**CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Jackie Seelbach reported that the following Regional Clubs have been granted permission to hold Specialty Shows:

Jackie noted that many Regional Clubs fail to notify the Corresponding Secretary of change in officers. This notice should be sent as soon as elections are over.

A letter from the Scottish Deerhound Club of America was read, stating their position that the A.K.C. has no authority to force breed clubs to change their standards. **Motion - Cooke/Kirk** to support the positions taken by this club. **Motion carried.**

A request from Debbie Mackie to reduce entry fees for additional classes, i.e. Brood Bitch and Stud Dog Classes, was read. **Motion - Seelbach/Prince** to reduce fees. **Motion carried.**

**RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Helen Prince stated that she had received several requests for a set of labels from Regional Clubs, but there was no policy on the general distribution of our mailing list to member clubs. **Motion - Seelbach/McArthur** to sell at cost a set of labels to Regional Clubs who wish to use them in club-related activities. **Motion carried.**

Some concerns had been voiced by members who want the Roster to have bigger print, and the listing of members by state, which was omitted this time. **Motion - Cooke/Hach** to have all subsequent rosters include this listing. **Motion carried.**

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Sandy Lehrack distributed a detailed report for the year to date.

Income .....	\$50,263.56
Expenses .....	\$43,717.24
Net Profit .....	\$6,546.32

Our future financial health was discussed. The Treasurer stated that we have an expensive venture ahead, the 1991 Handbook, and that we need to find ways to cut some expenses. **Motion - Cooke/Luken** to charge club members no less than per unit cost plus postage for the 1991 Handbook (the actual cost to be determined at time of printing), instead of giving it free. **Motion carried.**

We also need to find some good continuous fund-raising projects. Helen Prince suggested the official STCA Pedigree Forms. Sandi Hach will come to the next meeting with graphics, cost, and paper sample. All Board members were asked to come to the next meeting with some dynamic sales ideas.

**A.K.C. DELEGATE'S REPORT:** Dr. Kirk reported that the A.K.C. is considering dividing the country into 9 zones for point determination, and that some registration fees have been raised. Hand-on tests for judges will be implemented permanently in December.

The A.K.C. is considering changing the requirements for registering dogs. They propose two types of registrations, one for show dogs and one for dogs that breeders do not want shown or bred. The non-show/breed registration can be changed later, **BY THE BREEDER**, if necessary. This is the same type several other national kennel clubs have, including Canada. It was the will of the Board that Dr. Kirk vote for this change.

The A.K.C. is also considering Agility Tests as a Non-Regular Class at Obedience Trials.

Our letter to the A.K.C. regarding the Norden Filaribits advertisement was received, with a response which we felt was unsatisfactory. Marjorie Cohen has written a response to Mr. Marden. **Motion - Cooke/Lehrack** to send Marjorie Cohen's letter. It will be posted at the Annual Meeting. **Motion carried.**

**COMMITTEE REPORTS: Awards:** Chairman Carla LaCoe stated that all was ready for the Annual Meeting. She has received the approval for tallying the Junior Showmanship points from Charlene Hallenbeck, and they will be added to the award rules.

**Trophies:** Sue Martin will step down as Trophy Chairman after the Rotating Specialty.

**Ways and Means:** Note pads with drawings by Jackie Balog will be for sale at 2 for \$3.00.

**Handbook:** A letter was read from Muriel Lee. The following advertising rates were set: \$100.00 for full page+\$10.00 per picture if not camera-ready, for the "Early-bird" promotion. A Full page will be \$125.00 after the promotion deadline. Half pages will be \$60.00 and Quarter pages will be \$35.00.

**Talent Search:** The material will be in the mail shortly.

**BAGPIPER:** Marjorie Cohen reported that she is using a mailing service now which has reduced the costs considerably. She has received a tax-exempt status, and received more than \$300.00 back which had been paid in sales tax. She is presently trying for a non-profit status from the Postal Service.

**Educational Seminar:** A list of possible topics was distributed. **Motion - McArthur/Luken** to form a committee to work on having a Two-Day Seminar, to report back at the next meeting with place, time, format, etc. Sandi Hach will chair, with Bob Moore and Tom Hill on the committee. **Motion carried.**

**Computerization:** Claudia Leffler reported with some suggestions. She is presently surveying the membership for ideas.

