FIRST CLASS MAILING FOR THE BAGPIPER

The time and circumstances when first class mailing of *The Bagpiper* takes effect may not be clear to all members; this explanation may help.

First class mailing was first offered in 1987 when the bills for dues were sent out. However, the first issue that was mailed to anyone by first class mail was the Spring Issue of 1987. Consequently all first class mailings are either initiated or renewed annually with the Spring issue. Orders for first class mailing can be accepted ONLY with the payment of dues prior to the distribution of the Spring issue each year. Limited bookkeeping facilities preclude changing records at any other time.

REGIONAL CLUB'S SHOW CHAIRMEN — are reminded that a marked catalog for your Club's Specialty or Specialties must be sent, soon after the date of your Show, to the S.T.C.A. Historian, Cindy Cooke, whose address is 2097 S. 4th St., Rt. 1, Kalamazoo, MI 49009. Photos of the primary winners should also be sent to her as soon as possible after the Show.

CHANGES OF ADDRESS — All members should continue to send current information about change of address, change of marital status, change of telephone number, etc. to the Recording Secretary, Mrs. Helen Prince, 7415 Newburg Drive, Lanham, MD 20706. If your membership is a family one please tell Mrs. Prince whether the changes affect all members of the family. It sounds like a broken record, but it must be repeated: if you do not give Helen timely notice of your change of address you may not receive your *Bagpiper* unless you are on the first class mailing list. Third class bulk mail is not forwarded. The magazine is destroyed by the postal authorities even though they may send the Editor your new address. Then it is not possible to send a second copy by third class bulk mail.

Helen would also like the members to know that in some instances sets of labels are prepared and sent to the Chairmen of several Committees (Trophy, Advertising, etc.) some time in advance of the date of their use. It is difficult to effect changes of address later received on those labels. This may result in mail being sent to a previous address. Please be assured that all effort is made to keep the mailing list up to date and current.

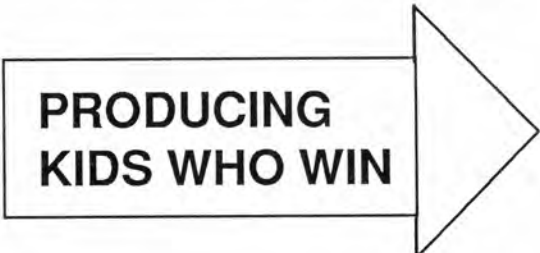

**SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES
MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE S.T.C.A.**

Days Inn, New Bedford, Massachusetts
June 2, 1989

President Kathi Brown called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. Officers and Directors present were:

The Chair entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the March 18, 1989, meeting. Corrections were noted and the minutes were approved as corrected. In Summary, *BAGPIPER*, p.14, under the A.K.C. Delegate's Report, change #3. to read: "A show-giving club may not participate in any event that does not offer an AKC title."

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Kathi Brown stated that the Raffle for Montgomery County will be the painting by Marjorie Cooke, instead of the portrait by Joann Glaser as previously reported. Joann's generous offer will be used for the Rotating Specialty or Montgomery County 1990.

In order to expedite the business of our meetings, Kathi noted the letter sent to the Board by Izzie McCool. She had suggested a form for having all committee reports mailed to Board members before the meeting for preview, and that all motions pertaining to this business should be prepared in writing, if possible. Although there will not be a form, it was the consensus that all committee chairmen will be responsible for sending out a report of their business and the necessary motions, to reach the Board no later than 2 weeks prior to a meeting. The Recording Secretary will provide the mailing labels upon request.

A letter from a Collie breeder concerning the use of ETHOXYQUIN, a preservative in dog foods, was distributed and read. [A summary of the letter appears elsewhere in the *BAGPIPER*.] Regional clubs will receive copies for input by the membership.

VICE PRESIDENT/SHOW CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: Betty McArthur noted that all Board members and committee members had received the memo with deadlines and information pertaining to this Rotating Specialty, Montgomery County 1989, and the Rotating Specialty in Houston in 1990. She reported that Boomer Balls will not be available as Sweepstakes prizes this year at Montgomery, but suitable trophies will be purchased instead.

