Excellent scheduling of the multi events gave people the opportunity to enjoy the dogs in a variety of activities. The large entry, the beautiful Scotties, the competent judges, the wonderful show site, the fantastic hospitality and the great people encountered along the way, provided beautiful memories of a grand weekend. Truly, we did move FORWARD TOGETHER.

Breeders, exhibitors and fanciers, we are most grateful to you also for bringing such fine Scotties so beautifully groomed and presented so well. Conformation, Obedience and Agility, we truly appreciate your strong support and participation. Each show dog afforded an opportunity to see and learn about another dimension of the breed. Each Scottie has her or his own uniqueness that we all recognize and appreciate. The variety of events permitted each Scottie to excel in her or his own special way. But isn't this the thing that binds us together - - love of the Scottie. That is what enables us to move Forward Together.

On Thursday, April 26, the STCA Officers and Board of Directors held their annual spring meeting in conjunction with the National Rotating Rally - Joint Partnership in Charlotte, N.C. Members, you elected a fine, most competent group to oversee the business affairs and programs of the Club. They have a very strong sense and commitment to be responsible to the membership and to Scotties. The agenda was long with serious issues calling for tough choices. 2. THE CENTENARY BOOK OF THE SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA 1900-2002 The Board, after long deliberation and membership input, voted to rescind the motion to publish a corrected edition. The book will stand as is. A committee composed of Helen Prince, Chair; Cindy Cooke and Don Siegel were selected to edit a YEARBOOK to be ready for distribution in October, 2002.

3. MEMBERSHIP ROSTER 2001-2002

STCA is most grateful to Sandi Lewis for the fantastic job in publishing this wonderful little book, the bible of STCA; Sandi is truly a professional demonstrating those wonderful skills in the publication. We are most fortunate to have the talent with the willingness to spend the hours required for a quality product. Express your appreciation to her.

4. AKC GUIDELINES AND RESTRAINTS FOR USE OF E-MAIL BY PARENT CLUBS. Business (voting) can be conducted at meetings or thru mail, fax or e-mail. In order for business to be conducted by e-mail the following precautions must be in place and INCLUDED IN THE BYLAWS:

Every board Member must be provided with the means to participate;

A procedure must be in place to verify the identity of the individual participating to ensure that they are the eligible board member. A mechanism must be in place to verify that the eligible members are listening." All board members must agree to participate in this manner

Parent club boards who want to utilize electronic communication may submit their proposal to AKC before submitting them to the general membership.

5. HEALTH TRUST FUND PROJECTS

Health Trust Fund Chair, Barbara DeSaye, and trust member, Marcia Dawson were invited to the Board meeting to present a description of the projects the Health Trust Fund had voted to support and were submitting for approval. The presentation was followed by a most informative question and answer session. Listed are the project titles.

- Characterization of Host and Environmental Risk for Urinary Bladder Cancer in a High Risk Breed (Cancer is the leading cause of death in older pets and this is the number one cancer in Scottish Terriers).

- Dr. Jerold Bell's Proposal for Genetic

Counseling and Pedigree Analysis to Owners and Breeders of Scottish Terriers Afflicted with Cerebellar Abiotrophy

- Development of a DNA-Based Diagnostic Test for CMO-Dr. Patrick Venta

- Development of a DNA-Based Test for Scottie Cramp-Dr. Patrick Venta

- The Health Trust Brochure

Brochures provided to Regional Club Reps for distribution at specialties, used as an enclosure in the STCA New member packets and sent to non-STCA donors to the HTF.

A most informative education table concerning eye defects of the Scottish Terrier provided attendees at the Rotating with most helpful literature and consultation.

Members, you recognized the health needs and concerns of the breed, developed the structure for administering a program and supported financially this extraordinary endeavor. Yes, Forward Together wonderful things do happen for Scotties and for members.

# HELP FOR OWNERS OF WOBBLY DOGS

Dr. Jerold Bell, assistant professor of clinical genetics at Tufts University School of Veterinary Medicine, is now available for consultations with owners of Scotties suspected of having the inherited neurologic disorder, Cerebellar Abiotrophy (CA). Thanks to funding by the Health Trust Fund with support of the STCA Board, Dr. Bell is conducting a new study about this disease to determine the mode of inheritance, frequency of the defective gene(s) in the breeding population, genetic (pedigree) spread of the defective gene(s) causing CA, and recommendations for genetic control. Writes Dr. Bell:

"Cerebellar Abiotrophy is a slowly progressive degenerative genetic disorder that causes muscular incoordination. Signs of incoordination can develop and be recognizable to an owner from less than one year, or up to four years of age. Signs can include; frequent stumbling, a high stepping stilted, gait and difficulty with going up and down stairs. This disorder is progressive. Once the signs develop, they do not go away. Clinical signs can remain unchanged for years or progress in severity.

This disorder can be confused with other disorders known to occur in the

breed. It can be differentiated from Scotty Cramp, because that is an episodic disorder. Dogs are normal between their cramping episodes. Some dogs affected with CA have been diagnosed with slipping kneecaps (luxating patellas). While this disorder can occur in Scotties and can cause an abnormal hind leg gait, CA affects the whole body. A neurological examination should differentiate these two conditions...

As a professional veterinary geneticist and genetic counselor, I can maintain the confidentiality of breeders and owners, while working to ensure that breeders and

owners are knowledgeable about the risks in their own dogs... Half the job is getting people to understand that no one wants to breed an affected or carrier dog, and that no one's breeding program created the CA causing gene(s)... It could happen to you, just as it could happen to anyone else...

[With the STCA's acceptance of] my proposal, breeders and owners of suspected CA affected Scottish Terriers can con-

tact me to assist with diagnosis, understanding [of] the disorder in their dogs, and counseling. These consultations will be at no charge to those owners and breeders. Other Scottish Terrier owners or breeders, who wish to contact me, Dr. Bell, by phone, will receive a return collect phone call. There will be no additional charge to those individuals...

If you suspect that you own [or have

owned or bred] a Scottish Terrier that may have shown signs of CA, please contact Dr. Bell for a confidential consultation. He will assist you in confirming or ruling-out a clinical diagnosis of CA. ## WANTED: SCOTTIE DNA Collection By Blood Sample And/Or Cheek Swab

We are extremely fortunate to live in a time when DNA can provide answers to help us prevent some genetic diseases and to assist us with management decisions for our breeding programs.

The future management of three specific diseases can be improved by the donation of Scottie DNA samples for DNA research. The diseases are: **Transitional Cell Carcinoma** (bladder cancer), **Portosystemic Shunt** (liver shunt) and **Canine Epilepsy**.

