ADVERTISING

For those sending in advertising, please follow these guidelines for the best results:

Photos will reproduce best if there is good contrast! If there is a black dog against a dark background, then the dog will not be seen well at all and the same applies to a wheaten on a light background. Also, the process used to produce half-tones sees red as black, so it is best not to have a black dog against a red background. Barring an accident, your photo will not be harmed by making a halftone of it.

You should indicate how much of the photo is to be used. Cut out a box in a white sheet of paper & attach it against the photo with something that won't harm the photo. Place the cutout over the portion you want used. If you don't indicate cropping, and you do not give instructions that indicate how to crop the photo or that the artist can crop your photo, then your entire photo will be used. Your photo does not need to be cut to size, and will not be cut in the halftone process.

For the least amount of legibility problems, copy should always be typed. You may include a hand written lay-out, but also include a typed copy as well.

You may indicate kinds of type you wish to have used, but the artist may not have that kind available. Therefore it may not be possible to give you exactly what you want.

The earlier you get your ad to the editor, the better. Ads not postmarked by the

deadline will not go into that edition. (Editor's note: I'm not kidding!)

Checks for the ads made out to the STCA must come with the ad. Look at the rates listed to see what your ad will cost.

ARTICLES

Please send your articles on disk if at all possible. I can accept 5.25" or 3.5" high density disks using MSDos Word for Windows, Word, Word Perfect or any standard ASCII file. I can probably convert Mac files. These formats are listed in order of preference.

Please use a 5.5" X 8.5" size page if possible, leaving only a *single space* after periods, and give each article a file name of its own. Also, please spell check your articles.

It is very important that you also send hard copy of your article in case we can't access your article on disk.

If you cannot provide a disk, please send a *typed* copy of your article to me:

A Letter to Remember

We lost T. Allen Kirk MD on January 13, 1992. With his passing, we lost the man, but never the memories.

One of the most memorable gifts Tom gave was a letter directed to the Officers and Board of the STCA, written on September 3, 1992. Tom had stepped down as AKC Delegate and his absence on the Board was felt by all at the October meeting when the letter was received.

I am grateful to Mrs. Kirk for her permission to pass on significant excerpts from his letter. Many of you may have read previous excerpts in the Gazette Scottish Terrier Column.

The letter specifically addressed the anger of a few member over changes the Board felt necessary in the membership application form and responsibilities of the sponsors.

Tom concurred that requiring a member to really know the person he was sponsoring is a small price to pay for the continued quality of the organization. He felt, as we do, the questions were designed to enhance the knowledge the Board needs of the applicant. Other questions hint to the Board that "this person would be a valuable addition to such and such a committee," or maybe not.

Tom gave so much to the STCA, but, perhaps in the following words, he left us with the ultimate in a clear concise explanation of what the STCA is all about, the

responsibilities of the Officers, Board, Regional Clubs and membership.

"The STCA is the parent club of the breed, responsible for the standard, for the good of the breed throughout the contiguous states, Hawaii and Alaska. Regional clubs are sanctioned by the STCA and are expected to represent the breed and look out for its interests in the region. The regional club committee was created by the STCA so the STCA could keep those regional clubs informed of board action, and to offer help when needed, and so that regional clubs could exchange information among themselves, not as a congress to tell the board what to do, though they are welcome to make constructive suggestions.

The membership has elected the board to handle the business of the club. The membership of that board is made up, as nearly as possible, of members from various parts of the country so as to have feelings from all the country considered in all its decisions, be they show, policy, or fiscal."

I said it before and I'll say it again. No one could have said it better. With a few paragraphs, Tom healed the wounds we were all feeling. The pain and agony we each felt as members of the board who were witness to the dissention within the club because members felt we were acting without the club's best interest at heart.

Thank you, Tom. Your physical presence will be missed, but the memories of you will remain. Your dedication to the breed and the STCA will be difficult to duplicate. Rest well, Friend.

In response to the "Letter To The Editor", Bagpiper Fall '91 issue signed by two senior members, Barbara DeSaye and Miriam Stamm.

First, I am saddened to see our Bagpiper used to air personal conflicts when it should be used to share information on a positive note. However, as Past President I must respond to these inaccurate statements.

In regard to our Standard Revision:

QUOTE..."Two years ago the AKC requested that we rewrite it to conform with their format."..."The Board then voted unanimously to leave the standard as it was."

FACT: Reversing a previous motion has been a common action of the Board. If new information is received we should act accordingly. The AKC did in fact repeal its original request regarding this issue.¹ This Board decided it was time to review our position.

QUOTE: "The Board appointed a 'Secret' Committee composed exclusively of Board Members to reformat the Standard."..."Members names were never published in the Bagpiper"

FACT: No "Secret" Committee was appointed, *Each Member of the Board was asked to prepare* a reformatted version of the Standard that we could physically make comparisons with our current Standard. Do we have to publish every board members name?

QUOTE: "This was sent to the AKC for approval without membership knowledge or approval."

FACT: A proposal to the membership

regarding our Standard or our Constitution is sent to the AKC for approval prior to a mailing to the membership in order to avoid a double mailing. Changes in our Constitution or Standard must meet AKC approval.

Once approved by the AKC, the proposal is sent to the membership per our Constitution, and is only accepted by the AKC after a 2/3 affirmative vote of the membership.² It is difficult to understand our senior members question regarding this issue as either they or their spouses have served as officers or directors and certainly would know this procedure. The Board's reformatted version of our Standard prompted us to consider a committee to Review the Need to Revise our Standard. It was obvious that there were areas that needed more clarification. A committee was formed to do just that, however this committee was not an appointed "Secret" Committee, but a group of Directors that Volunteered to Review our Standard.³ This Committee, Chaired by Dr. Kirk gave its recommendation at our June '91 Meeting. Based on specific areas *not covered in our Standard, we appointed a Standard Revision Committee*⁴, *none of whom are Officers or Directors.* Upon acceptance, this committee was published in the Bagpiper⁵. One member of this new committee, Barbara De Saye, strongly recommended that Miriam Stamm also be appointed. She too was asked to participate as an advisor and accepted.

THEY RECOMMEND:

Board Proposals be published in the Bagpiper with no action taken until membership response is received.

