## A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends:

Through the *Bagpiper* I wish to express my appreciation to the Club for the privilege of serving as Obedience Chairman for these past many years. It truly has been a joy to work with so many wonderful Obedience people and I am most grateful for their enthusiasm, cooperation and friendship. They are a very special group.

Obedience training, while a marvelous hobby and dog activity for many of us, is also a necessity for ALL dogs. Therefore, once more I ask our breeders to concern themselves as much with the companion puppy they sell (so unfortunately called "pet quality" in a demeaning fashion) as the puppy they sell to be shown in Conformation. To be a companion to man is really what the human canine relationship is all about. So please, breeders, encourage the owners of your companion puppies to train their dogs in basic Obedience - help them to find a good trainer or school and follow their progress and give them as much help and encouragement as you do for the puppy in the Conformation ring. Not every owner is interested in showing in either Obedience or Conformation but the AKC Canine Citizenship Certificate is an excellent goal for these people. Encourage the new owners to do something with their Scottie - look into the Working Terrier Trails and that new exciting activity call Agility. The true test of a dog is how fine a companion and neighbor it is. Let us have all our Scotties pass this test with flying colors. After all, our Scottie companion is one of the best friends we will ever have.

My thanks to all the members who have served on the Obedience Committee and to all of you who have supported the Committee's efforts to bring the Sport of Obedience to the Scottish Terrier Fancy. We look forward to seeing many more Scotties in the Obedience ring and completing the AKS Canine Citizenship test and to future STCA Obedience activities. Dear Col's L.E. & Glenda Crawford:

The Scottish Terrier Club of Michigan, Inc. is most alarmed concerning your auctioning of purebred dogs, or any animal for that matter.

Our Club does extensive advertising in numerous publications to help quality prospective buyers to find reputable breeders of Scotties.

We feel the only people willing to sell at an auction would be the same people who breed to supply pet shops. These people mass-produce, with no regard to health, temperament or the standard of the breed.

Only certain people are suited to certain breeds. We encourage people to learn about the breed they think they want before making a decision. There are already too many people buying on impulse. All an auction could possibly do is encourage that.

Most breed clubs have had to form a rescue committee in the last few years. Many of the rescue dogs come from homes that became disenchanted with the dog after it grew up or did not turn out to be what they thought it would. The humane societies are already burdened by so many indiscriminate breeding and all an auction would do is encourage more of it.

We can assure you, all ethical breeders would not consider auctioning their puppies.

We hope you will accept this letter in the vein it is meant. We are caring Scottie breeders and implore you to give up the idea of auctioning animals.

A letter from an organization wishing to promote a Dog Auction was read. **Motion** - Hill/McArthur to object vehemently to this proposal, and to state in a letter to the individuals concerned that it is prohibited by our Code of Ethics and that we will proceed against anyone who participates in the activity. The S.T.C.A. will also notify the ADOA and Mr. Furling of the A.K.C. of this proposal. **Passed unanimously.**

In response to an inquiry by a member, it was re-stated that the policy of the Club is to publish the names of new champions ONLY if all of the owners of the dog/bitch are members of the S.T.C.A., and we regret that this policy has not be followed in the past. Any deviation was accidental.

**RECORDING SECRETARY:** Helen Prince stated that several membership dues had been received by the Treasurer after May 31st and that several members had stated that they had not realized that their checks had not reached the Treasurer until after the deadline. The following motions were considered:

license. Charging a license fee might be a more appropriate way to receive additional revenues. The proposal to increase the Recording Fee will be voted upon in December. **Motion** - Prince/Sheehan to empower our Delegate to vote NO on the question of raising the Recording Fee from \$.50 to \$1.00. **Passed.** (2) Delegates' eligibility requirements will be enforced more strictly in the future. (3) Judges will mark on their sheet if they feel that the dog/bitch that is put to Winners is worthy of a Championship or not. The rationale behind this is that some judges are not willing to withhold ribbons to dogs that do not come up to the standard. There was strong feeling that we as exhibitors are being penalized because the Judges are not doing their job.

**Ways and Means:** Aprons will be sold this weekend. Pedigree forms will be available from the Corresponding Secretary @ \$5.00 per package of 12.