For optimum results in the genetic research of these diseases and other diseases to follow, it is important to have appropriate DNA samples from affected Scottish Terriers, the affected Scottie's mother, father and an unaffected sibling. By studying family groups scientists will be able to compare similarities and differences in the genetic makeup of the family groups. This type of comparison will help locate the actual genes causing bladder cancer, liver shunt and epilepsy respective-

ly. This is complicated research and requires time and multiple appropriate Scottish Terrier DNA samples.

You may be able to help us. Below is a paragraph for each of these three diseases with an appropriate contact person for each disease.

### **Transitional Cell Carcinoma**

Dr. Fredrick Leach, a senior staff urologist and principal investigator in the urology oncology branch of the National Cancer Institute needs Scottie blood samples for his work on TCC. A detailed article appeared in *Bagpiper* 2001#1. Dr. Leach needs samples from healthy middle aged Scotties, affected Scotties and close relatives of the TCC affected Scotties. This study needs blood samples that can be collected by your local veterinarian. There is a special procedure that must be followed when collecting the blood. ### **Portosystemic Shunt (Liver Shunt)**

Dr. Vilma Yusbasiyan-Gurkan of MSU is in charge of CHF Grant #1943. Congenital Portosystemic Shunts and Hepatoportal Microvascular Dysplasia in Cairn Terriers and the Yorkshire Terrier. This well funded grant is entering its second year. The STCA Health Trust is considering a possible grant for the collection of DNA from at least ten liver shunt affected Scotties and close family members, and discussions are ongoing with Dr. Vilma to include Scotties in her research. She is willing to take Scottie DNA samples now,

before HTF and Board approval, because some of the known family groups consist of older and/or ill Scotties. DNA collected for this study can be obtained by cheek swab. Additionally, fasting and post eating bile acid blood tests will be needed. ### **Epilepsy**

A consortium of researchers from U. of MO, U. of MN and OH State U. are working to answer questions concerning canine epilepsy. Currently, there are nearly 2500 dogs sampled. 400 of these dogs are affected with epilepsy and 59 breeds are represented. There have been NO Scottish Terrier DNA samples submitted to this study. The project is best described by accessing the Canine Epilepsy Network Website <http://www.canine-epilepsy.net>. This study requires blood samples. The samples should be sent to Dr. Gary Johnson, 320 Connaway Hall, University of Missouri, Columbia, Missouri 65211. Details can be obtained by CONTACTING: Liz Hansen (573) 884-3712.

# Health Trust Fund News

Welcome, Spring! And what could be a "finah" way to celebrate the season than to be in Carolina for a 3 day Scottish Terrier Specialty extravaganza! Congratulations to the STCWV, the STCA and the STCGA and all the legions of hard workers for a huge job well done.

Members of the STCA Health Trust met in Charlotte on Friday April 27 and discussed several exciting developments. First of all, the Trust is pleased to announce that the AKC Canine Health Foundation and the STCA Board have approved the proposal submitted by Dr. Deborah Knapp of Purdue University entitled "Characterization of Host and Environmental Risk Factors for Urinary Bladder Cancer in a High Risk Breed (the Scottish Terrier)", CHF Grant No. 2105. The Health Trust will match funds with the CHF and will disburse \$15,000 for each of two years in support of this important epidemiologic study, the first such project on bladder cancer in the Scottish Terrier. Once the official paper work is signed, the Purdue team will begin their work as early as June of this year. This will be a case control study of bladder cancer in our dogs and will involve the participation by owners of 50 Scotties (deceased or still alive) that have been diagnosed with Transitional Cell Carcinoma (the Cases) and at least 100 age matched, disease free Scotties (the Controls). The Cases and the Controls will be compared and evaluated with respect to host and environmental risk factors, management protocols, dietary exposures and potential protective strategies. Owners will be asked to complete a detailed confidential questionnaire and to respond to a follow-up telephone interview. The data gleaned from these sources will then be subjected to rigorous statistical analysis to ensure that any correlation or conclusions reached will be valid and reliable. Epidemiologic studies such as this can not only provide valuable information by looking back at cases that have gone before, but it can also suggest major areas



to concentrate future efforts and research dollars. This study may prove to be a key in reducing future morbidity and mortality caused by bladder cancer in Scotties, and might be relevant to cancer prevention in other dog breeds as well. Contact HTF Trustee Marcia Dawson for more information, and stay tuned for more details!

The Trust is also proud to announce that we will be supporting another year of Dr. Patrick Venta's CMO DNA study with \$5000 in conjunction with the Cairn and Westie clubs. Dr. Venta is progressing well in his research and feels confident that, with the extra year extension granted by the CHF, he will be able to establish the linkage to the defective CMO gene within the year. But he will not stop there. If breeders desire a direct DNA test for CMO, like the vWD test now available to us, Dr. Venta will need more time and more money in the future to pinpoint the actual gene, even after the linkage or "neighborhood" of that gene is found. The direct test is the ultimate and best goal for this research, and is one that Dr. Venta is very willing to pursue.

Once the gene is discovered and a direct test is a reality, the three breed clubs supporting Dr. Venta's research have the obligation and privilege to direct the management of the CMO DNA Test. To that end, the HTF has formed a DNA Test Committee to be made up of members from the STCA and the Westie and Cairn Clubs equally. This committee will work together with Dr. Venta to make important decisions for the future design and administration of the test and to answer the complex legal questions involved. Members of

the committee are Carole Owen, chairperson, Linda Orsborn, Dr. Robert Schall at Michigan State, and an equal number of members from the Cairn and Westie clubs.

In another new development, the HTF is very pleased to announce the retainer of Dr. Jerold Bell, clinical veterinary geneticist at Tufts University, for pedigree analysis and genetic counseling for owners of suspected cases of Cerebellar Abiotrophy (CA) and other inherited cerebellar disorders in Scotties. In her article entitled "Ataxia in Scotties- Wobbly Scotties"

in the *Bagpiper* #1, 2001, Carole Owen wrote about this progressive inherited disorder in a Scottie named Murphy owned by Debbie Smith. Debbie has meticulously documented the disease in her brave little Scottie and has been instrumental in bringing it to the attention of the Health Trustees and other interested Scottie owners. Although this disease may not be commonly diagnosed in the breed at this time, there is a potential for the recessive genes to turn up in several popular lines of Scotties at any time, and CA has to be considered a potential emerging threat to our current breeding programs. What is quite likely is that the incidence of CA is in fact higher than we know but, due to lack of information on the disease, veterinarians may misdiagnose severely affected pups and humanely euthanize them without further diagnostics or post mortem review. Dr. Bell now offers his expertise to help Scottie owners determine the mode of inheritance, objective frequency, and genetic spread of this defective gene as well as his recommendations for genetic control in the Scottie population. By pedigree analysis and confidential genetic counseling, Dr. Bell can offer realistic and sensible guidance and risk assessment without forcing breeders to abandon breeding programs or to lose breed-wide genetic diversity. For more information on the details of Dr. Bell's services, see his article in this issue of the *Bagpiper*.