Betty also stated that possible new headquarters for 1990 has been found, the Great Valley Hilton and Conference Center, located in Malvern, PA, about 7 miles from the Turnpike off Route 202. Jackie Seelbach has been to the hotel and feels it would be perfect. **Motion - McArthur/Seelbach** to contract with the Great Valley Hilton for 1990 after we have clarified the contract requirements. **Passed unanimously.**

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Jackie Seelbach distributed a list of correspondence sent and received. Permission was granted to the following Regional Clubs to hold Specialty Shows:

She noted that Cindy Cooke is still not receiving marked catalogs for the Historian files.

A letter from Mrs. Elizabeth Bullock offering a trophy for the breeder of the BEST IN SWEEPSTAKES winner, Montgomery County show, was read. **Motion - Seelbach/McArthur** to accept the trophy offered by Mrs. Bullock, in memory of Mrs. Bernice Ayers, to be known as the BERNICE AYERS MEMORIAL TROPHY. It is a sterling silver water pitcher, valued at \$1,500, to be won three (3) times by the same person(s) for retirement. The trophy shall be kept in the U.S.A. The trophy will be awarded at the Annual Dinner. The winner does not have to be a member of the S.T.C.A. **Passed unanimously.** The Awards Chairman shall inform the winner of its care, insurance requirements, and method of return.

The animal abuse problem in Ohio as reported by Ms. Hornick has been resolved, with AKC intervention.

Board member Ruth Ann Krause requested that club newsletters be sent to Board members so that they can be kept informed of Regional Club activities. Per a letter from the STC of Dayton, it was agreed that it might be too expensive for small clubs to add 14 additional persons to the mailing list. They suggested that the Corresponding Secretary make available at meetings the Regional Club newsletters. A notebook has been instituted for this purpose and will be available at Board meetings. Regional Clubs should be sure to send a copy of their newsletter to the Corresponding Secretary. A letter was received from the French Bulldog Club in response to our sending them Rescue Guidelines. [See "Letters to the STCA" page.]

Mrs. Martha Merrill also sent a letter to the S.T.C.A. inquiring why we did not respond to the questionnaire sent to parent clubs on health as reported in the AKC GAZETTE, March 1989. Jackie noted that the S.T.C.A. did not receive the questionnaire or its follow-up, so she called the AKC to get a copy of the letter. She will respond to the AKC Gazette that we would like to have them consider the following health problems pertaining to the Scottish Terrier: Cancer and melanoma, especially lymphosarcoma; canine cramp; VWD; epilepsy; subluxation of the patella; CMO; hypothyroidism; and dermatological disorders.

A list of 16 prospective member units (20 individuals) was accepted for printing in the next BAGPIPER. **Motion - Bigelow/McCool.** **Passed unanimously.**

TREASURER'S REPORT: No report of financial activity. The list of persons who did not renew their membership was distributed. **Motion - Prince/Taylor** to accept. **Passed unanimously.** In the absence of the Treasurer, the President reported that a letter had been sent to Conrad Ambrette requesting the return of a prototype of the Fanfare Statue, and that he had complied.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: No report

A.K.C. DELEGATE'S REPORT: Dr. Kirk distributed a written report. He noted that 2 items were of particular interest: Barbara Jarmoluk was suspended for 6 months as result of plea bargaining in connection with the Mackay affair, and that a new position, Chief Operating Officer, has been created at AKC. A search is on for someone to fill this position. Any members who have questions about the limited registration should contact Dr. Kirk directly.

SELECTED COMMITTEE REPORTS

Annual Awards: Chairman Izzie McCool presented the list of persons nominated for the Silver Service Medallion, Gaines Good Sportsmanship Medal, and the Anstamm Achievement Award. A ballot was taken.

Obedience: A letter from Ruth Tryon concerning the Obedience Demonstration in October was read and Betty McArthur also read her response to Ruth. Although the Board is sympathetic to her concerns for ring size and time constraints, we noted that we are working with limited space at the West Chester, especially if it rains. If we have a change in venue next year, we may be able to work it out better for everyone concerned. The softball field and the lower parking lot as alternative sites will be checked on by Helen Prince.

