-formalized the changing of the guard), and Westminster Abbey (where after trying a dozen banks and 3 coin shops, I finally found a 1985 Pound coin).

Wednesday morning, Bill Moore had left a wake-up call for all of us 6:00 a.m. so we could get our bags collected at 7. After breakfast we met at 9 to pick up our plane tickets, only to have to wait in the crowded lounge until 10:30 to get them. Marilyn's bags had been checked to Atlanta. After straightening that out we barely had time to catch the bus, barely time then to catch the plane and didn't even have time to get into the duty-free shop, were Evy was planning to get rid of the rest of her English money. But we make it, loaded down like pack mules and eager to be on the road home. Almost everyone, and especially Marilyn and Evy, said, "Now, next time..."

**OBEDIENCE**

By the time this reaches print New Year resolutions will not only have been broken many weeks ago but even forgotten. However, it is never too late to look at what we are doing in our training of Mac and resolve to improve.

One major improvement in training would be consistency in the time spent with Mac. Rather than working 25 to 30 minutes one day and then forgetting it for several days, a steady 10 to 15 minutes every day will show genuine results in Mac's work, his enthusiasm and your enjoyment. Sometimes it seems impossible to find those 10 to 15 minutes but look at what you are doing and think about the time you waste each day. We all do—there is more than time for Mac! One surprising discovery is that after working and playing with Mac we return to our activities relaxed and refreshed. Maybe it is because our dogs love us and working one on one this comes through to us. Think how you feel when you watch Mac wag his tail when he finally realizes he has done something just the way you want him to. We will let the psychologists figure it all out — we only know working with Mac does recharge our batteries and you go back to other activities with a fresh start.

There is an interesting list of mistakes most commonly made by handlers and trainers compiled in Blanch Saunders' "The Complete Book of Dog Training" written in 1954. Being human, we are still making the same mistakes. However, we can learn from them and help Mac by being better trainers. Incidentally this is still one of the best books for both beginners in Obedience as well as those who have taken a dog through Obedience degrees. There is always so much more to learn.

Giving commands without changing the tone of our voice is one of these errors. Mac has very sensitive ears and can easily detect a slight change in your tone of voice or expression. Yet how many of us tend to use the same tone, volume and expression on every command. Commands should be firm and strong but not necessarily loud. "Heel" should somehow carry a bit of forward motion in it, but not be so forceful as to startle Mac which will surely delay his response. "Stay" should be a firm, strong command that leaves no doubt in everyone's mind that staying in that particular place is the only acceptable thing. "Come" should have enthusiasm and encouragement in it. When you use the "Heel" as the command to go from sitting in front to the heel position, make sure it is a bit sharper and your voice does not go up at the end of the word. When you give Mac the command "Sit" try and say it so his head come up looking at you and his rump will easily go down. Practice saying this work with Mac, remembering to praise him each time he sits, until you find the tone and quality to which Mac responds most quickly. Then practice until you say it in that manner automatically. The word "Down" does seem to carry a downward motion with it and there again work with Mac until you get the best response. In both of these exercises Mac is at your side so you can observe his reactions very easily and he will tell you so much with his eyes and general deportment. Learn to read Mac just as he instinctively reads you. Once these commands are mastered there should be no delay in Mac's sitting or going to the down position in or out of the ring. These are the basic commands in Novice work and Mac should understand them thoroughly. Therefore, don't practice the exercises in the same pattern but mix up things a bit and in changing the order Mac will have to listen to and think about each command given.

While "no" is not an "official" command, it is used pretty constantly — make sure when you do use it that you do not end "no" with a question. If the tone of your voice goes up at the end of the "o" Mac could take it you aren't quite sure about how much "No" there really is in it. Listen to yourself! Try saying each command in a different fashion and decide how you would react to the various tones. Remember Mac's ears are sharper than yours so use the tone in your own voice that will be the clearest in expressing your wish, give Mac the greatest encouragement to do it right — and keep listening to yourself as you work with him. Watch his reaction and experiment a bit. Once you determine what is best for the two of you, use that knowledge but always keep listening to yourself for you can easily slip back into old habits without realizing it and then wonder why Mac isn't doing as well as he was before. Remember, you are the key to Mac's behavior.

We are all guilty of giving indistinct commands and confusing signals, another common

mistake. First, we must be consistent. It isn't "Come along" one day and "Heel" the next. While Mac can and will develop a very good vocabulary, words mean certain things to him and you can use this to your advantage in training. Heel should mean ALWAYS by your side, whether moving or sitting. Don't forget, either, it helps Mac if you start off on the left foot when heeling and stop by bringing your left foot up to your right. Mac is learning to watch you or should already be doing so depending how far along you are in your training. Again, why not use this to your advantage? The more ways you can tell Mac what is going to happen and what you want, the better he will work with you, and the happier he will be. Make your turns when heeling smooth and easy to follow so Mac can stay right with you, rather than sharp, sudden military turns that leave him scurrying around after you, not with you. And don't confuse him — if you are making a right turn, don't change your mind in mid-turn. If you aren't sure what you are doing how on earth can you expect Mac to stay with you?