Congratulations to Betty Cooper who was the lucky winner of the HTF Raffle! Although Betty flew to Charlotte, she was so thrilled to have won the oil painting that

Praise to Trustee Linda Orsborn for a fine display at the Rotating on Genetic Eye Diseases in Scotties! Many people stopped by the HTF table and were able to learn about the major eye diseases in our dogs as well as take away excellent information on CERF exams and other related articles. The Health Trust is discussing ways to organize CERF clinics at a future national event and/or one or two Regional Specialties. If anyone has ideas or suggestions for this kind of clinic, please contact one of the Health Trustees to give your input.

The vWD clinic over Rotating Weekend was successful with a total of 23 tests sold at the discounted \$99 price. Fifteen of these tests were for Scotties, 7 for Standard Poodles and one for a Dobie. According to VetGen's John Duffendack,

as of 3/1/01, there have been 907 Scotties tested with 7 affected, 97 carriers and 803 clear identified. Our breed is doing well, but we need to encourage all breeders to test their breeding stock and register the results. Remember that it is only with the DNA identification test on both parents and offspring in addition to a Clear vWD test on the parents, that we will be able to declare our puppies "Clear By Parentage." Look for notices of future discounted vWD clinics at the Fall Specialties.

The HTF introduced our new informational brochure over Rotating weekend and it was received well. If anyone is interested in having brochures for distribution at summer and fall shows or festivals, please contact Barbara or Marcia.

# SCOTTISH TERRIER

## Age/Head Length and Age/Weight Graphs

Permission was given by the STCA to reprint pages 102-103 from the STCA 1986 Yearbook.

These charts were redrawn in October 1964, from originals prepared by Messrs. Seth Malby and John McLay. The data was compiled during the late 1940s and published March 29, 1951.

The charts indicate that an ideal head length at maturity is eight inches and weight should be slightly under twenty-two pounds.

The official breed Standard for the Scottish Terrier states:



**"SKULL** - (5 points): Long, of medium width, slightly domed and covered with short hard hair. It should not be quite flat, as there should be a slight stop or drop between the eyes."

**"(1) MUZZLE** - (5 points): In proportion to the length of skull, with not too much taper towards the nose..."

It will be noted that there is no reference in the standard to a specific head length measurement.

The Standard is somewhat more specific regarding the question of weight in stating.. "General, a well balanced Scottish Terrier dog of correct size should weigh from 19 to 22 lbs., and a bitch from 18 to 21 lbs. The principal objective must be symmetry and balance..."

Editor's Note: As this data was compiled in the late 1940's it is being reprinted as to be helpful to those who want something to go by, but not to be taken as absolute...

## Betty Garthwaite Penn-Bull

August 17, 1910 - March 4, 2001

As the news recording the demise of popular personality, Betty Penn-Bull, was transmitted across the globe, it signaled the end of a significant era in Scottish Terrier history. Betty was known and respected throughout the U. K. and internationally for her great contribution to the breed. She was a constant source of inspiration and as a breeder, exhibitor, judge, author, journalist, orator and teacher. She was held in the highest esteem and should be listed among the all-time greats of the dog fraternity, blessed with an encyclopedia of knowledge. Betty was always willing to give her advice freely and selflessly as long as you were genuinely interested in her beloved breed. She was astute, thoughtful, articulate, perceptive but also strong willed and a fiercely independent lady who had served an extensive apprenticeship in canine management before finding the road to fame.

Coming from an affluent family, she had to endure living in impoverished conditions, and although she lacked early education and was unable to read until she was eight, she became somewhat of an expert on the English lan-

guage.

Betty was the youngest of three children of Albert and Charlotte Bull and was born at Norbury, South London in 1910. Her father's family hailed from Essex.

Despite being a literary man, he was extremely vague about most material and practical matters; Betty described him as 'an academic and a dreamer'. However, he supported the family with his writing, which generated a modest and irregular income.

Her mother, also a proficient writer, had done some stage work but, being a renowned beauty, modeled for a number of noted photographers and artists. Charlotte was an emotionally unstable woman who found herself incapable of coping with the demands of three young children and serious financial burdens. Sadly, apart from a few remissions, the break downs continued, and she was frequently hospitalized.

When war was declared in August 1914, Betty and her brother Derry were uprooted from their comfortable home and dispatched to a boarding school where they remained for six months.

Like something out of Dickens, the school was cold and cheerless, people were stern and severe, and it must have been a traumatic experience for a four year old. This encounter was followed by a succession of education changes and when she entered her twelfth incursion into the land of knowledge Betty was still only 11 years old. Apart from periods with no tuition at all, her previous experiences included three governesses, three boarding schools and six day schools.

Although the family home had been an 'animal free zone' all her life Betty had been obsessed about dogs and her only ambition was to work with them. So finally, when she reached the age of 16, Betty decided to forgo further education and set about to fulfill her dreams of starting work in kennels. She received no co-operation from her family who did not care for the idea or feel it was a suitable career for their daughter. Nevertheless, there was no actual opposition as they were probably of the opinion she would soon tire and be discontented working long hours for a pittance of pay and indifferent career prospects,

all of which were very real in the late 1920's, and would then be more sensible and embark on a secretarial training as her sister, Rene, had done. How wrong could they be?

Initially, finding work was by no means an easy task, as she had to compete with the more knowledgeable applicants who had received specific training from the well-established schools for kennel maids. Overcoming this obstacle, Betty accepted a less attractive and rather menial position, and to compensate for her lack of experience assisted with the household duties. Rapidly discovering more of her time was spent cleaning than actually working with the dogs, she quickly moved on to other employment. During the next six years Betty worked in an assortment of canine establishments including a stint in a dog shop where puppies of the popular breeds were constantly offered for sale, a business that would certainly be frowned upon today. The majority of positions were fairly unrewarding, however, she did learn basic general management and rudimentary trimming which was advantageous for when she commenced her own enterprise.

The first dog Betty personally owned was "Judy", a delightful nine month old Sealyham, who was her pride and joy and greatly loved pet, but subsequently, she tragically died following a disastrous protracted whelping. Naturally Betty was devastated and the loss haunted her for a very long time.

However, in 1930, fate took a hand as a chance meeting with William Jones, a Scottie breeder from Wales, transformed her life and started her on a seventy year association with the breed for which she became famous. In all probability it was mostly compassion that prompted Betty to pay the two guineas (\$4) for the yearling dog, a son of Ch. Albourne Reveller, who she registered "Nell the

Staunch", being of the opinion that the latter part of the named summed up the breed 'strong' and 'loyal'.