FACT: Since we only meet three times a year it is not feasible to have to publish everything in the Bagpiper pending membership approval. The Board is elected to run the business of the club. Directors

represent each of the four Divisions. Should members have questions they should call or write their representative or any Officer to speak on a specific issue.

QUOTE: ..."Secrecy surrounding the Board Meetings"..."Why should members wait for months to read an abbreviated form of minutes..." "Open communication between the Board Members and the rest of us will greatly reduce the "Them and Us" feeling..."

FACT: There are confidential issues discussed at the board meetings that are not available to the general membership for specific reasons such as complaints against breeder contracts, litter quality, and or financial matters that concern members. We believe they should be kept private. Certainly we agree that judge selection, committee selection be kept confidential until confirmation by those selected. Unfortunately information does leak out, most times inaccurately. When any member has a question regarding information they have heard, or materials in the minutes that are unclear to them, They should call an officer or director to be sure they get the facts before they too spread inaccurate information.

Open communication⁶ to the membership was started these past two years under the new role our regional club representative took. Faster than waiting for the next issue of the Bagpiper, within one month after our board meetings, our representative, Maxine Stickler, sent an update of the boards actions to each regional club. This included our requests for input from the membership, particularly on urgent matters. Regional clubs responded telling us how pleased they were to receive this information so swiftly. Many of the clubs

reprinted the information in their newsletters.

Appointment of New Treasurer

QUOTE: ..."They used secrecy and surprise to achieve an end."

FACTIS: Gilbert Robinson's unfortunate resignation as treasurer at the after dinner meeting was due to recent personal conflicts. He recommended me knowing my background in bookkeeping and property management. This was not the first time an elected officer/director resigned upon election. It has taken place on three other occasions within the last 12 years., consequently appointments have been made at the after dinner meeting and at the winter meeting previously. Circumstances sometimes change for an individual from the time they accept the nomination to the time of the annual meeting. I was nominated and appointed by the board because of my qualifications and availability. I have accepted and will complete the term of office as treasurer of the STCA.

QUOTE: "We should take President Bush's advise to be a Kinder, Gentler STCA, Courteous and Respectful to each other."

If they sincerely believe this would they have written this Letter to the Editor? Having known both these senior members for many years, I ask you Ladies, would not a simple phone call have resolved this?

Selected incoming correspondence was discussed.

There was a consensus of the board that each committee chairman should receive notification of upcoming board meetings with enough time to respond or report to the board, if they choose.

REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY: Shirley Justus reported on the packet to the membership (November 24, 1991) which included the revised Constitution/Bylaws, newly adopted Membership Application (Code of Ethics, STCA Membership Information, Application for Membership Form and the Sponsor's Questionnaire and a special notice page. The recording secretary brought up the expense of the first class mailing (75 cents). The fact that there was deadline material included in the mailing and a club policy prompted the first class mailing. Discussion followed.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER: Betty McArthur distributed a detailed financial report.

She distributed a *PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 10/1/91- 9/30/92 AND STCA CASH FLOW REPORT 10/1/91-12/31/91* (See following report)

REPORT OF THE AKC DELEGATE: John Sheehan announced that the following amendments are effective.

(1) The dog show class amendment gives clubs the option of including 12-18 Month classes at all-breed dog shows, effective March 1, 1992.

(2) The spay/neuter amendment permits neutered dogs and spayed bitches to be shown in Veterans classes at independent specialties and at all-breed events that do not offer competitive classes beyond Best of Breed, effective March 1, 1992.

(3) The judging amendment allows a judge to judge 200 dogs at specialties, effective January 1, 1992.

(4) A new process was adopted for a new judges approval system, effective January 6, 1992. The main difference between the

new and the old system are as follows:
 — A pre-application phase, or "request to apply," is now required.
 — Letters of reference are hereby eliminated.
 — Breeds will be granted to all applicants only on a provisional basis.
 — Performance evaluation tests will be given, if necessary, following five provisional assignments.
 — Confidential recommendations will be requested on all applications from the entire field staff.
 — Educational activities are mandatory and must be documented.
 — Four Groups is now the maximum number that will be approved in the regular process; advancement beyond four Groups will be by invitation only.

AKC president Robert Maxwell described the success of the new registration system: In September, October and the last three weeks of November, AKC agents inspected 671 kennels, resulting in 400 warning letters for identification and record keeping and a large increase in letters for unsatisfactory kennel conditions.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Information Report: Bill Martin distributed the names of people requesting the STCA Information Packets. This list was sent to the Regional Clubs. Included with the list was information concerning the new Public Information Coordinator position that AKC requests for in each club.

National Show Chairman (Vice President): Helen Prince distributed material related to the:

STCA NATIONAL ROTATING SPECIALTY (HOSTS: STC OF GREATER BALTIMORE-April 17-19,1992. Headquarters is Marriott's Hunt Valley Inn, 245 Shawan Rd. (301/785-7000). STCA will be receiving 10% of the advertising revenues. All arrangements have been made. Supt-MB-F

Montgomery County - October 4,1992. Headquarters is Guests Quarters Suite Hotel,(No Dogs) 640 West Germantown Pike, Plymouth Meeting, PA 19462 (215/834-8300). Arrangements are being made for members with dogs.

Sweepstakes: LULU TEMPLE - October 2,1992. (Secured site for next two years-penciled in for 1996.) SHOW SECRETARY-NORMAN PRINCE. To expedite the incoming mail they will rent a P.O. BOX.

ROTATING SPECIALTY (HOSTS:STC OF ATLANTA) - April 17,1993.

ROTATING SPECIALTY (HOSTS: HEART OF AMERICA STC - March 13,1994.

