LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I came across an ad in the February issue of **The Bagpiper** that contained some inaccurate information. While I'm not closely acquainted with the authors of the ad, I know them well enough to feel certain that it was an honest oversight on their part, rather than an intentional omission. My purpose in writing this is to correct the oversight; certainly not to offend or "make waves."

The ad in question stated that a certain dog was one of only three Scottish Terriers in history to gain English, Canadian and American championships and that he was the only triple-titled champion since Bardene Bingo and Viewpark Vintner. Actually, there were two before that—Bardene Boy Blue and Bardene Black Jewel, both of whom came to Anstamm Kennels in the early 60's. As far as I know these were the only other English, Canadian and American champion Scottish Terriers, but I haven't researched this and am relying on a rather capricious memory. Both Boy Blue and Black Jewel were Best in Show winners in this country, and Boy Blue may also have been the only Scottish Terrier to have won multiple Bests in Show in both Canada and the United States. I know of no others, but cannot claim this with certainty without further research.

Triple-titled champions are another matter. There have been a number of these. In addition to the five English, Canadian and American champions (Bardene Boy Blue, Bardene Black Jewel, Bardene Bingo, Viewpark Vintner and Scarista Rocky) there are, to mention three who come readily to mind, American, Canadian and Mexican Ch. Merriland Too Shoes, who also earned her obedience titles in those countries; English, Italian and American Ch. Enchanter of Eilburn; and more recently, American, Canadian and Bermudan Ch. Sandreg's Novelist.

Some people reading this may wonder: "Why all the bother over a one-time ad when it will all be forgotten five to ten years down the road?" True—perhaps it doesn't matter much now, but "now" soon becomes "yesterday", and "yesterday" inevitably merges into history. One seldom thinks of ads as historical records, but to authors of breed histories, anything about the breed is potential source material. **The Bagpiper** will provide a major source of information for future breed historians. If the articles or ads contained therein are inaccurate or incomplete, the result can only be confusion and uncertainty over the facts and events that ultimately are recorded as "history."

As advertisers, we can help keep the record straight for the historians if we exercise care in reporting the facts. For example, if your dog is a top producer, state the year; if it's a top-tenner, state the system; if you're reporting show wins, identify domestic and foreign wins separately; and, finally, to be on the safe side, avoid words like, the "only," the "first," the "most," etc. unless you have absolute verification of the fact.

The chair entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Correction noted: *Under Committee Reports*—Handbook Proof Reading (page 2)—Marjorie Cohen advised she could not proofread the Handbook properly in the time allotted her and requested that her name be withdrawn from this position with notice to be published in the next issue of **The Bagpiper**. John Cohen was not on this Committee as previously reported. **Motion Wooldridge/Prince** to accept the Minutes as corrected. **Motion carried.**

Motion Brown/Wooldridge to rearrange the Agenda to comply with the Greater Dallas Specialty Show. To adjourn at 1:00 and prioritize the Agenda, after reading the essential Reports, to include those things that must done, specifically, the following:

1. Election of Judges
2. Election of the Nominating Committee
3. Site for the 1989 Rotating Specialty
4. Fanfare Statue Report
5. Appoint **Bagpiper** Editor
6. Review **Bagpiper** Guidelines
7. Appoint Handbook Editor 1991
8. Historian's Report

Motion carried.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Jackie Seelbach reported that the following Regional Clubs have been granted permission to hold Specialty Shows.

Regional Club Changes in Officers: Listed in the Regional Club News Section of this Issue.

A list of correspondence sent and received was distributed; the following action was taken:

- **Handbook 1986:** Letters were received regarding the accuracy of a few specific areas in the Section on the History of the Scottish Terrier. Cindy Cooke advised that an errata page will be printed and enclosed in **The Bagpiper. Motion Brown/Wooldridge** that as a matter of Policy any errors in the Handbook be noted by the author and corrected. An errata sheet is to be prepared to be sent with **The Bagpiper. Motion carried.**
- **Honorary Membership:** Letter received from Mrs. Bernice Ayers thanking the Board for the offer and gladly accepting the status of Honorary Membership in the S.T.C.A.
- **Judges' Assignments:** 1988 National Specialty, Montgomery County: Mr. James Reynolds, Regular Class Judge, and Ms. Gail Gaines, Sweepstakes Judge have accepted the assignments for this Show.
- **Research Funding:** The Collie Club of America inquired of the S.T.C.A. procedure in awarding monies for research/educational projects. They have collected monies from many organizations and clubs and their donations reflect the names of all who contributed. They invited us to join their project. B. McArthur suggested we consider donating to the many new non-profit organizations that are forming to assist: a) the Senior Citizens, b) the low income families and others who cannot afford the high costs of treatment to save their pets from diseases such as cancer, kidney problems, etc. This will be discussed further when more information is available.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Betty McArthur reported that the latest additions and revisions to our Standard Operating Procedures Manual have been distributed to the Regional Clubs. She also requested permission to have more manuals printed as our stock is nearly depleted. Permission granted.

Results of last year's ballot showed that of the 970 ballots mailed, 552 were returned, approximately one-half of membership response. Provisions with the same accounting firm are being processed for the coming year.

The proposed Amendment to Article I, Section 2(a) of the By-Laws will be sent to the membership along with the Nominating Committee's Report on the 1st of June.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Sandra Lehrack submitted the balance Sheet as of 3/15/87 and the Profit and Loss Statement for the period of 10/1/86 through 3/15/87.

Income	\$ 32,653.57
Expenses	\$ 32,201.85
Net Income this period	\$ 451.72

These figures are based solely on actions taken by her as new Treasurer during that period. The next Board Meeting should find all figures current and up-to-date.

Sandra also distributed a list of those members who paid to have their **Bagpipers** mailed 1st class. This list has been forwarded to the Editor.

A.K.C. DELEGATE'S REPORT: Dr. Kirk distributed a full report of the A.K.C. Delegates' Meeting from November, 1986 to February, 1987. The following changes/additions were reported:

1. **Judges Exhibiting Dogs:** the rule was changed to state: "Judges at a show should not exhibit at any companion show or any show in the same circuit or cluster, whether they will be handling their own dogs or not."
2. **Amendment To Rules Applying To Dog Shows:** Show applications must reach A.K.C. 24 weeks before entries are to close for the Show. Judges' panels must reach the A.K.C. 18 weeks before the closing date. This should insure publication in the Gazette well prior to closing and insure exhibitors time to enter, particularly if they are on the "mailing list."
3. **Group Clubs/Group Shows:** was again voted on at the A.K.C. Annual Meeting. To date it has been voted down. The main areas of dissent were: Where would the workers come from? How would Local Clubs be affected? What about parent clubs? What about Montgomery County? What about show dates which are in short supply? Dr. Kirk reported the general consensus was favorable if a clause were added to their proposal stating: The Group Clubs would not be in competition for calendar dates with All Breed Clubs or with Specialty Clubs; that they would work in cooperation rather than in competition; and appropriate rules were put in whereby they would be safeguarded. **Motion Kirk/Cooke** to present this clause to the Group Club Representative for consideration. **Motion carried.**
4. **Computer Registration of Litters:** Dr. Kirk received correspondence from Helen Prince asking that he investigate the new A.K.C. Policy of allowing phone registration of litters just by providing the registration numbers of the sire and dam. She also questioned what would prevent someone from giving false information. Dr. Kirk inquired and the A.K.C. stated their system was secure from this type of incident. It was determined that this would not fall under the A.K.C. Board Policy; rather, a Staff Policy to expedite clerical work; however, Dr. Kirk will investigate it further.

Betty McArthur recommended that our Delegate propose to the A.K.C. that they consider sanctioning the Working Terrier, and that they be awarded a certificate of recognition for performance from the A.K.C. She suggested our W.T. Chairman, Claudia Leffler, forward a full outline of all that is necessary to complete the trials to Dr. Kirk. **Motion McArthur/Prince** to have our Delegate present this proposal to the A.K.C. **Motion carried; 2 abstained.**

Alternates are: Mrs. Faith Erlacher and Mrs. Jayne Anderson. The Committee's Final Report is to be submitted to the Recording Secretary by May 15, 1987.