BAGPIPER: Jackie Seelbach stated that she had received petitions signed by 57 members objecting to the action taken at the last Board meeting in cancelling the sending of the BAGPIPER to judges. She

also received a response from 16 of the 117 judges. After lengthy discussion, the following decisions were reached: **Motion - Seelbach/Prince** to send the *BAGPIPER* to those judges who return a reply to an inquiry, stating their interest in receiving the *BAGPIPER*. The same letter shall be sent to all newly licensed judges. The *BAGPIPER* shall also be sent to judges by 3rd class mail. **Passed unanimously.** **Motion - Taylor/Seelbach** to direct the Editor of the *BAGPIPER* to appoint a person to solicit advertising to help make the publication more cost effective. **Passed unanimously.**

Educational Seminar: Bob Moore sent a packet of information for each Board member to read. Discussion was tabled until October because we need some clarification.

Ways and Means: A number of suggestions for fund-raising projects were discussed. For Montgomery County, we will offer bib aprons, red with the STCA logo. **Motion - Brown/Hill. Passed.** As a long-range item, we will order pedigree forms to be sold in packages of 12 for \$5.00. They will be printed on parchment-type paper, two-color, with the STCA logo. They will be ready for sale at Montgomery, and then will be available from the Corresponding Secretary.

Nominating Committee: A letter was read to the Board from Judy Hughes. She suggested some improvements and clarification in the guidelines for this committee. It was moved to table discussion of guidelines changes until the Board has had a chance to review them. **Motion - Taylor/Bigelow. Passed unanimously.** Judy also expressed her concern that a member of the Nominating Committee had acted precipitously before the slate was finalized in sending out a letter soliciting support for a nomination on an opposing slate. **Motion - Taylor/McArthur:** The STCA Board will write a letter to John Anderson highly recommending that he apologize to co-members of the Nominating Committee for his actions in the violation of the secrecy of the executive committee of which he was a member. **Passed.**

The March, 1989 issue of the *AKC Gazette* carried an article entitled "CHOOSING A PROFESSIONAL HANDLER" by Laura Holum-Hardgen. This article is recommended reading. We feel, however, that there are more considerations than covered in it.

One of the hardest questions most breeders are asked is, "How do I find a good professional handler?" The answer to that question is not easy; it often depends upon the answers to a number of questions.

The *prime question* is, how will your Scottie be cared for. The good handlers think of the dogs before their own gain.

To what extent do you wish to use a handler? If you want to use a handler to go to a specific show or circuit, a great many people will serve you well. However, if you wish to place a dog with a handler over an extended period of time - to finish a championship or campaign a champion, the choice can become very limited.

How much are you willing to pay? Obviously, some handlers are much more effective than others. In the long run, a \$75 handler may be cheaper than a \$50 person. Of course, this is also contingent upon the answer to the first two questions. The \$50 handler may be very appropriate if you are alone at a show with two or more dogs.

Some handlers have complicated fee schedules. If a dog is boarded, what is the daily rate? How much is charged for grooming and coat maintenance? How much is charged for show and travel expenses? Is there an additional fee for Group of Best In Show placements? What other fees are charged?

If the owner decides to cancel the agreement, how much is he or she liable for? For example, at least one handler has an agreement that all handling fees and expenses are due once he sends in entries even though the dog is not taken to the show nor shown.

What breeds does a handler show? Even the best Working Group handlers may have problems showing Scottish Terriers yet their fees may be comparable to the better Terrier people. Experience with Scotties is important.

Does the handler show his or her own dogs? It is unfortunate that this question needs to be asked, but some handlers have taken clients' money only to show their own dogs in competition with their client's.

How many Scottish Terrier dogs, bitches and specials does a handler take to shows? If more than one dog of each sex is taken, who will actually do the handling in the show ring? If you paid for a specific handler, that handler should not show another dog against yours. If the handler shows another dog against yours you are at a disadvantage.

Does the handler require a contract? Contracts are not necessarily bad, but most often a contract is written to benefit the person who created it. No one should sign such a contract without having it read and interpreted by a lawyer. The small fee charged by the lawyer can be returned many times in savings should a dispute arise.

What type of facilities does the handler have for the care of dogs? Dog owners should make every attempt to visit the handler's kennel to see how he or she cares for, grooms and feeds their charges. Don't overlook transportation facilities. There are many distressing stories on how dogs are treated by handlers and exhibitors on the road. Dogs cannot be simply left in crates for extended periods of time without exercise.

What is the reputation of the handler? Dog people love to gossip. A few questions at dog shows can reveal a lot about a handler. It is important, however, to look beyond what is said to learn the facts. It is human nature not to look with favor upon a handler who always beats you. Questions about a handler should be directed to how he or she treats dogs.