**Judges Education:** A letter was read from Neatha Robinson, expressing her concerns. It was agreed that we need to develop an outline of procedures, evaluation, etc., for use by this committee, and that the Seminar Chairman and Mini-Workshop Chairman should work with Judges Education.

**Advertising:** There have been many good reports about the single mailing so we will continue it.

**Nominating Committee:** Robbie Robinson submitted his revised guidelines. **Motion - LaCoe/Cooke** to add his suggestions and timetable to the SOP. **Motion carried.**

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

**New Clubs:** Reports were received and discussed from Tampa Bay and Pittsburgh. Columbus will be removed from the list due to lack of activity or response. The review of Guideline for Formation of New Clubs was tabled. Jackie and Helen will remain as Liaisons for Tampa Bay and Pittsburgh, respectively.

**Rescue:** Responses were received from 5 Regional Clubs, who all said that they did not need help from STCA, unless they had a case of many dogs at one time. We will discuss Rescue again at the next Board meeting. Betty McArthur reported that Susan Morris had been working on a problem in Oregon, and had involved the AKC, with the result that the kennel is closed down. A letter of appreciation will be sent to Mr. Firling and Mr. Brennan (AKC) and Susan Morris.

**Dog World Ad:** The material is being assembled and printed for the packet. Bill Martin's offer to continue as Contact Person was gratefully accepted.

The Meeting was adjourned until 8:00 a.m. on October 7, 1988.

The Meeting resumed at 8:05 a.m., on October 7, 1988.

**Mini-Workshops:** No requests to date. **Motion - McArthur** to add Guidelines as developed by Merle Taylor to the SOP. **Motion carried.**

**Special Article on Coat Color:** After discussion on the prohibitive cost of printing it in *The BAGPIPER*, it was moved, seconded, and carried to not print it in *The BAGPIPER*. The color photographs will be used in the Seminar. The Board will inform the Chairman of the Judges Education Committee of our feelings that we are opposed to the artificial coloring of any Scottish Terriers.

#### NEW BUSINESS

**New Members:** The list of prospective new members, with sponsors' names, was distributed. These names will be listed in *The BAGPIPER*. Voting will take place at the Winter Board meeting.

**Rotating Specialty, 1991:** The Scottish Terrier Club of California invited the STCA to come in June, 1991, in conjunction with the 25th Anniversary Celebration of the Great Western Terrier Club. **Motion - McArthur/Kirk** to accept this offer. **Motion carried.**

October 8, 1988

President Kathi Brown called the meeting to order at 8:40 p.m. She then requested a moment of silence for our deceased members: Milarie D. Bliss, Claire Brumby, John T. Marvin, Frances Moore, Katherine Osenbaugh, Polly Packard, Dr. Evelyn Parsons, Elizabeth Reilly, and Al Remmen. A remembrance also made for Archie MacLaren, "Viewpark", Scotland.

The attendance was 245 members, and a motion was accepted to dispense with the reading of the minutes and the Roll Call.

**President's Message** Kathi Brown stated that many new things have come about since the last Annual Meeting, such as the change in the procedures for new member applications. Talent Search Cards have been mailed and she hoped that everyone would respond promptly. The Board has also approved having an Education Seminar, appointed a Chairman, Sandy Hach, and wants to know what topics the membership would want at a seminar. On July 21, 1988, Alice and I lost a very dear friend, and the Terrier world a dedicated lover of the breeds.

Jack succumbed at his home in Doylestown, Pennsylvania, after a short illness. He was one of the last of the "great old men" of the sport and he will be greatly missed.

When Alice and I first met Jack and Bea many years ago, it was as if he had known us forever. They had the "knack" of making you feel at home, and indeed, when we visited their home there was a great feeling of warmth and comfort.

Jack goes way back, he judged his first sanctioned match in 1939 and was licensed for all terriers in 1947. His special love was the "Westie", but as he often told us, all terriers are "grand dogs". He would tell us to study and watch and learn from all terriers because they, by nature, were so close to each other.

