A LOOK AT THE OCTOBER SHOW AND DINNER

Mrs. E. P. (Susan) FitzWilliam is our reporter. We quote: "I received your letter an hour before our departure for Pennsylvania. We had to run to the airport and pick up Lena Kardos, then drive 900 miles non-stop to the Treadway Inn."

. . . Col. Weaver, as usual, had arranged a delicious dinner for the more than 80 members and guests. Mr. and Mrs. Archie MacLaren of Scotland were present and were introduced. Other long distance travelers included Martha Melekov, Lorraine Davis and Lena Kardos from California, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Sharp from Canada, Mr. Ted Clark from England, and the FitzWilliams from St. Louis. Following the dinner Dr. Kirk and Mr. Fitzwilliam narrated a 20 minute film which Mr. FitzWilliam took of the Pennsylvania and California Specialties.

Mr. MacLaren, our judge, was kind enough to write some comments on the show which we are pleased to quote.

"On arriving at this show I thought the surroundings were beautiful and the rings were nice. It was a well-run show, with good atmosphere. I was delighted to hear of the magnificent entry of 91 dogs, which I was told was the biggest since the war. I thought the actions of the AKC in having a representative meet and brief me about the procedure, etc. at the show an excellent idea. I thank my two stewards Tony Stamm and Ralph Krueger for their help and guidance. I think, overall, the Scottish Terriers I judged were very typical, and most classes gave me quite a little thought. In the Winners Dog and Bitch classes there was very little between the first three dogs. The Specials Class intrigued me; I had never seen sixteen champions in the ring at one time. Many years ago in the late Bob Chapman's Heather Kennel I saw ten. I am deeply honored and very proud that the Scottie people gave me the opportunity to go over these dogs.

My BB, Ch. Raab Hill Merry Quite Contrary, a beautiful bitch who filled my eye, asked for what she got, and in my opinion was well worthy of it. My BOS, Shieling's Sergeant, a beautiful dog of great body and coupling. He wilted a little on the final run and paid the penalty. I would say of a number of the terriers their biggest fault was I did not own them. I would suggest that attention should be given to improve eyes and ears, and I also thought some tended to be long cast. Bitches I thought better than dogs, which I thought a good sign. Overall I think your terriers compare favorably with the terriers I have viewed in Scotland, England and Ireland.

On behalf of my wife and myself, I would like to say how much we enjoyed the pre-show dinner party, and I want to thank Dr. Kirk's committee and everybody we met for their great friendliness and hospitality. I also want to thank the exhibitors for the sporting way they accepted my decisions. I wish to say that any terrier folks coming to Scotland would be very welcome to visit us. Thank you all for a memorable visit to a great country."

## RESEARCH - PROJECT NEEDS SUPPORT

It is a truism that all breeds of dogs suffer disabilities. Fortunately for dog breeders and fanciers many devoted people through the years have found means of preventing, alleviating or curing many of them. In our Scottish Terriers the affliction seldom talked about and least understood is that heartbreaker called Scottie Cramp, and so far nothing much has been done to find the cause.

Now, at last, researchers have turned their attention to this particular problem. The purpose of the research is to see if the cause of the disease can be delineated, and if a treatment can be found.

Dr. John E. Lund of the Department of Veterinary Pathology, Washington State University, Pullman, Washington 99163, is in charge of the investigation. Dr. Lund would appreciate the cooperation of Scottie people and all information will be kept in strict confidence.

The facilities at the University provide for excellent physical care of the animals, including spacious outside runs. In some instances dogs will be accepted for observation and tests and will then be returned to their owners if desired.

Opinions differ as to the extent of this disease, but now we have an opportunity to put facts and figures, the true story, into the hands of trained researchers. More information is needed from people who have had experience with the Scottie Cramp in their own dogs, and more afflicted dogs are needed for observation and study. Cooperation from STCA members would facilitate this very important program, and hasten the day when the affliction can be eradicated.

## SHOW NEWS

STCA Fall Specialty Year after year this show, held in conjunction with the Montgomery County All Terrier show in Pennsylvania, has proved a popular event and has attracted big entries and a great deal of enthusiasm. The show held October 9 was no exception; in fact, it was bigger and better than ever! Only the Minature Schnauzers had a larger entry than the Scotties, and even the weather cooperated to make it a memorable occasion.

There were 26 dogs, 41 bitches and 16 Specials, a total of 83 dogs exhibited.

In recent years two of the brightest stars in the show ring have been bitches. Now they are shining in a new, and perhaps more important, sphere.

One of these is Ch. Blanart Bewitching owned by Blanche Reeg. Bewitching's show career was spectacular. It included Best in Show wins at some of the most prestigious shows, as well as BB at numerous Specialties, and can be summed up by recalling that she was the Lloyd Memorial Trophy winner in two successive years, 1959 and 1960.

She was not bred until after her retirement from the show ring but to date she is the dam of six champions; three from her last litter are on the current PARADE OF CHAMPIONS!

The second one, with the most impressive record ever achieved by a Scottish Terrier, is Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare owned by Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Stalter.

She, too, concentrated on one career at a time until her retirement in a blaze of glory about two years ago. In her first litter she had six puppies, and already one of them is a champion on the current list.

#### ANNIVERSARY

Ten years ago the BAGPIPER got off to a promising start with Mrs. John (Mary) Kelly as editor. In what was labeled "Winter Issue 1957" Mrs. Kelly states, "Your Board of Governors takes pleasure in presenting this first issue of a proposed quarterly publication, the need for which has long been felt and, indeed, requested many times over. It is hoped that through the medium of this paper we may become a more closely-knit group that can really get together and work constructively for the best interest of our favorite breed, the Scottish Terrier."

For the next three years Mrs. Kelly continued as editor, and many will recall with much pleasure her charming and humorous drawings that brightened the pages.

In the Spring of 1960 Eileen (Lynn) Weaver took over as editor. She changed the format of the publication somewhat and expanded it to cover more news around the country. During her three years as editor Mrs. Weaver followed the original concept of a paper designed to bring Scottie people closer together, and she did it in her well-known fashion: with tact and talent.

A new editor was appointed in 1963, and the first edition under the name of Mrs. Harry (Evelyn) Garber appeared in March of that year. Nothing much was changed in the ensuing years, but the paper was usually bigger, and, for the first time, it was published regularly four times a year.

Some months ago our president was asked to find a new editor to relieve this one who felt that after four years it was time to bring some new ideas and fresh enthusiasm to the publication. Such a person has been found.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve as editor: a privilege to work in this medium to further the purposes of The Scottish Terrier Club of America, and a great pleasure because of the contacts with Scottie people everywhere. That first dear little Scottie bitch which I acquired in 1935 led me down a long path filled with nice people and many delightful dogs. My sincere thanks go to the people, too numerous to mention individually, who helped me to carry on with the publication these last four years. Special thanks are due my husband for helpful criticism and many hours of rather tiresome labor in getting the BAGPIPER ready for mailing.
