**SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES  
MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE S.T.C.A.**

**Holiday Inn-Mission, Overlook Park  
Kansas City, Kansas**

President Kathi Brown called the meeting to order at 8:40 a.m.  
Officers and Directors present were:

The Chair entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Corrections were noted. **Motion McArthur/Seelbach** to accept minutes as amended. **Passed unanimously.**

The agenda was accepted as distributed, with additions.

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** Kathi Brown stated that she had received a letter of resignation from the Board from Margaret MacDonald, which was also sent to members of the Board by mail. **Motion - Kirk/Lehrack** to accept Margaret MacDonald's resignation. **Passed unanimously.** Discussion was held on the procedure for filling the unexpired term. Nominees were suggested and a ballot was taken. **John Sheehan (Minnesota)** was elected to serve until the next election. [John Sheehan consented to this position and will serve until October, 1989.]

Kathi also reported that she had attended the special AKC Symposium on Judges Education (Hands-on Judging) which was held in Rhode Island in November, 1988. Unfortunately, after all the suggestions and discussion, the AKC decided to scrap the plan.

The time frame for selection of judges for Montgomery County and the Rotating Specialties was discussed since we are finding that many judges are filling up their calendars three years in advance. **Motion - Prince/Kirk** to pick Montgomery County Regular Classes Judges at least 3 years in advance. **Passed unanimously.** Sweepstakes judges will still be chosen two years in advance, and the Rotating Specialty Judges will also stay the same, for the time being.

**VICE PRESIDENT/NATIONAL SHOW CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:** Betty McArthur reported that everything was set for the Rotating Specialty in June. Montgomery County is moving along according to schedule, and Claudia Leffler is keeping her informed about Houston, 1990.

Several bids for printing the Sweepstakes Premium List and Catalog for Montgomery County were presented. It was the consensus that the Superintendent, Dick Seelbach, should have the prerogative to choose one he can work with.

In response to the concerns expressed that there seems to be some confusion and delay in completing some of the tasks required to put on Rotating Specialty Shows, a checklist will be devised by Betty McArthur to give local show chairmen. **Motion - Hill/Kirk. Passed unanimously.**

**CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Jackie distributed a list of correspondence sent and received. Permission was granted to the following Regional Clubs to hold Specialty Shows:

- STC of Northern Ohio ..... October 28, 1989

A letter from Ginger Phelps with some suggestions for Montgomery County was noted. The Specialty Arrangements Chairman Nancy Burleson will be informed. Correspondence from Neatha Robinson was also read concerning the **GILWYN BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX TROPHY**. The Robinsons will not change the requirements for winning this trophy, as was suggested by a member.

The Board also turned down a proposal from the San Francisco Bay STC for a "matching funds" research project, to be funded in half by Regional Clubs and matched by the STCA, since we do not have the funds at this time.

A letter from Jackie Balog was also read to the Board.

**RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Helen stated that there has been some confusion with the members as whom one should contact if he/she wants to know the status of his/her membership, in cases where there is a question of whether dues were received by the Treasurer and the person does not appear on the Roster. **Motion - Prince/Lehrack** that any Board members who gets such an inquiry should refer them to the **Recording Secretary** who will determine the status and confer with the Treasurer. The **Recording Secretary** will then contact the person(s) with the necessary information. **Passed unanimously.**

As mandated by the Board at the October meeting, several estimates for printing the 1989 Roster were presented. The two lowest bids were from Helen and Marjorie Cohen. **Motion - Kirk/Seelbach** to authorize Helen have it printed. **Passed unanimously.** It will be mailed with the Summer BAGPIPER.

Ken and Peg James, and Terry and John Donaldson were reinstated due to a clerical error.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Sandra Lehrack distributed the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement for the period of October 1, 1988 through February 14, 1989.

Income .....	\$28,699.12
Expenses .....	24,022.39
Net Profit .....	4,676.73

Sandy stated that the STCA needs some serious fund-raising if we are going to print a quality Handbook and continue to produce the BAGPIPER. She will solicit come ideas from the Regional Clubs. Suggestions from Board members were tabled for later discussion.

