## RETIREMENT HOBBY ESCALATES TO FAST-PACED LIFESTYLE

Scottie power is awesome! Witness the early June gathering in Columbus, IN, of the 6th Annual Wee Scots Collectors brought together by Donna Newton, founder, and her husband Jim, to, as Donna puts it, "research, share information, enjoy close fellowship and improve our Scottie collections." The Newtons are also STCA members.

Of the 52 who attended the first collectors' show in 1985, 32 were also among the 150 at the 1990 show and 25 have attended all six years, as the loosely organized fellowship continues to grow to a total membership of 832, many being also STCA members who combine breeding and exhibiting along with collecting.

Donna stated in a 1988 issue of the SCOTTIE SAMPLER, the tabloid quarterly she and Jim publish, "Five years ago when the SCOTTIE SAMPLER was just beginning, life at the Newton home was quite simple. Some might have termed it boring, but we were happy and had time for family and friends. Our lives were not yet complicated with the IRS, lawyers, CPAs, tax laws, red tape, record keeping, etc. . . . I will be honest that even though I have found myself wanting that uncomplicated lifestyle again, I would not trade any of the friendships and relationships to go back to the old life."

And the last statement really says it all for the collectors who have been caught up in the excitement of Wee Scots. In their six year rise from an uncomplicated lifestyle to the fast paced "retirement life" they enjoy, the Newtons have traveled extensively adding to their large collection, visiting individual collectors in their homes and meeting with splinter groups of Wee Scots Collectors around the country.

In a recent SCOTTIE SAMPLER column, Jim said, "Donna thinks any town with a flea market, antique mall or shop within 1/2-inch of an Interstate on the map is a required stop," as he recounted some 50 "required" stops on a 1,600 mile trip. "She doesn't understand why states don't set up flea markets at rest stops!"

He was quoted in another edition after a long trip he and Donna had made in sub-zero temperatures, "Donna didn't want to make rest stops because it took her too long to unwrap and get out of the van. However, when it was an antique mall or flea market, she was out in a flash."

There is a third very important member of the closely knit Newton "triumvirate" - their 12 year old Sir James of Konnashire, who really started it all when the Newtons acquired a Scottie puppy in 1978 and named it JD. The much-traveled Scottie not only

puts in appearances at the collectors' weekend activities but he has his own very popular column in the SCOTTIE SAMPLER. This publication often runs to 24 pages on all phases of Scottie memorabilia collecting with educational articles, regular columns, want ads, lists and prices of available Scottie items from around the country, news of the membership, etc. It is heavily illustrated.

The subject of several articles since Donna's dream of a collectors' organization became a reality, the Newtons were featured in 1987 in the New Yorker Magazine in an article entitled simply "Buddies", JD's term for all the Scottie memorabilia with which he is surrounded. Jane and Michael Stern, writers of the article, described the weekend activities of the 1987 collectors' gathering in great detail and included a biographical study of the Newtons, including their two daughters, and of course, JD. The family circle now includes three grandchildren.

The article covered nine pages, but the editor of the New Yorker is a Scottie collector and a member of Wee Scots. Scottie power again!

An article written by Donna in a 1990 issue of SCOTTIE SAMPLER describes her activities over the past dozen years, "I have lived amid Scottie collectibles sharing a wall to wall, attic to basement Scottie decorated home, with the greatest of my collection -- my pet Scottie, JD. Not only have I shared this with my husband Jim but with hundreds, maybe thousands of Scottie enthusiasts through my writings -- first, the SCOTTIE SAMPLER, then a book Scottie Showcase, and then DANDY DOGS, a collection of pet owners' love expressed through picture and pen.

"My life is consumed with Scottie activities since my hobby became a seven day a week, 10-12 hours a day home business. If I'm not meeting a printing deadline, I'm out researching collectibles. If I'm not working on promotion, I'm planning the next collectors' show. There's little time for me or family members. Thank goodness my husband shares this Scottie passion and understands."

The Scottie Showcase, described as a pictorial introduction to Scottie Dog Collectibles, was published in 1988. It was illustrated by STCA member Marion Needham Drupp and contains over 200 photographs and pictures more than 800 Scottie items in its 148 pages.