I would especially look forward to our Delegates' meetings, because we would all sit together at the "Terrier Table", Tom Kirk, Walter House, Jack and Bea Marvin, Walter Goodman, and others. As you could guess, there was a lot of terrier talk and stories. Their trips to England each year were always a highlight to me, because of the Kennels visited and shows attended and people met. Bea and Jack had as many friends in England and Scotland as they have here.

I would also look forward to seeing and reading any new books he would bring back from his trips. Jack was an avid book collector as well as I am sure you all are aware, a gifted writer of books. His personal library consisted of over 3,000 volumes. He would always help someone with questions or information on terriers.

I remember a trip to their home, when Alice and I ended up sitting on the floor of his library with books piled all around us, like two kids, not knowing what to look at first! It always pleased him when people showed interest in the terriers and because of this, the library will be shared by Terrier people so they may get as much joy and education from them as Jack did.

Jack and Bea were a friend to everyone, it made no difference if you were a professional handler or a novice, they were always willing to help.

During his years he served major roles in other Clubs: President of the American Fox Terrier Club; President and Show Chairman of the Dayton Kennel Club; Vice President of the Associated Terrier Club; Vice President of Montgomery County Kennel Club from 1969-1977, and Board Member of the Fox Terrier Club of the Central States. He also served as President of the Dog Writers Association of America between 1973-1979.

Jack was a prolific writer. He was the dog columnist for the Dayton Daily News for more than twenty years. From his pen came more than 1,000 articles, many of which were published by the **American Kennel Club's Pure-Bred Dogs Gazette**. He was the author of five books: **The Book of All Terriers** (2 Editions); **The Complete West Highland White Terrier** (4 Editions); **The Complete Cairn Terrier** (2 Editions) **The Complete Scottish Terrier** (2 Editions); and **The Complete Book Of Dog Tales**. At the time of his last illness, he was in the midst of a book on the Fox Terriers. It was he who wrote the first ten chapters of **The American Kennel Club Source Book**, a history of the first hundred years of the AKC which was published in 1984.

Over the years, many honors came to him: in 1973 he was named Dog Writer of the Year by the Gaines Company; in 1975 **Kennel Review Magazine** named him the Outstanding Dog Journalist of the Year; in 1983 he received the Scottish Terrier Club of America's "Award for Outstanding Service." The American Fox Terrier Club awarded him their Governor's Award of Merit and the Wire Fox Terrier Club of the Central States presented him their Hall of Fame Award in 1988.

He is survived by his wife of almost 58 years, the former Bertha Slade-better known to us all as Bea; one daughter, Mrs. W. Stanley Walch (Valerie) of St. Louis; and three grandchildren, Gretchen Walch, Charles Walch, and John Walch. Because of Mr. Marvin's special interest in the Dog Writers' Educational Trust, Mrs. Marvin has established the John T. Marvin Memorial Fund within that Trust. 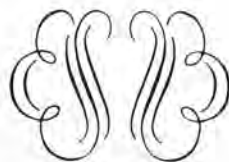

Bred-By Bitch, Open Bitch and Best of Breed were classes in which decisions were based on the finest points and many worthy dogs couldn't find placements. Thank you for the opportunity of judging this lovely class of puppies. It was an honor and pleasure to handle this grand entry - there was such depth of quality, and many classes with an opportunity to find just what you want.

The 6-9 month puppy division was delightful with 17 bitches and 6 dogs. My winner, Caevnes Abbey of Driburgh, was a pleasing brindle who is off to a promising start. She was sound, very appealing and very typey.

The 9-12 division winner, Brookhill Hope and Glory, was good both fore and aft, and showed flawlessly with both eye appeal and soundness. Her balance and movement gave indication of her overall quality. She is a small bitch with a lovely keen expression. More substance would be the ingredient that could have been added.

The Senior division was a delight. Any of the four division run-off winners, plus additional class winners, could easily have won on a different day. What a joy to have so many exciting choices.