After discussion the motion was made to rescind the 2-6-88 motion stating that we should pay for the Stewards' Dinners at Montgomery County Specialty Show Dinner and amend it to read - STCA will pay for the Stewards' Dinner at Montgomery County Specialty Show Annual Dinner if they steward at both the Sweepstakes and Regular Classes. **Motion-McArthur/Musson. Passed with 1 Abstention.**

In order to speed up the accounting process after events, all information, records

and/or bills must be submitted to the show chairman within three months after the end of the event. **Motion-Musson/Prince. Passed unanimously.**

After discussion and clarification of the fact that the award will be honored by STCA for 1991, the motion was made to cancel the Sandissy Trophy as of January 1,1992 and to solicit alternative proposals for a similar award for Best of Breed wins for 1992. **Motion-Musson/Krause-Passed unanimously.**

There was a consensus that we need to clarify the existing owner and co-ownership ruling of dogs qualifying for awards.(i.e. If the owner and/or co-owner change but all are still members of STCA, does the dog still qualify?)

Bagpiper: There have been members that have complained that they paid for first-class mailing of the BAGPIPER and have not received first class. The new editor will be apprised of the problem.

Karey Leichel's proposals were discussed and approved: Some of her proposals are:

1. More photos for Montgomery County and Rotating Specialties.

2. General advertising in the back of the edition with the exception of the front,

inside front pages and any Ways & Means ads.

3. Discontinue color front and back pages because of the expense.

4. Mail with a page wrap around the outside.

Printing estimate of 1000 copies approximately \$2684.50

Ways to Save:

1. Will provide halftones and provide ads to the printer camera-ready.

2. Deadlines will be earlier - written in stone.

3. Will proofread and spell check, but requests the contributor to also proofread.

4. Requests computer disk whenever possible. 3.5" or 5.25". Word, Wordperfect or check with editor for "other". Can also down load off a modem.

After discussion it was decided to rescind the May 28,1988 motion stating the editor has complete authority in BAGPIPER content. **Motion Musson/Watkins-Passed unanimously.**

Mel Musson volunteered to investigate and research editorial guidelines for the BAGPIPER and report to the board in April.

In the meantime the editor of the BAGPIPER will be advised to use discretion in printing controversial statements or articles.

Gazette Column: Ruth Ann Krause announced that beginning in March the GAZETTE will publish two or three groups in each issue. Terriers/Hounds in March, Working/Sporting in April/ Non- Sport-

Grooming Video: Plans are being made to produce a quality video.

Health Report: Ruth Ann Krause distributed copies of WATCH, West Highland Anomaly Task Council, Inc. The brochure contained updated summary information on the various genetic diseases occurring in Westies, genetic data registry, report of their survey, and etc. It could be an example for us to follow. In their cover letter it suggests,"controlling genetic diseases is an activity whose time has come."

Regional Clubs: STC of Tampa Bay had their first Specialty January 6, 1992. club liaison Jackie Seelbach attended and reported that it was very successful and considers this her last report as liaison. Report of STC of Greater Denver was given by liaison Betty McArthur and the club had their first sanctioned "B" Match December 8, 1991. A report is pending. Liaison Shirley Justus reported that STC of Utah has been approved for their first sanctioned "B" match to be given January 26, 1992. The club continues to grow and keeps the liaison well informed of their activities. STC of Greater Pittsburgh has been reporting well to liaison Helen Prince.

Rescue: Caryl Alten and Dennis Mileski were selected as co-chairs of the Rescue Committee. **Motion-Krause/Kinnelly-Passed unanimously.**

Jackie Seelbach was notified that a 'puppy mill' was closing in the Kansas area and that the auction included 7 Scottish Terriers. There was no time to poll the board since Patty Brooks from Heart of America Club had to leave early in the morning to arrive by 8 A.M. at the auction site to rescue the Scotties. Jackie Seelbach made a judgment call to contribute \$250.00 on behalf of STCA and Heart of America STC would contribute \$250.00. The final purchase price was \$1,735.00. The final number of Scottish Terriers was 11, including a bitch with 7 puppies. STCA contributed \$1,335.00 to the Heart of America STC for the purchase of the Scottish Terriers. There are several ways to cover the cost of this purchase; by contributions, sale of the Sun catchers (Debbie Mackie) and the placement of the Scotties involved were just a few of the possibilities. We have no money in our Rescue fund. After much debate it was the consensus of the board that this was a one time situation but that guidelines must be made for the future.

Bill Martin volunteered to chair a committee to solicit information & opinions from the membership and others on what STCA rescue should involve in order to revise the current rescue guidelines. **Motion-Martin/Musson-Passed unanimously.**

It was the recommendation of the board that Bill Martin contact the new Rescue

co-chairs to assist with the revision of the current rescue guidelines.

Standard Review: No report

Ways and Means: Donations of non-Scottie items was discussed. We will be selling them at the Rotating Specialty weekend.

Muriel Lee has signed a contract with TFH Publications to write a new book on the Scottish Terrier. She included a general outline in her proposal and stated that she will be receiving a flat fee without royalties. If STCA chooses, they will be receiving a royalty check every six months for the life of the book. She suggests that STCA receive a contract from TFH if they decide to go along with this project. The price of the book is \$20.00 and STCA would receive \$2.00 for each book. Before publication, if there are glaring errors or points that STCA will not accept then there will be a change. A motion was made that we accept Muriel Lee's proposal to write a book on the Scottish Terriers for TFH and STCA would receive the royalties (10%) for the life of the book. **Motion- Musson/Martin- Passed unanimously.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Melvyn Musson will investigate and evaluate policies of various animal rights groups. **Motion-Prince/Starr-Passed unanimously.**

A Membership Committee made up of board members was selected to help investigate problems concerning new applicants. EAST- Marjorie Cohen, alternate-

Helen Prince, MID-Ruth Ann Krause, WEST- Robin Starr. **Motion-Watkins/Musson-Passed unanimously.**

Under the Outline of Duties for the Nominating Committee (Pg.92,no.5) it was decided that—After the conference call, all nominees will be contacted by telephone for acceptance. Nominees may have up to three days for consideration. Upon acceptance the nominee will be contacted by certified mail, return receipt requested. **Motion-McArthur/Prince-Passed unanimously.**

There is an interest in instituting "Dog of Merit" at STCA Specialties. Since this is a new addition to our usual awards Helen Prince and Shirley Justus will investigate and draw up guidelines for the award. Joanne Kinnelly volunteered to design an attractive "Dog of Merit" certificate. The motion was made to institute the "Dog of Merit" certificates at the Baltimore Rotating Specialty. **Motion-Musson/Watkins-Passed unanimously.**



Update On San Mateo Animal Legislation

According to an AKC News Release of 11/27/91, a San Mateo County (CA) ordinance intended to help control euthanasia of healthy animals has passed, effective 3/1/92. This is not the original restrictive ordinance. Some key changes in the legislation are:

- moratorium on breeding removed
- "zero population growth" removed
- mandatory spaying & neutering of all dogs/cats reduced to mandatory spaying and neutering of all shelter animals before adoption
- residents allowed to keep unaltered and altered animals, with a differential on cost of licenses (\$10.00 for altered dogs/\$20.00 for unaltered dog. Cats \$5.00 and \$15.00, respectively)
- Breeding permit required to breed an animal - \$25.00 per animal.

