'STCA' LOSES MONTGOMERY COUNTY HEADQUARTERS

Over a year of planning, the expense incurred, and the hard work that went into encouraging members to take care of their rooms and hotel surroundings at the Great Valley Hilton Hotel and Conference Center. All the time that was spent by Ruth Ann Krause and her Mother, getting the tote bags ready to hand out to members; and the pre-Sweepstakes plea from Ruth Ann, asking members to make an extra effort so we, the STCA, would be invited back to the Hilton in 1991.....all this went down the tubes on Tuesday morning, October 9th. This is when I received a brief phone message from the hotel informing me that we would not be welcome back to the Hilton. In fact, they have instituted a "No Dogs" policy. I did mention the problem on the third floor Saturday evening into Sunday morning, but it fell on unconcerned ears. I was told that the STCA's weekend was discussed at a meeting of the hotel staff, resulting in the STCA being without headquarters in 1991.

We asked members to clean up after their dogs, many did, and we thank you but far, far too many did not. We asked members not to walk their dogs near the hotel building; many obeyed and we thank you, but many did not, especially after dark. We asked members not to allow their dogs to bark excessively, many conformed and we thank you, but again, far, far too many ignored the requests and the complaints. Members were asked not to allow dogs loose while the dogs were alone in the rooms; most complied and we thank you, but many did not. One elevator was left a terrible mess early Saturday morning. Some very thoughtless, uncaring member left their dog's mess (diarrhea) for others to clean. The hotel staff saw the effort being made by members scrubbing the elevator carpet and they took a dim view of the incident. There was some damage to several rooms and far too many complaints about barking dogs made to the front desk.

As of this date, November 1st, I have contacted several hotels in the area, the "No Dogs" policy is spreading! I do not know where we will be next October. Perhaps those who totally disregarded all our rules and common courtesy will volunteer to help find a decent hotel that will accept dogs...and their owners!

MOLECULAR GENETIC DIAGNOSIS OF
SCOTTISH TERRIER von WILLEBRAND DISEASE

In dogs and man, von Willebrand disease is a bleeding disorder of variable severity that results from a quantitative or qualitative defect in von Willebrand factor. This factor circulates in blood and normally causes blood cells called platelets to adhere and plug up holes in blood vessels when injury occurs. If the factor is missing or defective, the dog may bleed severely.

In Scottish Terrier dogs, the condition can be severe and sometimes fatal. The disease is inherited as an autosomal recessive trait in Scottish Terriers.

Currently, detection of affected dogs and carrier dogs is usually done by von Willebrand factor antigen testing. This testing procedure often yields frustratingly variable results because the test result can be affected by variables such as sample collection, sample handling, heat (estrus), pregnancy, vaccination, and hypothyroidism. For this reason, it is highly desirable that a more reliable test be developed for dogs and dog breeders. Use of new molecular genetic technology holds promise for the basis of such a new test.

Recently, a long-range, five-year project has been started to develop molecular genetic probes to reduce the incidence of genetic diseases in dogs. This large project, under the direction of George J. Brewer, M.D., is a cooperative effort of the University of Michigan Medical School and the College of Veterinary Medicine, Michigan State University.

In the case of von Willebrand disease, however, it will not be necessary to wait for the long term development of canine genetic probes because there exists a short-cut method of developing a direct genetic test for diagnosing canine von Willebrand disease. This fortunate situation exists because the human von Willebrand disease gene has been cloned and can be used for the genetic diagnosis of von Willebrand disease in the dog. Applying this human genetic probe to the Scottish Terrier breed will take some work and financial support but probably can be accomplished in a year rather than the five years needed to develop specific canine probes from "scratch." In fact, the human genetic probe has already been used to diagnose von Willebrand disease in pigs and we have done preliminary work in Scotties. We know from our initial work, however, that development of the molecular genetic test will require the continued excellent cooperation and financial support of Scottish Terrier fanciers and breeders.