You should know if the prospective handler has the tendency to enter a great number of shows

regardless of how many points your dog needs. Or he gives little regard to whom the judges are simply to run up the fees. Good handlers know their judges and enter your dogs in specific shows where they have a good chance winning. Some handlers have been known to travel long distances, passing up local shows in order to run up fees. Good handler will keep you "in the know" when it come to choosing the shows your dog is to be shown at. Again, this will be a part of the handler's reputation.

How are the handler's dogs groomed? The prime consideration is the care your dog gets. That means that time must be spent observing the handler on every occasion possible.

Handlers should have enough help so that dogs are not left unattended. Thieves have brazenly stolen dogs from unattended grooming areas; dogs left in crates in the sun have gotten severely ill or have died because of the heat. Dogs have developed urinary infections because they have not been periodically exercised.

Some handlers have been known to show dogs in clipped, sprayed coats. Judges are not dumb. They can tell when a coat has been artificially treated. Lacquer hair spray simply cannot replace a stripped coat on a Scottie.

In conclusion, remember, the most important consideration is not winning or cost, it is how your Scottie will be taken care of.

JUDGE'S CRITIQUE
HEATE WAVE ON A HOT DAY

It gave me great pleasure to go over an entry of 89 Scotties at the STCA National Rotating Specialty held in connection with Ladies Dog Club Show on June 3, 1989. A spacious ring, an efficient steward, nice exhibitors and my beloved Scotties made my work easy. Scotties usually don't like hot weather, and it was really a hot day! My ring was in full sun during my judging. Surprisingly, only one Scotty did not show properly, not due to the warm weather but due to some funny noise in the ares. All the others showed the desired Scottie temperament.

I would like to give my general impressions of the dogs: some very nice types, in general nicely presented, nice heads, some showing too much down face, ears not bigish, but some were placed sideways. By the way, I do not mind bigger ears as long as they are correctly placed. Dark, almond shaped eyes were prevalent. Only a very few bites were doubtful. Toplines were correct as well as tail carriages. Coats don't seem to be a problem nowadays. But a real problem in the breed seems to be fronts.

I bought my first Scotty in 1965 and bred my first litter in 1968. I got to know what a "good front"

is throughout the years. The Standard says: "Forelegs straight or slightly bent with elbows close to the body. Scottish Terriers should not be out at the elbows." Later in this paragraph you will find the most important "NOTE: The gait of the Scottish Terrier is peculiarly its own and is very characteristic of the breed. It is not the square trot or walk that is desirable in the long-legged breeds. The forelegs do not move in exact parallel planes - rather in reaching out incline slightly inward. This is due to the shortness of leg and width of chest." Most of the Scotties shown were far too narrow in front (a Fox Terrier front), and NOT a typical Scottie front. The Standard also asks for a broad and very deep chest, well let down between the forelegs. This means that Scotties have the sternum well in front of their forelegs and not a shallow chest.

A very helpful publication to understand Scottie fronts has been published in 1951 in England by Dr. Conrad Bremer, the well known vet and breeder of the Ortlely Scotties. I quote a few parts of this valuable article, published from time to time in the Year Books of the Scottish Terrier Club of England. "If a dog's shoulder and hindquarters are correctly formed its freedom of movement is assured. In order to be certain of this movement, the dog should be watched from in front, from behind, and from the side. Only from the side can one tell how much ground a dog covers in each stride. Well-bent shoulders, stifles and hocks, ensure great power with plenty of freedom." And another part: "The bony framework of the Scottish Terrier is constructed to give agility, balance, freedom of movement and great power in a small compass. The standard of the breed portrays a dog of this type, and for the type alone, breeders and judges must aim."

I am a "front freak" - not only in Scotties - I know. Fronts are a problem not only in the USA, but also in other countries. Hindquarters were not as bad as fronts were. Some were lacking in drive and if the standard says "well muscled and powerful" it also means hindquarters. A Scottie must have well muscled hindquarters and not only "pudding".

Some of the Scotties shown were too thin and lacked body substance. Scotties are balanced, compact - not fat- dogs. A longer headed dog is also longer in body and vice versa. Mentioning heads - leaving too long hair on the skull (standard: short, hard hair) gives the impression of having a coarse skull and out of proportion to the muzzle. Trimming, in general, was excellent, but some had too much furnishings. If a Scottie has the desired hard and wiry weather-resisting coat with dense undercoat it will be impossible to grow furnishings (like in Yorkshire Terriers). In the Best of Breed Competition I found one or two not very carefully trimmed. I do expect, especially when they are in this class that they do look really worth a Champion even if they are already. I chose in every class the dog I would have liked to take home. Unfortunately I had only one WD, WB, BOB, BW and Best of Opposite Sex. One stood out in the Best of Breed Competition and I was pleased to give her BOB.