John Cohen will be asked to continue as monthly auditor.

**A.K.C. DELEGATE'S REPORT:** Dr. Kirk distributed a written report and highlighted some of the AKC actions. As of July 1, 1989, the fee for Litter Registrations will be \$15.00. There is a new office, located in Durham, N.C., for handling registration questions and problems. It is open from 8:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m. and the telephone number is (919)493-7396. Registration forms have also been changed — no second name choice.

1. The ADOA and the AKC successfully fought Pit Bull regulations in Massachusetts. The judge declared that the regulations were too vague.

2. Non-regular classes which are judged before Best of Breed must be judged by a different judge than the one doing the regular classes.

3. Any show-giving club may NOT distribute information at their show function that does not offer an AKC Title.

4. The AKC declined to consider the 12-18 month class at all-breed shows and is not interested in changing the Bred-By-Exhibitor Class wording. The Board instructed Tom to pursue the Bred-By-Exhibitor problem.

5. In response to his inquiries for the Working Terrier, Dr. Kirk discovered that the AWTA has not approached the AKC for any official sanction. He will contact Claudia Leffler and offer to help with the AWTA's request, if needed.

The Senior Judges Association will have a "school for judges" in Pennsylvania this summer. They will incorporate some of the suggestions made by the breed clubs which came out of the Judges Education Seminar in November. Dr. Kirk noted that he was the proponent of the idea that breed clubs should be able to choose the third person on the panel, which the AKC vetoed.

**SELECTED COMMITTEE REPORTS: Annual Awards:** Chairman Izzie McCool stated that she had sent a letter to Regional Clubs asking for nominees. Nominations are due May 15, 1989.

**Handbook:** Muriel Lee met with the Board and reviewed her format and ideas. Sample paper and cover designs were circulated, and Muriel discussed her suggestions for advertising. She will use a full page in the next issue of the **BAGPIPER** to inform the membership of the advertising rates and solicit Club artists for the illustrations.

**Talent Search:** Merle Taylor gave the returned cards to the President who will find someone to sort and collate them.

**BAGPIPER:** Marjorie Cohen met with the Board and stated that the Fall Issue cost \$3,842.98, which included postage and envelopes as well as printing, for a loss of \$1,313.48. She informed the Board of the cost of mailing complimentary copies to judges. She suggested that we need to cut costs, and that we consider (a) not sending it to advertisers 1st class, and (b) raise the advertising rates.

After much discussion and consideration, the following decisions were reached:

(a) **Motion - Taylor/McCool** to cancel sending the **BAGPIPER** to judges. **Passed with 11 yes, 1 no.**

(b) **Motion - Seelbach/Moore** to cancel sending the **BAGPIPER** to advertisers 1st class. **Passed unanimously.**

(c) **Motion - Kirk/Krause** to raise the Advertising Rates. **Passed unanimously.** The rates will be effective with the Summer Issue. [The new rates are listed in the front of this issue]

**Obedience:** A letter was read from Ruth Tryon regarding the Obedience Demonstration for Montgomery, 1989. **Motion - Taylor/Hill** to have the Obedience Demonstration conclude 1 1/2 hours prior to the Sweepstakes judging. **Passed unanimously.**

**Educational Seminar:** Robert Moore reported in the absence of the Chairman, Sandi Hach. He stated that, based on the charge given to the committee at the October meeting, nothing conclusive had been agreed upon. A letter from Sandi Hach was read to the Board. Bob then gave some of the ideas that he felt might be pursued, and the Board agreed. The consensus was that Bob should pursue his ideas and report to the next meeting. Merle Taylor also agreed to serve on this Committee.

**Regional Club Specialty Shows:** Several members of the Board reported on the Specialty Shows they had attended since October.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

**New Clubs Update:** Jackie Seelbach reported that Tampa Bay STC had received Match Show status and Helen Prince reported on the status of the Greater Pittsburgh STC. She will be meeting with them this spring to help get their A-Match sanction.

Ann Wooldridge, known to all the Fancy, died suddenly on Friday, March 24, 1989, after a short illness. She was 59.