ANTHONY STAMM

Time among dog fanciers seems to pass more quickly in the shortened span encompassed by our dogs' lives. Sixteen years ago saw the death of one of the breed's best-loved fanciers. He was a successful breeder, exhibitor and judge. He served two terms as President of the Scottish Terrier Club of America and was a founding member of the Scottish Terrier Club of Michigan. He represented the Kalamazoo Kennel Club as delegate to the AKC for over 30 years, and he represented his home district for eight years as a State Senator. Today his kennel name is still one of the best known and most successful, but sixteen years after the death of Anthony Stamm, there are many newcomers to the breed who do not know the man behind the Anstamm name.

Anthony Stamm was born in 1912 in Kalamazoo, Michigan. He was the third of five children born to mill worker John Stamm and his wife, Stella. Tony was not one to let the grass grow under his feet. After two years at Parson's Business College in Kalamazoo, Tony was the youngest person in the history of Michigan to be elected to the office of County Clerk. He finished his undergraduate work and went on to earn a Master's Degree from Western Michigan University while holding public office.

Tony's first Scottie was not a childhood pet--Tony was thirty years old when he bought "Mac" from a breeder in nearby Plainwell, Michigan. Five years later in 1947, Tony went to the famous Kinclaven Kennels of Marie Stone to purchase two more Scottish Terriers. The first, Fella, was another pet, but the second, Kinclaven Junior Miss was his first show dog. Junior Miss never finished, but her successor, Kinclaven Staccato became Tony's first champion Scottish Terrier.

After Marie Stone's death late in 1951, Tony bought several Seaglen Scottish Terriers from Canadian breeder Robert Sharp. The best known of these was Ch. Rear Admiral of Seaglen. Rear Admiral finished second in the competition for the Lloyd Trophy in 1957.

In early 1952, Tony sold a bitch named Anstamm Cimarron. She was a dark brindle daughter of Ch. Kinclaven Staccato and Ch. Kinclaven Ballyhoo. Cimmie never finished--her rear was not strong and her new owner was very inexperienced. She must have had something special, though; according to George Ward, Tony married Miriam to get Cimmie back!

Actually, young Miriam Wise began coming to Tony for help in learning to trim and show her new show prospect. After her second grooming lesson, Tony told her, "you're going to be a better groomer than I am." He was right, but it did not bother him. Tony took a lot of pride in the achievements of his apprentice. By the time she finished the second of Cimmie's champion offspring, Ch. Heigh'Ho's Great Gusto, Tony had decided that, at age 43, he was ready to jump into matrimony. He and Miriam were married in September of 1955.

By then, Tony had been judging Scotties and Westies for almost three years. Over the next six years, with Miriam doing most of the grooming, she and Tony successfully handled their own Scottish Terriers. They felt that they had good Scottish Terriers, but not great ones. Both of them kept an eye out for a dog that could improve the heads and shoulders of the Anstamm Scotties.

In 1960, the Scottish Terrier Club of England yearbook arrived in the mail. On page 32, Miriam saw an ad that would change the future of Anstamm and of the Scottish Terrier in America. The ad featured Eng. Ch. Bardene Boy Blue. Described by his none-too-modest breeder Walter Palethorpe as "the perfect showman" excelling in head, neck and shoulders.

Miriam grew almost obsessive about Boy Blue's photo, taking it with her to work and gazing at it where it lay in her desk drawer. She talked constantly to Tony about the dog until he finally suggested that she make an offer to buy the dog. Miriam pointed out that the ad clearly stated that "offers have come from all over the world for this lovely dog." She was reluctant to court rejection from Palethorpe. Tony encouraged her to try and she finally took his advice. After nearly a year of lengthy correspondence, Walter agreed to sell Boy Blue to the Stamms.