Ch. Anstamm Heat Wave - Just the type of Scottie I like, especially when it is a bitch. Balanced, not overdone in any way, very feminine but showing great substance. Typical head, correct front, excellent, well muscled hindquarters, beautiful topline. Hard coat with dense undercoat and put down to perfection, not a hair out of place. A joy to watch her moving and what a show girl! I wished she were mine.

My Best of Winners and Best of Opposite Sex was **Balgair's Encore** - a masculine dog, correct size, excelled in head, correct front and deep chest. A compact dog with level topline. A hard brindle coat and a sound mover who showed to his advantage.

Winners Bitch was **Anstamm Got It Maid** - (she) was a half sister to my BOB and of similar type. An 11 month old bitch full of quality, feminine head, also typical in front, compact body, strong hindquarters, moved with drive, possessed an excellent coat and moved and showed well to her win.

All of this was topped off with an excellent dinner, wine and conversation to make my stay in the U.S. most memorable.

My best wishes to the Scottie people.

WEE SCOTS STAGE
FIFTH ANNUAL COLLECTORS' SHOW
As Covered By Margaret MacDonald

Twenty-two states were represented by 140 Scottie collectors at the Wee Scots fifth annual collectors' show last June 22 through June 25 at the Ramada Inn in Columbus, Indiana. This city is the home of the Wee Scots, organized in 1985 by Donna and Jim Newton. The communication link is their Scottie Sampler which has nearly 800 subscribers across the country and abroad, and is a quarterly publication in tabloid size of 20 pages of more on Scottie collectibles.

It is difficult to write a beginning and end to this account of the weekend because it was almost a non-stop marathon of exciting events—the opening Scottie parade, a silent auction, consignment auction, fashion show, flea market, Scottique, special displays, workshops, — great hospitality and great fun. If you arrived, as I did, a virtual stranger to the group, you left with an emotional tug, feeling that you were leaving 139 close friends.

To help the group to become acquainted Wee Scot buttons were color coded to identify the wearer as a first time, second time etc. attendee, and the Newtons chose a unique way to get better acquainted with those present by designating their table as the Captain's table and drawing names for each meal to see who joined the Captains. This was a great hit.

The entire weekend, with all of its activities, could have been sheer chaos as packing cases of collectibles were constantly being moved in and out of various display rooms, but the committee, composed of national Wee Scot members (membership is included with a subscription to the Scottie Sampler) saw to it that time schedules were adhered to, speeches were short, food was terrific and that ample time was set aside for just getting acquainted and renewing friendships. I had mixed emotions about attending this show, but I left the group feeling that this new Wee Scots movement, which is sweeping the country, serves a definite purpose in the Scottie world.

True, the thrill of the chase is somewhat diminished for those of us who have collected for many years, but we enjoy finding an occasional Scottie collectible and slowly building our collections. I am not acquainted with anyone who shows Scotties who is not, in some measure, also a collector.

As I drove through southern Indiana, I realized there are areas of the country where flea markets are a major industry. Many, if not most, of the collectors present for the weekend search flea market on a regular basis. Some number their collections in the thousands of items. Also, we learned of some who split up and comb the markets with walkie talkies to summon each other to a find.

The plus here, as I see it, is that many Scottie items such as glassware, playing cards, matches, company logos, jewelry, books, magazine covers, old quilts, children's toys, to name only a few, might be lost forever if they were not rescued from oblivion and preserved for all to enjoy through groups such as the Wee Scots.

Some collectors have catalogued their collections photographically with a history of the article on the reverse of the photograph. Album viewing was a popular segment of the weekend and it was surprising how many albums were devoted to a single type of collectible such as match cover, playing cards, magazine ads and covers, postcards, etc.