Finally in the spring of 1933, after leaving her ninth job Betty felt the time had come to branch out on her own, and after a brief spell operating as a "puppy retail business", she made the decision to concentrate on the Scottish Terrier. The Kennelgarth affix, derived from her second name Garthwaite, was registered the following year and a number of dogs were soon listed under this banner. Breeding and showing soon became serious businesses and in 1937 new blood was introduced to the kennel with the acquisition of Heather Herald, a son of the legendary Ch. Heather Realisation x Heather Louise. Although World War II intervened "Herald" appears in the majority of modern Kennelgarth pedigrees, thus linking the end of one great kennel and the beginning of another.

Through an earlier introduction Betty became a close friend of the talented artist, Lucy Dawson (Mac) therefore it is no surprise to learn that for many years the Kennelgarth Scotties acted as models whenever the breed was needed for her work on books, calendars and postcards, all of which are highly collectable today. Later, the head study of Kennelgarth Blacksmith was drawn specially for the cover of Betty's first book.

Apart from the outbreak of the war, 1939 proved to be an eventful year on a personal level, as in June the death of her father occurred and this was quickly followed by her mother in September, so it was necessary to close the family home and this entailed sorting through sundry papers and disposing of the furniture plus many treasured heirlooms. The number of dogs she owned also presented a problem, but Betty managed to 'evacuate' six to her friend Margaret MacBain, in Scotland, (her brother-in-law, William MacBain, owned the Diehard Kennel in N. Y. and was a former President of the S.T.C.A) others were rehomed or put to sleep, and the remaining couple she was able to keep

herself.

Betty had enrolled in the Air Raid Precautions (Civil Defence) some months earlier so was committed to be available on call for all emergencies, and she also worked on the buses as a conductress. Air raids and bombings were a common occurrence in London so she was often placed in danger; however, she endured the period of hardship and struggle with great determination.

As the hostilities abated Betty once again set out to strengthen her kennel, and by degrees worked her way up the ladder. Primarily, she owned a kennel of stud dogs although some breeding was undertaken, so consequently a large number of breeders had Kennelgarth in their breeding program, and Betty frequently purchased stock back to incorporate in her line. Show ring successes did not come instantly and although in 1949 Kennelgarth Marquis and Kennelgarth Melody were both certificate winners they were denied titles. For this honour Betty had to wait until Kennelgarth Mallich (bred by Muriel Owen) became a champion in 1952.

In all she bred and owned sixteen champions, bred three others, and owned and campaigned seven more, plus two more bitches that became her property also won their qualifying award while in her ownership. Although her dogs attained many major prizes, Betty never achieved a "double" or won a terrier group at the championship show. The first Kennelgarth to gain an American crown was Kennelgarth Holy Smoke in 1951, but probably U.K. & Am. Ch. Kennelgarth Romeo who was campaigned by Bergit will be the best remembered.

Perhaps her most rewarding milestone was the pleasure of breeding and owning Ch. Kennelgarth Viking who left an indelible mark on the breed siring a record twenty-three U.K. champions.

Prior to the war, Betty judged at a couple of small shows progressing to championship level at L.K.A. in 1950. Among her twentyfive championship appointments were Crufts 1966 and all

the major Club shows including S.T.C. Eng. Centenary show in 1983. She also officiated in Sweden, Finland and America including the S.T.C.A. national specialty at Montgomery County 1978 where she selected Ch. Dunbar's Democrat of Sandoone as her eventual Best of Breed. Although Betty was a recognized breed authority, she also had a very keen eye for assessing other terriers, but she never aspired to judging additional breeds within the group.

Inheriting her literary prowess from her parents, she had the skill to impart her knowledge in both a clear and comprehensive manner and her articles on all aspects of canine welfare have been in great demand and reprinted worldwide. As an author her book "The Kennelgarth Scottish Terrier Book", published in 1983 is generally considered as the definitive breed textbook. Betty also had a natural gift for speaking, and her presence was regularly requested at breed seminars and functions where she would talk unprompted and without pause to a captivated audience on the history, development or standard thus enabling numerous poten-

tial judges to appreciate and understand many of the finer points attributed to the breed. She would also demonstrate the complexities of show trimming or take part in a brains trust. Having gained much pleasure from her own association with the breed, Betty considered this was her way of repaying for the experience.

On the managerial level, in 1943 Betty played an integral part in reviving the S.T.B.E.A., which had lain dormant through the early war years. Initially she acted as secretary and then served as President for eight years, and in recognition of the years of service given to the club in 1988 she was elected an Honorary Life Member.

Unfortunately, during the last couple of years Betty suffered several set backs and due to her increasing frailty was conscious that she was no longer capable of administering the necessary care and attention to her beloved dogs, so made the heart rendering decision for them to be rehomed. Although Betty still remained eager to attend as many shows as possible, and closely monitored the progress of any Kennelgarth progeny, she never really came to terms living without her faithful companions.

Although her circumstances had changed enormously since the war years and Betty and the Kennelgarths had made such an indelible impression on

the breed, she did continue to live a frugal life style, the throw away era was not for her, she instead adopted the policy 'make do and mend' whenever possible! Infirm she may have been, but her brain continued to be alert and active, she kept up to date on current events and world affairs, and thankfully retaining her vivid photographic memory was still able to reminisce about earlier times. Betty was small in stature but a giant in personality, the world of dogs has certainly said goodbye to a totally unique and irreplaceable character. She will be sorely missed especially in our household, but Betty will not be forgotten.

Hopefully, later in the year it will be possible for her friends to arrange a day to celebrate her life long involvement with the Scottish Terrier, the breed which enriched her life for seventy years.

Betty had been a family friend for sixty years so had known me all my life; and in fact was a surrogate Aunt throughout my childhood! During the last couple of years she had spent a considerable amount of time staying in our home, which helped to pass her lonely days, so we have some very happy memories of these visits.



# *The Scottie Crime Busting Caper*

On a pleasant weekday afternoon my Scottish Terrier, Rusty, and I had an unusual adventure. It took place in Garden Acres Park, where we often go for our walks together.

The park is quite new, was expensive to build, and is a really classy layout. The major attraction is a complex of four softball fields that are situated in a huge circle. The home plates are all oriented toward the middle of the circle with wide walkways between them leading from the perimeter of the outfields to the center, like spokes from the rim to the hub of a wheel. The central area is attractively designed with tiered bleachers, two restaurant facilities, children's play areas and other convenient features.

Whenever Rusty and I walk there I am greatly disturbed by the repeated evidence of vandalism. Garden Acres is a beautiful park, but like other public facilities, it is frequently targeted for senseless damage. Routinely seeing this, I promised myself that if I ever witnessed such destruction, I would do my best to see that whoever was responsible would have to answer for it.