When I was asked to write this article on the 1990 Collectors' weekend, it seemed very important to introduce the Newtons and to show how their dedication to "JD" led them first into a collection hobby, then into a business based entirely on Scottie collectibles and by extension, to a fellowship composed of those who collect them. In 1989 they arranged a Fala event at the Little White House Museum in Warm Springs, Georgia, the first time such an exhibit was held. And it is said there are over 7,000 pieces of Fala-related material available.

Participation in the Collectors' weekend 1990 held in Columbus in June resembled running on a treadmill (or at least walking fast) from early morning to late in the evening in order not to miss any of the well-planned activities. Each year brings innovations and this year the committee added a Scottie remnant exchange; a hilarious Scottie bingo game presided over by STCA member Fred Krupp, with all prizes being much coveted Scottie items; a paper-care workshop; even a fellowship dance. An unscheduled but popular innovation was the appearance throughout the weekend of the three self-styled "Michigan girls" who wore matching Scottie costumes to every event and lavishly decorated the outside of their main floor motel room.

Of course there were the usual events, most popular of which are the Scottie consignment auction, displays of collectibles for viewing only, a Scottique featuring new merchandise, a show and tell session based on unusual Scottie finds, workshops, flea market and much, much more.

The auction featured a long table full of items supplied by the members and resulted in serious bidding. The highly animated professional auctioneer managed to get over \$300 for a Black and White jack-in-the-box, while three items which brought over \$100 were an Avon President's Award, a first-edition children's book entitled Tam, and a framed Icart print.

An unusual conversation piece was the Scottie penata which I had won as a door prize at the Western party given by the Scottish Terrier Club of Greater Houston at the STCA's Rotating Specialty weekend in Houston in early April. After enjoying it at home, I took it to Columbus and presented it to Donna, who joyfully exclaimed she had wanted one "forever" but decided she should share it and entered it in the auction. She outbid all others with a bid topping \$60.00 -- she really wanted it! A small portion of money bid goes to the auctioneer, with the balance to the supplier of the item. Donna and Jim surprised me by returning the net to me to be used for my Scottie rescues.

And as we went into the banquet room Saturday evening, there stood the larger than life penata at one end of the buffet table. Colorful red and black balloons floated above it, their strings attached to the metal ring on the Scottie. The penata was also a centerpiece at Sunday brunch, so it did yeoman service throughout the weekend, even contributing to Scottie rescue.

The main conversation at the banquet centered around the very large ice sculpture of a Scottie, prepared by the catering staff. And the co-ordinating committee had asked a number of people to prepare individual table centerpieces on a holiday theme and on a competitive basis -- featuring Scotties, of course. After the judging, the centerpieces were also displayed throughout the weekend. (I'm still trying to figure out how someone got that very large Scottie into a balloon.)

Following Sunday brunch, we participated in the closing Scottie march in a cool

grassy location on the motel grounds. Camcorders rolled again, cameras were snapped and 26 Scotties with their owners participated in the march, including Jim Newton with JD.

Resembling more a family reunion than a convention, the group was slow to disband, as old friends and new vowed to keep in touch and to meet again in 1991.

Donna said on the phone recently that each year she and Jim wonder how much longer they can keep up the fast pace at which they find themselves living and when it will be time to turn the Wee Scots collectors' weekend over to others. Both Jim and Donna have health problems which are of concern to them. But, just in case, when Donna settled up with the motel following the early June weekend, she decided to place a reservation for a weekend next June for the Seventh Annual Wee Scots Convention.