On Saturday 22 persons set up displays for a five-hour viewing session. Tables were 6 feet by 30 inches and, for uniformity, all coverings were floor length. One lady set up an artificial Christmas tree to display her ornament collection. A California couple flew in with their collection of Black Forest clocks. Some displayed only jewelry. One surprise was that one of the collectors had the cookbook issued by the Heart of America STC in the early 70s during my 14 year stint as the Club's president. There was a rush to learn if the books were still available, but both editions of 500 were immediate sellouts. I was pleased to autograph the cookbook for this owner.

My table displayed items which are either rare or one of a kind or which have an interesting history. However, I included the new Baldwin double bronze, of which only 75 were cast. One item I

displayed is a license-plate size porcelain covered metal rectangle with two black Scots in the center of the bright white field; the perimeter is a raised porcelainized black border. Last year I took it to Montgomery and Dan Comerford said the finish is a process done in Germany in the 30's, but he didn't know what its use was. Neither did Donna and Jim Newton. I am still in the dark about its history, but I enjoy it anyway.

One room held a "Scottique" where we could purchase new Scottie items. My firm resolve not to buy anything completely collapsed at the door to this room. Then the evening flea market was not to be believed—an entire room of Scottie collectibles. Only photographs could tell this story, words cannot. Suffice it to say the weekend came closest to bedlam when the flea market doors were thrown open!

The opening Scottie march early Friday found 26 Scots and their owners in Scottish regalia. Several Scotties wore sun glasses (the sun WAS bright) and tams. Many owners matched their costumes to their Scotties'. The motel had a lake and several acres of landscaped area and it was here the Scotties, led by a piper, paraded to the cheers of the crowd.

A human fashion show at the evening banquet featured home-made and store-bought divisions, but the hit of the evening was the appearance of two burly gentlemen wrapped in Scottie beach towels who proceeded to shed the towels and pirouette (to use the term loosely) in brightly colored Scottie-patterned boxer shorts. Camcorders were much in evidence as well as regular cameras and the two men laughingly insisted on buying up all the film of their performance.

Displays were not to be dismantled until the closing on Sunday morning, but the display room was not only locked but chained to protect collections.

Representatives of Black & White were present for the weekend and donated playing cards as table favors. They attended partly in the nature of fence mending because of the problems they have had with their catalog merchandising, and they are moving their fulfillment headquarters to New York. Several of my new friends helped me pack my display and load my car, but as I traveled through Illinois later that afternoon I realized I could hardly concentrate on the road so I stopped at a Ramada Inn, skipped supper and "crashed" for 14 hours in the delightfully air conditioned room. Greatly refreshed and wide awake I was on the highway by 6:30 A.M. and spent the rest of the trip home mentally reviewing one of the most pleasant weekends I have spent. Though the show ring will always be my first love, I am sure that next year will find me back in Columbus proudly wearing my Wee Scot pin and ready for another happy weekend among Scottie collectors. May their tribe increase.

GROOMING TOOLS

There are two basic types of stripping knives, the type with flat or rounded bottoms between teeth and the type with v-grooves between teeth. The v-Groove type is sharp and tends to cut the coat. I recommend the first type because it does not tend to break the coat. Old time handlers would dull this latter type by running it several times down the strands of a hemp rope, or they would soak it for several days in a glass of salt water (which will not work on a stainless steel knife).

Many breeders prefer to use finger cots to give their fingers some traction while pulling hairs. Others use natural lava rock which was mentioned in previous articles. I will be happy to direct anyone to this material. Give me a call.

The best stripping tools are your thumb and forefinger.

The best way to pick a pair of scissors is to go to a vendor and try it in your own hand. Scissors should fit your hand like a pair of shoes fit your feet. Scissors should be balanced; not too big or not too small. Scissors should move smoothly and easily, never bind.

Single edge thinners come in sizes based upon the number of teeth. The more teeth, the finer the cut. Spend money to buy the best pair that you can. Thinning scissors are difficult to sharpen and inexpensive varieties will dull quickly. Better quality thinning scissors will last much longer between sharpening.

Brushes are a matter of choice, I prefer UNIVERSAL, brand because it allows you to get in deeply into mats and splits them more easily. Other brands tend to skim over the top giving a less desirable job. If you have mats, grab the coat at the base of the hair at the skin line and use the brush to gently pick at the mat. In this way you can often save the coat without cutting out the mat.

Combs too are a matter of choice. I prefer the GREYHOUND or brands that copy the GREYHOUND. These combs are well built, and the teeth do not tend to bend. This type resists bending or breaking and will last a long time.