Known under the kennel name of Maranscot, she began grooming and preparing dogs for shows in the early 1950s. She owned The Dog House in Mill Valley, California, a grooming establishment for dogs and cats, where she held grooming classes and offered individual assistance to those interested in the breed. Her good friend, Mary Louise Porter, also of Mill Valley, says that Terriers were Ann's favorite show dogs because of their feisty temperament.

Ann devoted most of her life to Scotties. She was a member of the Scottish Terrier Club of America and served two years as a Director. She was a member of the San Francisco Bay Scottish Terrier Club and served as President, Secretary and Show Secretary. She also held memberships in the Scottish Terrier Club of California, the Northern California Terrier Association, the American Working Terrier Association and the Marin County Dog Training Club.

She judged Scottish Terrier Sweepstakes at the National Club's Specialty, Montgomery County in 1983 and at STCNE and NCTA Specialties. She also judged Sweeps for the Airedale Club and a variety of other Terrier breeds, hoping to someday apply for her own judging license.

Ann was the first exhibitor of the Scarista line in the United States, Ch. Aristocrat of Scarista.

Ann Wooldridge, as independent as the Breed she loved, will be long remembered! May she rest in peace.

An antique flea market adjacent to the 4 day Tulsa cluster last fall was a real treat for exhibitors on the lookout for Scottish Terrier collectibles. One of my finds was a commemorative brass Scottie pin advertising Sault St. Marie, Michigan. I bargained it from the original \$12 price down to \$6. A real shock though was the discovery of another stall where I could have bought the real thing, a live "Scotty Terrier" as the "breeder" from Kansas called her puppies.

Acting as if we knew nothing about Scottish Terriers, but were interested in buying a puppy, fellow exhibitor Sonya Neve and I questioned the woman about the breed. Were the tails supposed to be like that? (They were so gay they were almost flat on the back). How much grooming did Scotties require? Every three or four months, she told us, with some people doing just the heads, ears and tails.

In addition to "Scotty Terriers" and Miniature Schnauzers, this same breeder also specialized in "Miniature Dauchund" — (Yes, that's the spelling on her bill of sale). That bill of sale stated: "We guarantee our puppies to be in good health at the time of the sale. If you wish to take the puppy to the vet for a health check within 72 hours of the sale and anything is found wrong with the puppy that would prevent it from becoming a good pet, we will take the puppy back and refund your purchase price. You will be responsible for the cost of the health check."

On the positive side, the flea market bill of sale did give some minimal direction on feeding and general care, and the woman did express some interest in following up on her puppies: "We are proud of our puppies and we want you to be a proud owner. If there is anything that we can do to help you or answer any of your questions, feel free to write us or give us a call. We would appreciate a picture of your puppy when it is six months to one year old."

The woman had sold one female Scottie that day and told us that she liked to come down to the Tulsa flea market when she had puppies because people knew to look for her. She usually did pretty well there. Sonya and I asked the breeder how she managed to raise so many dogs. Did she do it in the house? No, she had it set up for the puppies where there was heat and automatic water. She'd rather raise the puppies where they didn't get too attached to her, so they would attach to the new owners easier.

If I thought flea market Scotties were bad, I didn't know the story that was waiting for me at the Wichita, Kansas shows in March. A woman who stopped to chat while I was grooming had three nine day old puppies at home, with no mother. This woman was a groomer who, as part of her business, grooms puppies in Wichita for a puppy broker. She'd always wanted a Scottie, so was interested when the broker told her of a Kansas breeder who was dispersing his Scottish Terrier breeding stock. The broker told this breeder that he would buy no more puppies of any breed from him unless he got rid of his Scotties, because he was producing too many of them and the broker couldn't move them fast enough.

As puppy mills go, this one was quite clean and well run, the groomer said of her visit of the operation in a small Kansas town. The breeder had all his dogs penned inside trailer houses. The Scotties were completely shaved down. Even beards were shaved off, reported the groomer. The Scottish Terrier this woman bought was #6, one of 47 Scottie bitches used for breeding there. (The breeder had named them all after horses, but they actually just went by numbers). Bitch #6 was purchased in whelp. At less than two years of age, she was having her third litter. This little Scottie which had a lucky reprieve from its assembly line life on the puppy farm died mere weeks later of a ruptured uterus several days after whelping the three puppies.

