It is a 4 inch circle; outer edge is gold with black letters, "Scottish Terrier Club of America", and the center is red with the full figure of the black Scottish Terrier. IS THIS A RECORD?

Received an interesting note from Dorothy Morris and wanted to pass it on to you. "I don't know whether this is a record or not, but a Scottie Bitch belonging to a Mr. and Mrs. Peter White of Lutherville, Maryland, just whelped a litter of ten puppies. There are 5 dogs and 5 bitches in the litter. While Mr and Mrs. White are not members of the STCA, the dog's pedigree indicates that many of the grandparents, great grandparents and such were bred by STCA members. The dam of this bitch is Char Els Top O' the Morn who is by Balachan Night watch ex and Ardeecce Cotton Picker daughter, Princess of Scots Haven. The sire is Char Els Angle in Disguise, also sired by Night Watch ex a Ch. Scots Delight Royal Savage Daughter, Sullie II. Royal Savage is by Ch. The Laird of Scots Guard. These puppies are now two weeks old and apparently doing fine. The owners have been standing shifts so that five of the puppies at a time can be put on the bitch to nurse. Ardeecce Kennel is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Irvin Czeskleba of Mt. Airy, Maryland; Balachan, the Kirks; Scots Delight, the Morrisises; Scots Guard, the Weavers."

This note was received June 26, 1967, so I hope the puppies are doing well.

A REMINDER

The American Kennel Club in its annual report reviewed the increasing costs, increasing registrations, increasing interests of all kinds, in pure-bred dogs and AKC activities. The basic fee of \$2.00 for registration of an individual dog has been in effect since 1921! Considering the way in which prices of everything have spiralled during the past forty years, the fees are now to be raised. Remember-- July 1, 1967; litter registration, from \$2.00 to \$3.00. Transfer of ownership of registered dog--from \$1.00 to \$2.00.

Montgomery County will be here before we know it, and the puppy sweepstakes entry blanks will be forthcoming very shortly. Send them in to Dorothy Morris as soon as possible. Mr. Robert Marshall of Raab Hill Kennels will judge the sweepstakes, and R. C. E. Sharp from Ottawa, Canada, will do the regular classes. Ring Stewards will be Richard Weaver and Ralph Krueger. In February, 1968, at the Associated Terrier Show in New York, the judge will be Heywood Hartley.