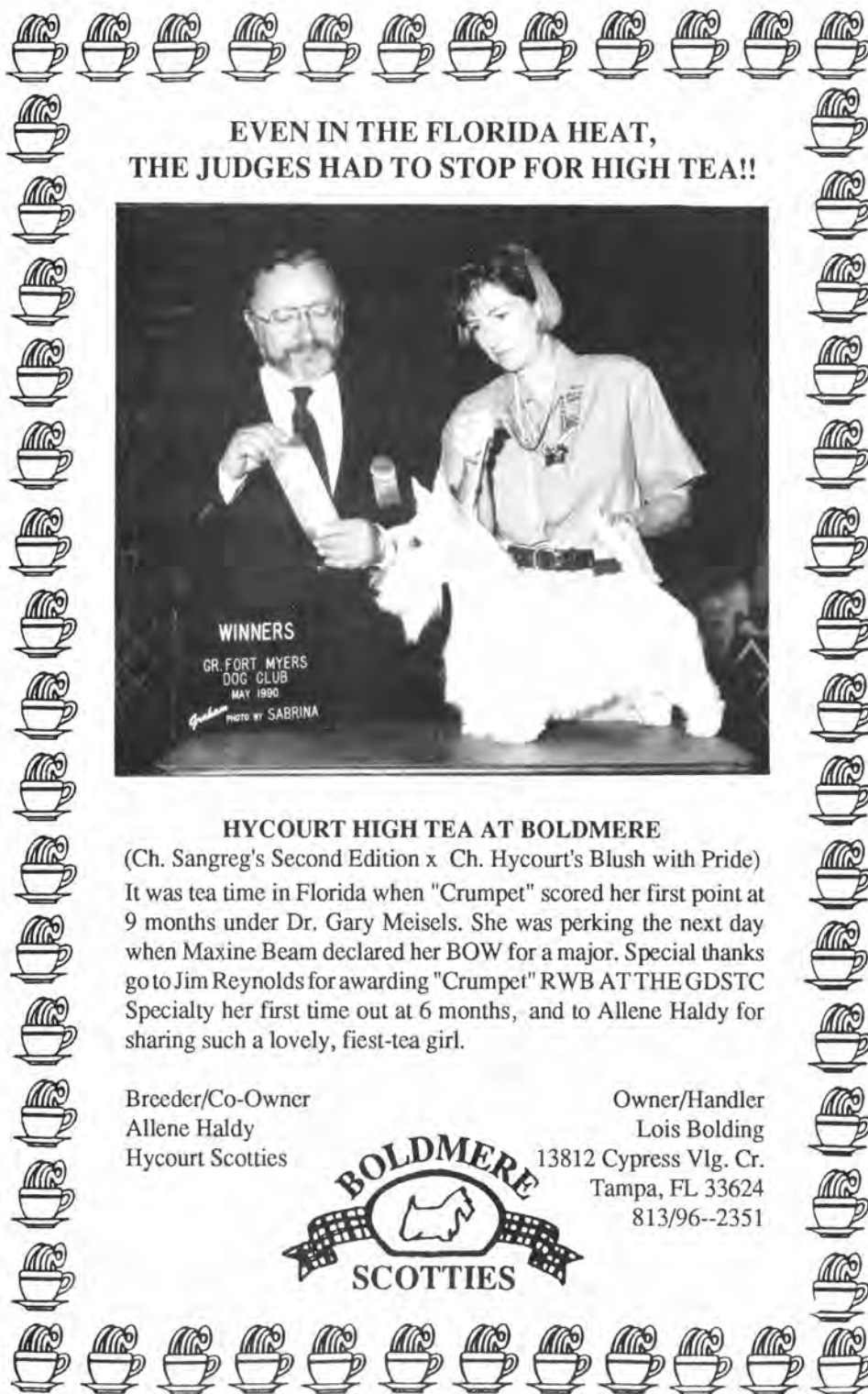

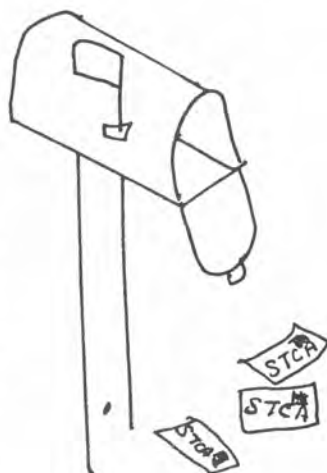

In Spring 1989, I went to my first obedience match with my scotties. Although both of them are breed champions, it has always been my desire to gain CDs and someday a brace certificate in obedience.