The first three dogs in this class were very good. This was the toughest decision of the day. Both the first and second place dogs were very much my type, each offering specific virtues and few objectionable faults. The shame was in having to choose. The lovely ears of the Glenby dog were like a magnet and in all ways he was a splendid dog. The Balgair dog used himself to the best advantage and always appeared keen. He appealed to me most as a very workmanlike Scotty with a very low center of gravity and broad stance that would keep him steady even in a fierce den battle. He gave the appearance of great strength without coarseness or excessive size—his bone is impressive. Basically, he fit my picture of a large dog in a small package.

In the Senior girls, the Uncanny bitch was captivating with much eye appeal. Her expression and ears are lovely and she does not lack for body. She may well be the show dog, but her kennel mate the Balgair dog seems a slightly better dog in my eye. The Glenby bitch was lovely, but not quite as showy as the other three that day. She has much to contribute.

Best in Sweepstakes, not surprisingly, was the 12-18 month dog, Balgair's Encore. It was a wonderful group of youngsters.

The thing most worthy of positive note was the vast improvement in mouths, excellent bodies, generally good temperaments and coats. The heads and expressions were not as outstanding. There have been so many more pressing concerns to deal with in the past few years we have had to let something slip and expression, i.e. depth of eye, placement and fill under the eye have suffered.

Scotties are first and foremost dogs designed to fight underground battles in tight spaces where oxygen may be limited; stamina and great strength of jaw and neck are required. Good bodies with large lung space, short legs to maintain stance, strong jaws and, most of all, tenacity become the essentials for survival.

Then we came to Utility Work which our talented Scots did so well. The Scent article exercise also included our Canadian OTCH Scottie doing the 3 Canadian articles. This was followed by the Directed Retrieve with the gloves and again our Canadian OTCH gal did the Canadian Seek Back. Directed jumping closed the individual exercises. The program concluded with all 23 Scotties in the ring, the Utility dogs at one end in the Utility Stand and the rest of the Scotties lining the sides of the ring doing the Long Sit. All our Scotties were off lead and handlers were in the middle of the ring. It was quite a sight and we were all so proud of our lads and lassies. ## SCOTTIE OWNER LEADS CAMPAIGN AGAINST PUPPY MILLS IN THE STATE OF KANSAS

"I now realize I was far too innocent at first to visit these places, but eventually my feelings turned to anger and I was able to continue my campaign. It hurt to see puppies mistreated but my greater concern was and is the terrible conditions under which most of the breeding stock exists in these kennels."

So states Linda Meredith, a grandmother in her mid-forties, weighing barely 100 pounds, but by her own admission she can never again return to a normal life of being "just a shy Kansas housewife who happens to be fond of dogs, and especially Scotties." The Merediths have two Scotties and Linda says in the past 3 years of attending meetings and hearings, she never left home without "something Scottie" as a talisman.

I read several times the article entitled Puppy Mills. New Kansas Law Sets Standards in the August, 1988 issue of the American Kennel Club Gazette. This 2 page article details procedures set in motion in Kansas 3 years ago because of a television news report about a veterinarian who had been charged with cruelty to animals and who, after serving a period of public service, bought a U.S.D.A.-licensed breeding kennel not far from Topeka.

What happened over the next 3 years is the story of a housewife who angrily watched the news report, wondered how a person convicted of cruelty to animals could operate a U.S.D.A.licensed kennel and was shocked upon investigating that there was no law in Kansas to prevent it.

Kansas is a big state, but I wondered if the Linda Meredith, who spearheaded the drive to clean up the puppy mill industry in Kansas, a lucrative \$30 million a year operation, could possibly be the Linda Meredith I met by telephone ten years ago (and subsequently in person) when a heart-broken Topeka family asked my help early one morning to find a Scottie pup to help ease the pain of having lost their Scottie to cancer during the night. And that is a story in itself. Out of curiosity and admiration, I dropped Linda a note and found out she indeed is the same person.

Talking with her several times since, on the telephone and in person, I asked her how she could possibly, with no activist experience and having devoted herself exclusively to raising her family — how she could possibly have set the wheels in motion which led to the recent signing into law of Kansas House Bill 2219, a law which for the first time sets standards for the care and housing of animals and which provides for licensing and inspection. At this writing a committee is working on rules and regulations to carry out the law.