Amazing stories don't end down on the puppy farm. During the Fort Worth shows in March, I was exercising puppies on a grassy area near the show site when two fellows stopped by to watch. "Is that the way their tails are supposed to be?" one asked. "We have a Scottie, and its tail is very long and thin. Have you fixed their tails?" No, I assured them, these puppies had proper tails.

The men watched a while longer and finally asked, "Is that the way the ears are supposed to be? Have you fixed them?" I explained that the only thing "fixed" on Scotties was dew claws. I supposed that the men meant that their pup's ears were tipped over, and just hadn't stood up completely yet. I asked how old the dog was. Five months, they replied.

A friend who was listening to this interchange asked what the dog's entire ear look like. Was it pointed? Was it upright? The men described the ears as rounded and they laid down from where they joined the head, not just the ear tip. My friend and I diplomatically suggested that perhaps they did not have a Scottish Terrier. The men were emphatic that it was a Scottie. The person who sold it to them gave AKC papers stating it was a Scottish Terrier. I couldn't help but wonder if a Cocker Spaniel had gotten into that yard at the wrong time.

An education like this as to what goes on in the real world of dogs is eye opening. I'm sure you could trade me story for story. All of us who join the STCA sign a code of ethics that we will not sell puppies through pet shops or brokers. But do all of us take the steps to insure that dogs a generation or two removed from the puppies we sell will not fall into the hands of puppy millers, flea marketeers or simply nice people who have no business breeding dogs. Is one of those bitches in Kansas a grand-dog or great-grand-dog of your own much loved brood bitch or stud? If you can say "no" with total certainty, bravo! You must be one of the breeders who are selling puppies with spay-neuter agreements, and then following up to make sure that the spaying/neutering has been done. I hope we're on the increase!

Once in a while a story about some very nice people surfaces and unless an uninvolved bystander tells about it no one knows. It ought to be known because taking care of our Breed is one of the things we pledge to do when we join the S.T.C.A. — not that it needs membership in an organization when it comes to having the "right stuff."

An elderly lady in Pennsylvania became "very forgetful" and could no longer take care of her animals. She was placed in a nursing home and the County and the Humane Society stepped in and removed her animals — one of which was a 14 year old male Scottie. The Humane Society people had good hearts and sought to place the Scottie and somehow obtained Ruth Tryon's phone number and she referred them to Jackie Seelbach.

Jackie made many calls to find him a home, without success, but Claudia Maloney, who lives in Pennsylvania, has a good heart too and she took him to her veterinarian for his shots and took him home. Although he is a very sweet fellow, Claudia couldn't give him a permanent home.

Claudia drove him to New Jersey where she met Dick and Jackie Seelbach on the New Jersey Turnpike. Dick and Jackie drove him to Sturbridge, Massachusetts where they met Debbie Mackie who then took him to Groton, Massachusetts and placed him with Mrs. Claudette Hollenbeck who agreed to take him and give him a nice home.

## YOUR DOG'S HEALTH

---

The December, 1988 and February, 1989 issues of Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine's *Animal Health Newsletter* have some interesting articles which are summarized for you here.

### INFERTILITY IN DOGS

Those participating in research at Colorado State University report that the causes of infertility in dogs is not well documented. According to their statistics, once a dog has been diagnosed as infertile, less than 10 percent will return to normal reproductive functions.

However, the article points out that a dog should not be considered infertile on the basis of one seminal sample or a single breeding that is not successful—particularly if the dog has suffered from an infection as it may take many months to attain normal sperm production thereafter.

The article states: "The Colorado experience indicates that there are multiple causes of infertility and few of them have been thoroughly studied or defined. The aim of current research is to develop better methods for diagnosing and possibly treating the causes."

### ULTRASONIC FLEA COLLARS

The *Newsletter* also states that the Food and Drug Administration reports that ultrasonic flea collars may not work, and, even if they do work, the sound made may be sufficient to bother the dog or cat that has good hearing.