I truly didn't feel the dogs were really prepared for the match, I had been on the road a great deal of the past year, so our training schedule had been disrupted. However, my instructor and the people in class urged me to get my feet wet and give it a try. I was so nervous that I stood like a stiff board in the ring. I tried not to lose points on handler errors. If the dog makes a mistake, he needs more training, but I really feel foolish when I am the cause of the loss of points. Tweed, my six-year-old scottie, went through his routine. Although there were things I thought could be improved, we seemed to have completed everything.

As the handler, you are always critical of your own performance, especially when you watch others that make the routines look like perfection. We have been attending obedience classes at Suffolk Obedience School in Green Lawn, L.I. It isn't easy training a terrier. They have minds of their own. I learned that treats encourage my fellows to work a little harder. Sometimes, they can try your patience when they just decide they don't feel like working. The first trick is to gain their attention. When those little dark brown eyes look up with that "what next" expression, I just melt. The communication between dog and handler when that happens is special. Working with my dogs in obedience is really what special owner-dog relationships are all about. It has taught me patience and love to complete a goal.

When the judge called us back into the ring, to my great surprise and delight Ch. Royal Mc Tweed of Reanda, "Tweed" to his friends, had placed 4th in his first obedience match. Poor Roddy had the misfortune to work in the pouring rain and just didn't want to do the down stay in soaked grass. His little body shivered. But I gave him a big hug and kiss when it was over. The brace went poorly as Roddy only wanted to shake off the heavy rain from his freshly stripped coat. But we worked hard, even if the results were not like they had been in school. Everyone cheered for them.

The comradeship of people in obedience is unique. Everyone gives support to fellow handlers. This is especially true when someone has a bad day in the ring. Obedience is truly a sport. The competition is created by the ability of the handler and the dog to work as a team. I haven't had so much fun at a dog show in years. We all went home soaking wet but having had a great time.

Since then, "the boys" have made excellent progress. Roddy successfully completed his C.D. in just four outdoor shows last fall. In addition, he won the "Highest Scoring Scottish Terrier Award from S.O.T.C. Tweed, who was more of a challenge to train, completed his C.D. in April. Also, both boys are still training in brace, which seems to be their favorite activity. Both are working toward their C.D.X.s. Also, they both participate in pet therapy work.

Hopefully, more Scottie owners will be encouraged to try obedience training. Many animals have had their lives saved through simple obedience commands. On occasion, my boys have escaped, and now they will return when they hear a "come" command. People have tried to discourage us saying that Scotties are just not obedience-type dogs. It's true that they don't work like some breeds. Scotties tend to think before they react, so they may not react as quickly as some breeds do to a command. However, I have learned to use praise and treats to get the responses I want. A sense of humor also helps. Most important, though is PATIENCE! When that special bond develops between you and your Scottie as his training progresses, it will all be worthwhile.

Of course, obedience training doesn't have to lead to an obedience title. Just having a better behaved pet can be an end in itself. Many people don't realize that when you train a dog for conformation and teach it to stand for examination and walk in the ring, you are doing basic obedience work. Letty Passig, our national Obedience Chairman, can give you more information on the sport. Hopefully, more Scots will join in the obedience ring.

### PHOTOGRAPHER OFFERS HINTS FOR BETTER PICTURES

Have you noticed that often in the pictures run in the Bagpiper that a black dog will appear as a silhouette, with no detail showing; or that the head or tail of a black dog will be lost against a black background? Or even sometimes lost against the dark clothing of the handler and/or judge?

These questions were taken to Vivian Lear, a professional photographer, and holder of an MA in photography from the University of Houston.

She told the Bagpiper that the photography, the type of camera, and the photographer can make a difference, but often the quality of the picture re-produced in print can be the better for the development technique. A flash camera can make a picture of stark contrasts, but by careful, "custom" development, the light on the black can be softened so that it brings out more detail, and the light on lighter colors can be enhanced to bring out detail. Photographers can also achieve some of the same effect by draping a light cloth over the flash bulb, a cloth not so heavy as a man's handkerchief. The use of a flash light from out of camera range that would act simultaneously with the camera to light up the background would also help, she said.

Other helpful hints from Miss Lear were to not stand a dark dog on a dark table top, or mat; for the people in the picture to be dressed in neutral colors; and even better, have a PVC framed backdrop in a neutral color, a light blue-grey being suitable for dogs of any color.