Not knowing where to start or quite how to proceed after watching the TV news spot about the veterinarian, Linda decided to complain to the Humane Society in Topeka. And complain she did, repeatedly, until that organization finally referred her to State Representative Ginger Barr, who at that time was a member of the Humane Society Board. She lives near Topeka and represents an area of Topeka.

For the first time, Linda found a sympathetic ear and together they outlined a plan of action and information-gathering to see if they could accumulate enough evidence to get legislators, kennel clubs and animal welfare groups interested enough to join in. The result was that for the next 3 years, Linda spent most of her time visiting kennels, talking with concerned people or working at a desk in Ginger Barr's office.

Linda learned of the Freedom of Information Act and was able to obtain and study inspection records of the U.S.D.A. and to request and study complaint files. She also obtained a printed list of the U.S.D.A.-licensed kennels and found there are 550 kennels listed plus 75 licensed puppy brokers, most of whom Linda says are breeders. (A newspaper article estimated there are upwards of 2,500 kennels in Kansas breeding dogs for profit, most of them located on back country roads and up until now out of reach of the law.)

Studying the U.S.D.A. files, Linda was able to learn of kennel record keeping discrepancies which ultimately resulted in the closing of several large kennels or revocation of their A.K.C. privileges.

At first Linda was able to visit kennels by watching for newspaper ads which named several breeds and then visiting the kennel ostensibly as a buyer. Linda heard many times over from kennel

owners, usually women. "I would so love to keep all these little darlings and just let them all run free." But Linda would browse casually through the kennel area studying conditions in the kennels and making mental notes. And more often than not, she would return to her car and cry, especially she says, if she observed badly mated Scottie adults in filthy kennels.

I have now read voluminous newspaper stories and seen photographs taken by animal welfare agencies, but it is not the purpose of this article to detail the many horrors involved, but rather to give credit to the housewife who literally put her life on the line because she cared enough to take on the puppy mill industry where one breeder-broker alone was found to have marketed 15,000 pups in a single year with sales totaling over one million dollars. And Linda says there are several kennels with breeding stock numbering upwards of 800 animals.

She continued, "Many times on leaving these kennels I felt as though I'd been run over by a semi but I was determined to complete what I set out to do — force Kansas lawmakers to accept the responsibility of giving more than lip service to the existing situation in Kansas, to protect generations of unborn puppies and kittens which exist on the breeding charts and in the income projections of the puppy millers."

She learned what the brokers thought about her when one of the most prosperous brokers called her to suggest she return to being a housewife but who accidentally left a phone line open and Linda was able to listen in on a 15 minute conversation between the broker and his employees. She was referred to throughout the conversation as a "humaniac".

As the Humane Society of America and the U.S.D.A. became deeply involved in the situation, one Connecticut TV news team arrived in Kansas to photograph puppy mills, following complaints of pet shops in Connecticut about sick puppies arriving from Kansas commercial breeders.

Others interested in animal welfare also became involved and Linda says the U.S.D.A. now admits that at least 30% of their licensed kennels in Kansas do not meet even the minimum standards of the Animal Welfare Act.

One day Linda received a phone call from the Humane Society of America about a shipment of puppies refused admittance to Canada because many of the pups were sick. Using the many avenues which had opened to her, she was able to trace the return trip of the sick puppies to Kansas and to learn that the well puppies had been shipped on to pet shops in the East.

Some of the veterinarians Linda and Ms. Barr called on for help had puppy millers as clients and were unwilling to rock the proverbial boat.

Linda says, "I'm 45 going on 100. I really wish I had never gotten into this — the nightmares of suffering animals, whose only purpose in life is to provide cash income to their owners, stay with me even in the daytime, but I try to keep busy. And by turning all this inner turmoil into rage against this sometimes cruel industry, I have been able to survive. Of course, there are some good commercial breeders, but we can't turn our heads from the unscrupulous ones who take advantage both of the animals and of consumers."

Thanks to Linda and Representative Barr, the unscrupulous ones are now being watched by the entire nation. Linda continues to be the catalyst and rallying point of the expose. I am proud to be her friend and I feel that legitimate and caring breeders owe Linda and Representative Barr a debt of gratitude. Hopefully adjoining states will now get into the act and legislation will be set in motion despite the powerful pet industry lobbyists to force kennels into line with stringent rules, licensing fees and meaningful inspections.