By coincidence, earlier that day a shipment of items I had ordered from an animal supply company was delivered. One of the items in the package was a small hand

spray canister containing "Mace Brand 'MUZZLE' dog repellent." The active ingredient is capsaicin, the same ingredient used in pepper sprays to repel humans. Having twice been attacked in the past dozen years by aggressive dogs (and once repelling a Doberman by using pepper spray), I usually carry this defensive device with me when Rusty and I take our walks.

On this particular afternoon, while we were walking in Garden Acres Park, we suddenly heard loud crashing sounds, like a rock being thrown against solid metal. The noises seemed to be coming from an adjacent walkway about 100 yards from us. Our view was partially blocked by large evergreens, but I was able to see that two teen-aged boys were repeatedly throwing a rock up into an overhanging light on the walkway. These lights are not just simple bulb affairs, but expensive decorative light pole fixtures that line both sides of the long walkways.

With Rusty on lead, we set out immediately to see if we could stop the destruction and identify the culprits. The two hooligans did not see Rusty and me, and they leisurely finished smashing a 3rd light before nonchalantly walking on. They stopped at the end of the walkway at a cov-

ered shelter, took off their backpacks, and sat down to lounge at a picnic table.

Rusty and I continued our stealthy approach, keeping out of sight behind the evergreens, until we were forced onto the open walkway. At that point, observing that both boys were facing the other direction, we stepped out onto the walkway and proceeded as if nothing were amiss. We walked casually toward them, and remained undetected until we were about 40 yards away. We continued unhurriedly toward them as if we were unaware of their mischief. When we were 15 feet away, I dropped the leash and put Rusty on a "DOWN" and "STAY," where he remained as commanded for the next 6 or 7 minutes until I returned to him.

I walked directly up to the two offenders, who were now curious about us, but were still not alarmed. When I reached them, I took the new pepper spray canister out of my pocket and thrust it forward, holding it two feet from the face of the nearest vandal. I told them that if either of them moved, I would immediately pepper spray both of them. Next I demanded they produce their names and addresses in writing.

The first delinquent took out his wallet and in a sudden move I grabbed it away

from him. I ordered the other violator to produce his wallet. He said he didn't carry a wallet, so I directed him to write his name and address down and give it to me—and I cautioned him that if he didn't do it, or if he lied, we would locate him from the information in the wallet I was already holding.

As I stood my ground, the second teen began fumbling very slowly through his backpack for pen and paper. During this delay I sensed that the first youth was entertaining thoughts about how he might physically overpower me in order to repossess his wallet. I abruptly re-aimed the pepper spray canister and warned him again: "Don't even think about it or I'll give you a bath with this stuff!" The threat was successful, and I could see his determination ebbing away. After several minutes, the second teen finally handed me a scrap of paper with a name and address scrawled on it. Satisfied with that, I carefully backed away until I was standing next to Rusty, pocketed the pepper spray canister, picked up the leash, and at my command we heeled away.

We walked back to the center of the complex and from there I called the city police on my cell phone. The dispatcher listened to my summary and then asked if I would remain there until a patrol car arrived, which we did. The police officer arrived 15 minutes later. I recounted the events of our adventure and turned over the confiscated wallet and paper scrap to him. Then we toured the area where the damage had been done. While we were there, a pair of young boys came up to us and blurted out that they had seen two high school guys smashing the lights. The officer asked them what they saw and they recounted the same facts that I had reported. He asked if they could identify the vandals if they saw them again. Although they weren't sure of that, they were able to provide the officer with good descriptions.

Next we inspected the picnic shelter where Rusty and I had the confrontation with the vandals. From there we returned to the squad car. The officer wrote down my name, address and other information. When he asked me where I was employed, I replied that I was retired, but joked, "This is my second career. Rusty and I patrol the city parks to prevent vandalism—you know, to 'protect and serve.'" He thought that was a strange reply, but then realized it was given tongue-in-cheek and we both enjoyed the humor of it.

Rusty and I finished our afternoon walk and went home. Late that evening the police officer called to report that he had apprehended the teen-ager whose wallet I had taken. He said that the boy's mother was very cooperative and gave him her full support. With her actively involved, as the facts were revealed, her son confessed to his part in the vandalism.

The second teen-ager, however, had written a false address on

the scrap of paper, and was still at large. But, with the first boy's mom involved, and her son left "holding the bag," my guess is that the second young law-breaker will soon be found.

Rusty, the Crime Busting Scottie, is quite pleased with these results. He said he's done a little bird tracking in his time, and if we need a good dog to track the fugitive, he's ready to go!

On reflection, I realized that Rusty deserves major credit for this bust. If it weren't for him, we wouldn't be taking frequent walks in Garden Acres Park. If it weren't for him, we wouldn't be carrying pepper spray. If it weren't for him, we wouldn't have appeared to be "just an old man walking his dog," and no doubt the teens would have fled at my approach. And if it weren't for him staying rock solid for several minutes on a "DOWN" and "STAY," I would not have enjoyed the advantage of unrestricted movement with both hands free to successfully confront the vandals.

We are certainly pleased with the way things turned out. But, after reconsidering our adventure, I do have one lingering thought: I can't help but wonder how Rusty and I would look in matching plaid capes.

Please check out the 2000 Rescues of the Year on the STCA Web Page at <http://clubs.akc.org/stca/highlight.htm> - This is what we are here for and what we are about. Stanley, the rescue featured in the previous edition of *the Bagpiper* and one of the above featured rescues, was diagnosed with cancer in March and lost the battle on April 23rd. Our condolences go to Kay Nellis who loved him for the best 18 months of his life and to Amy Cada who saved him from his previous miserable existence and nursed him back to health.

A recent breed column in the AKC Gazette angered us. The columnist's point was that all puppies should be micro-chipped before they are sold. She had been called on two occasions to check out dogs of her breed who had been picked up as strays and not claimed. As these dogs were not of her breeding and probably came from a pet shop or local broker, she walked away and did not know the final disposition of the dogs. **Please do not do this to a Scottish Terrier.** If you hear of a homeless Scottie and do not know who the rescue contact is for your area, please call us at (210) 653-3723 and we will find someone to help the dog. He may not be of your breeding or even a good example of the breed, but chances are members of the STCA bred some of his ancestors. We find recognizable names in almost every pedigree we do on rescued dogs. On two occasions recently, dogs were reunited with their breeders after entering the rescue program. Just because you sell your puppies on an airtight contract does not guarantee it is not going to go astray. The buyer may be too embarrassed to admit she has failed as a Scottie owner or there may be a death and the survivors do not know where the dog came from. A complete list of local and regional rescue coordinators is posted on the STCA Web Page. If you do not have access, please call us. We are here to help.

## The Company That Didn't Go Home

Story: Once upon a time, a couple who lived in Nebraska, bought a Scottie puppy and named her Abby. Abby had a sweet personality and wanted to please her family. But apparently the couple tried to make her into their own version of what a dog should be and do. Or maybe there just wasn't time for them to do anything with her but make her stay out of the way. They also had three older children and a 3-year-old girl, which made a very busy household for this little brindle Scot.

