### "GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITING"

Benched shows have dropped in popularity and one reason is the highly competative attitude of many of the new exhibitors. Many people do not know how to lose. When you win, even the dingy benching area in the basement of a National Guard Armory is beautiful, but when you lose the clock hands seem to move slowly.

The anticipation of a Group entry makes the time go quickly, but even without a win, the afternoon can be pleasant if you chat with other exhibitors and spectators. Someone always comes up with something like "...Our Scottie is show quality except he has a white foot..." A little modest bragging among the breeders can also be fun. Something can always be learned, especially from the old timers in the breed.

But along comes the neophyte exhibitor. He's either angry that he lost, pompus in a win or up tight in anticipation. One typical aspect is his attitude. His dog is better than anyone's.

To make life a little more fun at all dog shows I would like to offer ten rules for exhibitors:

- Don't criticize another's dog. He may beat yours.
- Don't criticize another's handler. You may want to use him yourself someday.
- Don't criticize the judge. All he wants to do is to pick the best dogs.
- 4. Don't entertain derogatory comments from others. They may be talking about you soon.
- 5. Don't be too free with advice. Someone who knows more than you maybe listening.
- 6. Don't discuss serious business. Dog shows are too hectic.
- Don't offer to groom someone's dog. There
  may not be enough time for it to grow before the next show.
- 8. Congratulate the winners with a smile.
  You'll want congratulations too some day.
- Accept congratulations graciously and humbly from all who offer them. Then you will deserve it.
- Be friendly and have a kind word for everyone. This is the fastest way to become respected.

### SCOTTIE USED FOR RABBITS AND SQUIRRELS.

My husband and I usually let my Scottie bitch accompany us on rabbit and squirrel hunts. The main dogs in our kennels are Gordon Setters so my Scottie fills in as a beagle. She works the brush for the rabbits, but our terrain makes it quite difficult for her to do much trailing.