And perhaps because of Linda's original indignation over the TV newscast and because of all the individuals, kennel clubs, animal welfare organizations and legislators who joined her cause, we will find fewer but healthier pups in our nation's pet shop. And because Linda is a "Scottie person," that will most assuredly include fewer and healthier Scottie puppies.

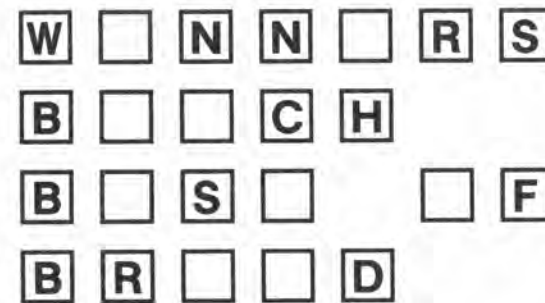

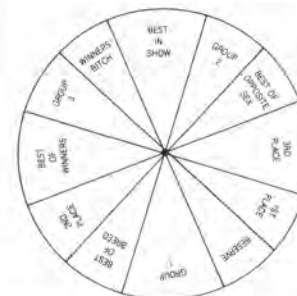

## THE RESPONSIBILITY OF SPONSORSHIP

If you have been an STCA member for very long, chances are pretty good that you have written a sponsorship letter for someone you do not know very well. For example, many of us have experienced a situation where another STCA member calls and asks you to sponsor Nancy Newpuppybuyer. You may even get the call directly from a would-be member who lives in an area where there are no STCA members nearby. There is nothing to make you suspicious, so you write the letter sponsoring someone who is virtually a perfect stranger.

This casual attitude toward the role of the sponsor has created some very serious problems for the STCA in the past year. For the first time in many years, an STCA member was brought up on charges before a trial board. Her sponsors were reputable and responsible people who took everything this person told them at face value. The results have been expensive and time consuming, both for the STCA and for the individual Officers and Board members.

In the past there has been a wide range of views on STCA membership. Some people felt that every Scottie owner should be encouraged to belong to STCA. Membership would give these people access to up-to-date health information about their Scottie, and educate them about responsible dog ownership, particularly with regard to breeding. The opposing view held that STCA membership should be limited to reputable breeders and exhibitors only. They, after all, do the work of the club, and they are the only ones who should be breeding anyway.

The current position of the STCA has, for the most part fallen somewhere in between these two extremes. Certainly we do not want to become a narrow elitist clik—there is no more certain death sentence for any organization. On the other hand, STCA membership is meaningless if it does not require high standards of conduct. While these standards are seldom articulated they comprise, at the very least, the following:

- a. STCA members will put the welfare of the Scottish Terrier ahead of their own interests;
- b. STCA members will work for the best interests of the STCA.
- c. STCA members will uphold the highest standards of ethical conduct and good sportsmanship.

In an effort to insure that prospective new members will meet these standards the STCA Officers and Directors have adopted a policy that the names of all applicants for STCA membership will be published in *The Bagpiper* before the applications are voted on by the Board. The general membership will now have an opportunity to review the names of prospective applicants and share with the Board any information that should be considered prior to the vote.

The down side of this new policy is that some applicants will experience a delay, in some cases nearly a year, between submitting the paperwork and being accepted to membership. This policy is not, however, to be construed as an attempt to discourage the membership of anyone who is truly devoted to the Scottish Terrier, whether that person be a breeder, exhibitor or just a person whose heart has been captured by a very special little dog.

To insure that our Club continues healthy growth STCA members must take more responsibility for the persons they sponsor. First of all, do not sponsor applicants just to be polite. Get to know them. Visit their homes and kennels. If you cannot go personally, talk to some trustworthy person who can. Second, explain the responsibilities of STCA membership.

Applicants need to know from the start that the STCA has high standards and expects the members to live up to those standards. Finally, warn prospective members of the potential delay. The kinds of members we are looking for will not object to a delay if they understand the reasons.