C. 1989 Rotating District: Invitations were received from the Greater Washington, D.C. STC and the STC of New England. The proposals were reviewed and voted upon with the result being the STC of New England to host the 1989 Rotating Specialty on their 50th Anniversary. The show will be in conjunction with the STCNE Specialty on June 2nd; the Rotating Specialty with Ladies Dog Club on June 3rd; and the Framingham Kennel Club on June 4th.

The STC of Michigan relinquished its previous offer to host the 1989 Rotating to the STCNE in view of their 50th Anniversary.

D. The Fanfare Statue: All attempts to communicate with the manufacturer contracted to produce the statues have failed and other steps are being taken to resolve the situation. **Motion Brown/Wooldridge** that the Corresponding Secretary, Jackie Seelbach and Cindy Cooke formulate a letter to all individuals stating the situation as it is and advising that the Board is pursuing the situation. Allow them the opportunity to request their monies be returned. All records shall be kept insofar as orders received. **Motion amended—Hickman** that the checks be returned with the explanation that there will be a long delay in production and, when and if the statues will be ready to be sold, they will be notified and may re-order at the same price and claiming the same number of order. **Brown/Wooldridge accepted the amendment. Motion carried.**

E. Stalter Bequest: The Board of Directors had requested Marjorie Cohen to seek Court sanction to use excess income from this fund for general purposes of the S.T.C.A. This not being practical from the cost factor, Marjorie approached the Attorney for the Estate, the Individual Co-Executor, the Successor Corporate Co-Executor and Cornell University, the Residuary Beneficiary. She presented our request to use the excess income in the fund for the general purposes of the S.T.C.A. when the Board, in its discretion, deems it excessive, advising that there would be adequate reserves maintained to replace the Stalter Trophy and to maintain it properly. *Approval was given by written consent from all parties concerned.* **Motion Brown/Cook** that Marjorie Cohen keep the complete file of research papers and letters of consent at this time. When we convene at our meeting next October a Safe Deposit Box will be obtained for the authorized signatures of the President, Treasurer and Recording Secretary. The Stalter papers and other important records will be placed therein. **Motion carried.**

F. Bagpiper Editor: Response to our ad seeking volunteers was very low and we are still seeking a new Editor. Comparison costs to publish **The Bagpiper**, as is, received from cross country sources, ranged from \$2,800 to \$9,000 for 1000 issues. Consideration was given to cut back to 3 issues annually or even 1 issue annually, however, the first step was to find a qualified Editor. **Motion McArthur/Hickman** to table further discussion until we reconvene. **Motion carried.**

Motion Cooke/McArthur to adjourn until 7:30 p.m. this evening. The Meeting adjourned at 1:30 p.m. The Meeting reconvened at 8:15 p.m.



MINUTES OF THE REGIONAL CLUBS REPRESENTATIVES' MEETING

Green Oaks Inn, Fort Worth, Texas
March 20, 1987

The meeting was called to order at 10:15 a.m. by the Chairman, Marjorie Cohen. The Clubs represented and those in attendance were:

STC of Greater New York (Dick Seelbach); STC of California (Pat and Tony Gruda); STC of Greater Baltimore (Lynn Struck and Ani Kramer); STC of New England (Gary Carr); Greater Dallas STC (Jan and Tom Beaman); STC of Greater Houston (Jim Justice); Heart of America STC (Margaret MacDonald, Margaret Brokaw); STC of Greater Washington D.C. (Norman Prince); Greater Miami STC (Marjorie Cohen)

The Chairman commented that few Clubs had given her the name of their Representative. This makes it difficult to notify the proper person to receive notice of the Regional Clubs Representatives' meeting and furnish him or her with the Agenda. She asked each person attending today to communicate with the President of his or her Club and request that the Chairman of this Committee be advised of the name and address of each Club's Regional Representative. Although the appointed Representative may not be able to attend a particular meeting the notice can be passed on to someone else in the Club who will attend the show weekend. All Scottie friends are welcome; it is not limited to Representatives or members of a Regional Club.

Liability Insurance is still a big problem for most Clubs. A few have lost theirs and have been unable to purchase new insurance. In many instances, if it is possible to purchase it at all, the cost is prohibitive. This makes a Club vulnerable if it hopes to remain active and sponsor events.