When you leave Mac on the Stand for Examination or the Long Sits and Downs, take off with your right foot. It is an extra clue to Mac to stay where you left him. When you return, be sure to walk around him, coming up to his shoulder with him on your left side. He will then know to wait until you give him a command to release him from that position. Decide on your release command to avoid confusion in his mind as to when he may move and joyfully accept your praise.

Decide what term you will use to call Mac on the Recall — "Come" or "Front" being the most common ones. See which is easier for you to use and for Mac's quick response and then use that word — and that word only. And be sure to use the name you most commonly call Mac by — if his name is Mac Dougal, he may flick his ears and respond at home to Mac Dougal, or Dougie — but don't try it in the ring. You are both under tension so use the name he is regularly called by. (This may seem like unnecessary advice but more than one exercise has been blown in the ring by a rattled handler doing just that.) Be certain all your commands whether voice, signal or aids in motion are ones that Mac can easily hear and understand, see or "read".

There are unfortunately many more common mistakes we make but for now let's work on these — and watch Mac improve as we too improve to be a better team. Happy Heeling — and lots of Obedience Titles.

### Wilfred Joseph Schwer

August 6, 1924–January 19, 1985

The scottie world has lost yet another gentle, supporter early this year. Bill, as he was affectionately called by his wife of thirty-eight years, Mary, and his three sons and six grandchildren, died of a heart attack at home. He had worked as a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service and had only just retired from his position on January 2, 1985, hoping to travel and pursue his new found hobby of photography.

Bill was the quiet partner of Schwerts' kennels which bore his sur-name. Early in their marriage Bill & Mary raised Persian cats followed by Dachshunds and Welsh Terriers for over a period of twelve years. In 1964 on a visit to one of Mary's sisters who owned a new Scottie, they both fell in love with the breed. They vowed they would soon own a Scottie. One was purchased from a litter that the Galriels had bred. A friendship developed between the Schwerts' and Susan Fitzwilliams who had purchased a litter mate. A second purchase of Anstamm Ruff & Ready of Relluf resulted in their first Scottie champion.

Through Susan they soon had a foundation bitch in Ch. Fitzwilliams Happy Girl (Ch. Bardene Bobby Dazzler x Ch. Mar De's Dark Felicia). Soon the kennel became well know for their Happy litters.

In February 1970 Happy Girl was bred to her half-brother, Ch. Anstamm Dazzler Dynamic, which produced the Montgomery Co. BIS winner Ch. Schwerts Dynamic Happy Boy, No. 2 winning show dog for 73-74. In September 1970 a breeding took place that has had a lasting impact on the breed. It was decided to breed Happy Girl to her maternal grandsire, Ch. Anstamm Dark Venture. A litter of five resulted but the standour was a male pup who went to Anstamm Kennels and became known as Ch. Anstamm Happy Venture. His influence on the breed has been stunning. Over 75% of all show scotties today trace back to him in their pedigrees, some many times. As you know Ch. Braeburn's Close Encounter is a Happy Venture granddaughter on her dam's side.

Many champions were bred and finished at this very small select kennel, never having more than five or six occupants. The more illustrious champions include Happy Boy, Happy Venture, Happy Fellow, Happy Traveler & Happy Melody. All specialty, group, BIS winners.

During the last five years only a small breeding program has been carried on due to health and family reasons.

Bill's many contributions to his loss, but can reflect on the Schwerts' scotties great and lasting contribution to the breed.

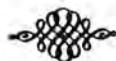

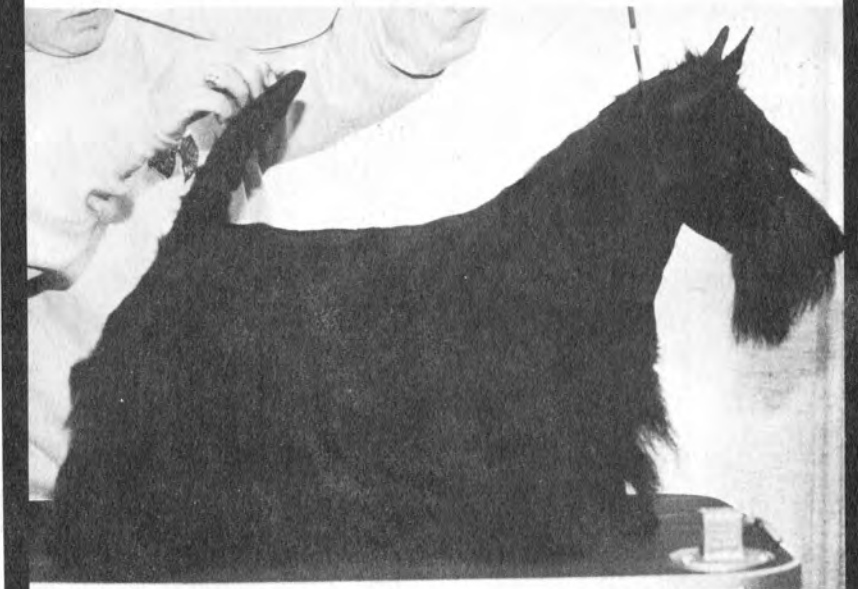