One day, the little girl was being baby-sat by the Grandma, who wasn't paying attention to either her grandchild or Abby. The child tried to put lipstick on Abby's mouth (where she got the lipstick was not disclosed), and you can guess what happened. Abby nipped the little girl. Her parents were angry at poor Abby and whisked her off to the shelter immediately. Abby's sweet-tempered bewilderment prompted the shelter to call Daphne and Marshall Branzell, Scottie Rescue National Coordinators, who called Don and Sally Gilman, Rocky Mountain Region Scottie Rescue coordinators, and Don drove to Nebraska to get Abby. All in a day's work for these wonderful people.

Meanwhile, back at the Flora Pl. Ranch: Mandy Weigand, the most dog-oriented of all my Scotties, had begun to yearn for a companion of her ilk. (The word "ilk" is of Scottish origin, used mostly in reference to aristocratic families, appropriate, huh?). I didn't need another dog, but finally came to the conclusion that Mandy did. I've done my best to entertain her, play toys on the floor, and chase her around in the yard, but always she would finally sit down and look at me kindly with those big brown eyes as if to say, "Nice try, Mom, but you're just not a dog!" I got the message. We went out to the Gilman's Scottie orphanage to let Mandy "test-drive" some of the dogs needing homes. It seemed like Abby was the best choice, a little girl about Mandy's size and just a year older. Two weeks later, Abby came to live in Mandyville, and began to learn about life here from the Princess of the manor herself.

Abby the Rookie: Day One. Mandy gives Abby her usual enthusiastic, in-your-face greeting. Abby is overwhelmed at her welcome, but doesn't make a serious defensive move. They go bounding toward the back yard right away, with Abby stopping to make her initial mark on a rug in the dining room on her way out. This is par for the course so I forgive her quietly. Abby can't believe the big yard and the freedom to roam in it. She spends half the day just sniffing. The puppy door is a mystery to her and she is puzzled at Mandy's sudden appearances and disappearances through the wall. Both dogs are exhausted and ready to turn

in before 9:00 p.m.

Abby is installed in her crate in the bedroom, which she seems to take for granted, and Mandy sleeps on the divan in the family room until about 2:00 or 3:00 a.m. as is her habit, then joins me in the bed. A good night's sleep is had by all of us.

P.D. Department: Day Two. Abby is determined to learn to use the Puppy Door. It takes some good timing when two dogs are using it. Abby tries several times to follow Mandy out, but gets the flap in her face because she's too close behind. Finally she gets the hang of going out, but not until late in the day does she venture to push through to enter the house. Lesson learned. Mandy gives her an A.

First Walk. We discover Abby hasn't been hunting lately. Abby does understand that Mandy is on the trail of something and keeps her ears pricked up, but no game is flushed today. It's only a matter of time. My problem is how to keep my arms from being pulled out of their sockets when a rabbit hops out of the bushes. The girls travel well together. Mandy is in her element, and keeps ahead of Abby with the advantage of familiarity. She obviously is enjoying her ability to lead the way, and I'm tickled to see this display of self-confidence in my tiny resident Scot.

Toy Time. Mandy starts the after dinner routine of bringing her toys out of the box one by one to have a squeaky ball game, play "kill the stuffed animals," tennis ball throw, etc. Abby sits and watches. She doesn't do toys. That will change by Day Four.

Bedtime; Night Two. I try to put Abby in her crate, but she jumps into Mandy's basket bed instead. Then she notices that Mandy isn't even in the bedroom. (Mandy is on the divan in the family room where she usually starts the night). Abby runs out of the room. I take a shower and get ready for bed before going to see where she is. I find her all stretched out on the big chair in the family room across from Mandy's spot on the divan. She gives me the whites of her eyes, and strikes a pose that says, "If Mandy gets to sleep anywhere she wants, so do I!" Considering Abby's age and dignity, granting the equal privilege seems reasonable. So I leave them there, and don't hear "Roo" until 7:00 a.m.! Sometime in the middle of the night, I go check on them. They've changed places, but are still sleeping soundly and don't stir a muscle. Goodbye crate... Van Riding. Piece of cake. Great Scottie show at the stoplights!

Old Polish Proverb; Day Three. "Company is like fish; after three days they begin to stink." Mandy realizes now that Abby is not just visiting. She spends most of the day outdoors by herself, wondering why ever she thought having a dog of her own was a good idea. She just wants her queendom back. She gives me a look I've seen before in other circumstances. We have a neighbor dog whose rambunctiousness wears Mandy in a short time. Her eyes say, "I'm tired of playing with this dog now, Mom. Send him away, please!" I pick her up to relieve her of the young Poodle's company, and she sits on my lap gratefully for the duration of the visit. Now I see the same expression on Mandy's face. How can I explain the Abby situation to her? I'll keep trying to divide my love and attention between the two dogs, balancing their needs as best as I can, and hope for the best. I know it may take several weeks, maybe longer, but they are two wonderful, deserving Scotties, and my expectation is that they will adjust to each other and become close buddies eventually.

Since she's been here, Abby has made no sound except for a barely audible squeak. I begin to wonder if she has been de-

barked. Then, Night Three, she goes out with Mandy who routinely does the "clear the backyard for the night," sentry bark that lets the (unappreciative) neighbors know she's got everything under control. Abby joins in with such a tentative restrained bark it leads me to believe she's been harshly disciplined for barking. I'm delighted to hear her voice for the first time, and despite her hesitancy, it sounds like all of her ancestors and contemporaries the deep throaty bark that overstates the size of a Scottie.

Toy Time Again: Day Four. You guessed it Toy Time is a real circus. Lots of keep-away chases through the house with stuffed monkeys and elephants flying out of mouths, and tug-of-war. Looks like Abby is beginning to relax a bit.

The Chair; Day Five. We have a problem. There's an old recliner in the front window that has served as a Scottie lookout post for nearly 15 years. It's irresistible, and is the first piece of furniture every new Scottie latches onto. When two dogs have lived here, they vie for the chair constantly. It's the one contest that never ends. Well, we're at it again. Abby wants the Chair, and little Mandy just retreats dejectedly when the newcomer gets on it because it isn't in her nature to be scrappy. She is so upset today, I put Abby in her crate for the afternoon nap, because Mandy always takes her siesta on the Chair. I know I can't solve this Alpha thing for them. They'll have to work it out themselves, but Mandy needs some encouragement to salvage some ground around here. Mandy is a second-hand dog herself, and was terribly insecure when she first came. I was hoping she had gained enough confidence to maintain her status as first dog, but it's debatable as yet. She is not arguing with Abby for the Chair. Meanwhile, Abby is so nervous and scared of everything, I have to give her a lot of attention to try to ease her fears and confusion. It's a real challenge to meet both dogs' needs right now.