"While the American Kennel Club does not endorse the outcome of this legislation as a panacea for the rest of the nation, we are pleased that people from all sides of the issue were able to work towards a more reasonable resolve. This was an overwhelming effort with input from the Responsible Dog Breeders of San Mateo County, the American Dog Owner's Association, the cat fancy, the dog fancy, and many other hardworking organizations and volunteers. It is a tribute to all of those involved that, in spite of differences in philosophy and approach, the tireless San Mateo County Task Force, the new staff at the Peninsula Humane Society, the County Board of Supervisors, and the residents of San Mateo County were able to sit down together for the welfare of animals. The American Kennel Club is pleased to have been part of this effort and looks forward to working with all interested parties for progress in all facets of reasonable and effective canine legislation."

Montgomery County 1991 SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA

It's Sunday the 6th of October, we're on the Ambler Campus of the Temple University and it's our pleasure to be part of the great Montgomery County Terrier Show. Our task today is to sort out a lovely entry of Scottish Terriers, an entry of 200 which means that my able co-judge will fill in for me in a variety of places to include the first puppy dog class. I do hope the weather will hold, I've looked forward to this day for many years and it's a real pleasure for me to be back to judging the National Specialty of the Scottish Terrier Club of America, once more. The morning sky is overcast with a slight drizzle, quite damp under foot. We will start off with the hope that the day will improve. It's not terribly cold, thank goodness.

NINE TO TWELVE PUPPY DOG CLASS

We appear to have ten in the Nine to Twelve Puppy Dog Class. Well! We had a deluge in the first class that we judged! A pair of brindle dogs are at the head of the class, very similar in balance and proportion. The dog that won the class kept himself in positive form at all times. He's a good dog, with a good skull and dark eye, very high opinion of himself, and he moved right along at the trot, not caring what he was going through as far as footing. He's a handsome dog and a very useful dog. Both of these dogs are of lovely size. The second dog is very similar, not quite the polished performer as the dog that won the class, but a lot to offer with this dog. The third dog is a black dog with a characteristic ring around his tail. A lovely size dog, beautiful coat and condition, just does not have the attitude of the

two placed above him, this dog also with a nice head and a good eye. The fourth dog is a little on the small size for a male, but appeals because he kept himself together on the move. He had a keen piercing look to his eye. I do hope as we go along in the class we don't find quite so many "finished off" with clippers as we found in this class!

TWELVE TO EIGHTEEN DOG CLASS

It appears that we have eleven in the Twelve to Eighteen Class coming up. Once again we opted for a brindle dog perhaps not the greatest dog in head, his head is still however, pleasing and in balance with the dog. He makes a compact package, his tail is up where it belongs, makes a good use of his legs. His ears are wide but they're set in the right place, and he's nicely presented. Second to a black dog who sometimes was using himself and sometimes wasn't using himself, but when he was using himself he was similar to the winning dog. Made a compact package going around the ring. Not quite as positive in his topline at all times as he might be, but that seems to be a temperament thing. Decent head, eye and ear and a nice short back. The third dog is a dog of some exaggeration and some of these exaggerations are very good for the breed. He's a very, very long headed dog, he's a decent dog in his skull. He's got a nice pair of ears set in the correct place. He's a long necked dog, but correspondingly he's a little longer in the loin than I care for, a little longer in tail than I care for. He's a showy dog and a "goey" dog and he will have his use as far as a producer is con-

cerned I'm sure. And the fourth dog is much more the stamp of the first two placed. But this little dog was an in and out showman, sometimes he would use himself and sometimes would not. A dog presented in a very handsome condition, he's a black dog, has some appeal in this class.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR DOG CLASS

Twelve in the Bred by Exhibitor Class, one has not picked up so far. Now this was a nice class, and it was perfectly apparent when they came in as to where the interest lay. Class was won by a perfectly lovely puppy, he's not a year old yet, he's in magnificent condition. He looks like a Scottie, he acts like a Scottie. He's of harsh crisp coat, all the way down to his furnishings. He's got a beautiful head, eye and ear. He's got no signs of bumpy skull. Plenty of neck for a Scottie, with a beautiful laid back shoulder. Nicely set on tail, departs himself very well on the move, he's dark red brindle. And second to a dog maybe just a size bigger, not to be denied his placement in this class, he was very close up in this class. He's just a size bigger dog, not quite the coat condition of the puppy that placed first and not quite the cleanliness all the way through. The winning puppy is so clean over his neck and shoulder, he's the right size of bone for his size, the right length of leg for this type. The third is a silver brindle dog presented in very handsome condition and nice shouldered little dog with a pretty head, eye and ear. He shows all the time, uses his legs well. And fourth is a dark brindle dog much more the type of my second dog, this is a dog with a hard topline, a well set tail, good use of his legs. The three placed above him just had the advantage in head.

AMERICAN BRED DOG CLASS

Three in the American Bred Dog Class, they seem to be all here. A brindle puppy dog in not very big coat to win this American Bred Dog Class. A dog well off for balance and proportion, good idea of himself, nice boned puppy, pretty eye and nice proportions of head. A dark brindle dog in second, not quite the bone and substance of the dog that placed ahead of him, but a nice dog with it all. Not the tail set of the puppy that won the class. And the third dog is a nice black brindle dog, very happy to be out this day.