Club Activities - One person present said that there has been some criticism of her Club as being too involved with their Specialty Show and not enough activity to attract people who do not exhibit. Others mentioned activities of their Clubs include handling classes, grooming sessions timed for their Specialty, pet grooming sessions, breeders' seminars, fun matches, participation in local Highland Games and taking part in field trials. The Greater Washington D.C. STC is fortunate that one of their members has the facility to hold flat races and other phases of field trials. All of these activities can generate enthusiasm of your members and attract new members too.

Health Problems will always be with us, but one causing concern recently is the deaths of their Scotties reported by owners whose dogs had been on a product called Filaribits Plus. Last January, at the behest of our Board of Directors, a letter was sent to all S.T.C.A. members alerting them to apparent problems. The letter urged all whose dogs were taking this medication and who were experiencing the symptoms described in the letter to ask their veterinarians to report this to the manufacturer Norden Laboratories.

At this meeting one participant had been in contact with an owner who lost two Scotties, both with liver damage. One, a 9 year old, died first and the autopsy performed at the State Veterinary School was reported to attribute the cause of death to the chemicals contained in the product. The other dog, a 7 year old, was taken off the product, but died about 4 months later. His autopsy report was said to be the same as the first dog.

The discussion that followed covered whether it is only dogs with some proclivity to liver ailments that are affected and whether dogs that are constantly afflicted with whipworms and are treated for them with medication may not suffer identical liver damage. Others questioned whether daily doses of other medication such as Styrid Caricide may not also be harmful, but it was generally conceded that the danger of heartworm damage from one mosquito must be recognized.

Use of other products such as those designed to combat fleas also have hazards. Continued use of some of these have caused liver damage and it was also conceded that many people, in their anxiety to use new products described as "miracle workers" fail to use caution. Often veterinarians don't tell you and few people read the fine print on a label until the damage is done.

The next meeting of the Regional Clubs Representatives' Committee will be at the West Chester Inn, West Chester, PA on October 2, 1987.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.

PROMISES! PROMISES!

Mr. Robert A. Marshall gave this critique of the dogs shown in the Regular Classes at the Rotating Specialty, March 1987 at Fort Worth, Texas.

Some years ago there was a Broadway musical "Promises, Promises" it lived up to its title. This afternoon, while I was jotting down my impressions of dogs exhibited today, I thought that this notion would adequately describe what I felt as I judged the entries this morning.

Most of us look at new litters and always find the dog or bitch that holds great promise. More often than not, we are disappointed. On other occasions, when a young dog grows up and lives up to his promise, we experience a very special joy and satisfaction. Several breeders shared that today.

The Best of Breed competition today was one of the best specials classes I've seen in more than twenty years of judging. There were at least six or seven exhibits that have kept their promise to their breeders.

The Best of Breed Dog, Ch. Simonsez Charlie The Charmer, is now almost five years old. I've seen him several times since he was a puppy and each time felt that he was measuring up to his promise. Today, I felt he fulfilled it!

He is a solid, honest (what you see from ringside is what there is) kind of dog. He moves well, has a good head and neck, is well bodied-up and in superb condition.

Most certainly my Best of Opposite Sex choice, Ch. Merriland Windy Moor kept her promise too! She is a classy bitch, sound, well-groomed and nicely handled. Her owner has been in Scotties for more years than we both want to remember and has produced a real good one for us. She is to be commended.

Hopscotch Here Comes Trouble, my Winners Bitch and Best of Winners, also promises to be a good one. She has all of the attributes of a champion and I think, will do well in the whelping box as well.

My Winners Dog, S and R's Carefree Show Stopper should also finish soon. He has a fine head, is a sound mover and has a good sharp expression. The Reserve Winners Dog, Passmore's Gringo Gold, came from the Puppy Class and has great promise. He is a rare one. A wheaten with good color, a coarse, hard coat, a dark eye, good pigmentation, and has real class. I think he should be champion soon and will (he promises), be a great credit to his breeder-owner.

Much of what we see as a young dog matures is predestined by his genetic make-up. There's not much we can do to change that once we make our decisions on the breeding. But we can provide the environment which allows for the development of his promised potential. That environment involves, among other things, grooming and conditioning.