Boy Blue went out with handler Jake Terhune and was an immediate success. When Jake Terhune passed away, Lena Kardos took over as Boy Blue's handler. They were a great team, winning Best in Show the first time out in California. Boy Blue was a controversial dog; for all of his success in all-breed competition, Boy Blue never won a Specialty Best of Breed. Breeder-judges may have been slow to appreciate Boy Blue's virtues, but his striking head and clean shoulders soon caught the eyes of discerning breeders. Within a few short years, Boy Blue's offspring began to make their mark in the show ring. His son, Ch. Anstamm Dark Venture, won the first of six Lloyd Trophies to be won by Anstamm Dogs.

Meanwhile back in England, Walter Palethorpe was growing up another young puppy. Bardene Bingo was a small sensation in England, winning his first Best in Show, at age 11 months. Walter had promised Bingo to Tony and Miriam, but Carnation Farms made him an offer he couldn't refuse. The Stamms' consolation prize was the Dazzler's arrival in the United States, 75% of all champions who finished were descended from one or more of the so-called "Three B's". Campaigned by Lena Kardos, Bobby Dazzler won the Lloyd Trophy in 1966.

1966 marked a big turning point for Tony Stamm in his political life as well. After serving as Kalamazoo County Clerk for over 30 years, Tony had been elected as a delegate to the state Constitutional Convention. Tony enjoyed politics at the state level and, in 1966, was elected to the State Senate. This meant a daily commute from Kalamazoo to Lansing, about 75 miles each way. More and more, the responsibility for grooming and exhibiting the dogs fell on Miriam's shoulders.

It was not just drafting legislation that kept Tony from exhibiting his dogs. He was a very popular dog show judge and had assignments all over the country and in Europe. At the time of his death in 1974, Tony was approved to judge Terriers, Toys, Hounds and Non-Sporting breeds. As if he was not busy enough, Tony served as President of the Scottish Terrier Club of America for two terms during 1969 and 1970.

That does not mean that Tony completely abandoned the show ring. One weekend Tony decided to show in Lansing while Miriam took some of their dogs to Illinois. He arrived at what he thought was an appropriate hour only to discover that he had arrived too late at a benched show. In those days, the building was locked to prevent late comers from showing their dogs. While checking all the entrances, Tony bumped

into a man leaving the building. He wheeled into the benching area and began preparing his dog, a Boy Blue son called Ch. Anstamm Dark Dennis.

Late that night, Miriam arrived home to a dark house. She entered from the garage into the kitchen where she saw a Best of Breed ribbon lying on the counter. She smiled and started upstairs where she saw a Group I ribbon tied to the bannister. She was positively beaming as she turned into the bathroom where she saw the red, white and blue Best In Show rosette! Tony had won his first and only Best of Show.

Shortly before Montgomery County in 1973, Tony complained to Miriam that he was experiencing dizziness and double vision. These were the first symptoms of the stroke that left him comatose for the last six months of his life. Miriam was completing her second year of campaigning Ch. Anstamm Happy Venture, a two-time Lloyd Trophy winner. Everything in their lives came to a standstill. Their next-door-neighbor Nancy Donovan took over showing Happy Venture so Miriam could spend every day at Tony's side. He died in April of 1974.

Those who knew him always talk about Tony's kindness to novices and his dry sense of humor. Miriam seldom goes to a show where some exhibitor or judge does not approach her to share some fond remembrance of her late husband. They were an ideal team and neither could have achieved all that they did without the other. Most importantly, they knew and appreciated that fact. The influence of their breeding program on Scottish Terriers is staggering. Over half of the Scottish Terrier champions entered at Montgomery County last year are descended from dogs owned or bred by Tony and Miriam Stamm. Anstamm dogs have won more Lloyd Trophies than any other kennel since the famous Relgalf Kennels of the 40's. Tony Stamm was proud of all of his accomplishments, but his most enduring legacy is the line of Scottish Terriers that continue to carry his name and reflect his devotion to the breed.

Jeannie Passmore is the instructor for the Trick Class.