OPEN DOG CLASS

A lot of absentees in this Open Dog Class, however, the four we're left with for the most part the right size and the right shape. The dog at the head of the line is just barely over a puppy if that. He's a black dog, he's the right size, keen attitude and shortback. Uses himself well on the lead once he gets himself settled down and gets all his legs going in the right direction. The second dog is silver dark brindle dog, shortbacked. The dog in first had the advantage of placement of shoulder. However, this little dog is a useful dog and nicely put down, nicely shown. The third, a little bigger than the two dogs above him, he's a showy dog, shown in lovely condition. The two dogs above him appealed more in type. And a wheaten dog with a black eye in fourth, just a little more Scottie than I would like. But, he has a keen expression, good use of himself on the move.

WINNERS DOG

Winners Dog to the smashing Bred by Exhibitor Puppy Dog on all of his positive attributes. And Reserve to the very, very

masculine, handsome, sound Nine to Twelve Puppy dog who has such great expression.

NINE TO TWELVE PUPPY BITCH CLASS

Big Nine to Twelve Puppy Bitch Class with a lot going for it. The first three bitches are all brindles. Not too much separates them except the bitch who stands in front of the line has the advantage in balance and proportion, condition of coat and tail set. These three bitches are very, very close in head, eye and ear. They use themselves nicely. They're very, very decent on the come and go. They're nice sizes, they've got enough neck without being swans, they are handsome bitches. The fourth bitch, a little black bitch, in the most magnificent shape, very, very shortbacked and hard coated. She's a black bitch, she shows all the time, she's got a million dollar pair of ears. I just preferred the little differences in type that set the three bitches that were at the head of the class, apart from the bitch that was in fourth. They all just had a little on her reach in front. But she's a lovely bitch and I'm sure will do well.

TWELVE TO EIGHTEEN BITCH CLASS

Twelve to Eighteen Class was dominated by this black bitch, an up to size bitch, but not coarse or over done, beautiful balance and proportion and balance of bone to size. She's very stumpy, she's a very important bitch. She's put down to lovely condition and hard coat and she's got a lovely head and eye. Beautiful shoulder, takes a lovely stride, a good push behind. Second a young wheaten bitch, nice size, pretty head, needs to settle down a little bit and use herself a little bit better. The third is also a wheaten bitch and in impeccable condition, just a little too much bitch for

me in here and not ready for this competition. The dear shortbacked little silver brindle bitch in fourth completed my placements in the class.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR BITCH CLASS

Nice Bred by Class with two bitches at the top of the class, very, very similar in type, color, size and what they've got going for them. The bitch that won the class had the advantage in her attitude and the way she carried her top and used her neck. Both bitches are dark red brindles, they are lovely size, they are lovely balance and proportion, and they stood out in the class. The brindle bitch in third is a very handsome bitch, very imposing bitch. She's a size larger than I like, but take nothing away from her, she's got a million dollar personality. She shows her heart out, was in good coat and demanded her place in line. The fourth bitch is a little black bitch with a little short tail, not a glamorous bitch, but a useful bitch and I was happy to have her.

AMERICAN BRED BITCH CLASS

The American Bred Bitch Class of five bitches. Won by this very appealing black bitch, she stands in first. She's not in the best of coat, but she has a beautiful head, a beautiful pair of ears, she uses herself like a Scottie. She keeps herself together and she won the class quite handily, she's really got a classic out look. Second to a bitch of somewhat similar stamp, doesn't have the head, eye or ear of the bitch that won the class. But because of the use of her tail and her keeping herself together on the move, got into second in this class. The third bitch is a very handsome bitch, just won't get her tail up high enough, I don't know whether it's structure or whether she just hasn't been shown enough. A brindle bitch in hard coat, some appeal

to her head. And the fourth little bitch is a shortbacked little bitch, not the best coat today, but has some appeal to her, and has a pretty face.

OPEN BITCH CLASS

We ended up with a wheaten bitch in this class, this Open Bitch Class, on the basis of her balance and proportion, a black eye, her willingness to show. She's in lovely

condition, she moves beautifully in front, she's a little wide behind, but I think it's as much coat as anything. She has a well made head and no sign of a bumpy skull at all, uses herself well at all times. She has a very short well placed tail. Second to a showy little black bitch, very good on the go. The bitch that stands in first had the advantage in coat and condition on the little black bitch and a little length of head. But the black bitch is a lovely little bitch, and I would be happy to have her on another day. Third to another black bitch, the black bitch that is in second had the advantage in profile movement when they went around the ring the last time. But once again, this is a black bitch with a lot to like about her, front is back under where it belongs, in lovely condition. And fourth to a very showy black bitch, full of herself, makes the most of herself, hard coated, I would just like her truer in front.

WINNERS BITCH

Winners Bitch to a smashing, "all of a piece" ten month puppy bitch, the only things she does wrong is to be a little too full of herself on occasion. She's a beautiful size, great legs and feet all the way around, she's put down in lovely condition. Great head, eye, ear and attitude. She misbehaved slightly in the Winners Class. I gave her a chance to settle down, and she said "alright", and she got down to her

business and she did a good job. And Reserve is the pretty black bitch who is from the Bred by Exhibitor Class. She's just a size more bitch than I like, but she is just so important and carries herself so well and she has so much to do for the breed. She reaches in front and keeps topline, her tail is where it belongs, she's got a dark eye, these are a lovely pair of bitches and very exciting.

SPECIAL'S CLASS

And to climax my part of the day, was the handsome Special's Class. Too bad we did not have Awards of Merit, as we could have honored some of these close contenders.

BEST OF BREED

Best of Breed went to the well known, well shown black bitch, Ch. Brookhills Morning Edition. She puts it all together and keeps it there. Sound, big ribbed, good headed, dark eyed, she carried the day.

BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX

Best of Opposite Sex to Ch. Sparwyn Speak N' Spar, a dark brindle dog, lovely size, short topped, good legs all the way around, keen expression, appealed standing and moving, never let down.

BEST OF WINNERS

Best of Winners to the Winners Bitch, Tardun Teatime at Haslemere, who just kept getting showier each time in the ring. What a future for her!

Protect Your Dogs At Shows

by Melvyn Musson

There is a new threat to dogs at shows and we must take action to prevent dogs being killed or injured. The following are points which should be considered. The list is not intended to be all inclusive but to stimulate thought and actions on the part of those showing dogs.