It is stated that "no one knows whether the sound actually repels fleas because no well-controlled studies have been done on the subject," and goes on to say that today's flea and tick preparations are not "poisonous if used correctly" and "there is no scientific evidence that ultrasonic collars can replace bathing, spraying, dipping, vacuuming, and so on."

## GETTING YOUR DOG'S ATTENTION — AND KEEPING IT

Some dogs seem to need a knock with the proverbial 2 x 4 to get their attention—others tune in with a whisper—most are in between. Anyone can get a dog's attention. Keeping it seems to be the problem most trainers face.

You see them at any show at every level, the team in the ring that is only half there. The human part performs the judge's commands while the canine member engages in activities such as crowd gazing, mat sniffing, doggie aerobics and/or judge licking. While the dog may well know the exercises, he fails to grace his owner with the slightest ounce of attention. If you look at life from a dog's point of view his choices make perfect sense.

Imagine a room full of three year old children. The teacher is trying to teach them colors—suddenly balloons fall from the ceiling—then a clown peeks through the window. Want to bet where the kids' attention falls? To a dog the sight of other dogs, food, people and smells are the balloons and clowns. You are the poor teacher.

As a teacher, you are competing with these things and you will get nowhere fast if you do not (1) use props and methods to be even more interesting than these distractions; (2) compel them to pay attention through conditioning that makes it more fun and pleasant to do.

Attention is initially best gained without the presence of clowns and balloons. Therefore it is important that your dog initially learn in any environment of as little distractions as possible. There goes the myth of "having them join a big dog class." An ideal class is 2-4 dogs

who will be working together. This is more fun for the dog than a totally private lesson because dogs do learn from one another. Problem behavior dogs should always initially learn privately, as they are too distracting to others, and take away from the rhythm of the group. Dogs in the group should be emotionally compatible but can be of different levels of training, working at their own pace. It is easier for you, the handler, to keep attention in this type of situation.

Most new trainers tend to over-verbalize or under-verbalize. Your dog will pay attention to quality, meaningful praise—not to a chain of fake sounding "good dog—heel—good boy." When he does something right speak exactly as you do at home for a good deed. Praise when you are genuinely pleased, not because you think you must speak. Be quiet when you feel he is trying, but concentrating, reprimand at the exact instant you make a physical correction.

When first training in your small group practice at home on new lessons at first with as little distraction as possible. Again, if you are not competing with clowns and balloons, your chances are better to win attention. As you gain confidence and your dog catches on to the new things you teach, venture into new territory (parks, matches, a visit to a friend's dog class) and work your exercises. If you need to "back up" and explain a step again among new distractions, be ready to do so.

The use of food seems to be a favorite method among the dogs I have worked with. When picking an Obedience prospect I would not consider a dog that did not have a great desire for goodies. Treats should only be given by hand, and only when your dog is watching and paying attention. This is the rule for home life as well as training. Your dog will learn to watch your hand, which is his guide in teaching many exercises.

Learning hand signals and correct pivots are essential attention exercises. These can be taught with food reward and come in handy in all levels of Obedience. I always do pivots before entering a show ring, and this really helps for attention. Plus, it gives you something constructive to do while you wait!

Food must be given with timing for it to be effective—a split second of watching and anticipating is necessary for true baiting. Directed jumping can be taught a young dog to gain wonderful attention and it is fun as well.

Correction is also a necessary element in getting, and keeping, total attention. If you are correcting properly and your timing is good, you must correct harder if the result is not there. If you are doing a correction over and over you must consider this factor.

Keep your dog's attention between exercises as well. Don't let him wander about or sniff and bother others during the entire training session. Keep him "on" you. If you cannot, stop there and work later. You want his focus the whole time. Have a "release" word such as "Okay" when you are truly done.

A little trick I have used in the ring is to use a phrase familiar to the dog, suddenly, between exercise when I feel I am losing total attention. One example may be "Want to go in the car?" To a dull dog, after a stand, it might perk it up for the off lead heeling. When my Scottie, Becca, was wilting before the off lead I said "All done let's go." She thought she was done and worked superbly. Watch out, though, Scotties are smart. I'd tricked her and she never fell for that particular one again. I have used many—use your imagination!

Don't let the clowns win!