The Hungries Banished; Day Six. Abby has obviously spent a lot of her life wondering when or if she's going to be fed. (Coming from a family of six, this is understandable). She walks the kitchen

on her hind legs like a dancing bear while I prepare the meals, eats ravenously, and exhibits a great deal of anxiety over feeding time. She has an extended belly and fills her skin out tightly. Whoever took her to the shelter, confessed for the record that Abby had been fed mostly people food during her lifetime. Mealtime here is difficult to manage because of Abby's anxiousness. I begin on Day Two to feed the daily ration in four small quantities, hoping to shrink her stomach and at the same time, keep her from getting too hungry. Today, she doesn't even finish her breakfast, much less scarf it down like a starved wolf. I make a point of putting Mandy's dish down first, and already Abby is learning that her dinner is coming, too, and her panic is subsiding.

One Week Does Not A Family Make; Day Seven. I've talked with people who say, "I don't know how you can take the risk of Rescue dogs. I'd never have a dog I didn't raise from a puppy." Well, I used to be a control freak, too. A strange dog wouldn't have darkened my door. But I know better now on both accounts. Rescue dogs usually come house-broken, leash-trained, car-happy, family-friendly. To be sure, they also bring a history from their former life and possibly some serious problems, depending on their circumstances. However, most of their troubles are not their fault. If owner induced, new owners can overcome in time. Abby cringes flat to the floor when I approach her, and braces for something unpleasant. She's got the makings of a dear little dog who will respond to her new environment. In just a week, the two of them are safe to leave in the van while I do some shopping. They walk, play toys, and romp together beautifully, sleep wherever they want, sometimes both on the divan now. Mandy has a "sister" to be her canine companion and has decided she was right about that after all. All signs point to a happy outcome, and I've had two

uninterrupted hours on the computer this morning. Glory be!

P.S. The dogs are sharing the Chair now, a compromise of the first order. Six weeks into the adoption, I'm in Scottie Heaven. The girls have not had a cross word, and it's still a toss-up who's in charge here. Mandy is holding her own in places that are important to her, and Abby sees fit to humor her even though she could bully Mandy out of anything. I'm delighted to see the integration process going so smoothly, and much of the credit goes to Mandy, who is the quintessential Scottie in charm, character, mind, and heart. She has rescued a damaged, heart-broken "sister," with astonishing magnanimity, giving me the last proud entry in this adoption journal!



# STCA PERFORMANCE AWARDS RULES FOR 2001

The AgilScot award listed below is a new award created to encourage participation and excellence in the area of Agility.

It is offered by Kellie and Tim Verrelli.

The full explanation for this award follows below:

## The AgilScot Agility Award. (AAA) 2001

This award is to recognize dogs that exhibit superior performance and consistency in the sport of Agility. It was patterned after the AKC MACH (Master Agility Championship) Title<sup>(1)</sup> but was expanded to include dogs in the regular AKC Agility titling programs (NA/NAJ through MX/MXJ) for completeness.

The AgilScot Agility Award will be given to the Scottish Terrier Club of America (STCA) Member who's agility dog has earned the most points in a given year. The AKC MACH Title is open for only dogs who are in Excellent B (both Standard Titling and Jumpers With Weaves), but any level agility dog has the ability to win the AgilScot Agility Award. Agility is a sport for all dogs, but speed and consistency is the goal. Older and slower dogs can do well by being consistent and qualifying in both classes on the same day.

We want to make this award attainable for more Scottish Terrier Members without losing the true meaning of the word agility.

### NOTES:

- AgilScot Agility Award(AAA) can only be won by members in good standing with Scottish Terrier Club of America (STCA)
- Only those performances that result in a Qualifying Score (pursuant to AKC Rules and Regulations for Agility) at an approved AKC event will be considered for this award.
- Records are kept by individual dog – Owners with multiple dogs will NOT be tabulated together.
- Dogs/Bitches that have earned this award three years in a row will be allowed to keep the trophy.

Points will be awarded using the following criteria:

- Dogs/Bitches earning a Qualifying Score will receive 5 points (Regardless of Titling/JWW level).
- Dogs/Bitches qualifying in both the Standard Agility Class (Std) and the Jumpers With Weaves (JWW) Class on the same day will receive an extra 10 points (Regardless of

Titling/JWW level).

- Additional points for placement will be added as follows:

1. Dogs/Bitches placing 1st in their class receive 4 extra points.
2. Dogs/Bitches placing 2nd in their class receive 3 extra points.
3. Dogs/Bitches placing 3rd in their class receive 2 extra points.
4. Dogs/Bitches placing 4th in their class receive 1 extra point.

- Dogs/Bitches that receive a perfect score of 100 for a class can receive additional points for each whole second under the Standard Course Time (SCT) as follows:

1. Novice A/B Class Dogs/Bitches earns 1 point for each full second under standard course time.
2. Open Class Dogs/Bitches earns 1.5 points for each full second under standard course time (rounded down).
3. Excellent A/B Class Dogs/Bitches earns 2 points for each full second under standard course time.

NOTE: Standard Course Times are based on a yards-per-second (yps) calculation based on the class (Std or JWW) and the height of the competitor. For Scottish Terriers (who compete in the 8" and 12" jump heights, these rates are as follows:

For Std Titling:

For JWW:

Novice A/B: 2.00 yps

Novice A/B: 2.50 yps

Open: 2.50 yps

Open: 3.00 yps

Excellent A/B: 3.00 yps

Excellent A/B: 3.25 yps

### Rules for Assembling the AgilScot Agility Award Tally Report

1. AgilScot Agility Award(AAA) can only be won by members of the Scottish Terrier Club of America (STCA). To

earn points toward this award all the owners must be a current members of the STCA at the time of each win used in the tabulation.

2. The Tally is arranged by Dog (Bitch). A dog may earn points for this award by qualifying at a given class based on the dogs level. Additional points are awarded based on placements and multiple qualifying at the same show.
3. The Tally ledge can be constructed in the following outline:

In order to acquire the MASTER AGILITY CHAMPIONSHIP title, a dog must achieve a minimum of 750 championship points and 20 double qualifying scores obtained from the Excellent B Standard Agility class and the Excellent B Jumpers With Weaves class. 750 Championship Points (CP's) required minimum

—1 (CP) point is awarded for each full second under standard course time. (No partial points are awarded.)

—Dogs earn points from the Ex B Agility Class and/or the Ex

B Jumpers With Weaves Class.

Placement Multiplier:

—Dogs placing first in their class double their championship points.

—Dogs placing 2nd in their class receive 1-1/2 time their standard championship points. (All fractions of points are rounded down.)