**Informational Packet:** Chairman Bill Martin reported that this project has been very successful. **Motion** - Krause/Hill to continue the informational packet service and the *DOG WORLD* ad. **Passed unanimously.**

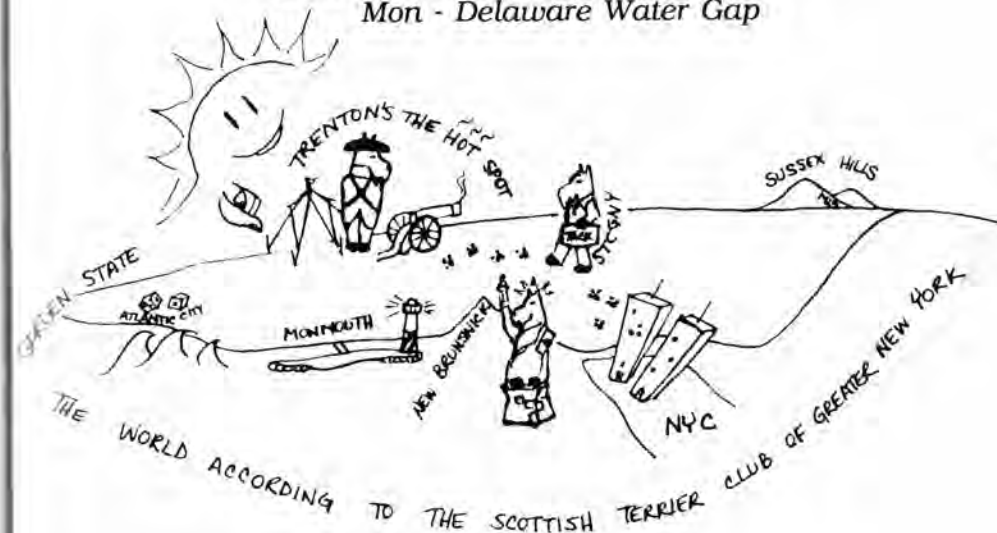

## MOTHERHOOD AT ITS BEST

OR

### HOW TO KNOW YOUR DOGS HAVE GOOD MOTHERHOOD SKILLS

Who says we've bred a lot of our "showdogs" too much for length of tail (ear, etc.) at the expense of adaptive, survival of the species skills like being a good natural Mother?

Let us introduce you to Toby (Drumachose Hurricane Toby in that great computer at CKC), who showed her owner, Jean Davis, and us, that mothering is in her "genes".

Toby is the diminutive daughter (approximately 13-14 pounds - full grown) of a somewhat less diminutive mother - PeeWee (Ch. Drumachose Thing Two, approximately 17 pounds - full grown). PeeWee was only bred once because of both her size and the size of her puppies. She

reared three - a male who grew to normal size and two females who were both Toby size. So Toby went to a loving home on a non-breeding contract. Last summer, when Toby was nearly two years old, a pair of orphaned kittens about two weeks old were left on the Davis' doorstep. Jean's husband had been a wildlife officer and so, in the small community where they live, Holyrood, Newfoundland, any orphaned animals find their way to the Davis home.

As already noted, Toby has never been bred, but she had been in season some weeks before the arrival of the kittens. So, undaunted, she got on with the job. Jean knew Toby had adopted them. She cleaned them, tried to carry them around with her, and tried to get them into her favourite chair to curl up with them. She needed help with the last of these! What Jean was surprised to learn was that Toby really took her adopted mother duties very seriously. Toby was also nursing them. Her vet's best explanation was that having been in season at more or less the right number of weeks before the kittens appeared, Toby decided that this "instant" family was hers and carried on accordingly.

It would be nice to say that mother and kittens lived happily ever after. However, that was not to be. Both kittens were lost to feline leukaemia, to the great distress of their "mother". She exhibited an almost complete regression in terms of house training that took some time to overcome.

We can say that Toby is fine now, but both we and her owner are left wondering if we had not sidelined an all-star mother because of her size!

As I sit down to write this stab at an article, my young bitch lays on the couch beside me, our spayed "rescue" bitch is asleep at my feet, my stud dog dozes in my husband's recliner. They have had their dinner, after their walk, and are sleeping the "sleep of the just". Later, they will get their teeth brushed, and all four will sleep on my bed. Spoiled, sweet, loving, yes, but boy can they pull a Jekyll and Hyde act! All I have to say is the word "Rats" and they are eager and tense. Should I set the rat cage on the

floor, they would all happily acquire minor injuries biting, scratching, and rooting at that cage. Heaven help the rats if they ever got out. This is largely instinct, and partly, I hope, my training. Between those two factors, my mellow, laid back wheaten dog, Ch. Glad Mac's Taliesin the Bard, earned his Certificate of Gamesness on September 23, 1989.

Training my dogs for "going to ground" involved the same basics as any training does; encouragement, praise and reward. It also took some labor, in the form of building liners, digging trenches, and getting the one into the other, and buried. The cost was minimal (renting a trenching machine) and the time was pretty minimal, too.