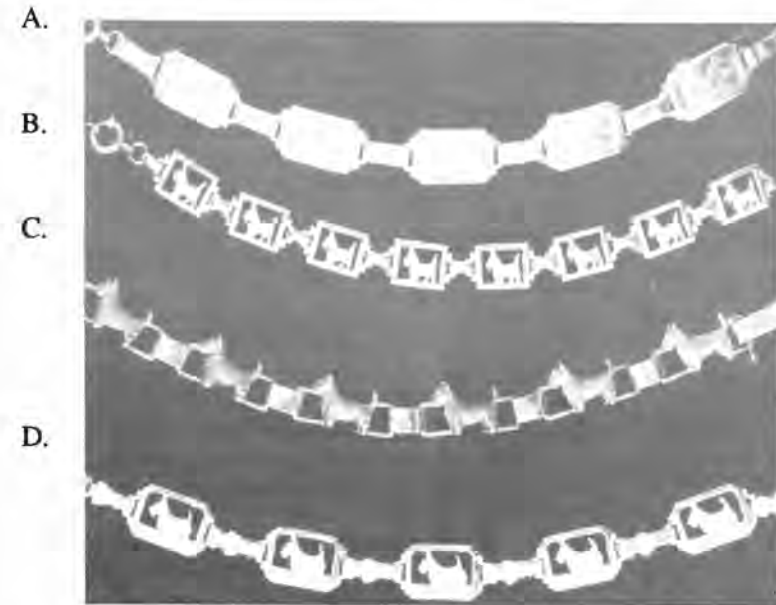
Part Three was a handling class conducted by Bob Childress. He used the event to explain to the people in the crowd the points of the breed, and what a judge is looking for when judging scotties.

Jackie Seelbach reported that she, Dick, and Helen Prince had inventoried the contents of the storage locker and we have a surplus of Grooming Manuals. **Motion - Prince/Seelbach** to reduce the cost of the Grooming manual to \$7.50. **Passed unanimously.** Bob Moore suggested that we should offer the Regional Clubs an opportunity to buy Grooming Manual and 1986 Handbooks at a reduced price for resale to members. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:05 p.m.

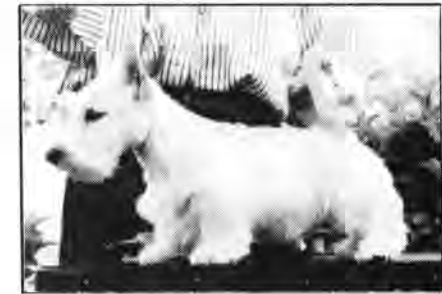

Supplied through a network of veterinarians trained in ICG breeding procedures, the company's existing products and services include: an ovulation timing test kit, pregnancy testing, paternity testing using DNA probes, kennel-testing systems for freezing and chilling semen, and training programs for vets. ICG is also supporting the von Willebrand's research of Dr. Gary Johnson at the University of Missouri. Research of the disease is as a genetic disorder. John DeSaye reported that the STC of Michigan has donated \$3,000 to a similar study being done at the University of Michigan. Craniomandibular Osteopathy: Gail Gaines reported some findings concerning craniomandibular osteopathy, commonly called CMO. CMO is a noncancerous growth of bone on the lower jaw (ramus of the mandible) or over the angle of the mandible and tympanic bulla. In most instances it is bilateral. The bone is dense and hard and has a rough surface that can usually be detected on palpation. The disease is painful and is usually first recognized when a puppy shows discomfort while chewing. Bony growth can occasionally occur on other parts of the cranium. The jaw may appear enlarged or abnormal. Condition is most often recognized between the ages of four and seven months, but it can occur as early as three to four weeks. The disease can be treated, and affected dogs nearly always recover, but the length of treatment may vary from four to 10 months. CMO is inherited as a simple autosomal recessive trait. The disease is known to occur in Westies, Cairns, Boston Terriers, Doberman Pinschers, Great Danes and Labrador Retrievers as well as Scotties. CMO is known to also occur in Canada and most European countries. Handouts with references were available.