- Be aware that there are organizations and people whose actions can kill or injure your dog(s).

- Do not leave your dog(s) unattended.

- If you must leave your dog(s), use the "buddy" system. Ask those around you to keep an eye on your dog(s).

- Help others when they ask you to keep an eye on their dog(s).

- If you see someone acting suspiciously, challenge them. Also, take note:

What do they look like?

What are they wearing?

Is there any other distinguishing feature(s) or information that may be helpful in identifying them?

- Report anyone acting suspiciously to the club's show chairman and the superintendent.

- Keep your crate doors padlocked. (You can buy four or six padlocks that use the same key.)

- Check your crates regularly for foreign objects, food you have not given your dog, etc.

- Look out for people who are trying to feed your dogs either in their crates or on the table. Remember, most show people will not give food to a dog without a specific reason. Even if a person looks like a "show" person, if they are attempting indiscriminate feeding, challenge them.

- Look out for people with spray bottles, spray cans, etc. A recent threat to kill show dogs involved spraying ethylene glycol (antifreeze) into dog crates.

- Ask your own all breed and/or specialty clubs about the special actions and security they intend to utilize to reduce the chances of an incident at your show.

- Ask the same questions of friends in other clubs.

- ABOVE ALL, BE AWARE THAT THERE IS A PROBLEM; TAKE ACTIONS TO PROTECT YOUR OWN DOGS(S); AND SPREAD THE WORD TO OTHERS.



Dog Auction — 270 Dogs — Breeder Going Out of Business — Entire Stock Must Go” read the hand bill. It then went on to list the breeds and number of males and females in each to be auctioned.

After communicating with other members of the Heart of America Scottie Club and the STCA, my husband, Fred, and I decided to stay home from the Nebraska show; the weather wasn't looking too promising anyway, and attend the auction which was to be held between two very small towns in the Ozarks outback.

As we wound along the back road we were encouraged. There weren't many cars going our way; maybe the auction would be a big flop. “Top Of The Ozarks Dog Auction — Turn Here”: read the sign beyond a dingy white-frame house and a couple of out buildings. One of those, we would discover later, was filled with metal crates full of cats. As we turned we drove past a dilapidated pig sty inhabited by one lean, dirty, solitary pig.

As we traveled deeper into this barren farm, we came upon activity. Boys directing parking for a lot full of cars and trucks. Most vehicles had Missouri plates or those from adjoining states. Most were enclosed vehicles. All were FILLED with empty crates. People had obviously come to buy on this day when the temperature never reached above freezing and the wind chill was near zero.

Oh dear! We had come to rescue four Scotties (one male and three bitches, one with “seven puppies on her” we had been told). Would the \$500 total we had from the two clubs be enough to save all the Scotties? We could only pray so as we

lowered our heads against the cold winds, swallowed the lump in our throats and determined that we too would proceed with the tenacity of our wonderful Scots. Ahead stood two gray, metal buildings approximately 50' x 50' without windows — without exercise runs — without humanity.

The first building where people registered and got their bidding numbers, housed the Frenchies, the Brussels, the Affenpinschers, the Bulldogs with undershot jaws, and the Poms, many of whom were coatless and had surely never been able to grow a coat. Most of these were kept in this barely heated building by ones or by twos in what all of us would call “puppy play pens”, but believe me, there was no sign of play here. Just dogs that for the most part didn't bark, didn't wag their tails or even take notice of the prospective buyers walking up and down the aisles surveying the “stock”. A few of the terriers were housed in this building also by twos and by threes in runs approximately 2' x 6' or 8'. The white bulls seemed pretty normal and unscathed by their environment. They did not offer to attack when prospective buyers kicked their gates. The Kerrys, all several years old and barely large enough to be in a 6-9 puppy class, were pleased to have some attention and came forward to greet us, one on only three legs. One stayed back in the corner. She was blind “but still is a good mother and takes good care of the puppies, you just can't reach into her pen too fast” the auctioneer would later tell the crowd.

It was still 30 minutes before the auction was to start when we reached the head of the registration line and received our bidding number: 60.

The second and larger building was where the auction would be held. Here with no heat save two portable butane heaters, with a foot-wide strip of plexiglass running the length of building at the roof peak was the only source of daylight. The larger breeds were kept in pens only slightly bigger than those of the toys. All were kept on wire. In fairness it was coated. Although you wondered if this was to make it easier on the dogs feet or for faster cleaning. We walked past the raised pens with their 2' x 8' wire floors at waist height and dilapidated dog houses at the far ends. On the doorways of these houses leaned some inhabitants, while still others remained within, staring at us blankly as if we did not exist — as if they did not exist. We walked past the disfigured Pekingese, the Shih-tsu, one a 12 year old pregnant bitch, the “Toy Borzoi—Very Rare Breed”, the Wires and the Welsh. There at the very end were our Scotties. A fat, black bitch; a wheaten bitch, who stayed inside the doghouse, and was advertised as having been bred ten days earlier. The black “stud dog” walked down to see us. Yes, he was a Scottie despite the fact he was as high on leg and chest as a Border Terrier. The mother Scottie was in the “nursery” with the puppies but they had been weaned and therefore would not be auctioned with her, we were told. They would not be auctioned at all. They were five weeks old and in two weeks would go to pet shops. Quickly I looked at the pedigrees. For, tragically, in other breeds I had seen kennel names I knew, even champions of great repute appeared in the first and second generations.

To our great relief, and your great credit, the Scottie pedigrees carried the names: Bruno Bob, Wolfer, Annas Lassis. Not a Scottie fancier appeared on them.

I was studying the terrier pedigrees as I worked my way back up the aisle when I was accosted by a woman, the collar of whose down jacket almost covered her lips and her white knit cap was pulled down into her eyebrows.

“What kind of dogs do you breed? Do you make your living or supplement it breeding dogs? Do you sell litter lots?”, she demanded!

Was she a spotter for the auctioneer? Had I been detected as an outsider? Would we be evicted before we could rescue the Scotties?

“I want to get started breeding. What are your breeds? Which are most profitable?”, I retorted.