My husband and I built the liners in the summer of 1988. We never got them in the ground that year, so we covered them in black plastic to make them dark. We taught Maggie and The Bard to go through first one section, then two, then all three. Me on one end, my husband on the other, back and forth until they were totally comfortable with the idea. A little liver helped say "Good Boy/Girl!" We then introduced the rats, housed safely in a #200 VariKennel, at one end. Maggie loved that, and scratched, dug, whined and hooted desperately to get to the "varmint". The Bard was not so sure, even though the rats looked and smelled a lot like the mice he had caught in the house the winter before. With encouragement from me, he began to whine, bark and dig pretty well, though not so frantically as Maggie. We practiced three or four days a week, and after a month or so it was time to head north, to the Pacific Northwest Jack Russell Terrier Network's Fall Hunt. A wonderful lady there, who had miniature dachshunds, had brought her rats, housed in the more typical wire cage. Seeing them up close got our dogs really "bothered".

The Bard was first up of our two, and when we were called I took him to the start, told him "Go Through", and set him down. He charged the hole, got his front end in, then backed out. OH, NO! Oh, well - OK in Novice. He proceeded to march up to the rhododendrons near the tunnel entrance and lift his leg! Life's "Most Embarrassing Moments." But, his macho duty done, he turned, went for the tunnel, ran it and worked his rats well for the thirty seconds required to pass the test. Maggie was next. She went through a similar routine, at first refusing. The judge told me "She's testing you, she knows what you want, start her again." I did and it was all business and another 100%. We moved both dogs up to Open, but The Bard, feeling he had done his job for the day, backed out of the tunnel when he hit the second turn. Maggie met the time limit for the tunnel run, but worked the rats for only forty-five seconds, fifteen short of her title. I was happy, though. It was only our first trail, and there was always next year.

In November, Lucy (Glenlee's Sable Fox) came to us here in the soggy northlands from sunny California. She, though young, gave strong signals as to her "rat quotient", jumping, snapping, barking and scratching whenever she was let near the cage. The "Siberian Express", Spring, and finally, Summer arrived, bringing Scottie #4, our "rescue" Gussie. We rented the trencher, moved the liners from the barn, and placed and buried them. Lucy and Gussie didn't get to learn one tunnel at a time, but following Momma Maggie they quickly became expert tunnel runners. Rat time again! Encouragement was superfluous for the new girls from then on. Both of them wanted blood! Lucy very vocally, and Gussie with a deadly stare. Sadly, the stare doesn't qualify at a trial, but she wouldn't make noise. Oh well, we love her anyway. Lucy, I felt sure, was a first time qualifier. Her feet became jet engines, and she hit Mach Four in that tunnel. She barked, bit scratched and whined without end at the cage. Maggie and The Bard knew their job, and never faltered. We only practised two weeks, but almost every day. North Again!

At least this year it wasn't pouring down rain, but 95 degrees wasn't great either. We took what was given to us, and arrived once again at the Old Redmond Golf Course. I had been really encouraging Maggie to work longer, and she was going great. The Bard was his usual self (Why should I work so hard when I know I can't get to the rats). Lucy was a Warp Nine Killer, and Gussie was ... Gussie. When the dust had settled however, Maggie had rerun last year's performance, Lucy choked and wouldn't enter the tunnel at all, and Gussie stayed consistent. She has never been to a show, let alone a terrier trial, and was a month and a half from starved, flea bitten bald, and mangy, and worked exactly as she did at home. Her 50% in Novice may be her best lifetime score, but she's a winner to us.

The real triumph was where I didn't expect it. The Bard knew, apparently, that "home practice" and "trial-do it right", because He hit the Mach Four, and went for blood at the end of the tunnel. I had trouble getting him out of the trapdoor, but when the judge told me that he had qualified, I was the embarrassing one. My grin must have been nuclear in intensity, and my eyes were tearing. I hugged my boy so hard he looked at me as if it'd lost my mind. He could tell, though that he'd made me proud of him, and he was happy too.

To temper my joy, he didn't do as well in the class for dogs who had already earned their CG. He didn't duck quickly enough and went for the tunnel so fast that he hit his head, right at the stop, on the liner's top board. It made a LOUD thump, but he pulled back, ducked and ran the tunnel, but just didn't bark. I couldn't blame him with the whopping headache he must have had. A long sleep in the van on the way home, with suitable stops for refreshment (they like that Scottish restaurant McDonalds. Fella makes a right good "haggis" burger) and a long night on Mom's bed put his right again. He didn't even get a bruise to show for his troubles.