Two of my pet gripes, and I saw both today more often than I would have liked, are long nails and soft hind quarters. Both keep a good dog from fulfilling his promise. A little bit more care to nails and more on-lead exercise will harden those quarters ... promise!

Thank you for asking me to judge, and to all of you who showed today, thank you for the privilege of allowing me to examine your dogs.

OBEDIENCE

By Ruth Tryon

You and Mac have gone through your paces in the ring and as you pick up your lead at the gate you know it was a disaster. Nothing went well and Mac put the final icing on the cake by requiring two commands on that last exercise. You begin to wonder what happened. You thought you two were ready, you have been training faithfully and trying to do all the instructor suggested. Of course, it was very warm in the sun and Mac hates the heat, then there were those children three rings away that were playing and distracting Mac, and let us not forget the dog barking outside the nearby ring at a crucial time in your heeling pattern, nor the Judge's too loud voice that scared Mac or his too quiet voice that you had trouble hearing when you were busy concentrating on what Mac was doing, etc., etc. The excuses can go on and on. But instead of making excuses, why not take the time and energy it takes to think them up, and try to analyze what went wrong and when.

You have been training faithfully but were you really ready? George Witte, an Obedience Judge and Training Director of Twin Ports Dog Training Club, wrote an excellent article which was published in the Winter 1985 issue of *The Bagpiper* which explains very well the chances you have of earning a leg based on the percent of time your dog consistently does an exercise correctly. It might seem discouraging but thinking about the article may well clue you into why you failed. Ask yourself honestly how consistent Mac is in training. Does he really do the exercise 8 out of 10 times, giving you a chance of earning a leg to 1 leg in 5 trials. To earn a leg every time he should do the exercises correctly 95% of the time. Not being really ready to enter a Trial the first time and not realizing it is no crime. It happens to nearly everyone. It only means we must think about the mistakes we made in the ring, how often Mac does fail to do that exercise, or a particular part of it correctly and realize we do have areas in his training that need extra attention. To make a mistake is no sin, but not to correct the error and not to teach Mac how to do it properly is hardly fair to him. If you accept Mac's errors he has no way of knowing he is doing things incorrectly. He cannot read the book, he can only read you and what he thinks you are teaching him. Therefore, sit down and make a list of those parts of the Obedience routine in the ring you feel were a disaster, large or small—and no excuses!—and then think about why Mac made those mistakes.

Lack of attention is one of the biggest problems with terriers so face it—you must spend more time on getting and keeping Mac's attention than handlers of some other breeds. Don't let that discourage you. Just keep on working with Mac and remember, Scotties are smart and quick and you want to make sure you are teaching him properly. He will learn bad habits as quickly as good ones! Watch good handlers train and observe what tricks and methods they use to gain and keep the attention of their dogs. Terriers will probably become bored more quickly in training than other breeds. Watch your training and gauge it so Mac does not get bored. When he is learning a new exercise and some repetition is necessary, intersperse it with things he does well so he can be praised and feel success and approval. Also play with Mac, for play relaxes both you and Mac. Never forget if Mac becomes bored with an exercise he will think up other ways of doing it and then you have to go back to the beginning. Break down each exercise into its smallest parts. For example, in heeling starting immediately with you is essential. If Mac delays only for a fraction of a moment he is already lagging and you are in trouble. So practice starting and work until you have Mac eager and as primed as a racer to start and you will have solved most of your lagging problems. Remember about every 15 feet the Judge will tell you to turn, halt, slow or fast. Watch your foot work on each of these changes. Work without a dog until you are letter perfect. If you stumble around on the changes why should you expect Mac to do them well? Practice each one of those changes so that Mac will be waiting for your cue to follow you as you execute the Judge's commands. As you work on these things you will suddenly feel Mac is really with you and each small piece of the whole is suddenly better. Put the heeling pattern together and you will be amazed at how well Mac heels and you will realize why he was so dreadful in the ring and how far you have progressed since that day. Break all the exercises down that way and then when you put them together you will discover you and Mac are really now ready for the ring. It will not only take far less time to accomplish than you expect but your training sessions become great periods of successes and fun.