Her answers were as peculiar as mine and immediately it was obvious to each of us that we were both there for the same reason. This was shortly confirmed when a Kerry breeder I knew arrived. This lady would later introduce us to a woman from Chicago and her friend who were also there to rescue.

Thirteen all together on rescue missions and two more from our Kennel Club made 15 fanciers in the crowd which by now was numbering over 250. We found chairs in the unheated building, the floor covered with the green cedar chips. In front of us was the auction podium covered with green indoor/outdoor carpet, and small plastic bouquets.

10:00 a.m. Time for the auction to start.

Three assistants stood ready to work the floor while the auctioneer, “commercial breeder” and two white-coated handlers worked on the platform.

First the owner spoke.

"I love my dogs so much and regret having to sell them. I have always taken pride in providing quality pets for people in the cities who would otherwise have to buy from a kitchen breeder. I am quitting to devote full time to my dog brokering business; so remember to bring your puppies back to me. We're going to auction lots of fine dogs here today, many champion sired and champion dammed. Many of you know me and know we've shown a lot and done real well. Many of these dogs we sell today just lack a point or two of having their championship. The AKC Welsh Terrier Club is real upset about some of their breed we have; but we can't help it if we have better dogs than they do. After all, we're entitled to good dogs too. I want to introduce professional handlers Ron and Pat Wright from Bucyrus, Kansas who will be glad to show any of these dogs for you."

The first animal on the block was a French Bulldog. The handler stacked, the auctioneer began his cry, the owner inter-upted for the first of 270 times to explain what a wonderful breeder, whelp, producer, etc. this animal was and how it was worthy of a much higher bid. Intensely the puppy mill owners bid. This man was obviously respected by his peers and they wanted his stock. The first dog: "Sold for \$2000," cried the auctioneer. \$2000! Would we even be able to rescue one Scottie with our \$500? The second dog sold for \$850; the next two, for \$1550 each.

At the end of the first hour only 20 of the 270 dogs had been placed, trembling, on the block while their money-making virtues were extolled. One woman had spent

\$5000 that hour. Maybe people would be out of money or just plain gone by the time they finally reached Scotties, listed in the middle of the catalogue.

We read the catalogue. According to it very few of the dogs were whelped prior to '89. Where had all the old dogs gone? Where HAD all the old dogs gone?

The building had been clean when we arrived but as time passed it filled with the smell of feces mingled with the cigar smoke. The air in the port-a-potty was fresh by comparison. Someone with the auction was video taping, not the dogs, but the crowd as they bid. Most of the crowd seemed to know each other and would periodically visit back and forth. They wore cowboy boots and hats, down jackets and small pieces of gold jewelry. They did not seem to be unpleasant people or to have any sense of how unkind their actions were. At the back of the crowd around the edges stood those obviously much too poor to participate in the bidding thus far. I had never seen such faces first hand before. As they watched the bidding and dreamed of buying into this wonderful rich world of puppy milling; I watched them and imagined the horror of being small and helpless and left to their mercy. Dog #95 sold for \$1035; #96 for \$1500; #98 for \$2200; #100 for \$2250.

At 3:30 p.m., Lot #110, the first Scottie, was put on the block. She was the dam of the five-week old puppies. The crowd knew it would be six months before she would have another litter and produce revenue. We got her for \$150. The next bitch also for the same amount. The Chicago rescue lady had private funds and a home for one Scottie so we still had \$350 left to spend. Third was the wheaten bitch.

She had been bred 2 weeks earlier so interest picked up and so did the bidding; we were successful at \$260. Then came the male whom we bought for \$175. We had them! All four of the adult Scotties would soon leave this horrible place and enter into a world of love and companionship and sunlight and grass that they didn't even know existed.

Somehow we had to get the puppies too.

I approached the platform, "I might be interested in taking these Scottie puppies off your hands too. How much do you want for them?"

"They are going to be ready to ship out in two weeks, and we broker them for \$200 apiece. We couldn't take any less than that for them."

"How many dogs and how many bitches?"

"I'll have to go check, I'll let you know in a few minutes."

Seven puppies at \$200 apiece brought us to \$1400 which no one had authorized us to spend. Yet Margaret Brokaw had volunteered to provide a foster home for the dam and puppies, and surely no Scottie lover would want these puppies left here. Surely fanciers and clubs would help bail us out. We were leaving on a business trip the next morning and had \$1000 cash buried deep in our pocket.

"Offer them \$1000 cash for the puppies," Fred said.

The man returned, "We have four males and three females."

"I'll give you \$1000 CASH for the lot of them."

Following a conference with his partner, we were told the puppies were ours too. Thank God!


We paid the bill, heated the car, gathered our rescued Scotties, gave the rescue lady from Chicago the one she was taking to a home there, and left as quickly as possible. It was 4:30 p.m.

On the way home we talked. This had not been a puppy mill in the "20-20" expose' sense, but a country club by comparison. How careful we all must be about to whom we sell our puppies and whose bitches we permit our stud dogs to service. For this is not a place any dog lover would want any of their line to end up.

Back to Springfield and veterinary care, the Scotties went until Monday when they could be met by Margaret Smith and Emily Mathis and taken to their new foster homes in Kansas City.

Our particular thanks to Jeff and Phyllis Jones, Margaret Brokaw, Margaret Smith, Emily Mathis, Jo and Mel Musson, of the Heart of America Scottish Terrier Club, and Jackie Seelbach and the Scottish Terrier Club of America for their wonderful support of this rescue. The Heart of America Club contributed \$250.00. The STCA contributed \$1335.00 to this rescue with the proviso that as the puppies were sold (for \$150.00; adults were to be given away to suitable homes) any amount over actual expenses (food, vet, etc) be returned to the STCA Rescue Fund. Anyone wishing to help support this or future rescue operations should send a donation to the STCA marked "Rescue Fund".

The Molecular Diagnosis of Von Willebrand's Disease in Scottish Terriers

When an injured animal bleeds, its body has a mechanism to stop the bleeding that we all know as clotting. The process of clotting, although seemingly simple, is actually a complex biochemical process that the body carefully regulates. For most people and animals, shortly after an injury, the clotting process occurs and healing begins. However, for a few people and animals, there is a genetic defect in one of the components of the clotting process and excessive bleeding is a problem.

