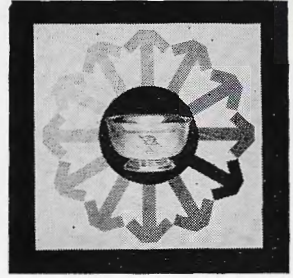

SHOW OF THE MONTH

MONTGOMERY COUNTY

ALL TERRIER SHOW



Mr. G. Harrison Frazier, Jr. was again host for that "show of shows," the Montgomery County Kennel Club. The grounds of his beautiful estate in Gwynedd Valley, Pa., again provided the exhibitors and spectators with an atmosphere seldom seen for such events. Every year heaps of laurels are placed on Mr. Frazier and his committee, and every year they are more deserving than the last, as words cannot express the hospitality that is omnipresent at this wonderful show.

The judging panel on Sunday, October 6th, read like a "who's who" of dogdom, with Mr. John Marvin having the honor of making the final placements. His selection for **Best in Show** added just one more in the long list of wins made by **Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare**, the outstanding Scottie bitch owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Stalter, and handled impeccably by John Murphy. The second spot went to a class dog, the recently imported Airedale that can boast of several outstanding wins since his debut just a month ago. He is **Bengal Flyer**, owned by J. R. T. Alford, and handled beautifully by Tom Gately. In third place was the lovely owner-handled Skye bitch, **Ch. Jacinthe de Ricelaine**, piloted as always by her owner, Walter Goodman. The fourth place award went to the Miniature

Schnauzer, **Ch. Phil Mar Dark Knight**, who earlier had defeated the largest entry of the day, this breed garnering an entry of 92 for this event. He was also owner-handled by Mrs. Philip Anspach.

Best Brace in Show, always a popular event, produced an exciting win for Joyce Wilson with her beautiful pair of Irish Terrier champion bitches, **Ch. Dungarvin's Hell-Fire** and **Ch. Dundalk's Scarlet O'Hara**. The beautiful working team of Australians were a close second. These were **Ch. Pinedales Tambo** and **Ch. Cooees Straleon Brilliance**, owned by Milton and Nell Fox.

ANSTAMM VISITS ENGLAND

By Miriam Stamm

(We are delighted to be able to present the first in a series of articles written by Miriam Stamm, covering her recent trip to England with her husband. The first, below, serves as an introduction to the "people" of England. Succeeding articles will deal with the kennels visited, and the dogs they saw. These will be supplemented with pictures of some of the great winning Scotties of the day.—The Editor.)

June, 1963 has gone on the books as the coldest, wettest June that England has experienced in something like 84 years. At least this is what we've been told and I can readily believe it, for it rained almost the entire time we were there, and I don't believe the temperature rose above 60 degrees more than twice. Despite this, our holiday in England was a wonderful, memorable one and we're anxious to return. The warmth of our reception more than compensated for the coolness of the weather, and the rain, while we could cheerfully have done without it, failed completely to dampen our enjoyment of each day and each new experience. An English holiday, even in miserable weather, is delightful. In fair weather, I'm sure it must be heaven on earth.

Fortunately, we had scheduled no definite itinerary. We had, however, thought we might spend a week in Scotland, another week in London, and several days in Cornwall. Four weeks, we felt, would be ample time to visit English kennels, attend dog shows, and do whatever sightseeing we wanted. The fallacy of this thinking, however, became apparent soon after our arrival in England.

Instead of a week in London, we were there only one day, and we never did get to Scotland and Cornwall! Travel in England, we discovered, is quite unlike travel here, where express-

ways, superhighways, skyways, by-passes, and wide open spaces make it possible to average an effortless 60 m.p.h. and to drive five, six, or seven hundred miles in one day. To illustrate the difference, **four hours** were required to drive the 100-odd miles from Alfreton to Blackpool! Another factor we had failed to take into full account was British hospitality, which surpasses anything I have ever experienced or imagined. In every instance, our visits extended well beyond the limits we had intended.

Having deliberately avoided the fixed, pre-planned itinerary, however, it was a simple matter to plan tentatively for two or three days at a time and adjust our schedule as necessary. We didn't consider ourselves "tourists" in the strict sense, for our primary purpose in going to England was to see dogs and meet "dog people." We also wanted to see as much as we could of the beautiful English countryside and the quaint little towns and villages, but castles, cathedrals, and historical landmarks were far down on our priority list.

One is not long in England, however, before he senses that history, both ancient and modern, is very much a proud part of an Englishman's daily life and environment. One doesn't have to be told this; it is evident everywhere. Charming 500-year-old homes in won-

derful state of repair are not at all uncommon. Many of the kennel buildings we saw had originally been carriage houses of the same or an even earlier vintage. A number of the little shops we visited were doing a flourishing business when the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock, and some of the marvelously quaint old pubs and inns were dispensing bitters and ale when Columbus discovered America. Castles and cathedrals that date back to the 11th century are standing today in well preserved splendor. Durham Cathedral is an impressive example of the beauty and durability of the architecture and the imagination, skill, and high standards of workmanship of this period. It is massive, immense, and intricately beautiful. Nearby Durham Castle was built about the same time and is in current use as a dormitory and dining hall for the boys who attend Durham University. The old Roman Wall, parts of which are still extant, dates back to the 2nd century. The stone fences which criss-cross the countryside everywhere in Derbyshire and other northern counties were built by Roman slaves, probably in the same period, and in actual linear distance must cover hundreds of thousands of miles. It is small wonder that the average Briton, instilled from birth with a keen sense of history and exposed daily to these and other historic reminders, places such value on tradition and heritage.

While we had fully expected to like the British people, we were prepared to find them reserved and somewhat aloof. Instead, without exception, we found them extremely warmhearted, friendly, direct, completely honest, totally unaffected, and **most** hospitable — certainly quite in contrast to the rather universally accepted "English image." Too, we had been led to believe that English and American humor were quite incompatible — that an Englishman couldn't understand an American joke and vice versa. Further from the truth this could not be. The English have a keen and lively sense of humor and can appreciate a good joke or humorous situation

anytime, even when it's at their own expense. They are at their best when the "chips are down" and can be depended upon to "carry on" come what may. We witnessed two or three instances where well-laid plans had gone awry at the last moment and it was an inspiration to see how these people met each situation with a fine mixture of resourcefulness and humor.

Our British hosts all expressed an active interest in our country, our people, and our dogs. We continually amused them with our "Americanisms" and amazed them with our preference for tea over coffee, our appreciation of English cooking, our enthusiasm for English bakeries, and our desire to stay in small town inns instead of the larger, modern, "Americanized" hotels and motels. Apparently we did not conform too closely to the "American image."

Perhaps it was the sincere interest in dogs that we shared in common with our British counterparts that opened doors that might have remained closed, that removed barriers and broke down reserve and restraint, and that generated such interesting and stimulating exchanges of thought wherever we went. Certainly, at no time did we feel like strangers or "foreigners" and we had no difficulty whatever in establishing an immediate rapport with the people we met.