Responsive Advertising - Marjorie Cohen reported on the on-going "battle" to have the AKC GAZETTE place Norden Laboratories "warning" for the product Filaribits Plus on the same page as the advertisement and to have the size of the printing of this warning enlarged to make the type legible. Marjorie has written to Mr. Louis Auslander, chairman of the Board and Interim President of the AKC concerning this issue. At present, President Auslander has not acknowledged the letter. Marjorie asks support from regional clubs in the form of letters to the American Kennel Club, complaining about the ad and the warning. Remember, the argument is with the advertising practices. Letters do make a difference.

Sharing That Works - Dan Stickler shared a flyer from STC of Greater Louisville. The flyer serves as an introduction to the club, stating the goals, purposes, activities and other general information which prospective members would find informative.

Other Business - Betty McArthur, STCA president, responded to the questions asked by the members on the regional club questionnaire. She addressed the membership process, backyard breeders, high pressure ads and some other general questions. The printed response is a part of the representatives' packet.

Karen Hanson, STC of New York, reported the following club successes: 12 successful rescues since January, 1990, and development of a network to screen questionable callers for puppies.

Maxine Stickler distributed copies of the regional club representative job description and the committee's annual report.

The consensus of the group was to request that the regional club representatives' meeting be publicized with the weekend events for Montgomery County, 1991.

The group agreed that the session was most productive and informative. Truly, it was a wonderful weekend: wonderful weather, wonderful setting and facilities, wonderful people and wonderful dogs.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p.m.

**SWEEPSTAKES JUDGES COMMENTS
ON FALL, 1990 CONTEST**

In the dog world, the most rewarding honors are those bestowed by your fellow breeders and exhibitors. In asking me to judge the National Sweepstakes, I was honored twice: first, by the Officers and Directors of the STCA who selected me; and second, by all of the exhibitors who brought me such a fine entry. Thank you all for a day I will always remember.

Judging this entry was a lot of fun, but it was also an exceptionally valuable learning experience. Nothing gives you a clearer picture of the strength of our breed than judging a National Sweepstakes. Based on my entry, I came away with the distinct feeling that the breed is in pretty good shape.

I have always disliked reading, or worse, sitting through critiques that emphasize the faults of the dogs exhibited. My experience has shown me that most breeders and exhibitors know the faults of their dogs; and all the "pointing out" in the world won't affect those breeders who don't! The most valuable advice I can give you is also the oldest. Evaluate your dogs objectively so you know where they need improvement. Evaluate other breeders' dogs objectively so you can use them to improve your own line. Declining to "inventory" faults is not a copout. Like all of you, Christine and I are wading through the gene "pool" without completely knowing what lurks beneath the surface. Having chosen to play with genes, to "fool Mother Nature," we must do everything to make our beloved breed the best we can.

On a positive note, the puppies that I placed were exceptional puppies. Given the opportunities, there are sure to be a few more Best in Sweeps among them. My 6-9 division winner, Deblin's Look Who's Talkin', came from the dog class. This boy is very sound with plenty of bone, a good head and ears, and a great blend of neck and shoulders. I know he was a little headstrong about walking properly, but I like to see puppies act like puppies. I have yet to see one who doesn't learn to walk given time and maturity! If this puppy develops his full potential, he is a dog that we are sure to hear from in the future.

The 12-18 division winner was Patcay's Looks Are Everything. She is a lovely, feminine brindle bitch with plenty of bone and substance topped by a clean, balanced head with small, well-placed ears. This well-conditioned bitch would grace any breeder's kennel. My compliments to her breeders and owners.

The 9-12 division was a hotly contested one between the puppy dog and the bitch. The dog, Brookhill's Noble Heir, caught my eye as soon as I saw him and he pushed the ultimate winner very hard. This boy is a dog of great style, with a particularly pleasing head and ears. He was presented in immaculate condition which showed off a superb coat.

My 9-12 divisional winner, Tandem's Chances Are, is a bitch that had everything I was looking for: soundness; a short, cobby body; and a good head and ears. What finally put her over the top was ATTITUDE. This puppy never let down for a minute and every time I looked at her, she was striking a pose. She was clearly enjoying herself and her handler made it fun for her. When I brought the three youngsters into the center of the ring, this girl gave me a look that said, "Here I am. What are you going to do about it?" I gave her the only answer I could: Best in Sweepstakes.

