Yankee Pride Blushing Squaw; his litter-mates, Cana.Am.Ch's Treleaven Tobasco and Treleaven Hot Stuff campaigned at the same time as the great Carmichael's Fanfare with Tobasco and Fanfare continually meeting for B. of W's with Tobasco bowing in her favour; Cana.Am.Ch. Treleaven Top Brass who went to Renaldo Kennels and was the first recipient of the John Treleaven Memorial Trophy at the Canada S.T.C. Specialty; his imports, the Ch. Reanda's Riot, Ritter and Rattler, the latter going down eventually to the Reason Kricks; T. Rattler to Norma K. Prescott who made him up and used him to advantage; Vic and Frank Miller (Grand-Mill) who had Ch's T. Top Brass and T. Sheeba and have founded a sound line of scotties who can win with the best; Mrs. MacKenzie-Gallagher who founded her (pg 7.

He has been a contender in all the rating systems for 1973 and current data indicates that he will end the year as "No. 2 SCOTTIE male." His outstanding record during the year was earned in top Eastern competition, where frequently the best in the east was competing in the breed. He was Best of Breed in Madison Square Garden show in February 1974. He is owned by Linda L. Catlin - Cantray Kennels of Neenah, Wisconsin.