There are two types of coat dryers; the type that blows moderate strength hot or cold air, and the extractor which blows high intensity air to force water off the hair shafts. In the first type, you must continue to comb or brush the coat as you direct the air stream into the coat. This is a disadvantage. Because you have to brush continually, you tend to remove more hair than is always desirable. Also, hot air tends to dry the coat. The extractor does not blow hot air, but simply drives the water off each individual hair. Another advantage is that as you are drying your dog, the machine blows hairs out straight and you can see the skin. This gives you a chance to see any irregularities in the skin.

Most groomers will choose the detachable blade OSTER A-5 clipper. OSTER has recently brought out a variable speed model, but for Scotties this new variety is not necessary. The A-5 has recently come down in price because of this new model, making it a bargain. With good care, the OSTER A-5 will last a life time with a minimum of service.

OBEDIENCE

At long last we can tell you there will be an Obedience program during Montgomery County weekend, Saturday morning, October 7th, to be exact. The program is "Scotties Can Do" and will be divided into two parts.

First we will have an "Abbreviated Fun Match" which will be followed by the main event, "How We Are Judged". In each class two Scotties will be selected by the participants in the Abbreviated Fun Match and the Judge. These dogs will then, in How We Are Judged, be judged in Novice, Open and Utility Class work with the Narrator explaining how exercises are scored and points are lost. It should

YOUR DOG'S HEALTH

Does the food we feed our dogs endanger their health? A Collie breeder wrote to the members of our Board describing ill effects suffered by her dogs when she fed a commercial dog food which she discovered contained the chemical "Ethoxyquin".

This lady told of her dogs being virtually free of any problems but then developing skin problems when fed one of the "better brands of food" dispensed only by dealers. She then switched to another brand and, at first, her dogs seemed to thrive on it. However, new problems arose soon - the bitches started skipping heats, or when bred missed. Those that whelped produced sickly puppies that did not survive. Then her stud dog became very ill and the veterinarian diagnosed the problem as an immune breakdown "triggered by a virus or a chemical."

The virus seemed improbable and the lady then checked the ingredients of the food she was giving her dogs. One of the ingredients was "Ethoxyquin" which a friend told her was a chemical manufactured as a rubber stabilizer and also used as an herbicide, an insecticide and a preservative.

She called the FDA to tell them of her experience and they asked for additional input from other breeders who had the same problems as well as a list of the dogs foods that contain this chemical.

When she again changed dog foods to one that does not contain "Ethoxyquin" her stud recovered although he received other treatment to which he did not respond until she changed food.

We have been told that there are some arguments temporizing the effects of this chemical, but this lady, relying on her experiences as well as those of some of her friends, would like to hear from dog owners who have had similar experiences. 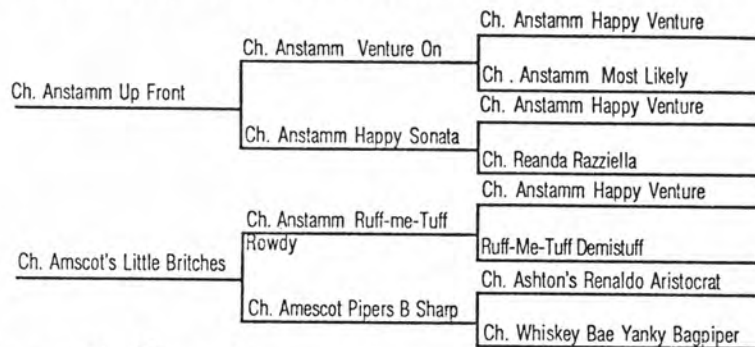

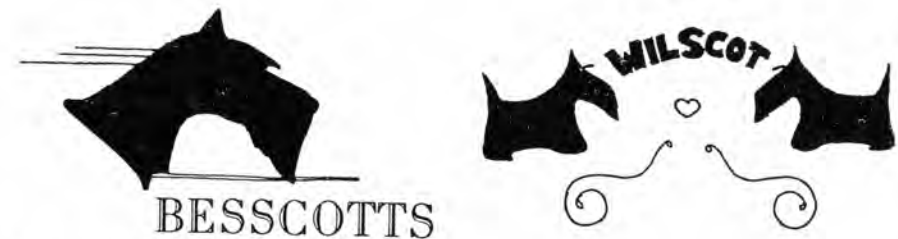