20 Double Qualify (2Q's) required minimum:

—Dogs qualifying with scores of 100 in both the Ex B Agility Class and the Ex B Jumpers With Weaves Class on the same day is equal to 1 (2Q)

## STCA OBEDIENCE AWARDS

The four Obedience Awards listed below are tallied by the following rules:

THE HIGHEST SCORING DOG/BITCH FOR EACH OF THE AWARDS WAS DETERMINED BY AVERAGING

ONLY THE SCORE THAT AKC COUNTS TOWARDS THE OBEDIENCE TITLE; THE FIRST THREE QUALIFYING SCORES EACH DOG/BITCH MAY HAVE EARNED.

The awards are:

#### **HARROP AWARD FOR THE HIGHEST SCORING COMPANION DOG**

Plaque awarded by Faith Harrop to the dog or bitch earning the highest average score in qualifying for a Companion Dog Obedience title during the award year.

#### **PASSIG AWARD FOR THE HIGHEST SCORING COMPANION DOG EXCELLENT**

Plaque awarded by Letty Passig to the dog or bitch earning the highest average score in qualifying for a Companion Dog Excellent Obedience title during the award year.

#### **FAIRBANKS AWARD FOR THE HIGHEST SCORING UTILITY DOG**

Plaque awarded by Virginia Fairbanks to the dog or bitch earning the highest average score in qualifying for a Utility Dog Obedience title during the award year.

#### **MACLAPIN "SAM" MEMORIAL AWARD**

Award donated by Lorayne Lapin in memory of CH MacLapin Just A Sample, CDX, CAN.CD, CD to the champion of record who earns the highest average score in qualifying for CD, CDX, UD Obedience titles during the award year.

#### **THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB VERSATILITY AWARD**

This award is offered to any member whose dog/bitch has been awarded three of the five AKC recognized titles ;Conformation, Obedience, Tracking, Earthdog or Agility. Application must be made to the STCA Annual Awards Chairman and must be accompanied by a photocopy of the championship or title certificate and must be received by July 1st for the year it is being awarded.

#### **CORRECTION FOR THE CONFORMATION AWARDS**

The rules for conformation were printed in *Bagpiper* 2001 # 1. The **GLENBY OPPOSITE SEX AWARD** should be as follows: Using the tabulation of the Francis G. Lloyd Award, this award is offered by Fred and Christine Stephens and is awarded to the owner of the Scottish Terrier that is the opposite sex to the winner of the Francis G. Lloyd Memorial Award.

# Regular Classes Critique

Judge: James G. Reynolds.

I would like to thank the membership for allowing me to judge the STCA Rotating National in Charlotte. Scotties have been an important part of my life for a long period of time and although I usually find that my judging assignments only occasionally include Scotties with the odd regional thrown in I always enjoy seeing the breed and the developments in it. The large entry this past weekend exceeded all of my expectations both in size and quality. Add to that the pure physical joy of handling Scotties and interacting with them and you have everything that judging is supposed to do for the judge.

I thought that the breed is in overall excellent shape. All of the animals exhibited showed the important characteristics, which make the breed unique and were, in great condition to enhance the competition. I found temperaments to be excellent and even the occasional barking was more in good characteristic breed fun than malevolence. Coats and presentation were very good. Most of the headpieces had good planes and good balance of skull and foreface—depending on your interpretation some were too short, some too long and some just right. The odd exhibit lacked a little stop but this was a relatively minor occurrence. Most ears were of proper size and although some "sets" were a trifle low on the whole size was greatly improved. I had only one "iffy" bite although a large number of pop or floating teeth were evident. In many cases this was either caused by or reflected in a rather narrow lower jaw. This whole jaw structure is an important part of what a Scottie is and breeders should be alert to possible issues if the problem becomes too endemic. My major criticism of heads were large, round and sometimes too bold eyes. This totally alters expression and since so many characteristics such as this will bedevil a breeding program for many generations I would urge caution. Necks were great and in most cases shoulder lay-back ranged from adequate to excellent. I was however shocked and disappointed to see such a great number of chippendale fronts. I really thought that we had got this

under control but clearly today that was not the case. Middle pieces were great as were toplines and tail sets. Rear movement had improved although a number of dogs fought with their handlers when the handler tried to place the hind legs properly under the dog and parallel. Many dogs resisted and actually preferred to stand with one leg far in advance of the other. This was not a case of the handler overstretching the dog but rather in the construction of the rear as was reflected in handling and in gaiting the exhibit. As someone who is privileged to judge all breeds including many specialties in other breeds I would like to reaffirm that Scotties, from my perspective, are in very good shape.

W. D. was Caevnes Backstreet Boy from 12 to 18--This young dog only a few days over 12 months took my breath away when he came in the ring. The first thing that I thought as he went around was that he looked like a young Democrat. The next was a caution to myself not to get too enthused until he had been examined. He didn't fail to meet expectations—long lean balanced head with lovely planes, great ears of proper size and placement giving a superb expression which he never failed to give me over the long, hot course of the rest of the day.

Lovely front, dead sound both front and rear moving with reach drive and carrying a dead level topline at all times with tail bang up. To be critical I would like a little more middle piece but when I found at the end of the show that he was just over twelve months I was reassured.

When the 24 specials came in I recognized two dogs that I have done very well for and a number of other promising dogs. As I worked and worked and worked the dogs--apologies to the handlers who felt they had entered a marathon, it came down to a bitch special and two dog specials who are extremely different dogs with individual strengths and my W.D. who simply would not go away and in the end was my B.W. and B.O.B. When I judged STCA at Montgomery years ago I took my WB on To BOB and she went on to lead the pack the next year. I can only hope that this young dog has as meaningful a career. I was also happy to see that he was sired by one of my finalists

R.W.D. was Deblin's Street Talk from Bred By. A lovely dog of great proportions, beautiful head and condition with a superb middle piece. He kept giving his handler a hard time as he wasn't always as enthusiastic

about the process but was a most worthy competitor.

I thought that my final line-up for W. B. was breathtakingly beautiful and it came down to some nit-picking and who held together the best to come up with W.B. Jovial's Ci Ci Sue from 12-18--Another show stopper when she entered the ring although she did not have this class all her own way. She has an exceptional head, eye and expression --hard bit and varminty with beautiful ears. As always from this handler fantastic coat and condition, good front, great mid piece and always on the look out for fun or trouble. In this end it was this characteristic, which took her to the top although, she was hard pressed by several of the others in this class. I understand that Peggy Sue who was my BIS at Beverly Hills years ago is her grandmother and she is very reminiscent of her.

R.W.B. was Thistlepark Rose of the Moment from Bred By. A lovely short backed black bitch with outstanding proportions. She kept up in the heat thus beating my Open Bitch Karascots Scotch Mist who said enough is enough. She should have borrowed a little of oomph from her litter sister who was also in the challenge