Set your expectations high but also be realistic. Remember, if this is the first dog you have trained, you are probably contributing a large measure of Mac's problems. Don't watch an experienced handler earn 198 and be disappointed if you and Mac do not do the same. Maybe it will be your lucky day but if you don't get those high scores, don't dismay. Do your best and remember we all, dogs included, have good days and bad days. It is doing your best and enjoying it that makes training and showing dogs in Obedience a happy experience and brings you and Mac closer together. Don't use your inexperience as an excuse for failure or low scores but use it as a reason to learn more about Mac and training him. Accept the Judge's score even if someone tells you that you should have had a higher score, that he took off points on you and not on someone else's dog. Remember the Judge is in the ring and has the best view of what went on. The Judges are truly dedicated to the sport of Obedience—who else would stand out in the broiling sun all day, or be drenched by rain, or face a cold wind all day? Respect and admire them they are a class apart.

In the March 1987 Issue of the **AKC Gazette** James Dearing, Secretary of the AKC and formerly the Obedience Director, has written an editorial "Point of View." Read it. Showing in Obedience is fun, don't worry about competing against other handlers, enjoy being there with Mac, do your best. If you don't pass, don't despair or take Mac to task it is a team effort and there will be another Obedience Trial. Never forget Mac is a very special friend and you are, pass or not, a very special pair. When you do earn that green ribbon, be proud of it and the leg and most of all, your Mac. Let Mac know that. Happy obedience training and exhibiting.

About six or seven months ago reports began to surface about Scottish Terriers, that were taking a heartworm and other worm preventative known as Filaribits Plus, having liver damage. Some of the reports were that the damage was irreversible and the dogs died. Filaribits Plus is dispensed only on the order of a licensed veterinarian.

The members of the Board of Directors of the Scottish Terrier Club of America felt that our members should be aware of possible problems and a letter was sent to the members. It asked that owners of dogs that were on Filaribits Plus and whose dogs had experienced irregular symptoms of diarrhea, stools with mucus and/or blood, distended abdomens and loss of appetite have their veterinarian report this to the manufacturer, Norden Laboratories. The letter did not state so, but it was expected, that owners whose dogs were taking the medication and whose dogs died, would see that their veterinarian made the report.

The letter was mailed to the members very early in January. In the February 16, 1987 issue, of the **Marketing Report**, published by the Marketing Division of Norden Laboratories, one of their veterinarians wrote an article entitled "Filaribits-Plus Story Has Happy Ending." His article made it known that he was aware of our letter and then treated lightly the report they had from one breeder—and it was a very serious one. The article continued with "Although expecting a barrage of calls from Scottie owners and vets, we have received only 2 letters, both of which appear here. Enjoy the positive comments and compliments." Complimentary letters from two of our members who like the product were published at the conclusion of the article.

True, the time element between the date of the letter and the printing of the article was short; and true, perhaps the loss of the Scotties can't be directly traced to the product, but PLEASE, SCOTTIE OWNERS, DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT. Get with your veterinarian and if he thinks there is any possible relation HAVE HIM REPORT IT TO NORDEN LABORATORIES.

Your attention is also called to an advertisement for Filaribits Plus which appeared on page 166 of the April 1987 issue of the magazine **Women's Day**. At the bottom of the ad, in print so small you can barely read it, there is a disclaimer. First the composition of the product is stated. Thereafter the following appears: "**Warning:** 'Filaribits Plus (diethylcarbamazine citrate, oxibendazole) Chewable Tablets have been occasionally associated with hepatic toxicity including several fatalities. Close, monitoring of animals receiving this drug may identify early hepatic injury. The hepatic injury has usually been reversible upon discontinuation of 'Filaribits Plus' administration; thus dogs exhibiting signs of hepatic dysfunction should be removed from treatment immediately. Dogs with a history of liver disease or dogs receiving 'Filaribits Plus' concurrently with other potentially hepatotoxic drugs should be carefully monitored for clinical or biochemical evidence of hepatic disease. Dogs with established heartworm and/or hookworm infection should not receive Filaribits Plus until they have been converted to a negative status by the use of appropriate adulticidal and microfilaricidal heartworm therapy and/or hookworm therapy. A dog on prophylactic therapy should be examined for the presence of heartworm microlifaria every six months. **Precaution and side effects:** Occasionally in dogs, hepatic dysfunction, sometimes fatal, has been reported with the use of 'Filaribits Plus'. Clients should be instructed to report any signs and symptoms which may suggest hepatic dysfunction so that appropriate biochemical testing can be done. Signs and symptoms reported as accompanying hepatic dysfunction include anorexia, vomiting, lethargy, jaundice, weight loss, polydipsia, polyuria, ataxia and dark urine. The use of diethylcarbamazine citrate is not recommended in dogs with active D immitis infections.