The von Willebrand's factor is one of these components in which a genetic defect can occur. Named after the discoverer of this disorder, the von Willebrand's factor (vWF) is a protein involved in the activation of clotting. Certain breeds of dog have higher than average incidences of the vWF disorder. In Scottish Terriers, the disorder is inherited in a recessive fashion, so that unaffected carrier parents can pass on a defective gene. Offspring need to inherit two copies (one from each parent) of the gene to inherit the disease but need but one copy to be carriers.

Because the animals quite often appear normal until severe trauma occurs, diagnosis of the disorder is important. The diagnosis of carriers of this disease has been maddeningly difficult because the current laboratory technique to detect the factor is difficult to reproduce, however, work is underway to detect carrier animals by directly examining the gene that codes for the defective protein. Genes are

made of DNA, a complex chemical that resides in the chromosomes of every cell, and are the blueprints that code for all protein.

Using newly developed recombinant DNA techniques, a research team which includes Drs. Bill Schall, Pat Venta, Vilma Yuzbasiyan-Gurkan, and George Brewer at the College of Veterinary Medicine at Michigan State University is working to develop a reliable diagnostic test for vWF disease in Scottish Terriers. This important work is funded by individuals and Scottish Terrier breed clubs. The von Willebrand's factor gene is fairly large, as genes go, and mutations that lead to defects can occur anywhere within it. It is not clear yet whether one or more mutations are responsible for the disease in Scotties. For this reason, the researchers are working on two approaches to develop an accurate genetic test. The first approach involves searching for the mutations themselves. Because the gene is so large, the researchers have isolated portions of the gene in smaller, more manageable pieces. These smaller pieces have been isolated using a new technique called the polymerase chain reaction (PCR). Each piece is examined in turn for a mutation that could cause the vWF protein to be defective. Although a mutation has not yet been found, there are still many more pieces to be examined. Once a defect is found, a simple, highly accurate test can quickly be made to detect the mutation using a small amount of DNA isolated

from a dog's white blood cells (the red blood cells in mammals do not contain any DNA). It may eventually be possible to use the residual DNA found in the hair from a dog or from the DNA in cheek cells shed into the dog's saliva.

However, because it is still not known if one or more mutations cause the disease in Scotties, a second approach is also being developed. This method relies on the physical linkage of a DNA "marker" with a defective gene. The advantage of this marker approach is that it will be universally useful for any mutation that occurs in the vWF gene. It will not matter if more than one mutation occurs in a breed of dog. However, the marker method does require that the DNA of affected relatives or known carriers be obtained to examine the pattern of inheritance of the DNA marker with the defective gene. The first approach requires only the DNA from the animal being tested, but only previously identified mutations can be examined.

Once the diagnostic tests have been developed, detection of carrier dogs will be easy and the incidence of von Willebrand's disease in Scotties can be reduced by carefully designed breeding programs that take advantage of the new diagnostic tests.

ing with State as far as supplying blood and donations for this worthy cause. I did give a report at Montgomery County and had wonderful response from a few people. That's where it ended for the most part.

Our total so far is \$8,975, which is a far cry from our goal of \$25,000. We have donations from 7 regional clubs and the STCA. The Dallas club is making a donation quarterly for which we thank them. We thank all of you and please know we appreciate all your help - but we must do better. The Michigan club has raised \$5,500 of this money so, as you can see, we're talking about only \$3,375 from all other sources. I'm sure some will be upset when you read this but, please, know this is nothing personal - this is for our breed and to be finished with one problem so that we can go on to help with other things.

Please know it is just not the clubs we're asking to help. We have members all over that have to know how important this research is. Any amount, large or small, will help greatly to further this wonderful work done for us by Drs. Schall, Bell, Brewer, Venta and Yuzbasiyan-Gurkan.

Remember our little guys are very independent but still they would be nowhere without our help. If you have any questions, give me a call or drop a note.

him to see if he was good enough for the ring. That's how we met Sharon and Jerry May. They didn't think he was show stock, but maybe obedience trials would work. His tail was a little low on his back, his coat wasn't coarse enough, the ears were just a smidgin too far apart, his body wasn't as large as the Scotties that were showing and his head was a perfect miniature. God, he was beautiful. They told me I would have my hands full trying to train him because Scotties want to do their own thing. Back to David and Diane Thompson I went and they said "Go for it."

We started and Shadow took to obedience training like a duck takes to water. By the time he was 9 months old, he had earned his CD and won a trophy for highest Terrier in the ring. In 1987 he was the Number Two Working Scottie in the nation and had his CDX, also another trophy. He was almost two then. We started working for his UD, but never got that far. We moved from Wichita, KS to Oxnard, CA in 1989. Money was short during this time, but we were hoping to finish him this spring. Needless to say, this is not now possible.

Sometime around the end of September or beginning of October '91, he got sick. We were finding blood spots every once in a while, but since our new bitch puppy was in her season, we just assumed it was from her. Shadow never once acted sick or did he seem to be having any problems each time we checked. Finally we found he was losing the blood and took him to the vet. After the tests, the vet found a tumor in his bladder. This little guy's personality was

Well, Shadow was a fighter, as all Scotties are. He came back to his normal self, playing ball, working and just being Shadow until January.

The day before Shadow went to sleep, he was happily loving us and playing. It almost made you forget he was sick. January 7th we came home from work and were greeted by all three Scotties doing their happy-time play before dinner. Shadow picked up his ball as always and wanted to play. We threw it a few times and then he went to eat.

Later that evening after he had played some more, he started to vomit and was trying to potty, but couldn't. I took him to Pet Emergency. He gave no sign of being in pain until then.

It was hard to make the choice, but the time had come. I had to let go. I stayed with him until he took his last breath and then I had to say goodbye to my love, my best friend.

I loved my Scottie, he was the joy of our lives. I worked him in the show ring and he gave me his best. He was my first Scottie and there will never be another like him.

He was very special. I lost a good and true friend and he will be missed. He had a happy six years and loved what he did and gave us a lot of love.

So this is in memory of the true Scottie "Shadow", February 1985 to January 1992. Shadow, we loved you and miss you now.