Well, that's the account of two trials and one Certificate from a Pacific Northwest Scottie owner. As for training tips, all I can say is that, yes, a buried tunnel as described in the latest Handbook is pretty vital. It is, however, no guarantee of easy success. Game of some sort is a must. My rats have long since figured out that they are safe, and so don't worry. I can't bring myself to let the dogs kill "Frith" or "Grodin", or even a nameless mouse or gerbil bought for the purpose. I have been told that killing in the tunnel will make a dog a better worker. I personally don't feel that ANY title is worth the life of another feeling creature, however humble. This is only my philosophy, others, however, may make their own choice in this matter. Finally, time, patience and love help any Scot to do its best at whatever it attempts. I hope our story has been interesting to you, and even inspire some to go to a Terrier Trial, perhaps even to enter a dog. True, they do get wet or dirty, or ruin a coat somehow, but they'll have fun doing what they were, in the beginning, bred for.

## YOUR DOG'S HEALTH

---

Misty Sarvis writes "For the years that I have had Scots, I have been fortunate to always have reports of 'negative' on their fecals without giving it much thought. I attributed it to good, clean, wholesome food and little else. My vet enlightened me with some wonderfully written articles which I have condensed and simplified in the hopes the layperson could easily understand *Toxocara Canus*."

### TOXOCARA CANUS As Explained by Misty Sarvis

Toxocara are large, heavy-bodied nematodes, the adult stage of which reside in the small intestine of their final host. Adult *Toxocara* have a life span averaging 4 months. Individual female *T. canis* can produce 200,000 eggs a day, and because intestinal worm burdens range from one to several hundred worms, infected animals can contaminate the environment daily with millions of eggs. Round worms are by far the most common; however, the other species of nematodes, such as hookworms, gnathostomes, and others found in various host mammals are capable of causing disease in human beings.

People become infected when they ingest infective *Toxocara* eggs in the soil or on contaminated hands. Direct contact with a dog plays a secondary role in transmission with the exception of nursing bitches and pups. The confined litter area, including the pups' coats is a place for intense egg excretion. Frequent and thorough hand washing should be used to avoid the risk of becoming infected.

Children under 12 years old appear to have the highest infection rate. Exposure can occur from contaminated soil in parks and public places as well as backyards or in houses. Early signs may be an extended abdomen and occasional coughing and wheezing. Recovery can take place without specific treatment and most are asymptomatic if the infection is by a few larvae. Few human fatalities are caused by *Toxocara*, but extensive contact may affect the lungs with flu-like symptoms and the eyes, with partial or complete blindness.

Dogs become infected with *Toxocara canis* by ingesting hosts animals such as mice, birds, earthworms, and others; a pregnant bitch to her developing pups; a lactating bitch to nursing pups, and ingestion of infected vomitus or feces. A pregnant bitch releases the larvae during late gestation and they migrate through the placenta to infect the pups. By the fourth postpartum week they have matured in the pup's intestines and are already producing eggs. There is no placental transfer of larvae in cats. When mature dogs ingest *Toxocara* eggs, most larvae do not undergo further development and translocation to reach the dog's intestines; rather, they are distributed to the lungs, liver, kidneys and muscles.

The most appropriate treatment for dogs is with Piperazine compound, most commonly used by veterinarians. Puppies should be treated at 2, 5 and 11 weeks of age. Repeated treatments are necessary because of continued infective larvae from milk throughout lactation and from ingestion of eggs in the environment. Lactating bitches should be treated at the same time as the pups. Two treatments, 10 to 14 days apart, should be adequate for newly acquired weaned pups. Older dogs should have a fecal examination once or twice a year and treatment given if indicated. Owners are

advised to promptly dispose of expelled worms by burning or flushing down a toilet.

There is no easy and inexpensive way to rid animals of somatic ascarid larvae other than by isolation and repeated treatment of bitches for several generations to prevent reinfections and gradually reduce and eliminate the larvae in the tissues. Daily administration to bitches from the 40th day of gestation to the 14th day after whelping lessens the *Toxocara* in the pups by 98% to 100%. Thus, administering to the bitch before pregnancy might prevent prenatal transmission to future litters, unless the bitch acquires a new infection during pregnancy or early lactation.

Moist soil around kennels or doghouses where dogs have been chained are the prime areas where *Toxocara* eggs may survive for months or years depending on weather conditions. No chemical is known to be effective, although full sunlight will cause eggs to disintegrate. Turning the top soil to bury the eggs can keep children from contact along with steam sterilization or replacing sand in sandboxes. A flame-gun can destroy nematode eggs on concrete floors or a solution of 1% sodium hypochlorite may be mopped or sprayed on cleaned surfaces. This strips off the outer protein coat of the eggs so they won't stick to surfaces and can be rinsed away.

Since the proportions of American households owning cats and dogs are on the rise, it is more important than ever for careful personal hygiene, elimination of intestinal parasites from one's pets, and awareness of potentially contaminated environments.