Inadvertent administration to heartworm infected dogs may cause adverse reactions due to pulmonary occlusion. Overdosage may cause emesis. In U.S. Clinical studies only 1 of 487 dogs receiving 'Filaribits Plus' exhibited clinical signs of diarrhea, emesis and anorexia. **Caution:** U.S. Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian. See your veterinarian for complete dosage and administration information. **KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.**"

We are not in a position to evaluate the merits of Filaribits Plus nor is this article to be construed that it does. The sole purpose of including it here is to remind anyone who has used it and had adverse effects to see to it that your veterinarian brings your experience to the attention of the manufacturer.

CAREFREE NAIL CARE

The dog's nail consists of 1) the "quick", the heart of the nail and center of blood vessels and nerve endings; 2) "Soft tissue" which surrounds the quick, protecting it from infection and acting as a buffer and sensor to the sensitive quick; and 3) the hard-shelled covering, the protector of the soft tissue. This part of the nail has no blood or nerve supply. See Illustration #1 on the opposite page.

Trimming the dog's nails should be like our manicure, a painless procedure to shorten the hard shell.

Grinders work well for Scots. A Dremel Tool, which can be purchased at a hardware store, is easy to use. The variable speed model is not essential for adult nails, but is helpful for young puppies. Here are a few tips for its use:

1. Trim nails at the beginning of the grooming session, not later, when the dog and groomer are tired and irritable.
2. An assistant (see Illustration #2) is helpful to hold the dog upright and scratch the dog's chest. If help isn't available, the dog can be taught to lie on his back on a table.
3. Avoid battle. You can't win. If you suspect the dog will bite, put a basket muzzle on him before starting then ignore his offers of combat. Just go about your business of the nails. Any Scot will conquer his feeling of anxiety if you don't add to them.
4. The most common mistake made by groomers is trying to remove the same amount from each nail. Nails on the hind feet are usually shorter than those on the front feet, but each nail is a different length and must be evaluated before shortening.
5. Keep the grinder away from the dog's hair. It can, in an instant, become entangled in the dog's coat. Draping a towel over the dog will keep the hair away from the grinder.
6. To avoid heat: (a) use the coarse sandpaper disc attachment—NOT the smooth stones; (b) constantly move the grinder around the tip of the nail. If it is held in one spot, it becomes hot enough to be painful to the dog; (c) don't apply pressure. It isn't necessary; (d) set variable speed at #5 (fast).
7. Expose as much of the end of the soft tissue as possible, then touch lightly with the grinder underneath the nail. Learn to "feel" the soft tissue and stop there. The exposed soft tissue massages the quick which recedes from the friction and wears the nail back naturally as the dog walks. (See Illustration #3).

NAIL CLIPPERS may be used with the same method. They are much faster, but since the soft tissue can't "give", it and the quick are easily cut. Use them cautiously.

To shorten nails rapidly, File them every 3 or 4 days. Weekly or every other week care is adequate for maintenance. Having the nails cut back by a veterinarian makes as much sense as having your teeth pulled to avoid brushing—with one exception. Nails grow right back! Not only is it the most painful "operation" a dog can have, but frequently the nails become infected and deformed.

End each session with a special treat. The dog soon focuses on anticipating the treat rather than the nail filing. Be generous with the goodies. When trimming puppies or retraining anxious dogs, offer a reward after completing each foot or nail. The first couple of sessions with the "impossible dog" should end with the completion of one nail. You'll find these dogs respond quickly.

Years ago we noticed how relaxed the dogs became when their chests were scratched. Recent findings have shown a marked decrease in the rate of heart beat when the nerves in the chest are massaged.

Any dog can feel comfortable having a manicure. While quiet reassurance will help, orders of "Quit" or "Stop it" only create more anxiety and confusion. Keep it positive and please—PAINLESS.