Thank all of you again for the pleasure of your entries, for the memorable experience, and for the fun of the day. Few activities can compare with spending a day among friends, with plenty of time to go over a group of high-spirited Scottie puppies in superb condition. There were no losers in that group--sharing our lives with Scottish Terriers makes us all winners.

The American Kennel Club recognizes the S.T.C.A. as the Scottish Terrier Parent Club. Thereby all regional club show sanctions must first be approved by the S.T.C.A. before AKC permission is granted. Of course, you may continue as a club, to hold meetings and have activities among yourselves, but you would not be a show-giving club without the S.T.C.A. sanction.

The STCA offers two specialties a year. Our annual specialty at the Montgomery County K.C. each year, always a spectacular show. Our Rotating is hosted by a regional club, such as yours. They have proven to be very successful, and we do appreciate the hospitality of each regional club. We are aware of the expenses incurred to host a national show, but do remember that the STCA does furnish the trophies, advertising and pays for the judges expenses.

The STCA offers a quarterly publication which aside from advertising, offers updates on medical information, AKC policies, club activities/minutes, rescue programs, and many more educational items. We plan to print our Handbook every 5 years, which is not a small task, and currently are studying the feasibility of educational seminars which will be hosted by our regional clubs.

The STCA has had an ongoing Judges Education Program, chaired by Neatha Robinson that has made great strides in "hands on" education seminars.

MAURICE POLLAK

Former President of STCA Dies at Age 94.

Maurice Pollak, known to most present-day members of the STCA as a name on the list of honorary members, died at his home in West Long Branch, New Jersey on August 5, at the age of 94. He was, however, a major figure in Scottish Terriers in the 1930's and early 1940's, serving as president of the club for two years, 1941 and 1942.

Twenty-three Scottish terriers bearing his kennel prefix, "Marlu" earned championship certificates. He was also a breeder of Welsh terriers, and served the WTCA as secretary at one time. There were up to 140 dogs of the two breeds, combined, on Marlu Farm at times.

The Marlu Farms kennel was among the last of the large breeding-show kennels in this country. Mr. Pollak closed the kennel just after World War II, the latter part of a time period when kennels of that type disappeared from the scene.

Bob Bartos, STCA member and Scottish terrier judge, was himself manager of two such kennels, Deephaven and Carnation Farm, explains that the disappearance came about because of the inflation of prices and wages that started in 1939, continued through the war, and carried on heatedly in the post-war period and the tax laws, which did not allow the expenses of a hobby kennel to be used as tax deductions. Thus the owners of those kennels could not justify carrying on with their operations.

Mr. Pollak was born in New York City. He became president of the family firm of Henry Pollak, Inc., New York City, importer of raw materials used in making hats and knitwear, in 1928, and continued in that capacity until 1958 when he opened an investment office. He was active in the latter until his death.

In his early years Maurice Pollak spent time abroad, receiving part of his education in Switzerland and England, becoming fluent in five languages.

Mr. Pollak was a benefactor of Monmouth County, New Jersey. He was an early supporter of psychiatry, and founded the Pollak Mental Health Center at the Monmouth Medical Center, Long Branch, a generous donor to Monmouth College, and served as trustee of both institutions for many years. He was a member of the Monmouth Park Charity Fund, and most of Marlu Farm has been acquired as a park by the county. He also served on the Monmouth Council of Boy Scouts of America.

One of his last benefactions was to the STCA. He gave a sum to establish the Marlu Milady Memorial Trophy BB trophy at Montgomery County, to be given outright, annually.

Dogs were not the only area of Mr. Pollak's animal hobbying. In 1941 he established a herd of show Jersey cattle on Marlu Farm which became known as one of the best in the world, earning many prizes and awards of Mr. Pollak. He served as a director of the Americal Jersey Cattle Club twice.


