## Our Cover

FOUR famous winning Scottish Terriers are pictured on the cover this month. The bitch, Fashion Favorite, and the dogs, Ch. Walsing Whirlwind, Ch. Cabrach MacGregor II, and Ch. Shieling's Designer. We will start the write-up with the only lady in the quartet.

### Fashion Favorite

Fashion Favorite, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Israel of Dayton, Ohio, is the bitch which went clear through from the Open Class at this year's Westminster show to Best of Breed in an entry of 68, including a class of nine Specials, judged by Maurice Pollak, President of the Scottish Terrier Club of America. She is a daughter of Ch. Quince Hill Bucko out of Ch. Cabrach Circe. It will be remembered that Ch. Quince Hill Bucko won the Scottish Terrier Club of America's trophy for the dog winning the most American-bred awards in 1939, and in addition he won two of the club's other trophies that year.

"Rena" was bred by Mrs. Lillian M. Greenwood of the Glen Corrie Kennels, who sold her to John Murphy at the age of three months. The Israels purchased her from Mr. Murphy last August. A black brindle, Fashion Favorite, is described as a cobby, low-to-the-ground bitch with an extremely harsh coat, deep brisket, broad firm body and good bone—a sound bitch which will be three years old in April and in spite of the fact that she has always been a house dog she is an extremely good shower.

### Ch. Walsing Whirlwind

Ch. Walsing Whirlwind is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Stalter of Hohokus, N. J. He was shown but once in England, while still a puppy, and he went on to win his Challenge Certificate in that show at Harrowgate, topping nine champions. There were 2,979 dogs entered. Mr. Stalter brought him out for the first time in this country at the 1941 Morris and Essex show, where he went Winners Dog and got his first five points. He was Best of Breed at Katonah and got the balance of his points at Westport, Baltimore, and Atlantic City.

Ch. Walsing Whirlwind is a son of St. Margaret Subaltern ex Walsing Wellborn. Whirlwind sired the Winning Puppy Bitch, 9-12 months, at this year's Westminster show and was also the sire of the Best American-bred bitch at the show. The Stalters are well pleased with his progeny.

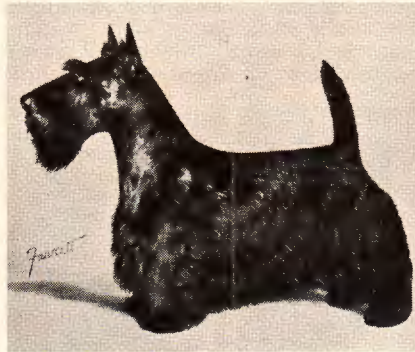

Ch. Cabrach MacGregor II is proving to be a very potent stud. He was the sire of both the Reserve Winners Dog and Reserve Winners Bitch at the recent Westminster show. The daughter, Rampant Shadow, is considered one of the most promising bitches in the country. Mrs. Malby makes no secret of the fact that she feels she has attained pretty close to perfection in Shadow. Acton Hill's Individualist, the Reserve Dog at West-

Ch. Shieling's Designer is a home-bred son of Ch. Shieling's Stylist (the sire of four champions) out of Shieling's Ginger (dam of three champions). He is owned by the Shieling Kennels of Mr. and Mrs. T. Howard Sneath, Allison Park, Pennsylvania. A beautifully bred Scottie, De-

## "Cheer Up"—Defeatists

HAVING been urged in a very complimentary letter by the Scottish Terrier editor of Dog News to write something for the April Scottie number, I submit the following.

If I could speak my mind and desire, I would try to say something to stifle the foul cries of the defeatists who so often go out of their way to further depress the Scottie fancy. They forget we are in the midst of a global war and that there isn't a breed which isn't suffering a partial blackout at the moment. They mourn Scottie's decadence and "sit under the greenwood tree" (with encouragement all around them, if they could only bring their pessimistic minds to balance things) and bewail what Shakespeare's "melancholy Jock" called "winter and rough weather," instead of getting up on their

Great Britain is a great one. There is a record of 21,076 registrations, an increase of 8,607 over 1941. In 1942, 349 shows were held under Kennel Club rules and sanction. This was better than the 1941 record. In face of the registered determination of the British people to save their dog fancy we should remember that many of the people themselves are on short rations and they have undoubtedly shared their food with their dogs that they might carry on with them. During these times we should always remember Keat's words, "If winter comes, can spring be far behind?"

signer has carried the Shieling record (and perhaps Scottie placings) to a new high in the proportion of Group and Best in Show wins to number of actual times shown.

He was campaigned during the years of 1941 and 1942, and while shown widely he was not shown intensively. His batting average is really amazing and has certainly been on the credit side. Out of nineteen times he placed Best of Breed, he went on to win eleven Terrier groups. In other words, he was Best Terrier more than half of the times when he entered the group. Out of eleven Best Terrier wins he was four times Best in Show All Breeds. This is truly an amazing record, when you consider that in the Group and Best in Show line-ups he competed against the country's best dogs.

Designer comes from a litter containing three champions, and he is from a line of Shieling's Scottish Terriers that have won more major wins with nine different home-bred champions than any other kennel in active competition. Year in and year out, Mr. and Mrs. Snethen have produced many different top winners. As a matter of fact, it is their desire to breed and show a number of good Scotties rather than to produce just one top dog and continue to show it year after year. In line with this policy, they are, in spite of the war, currently exhibiting a home-bred dog and bitch in the classes. Out of three times shown this year, the dog, Shieling's Flash, has been Winners three times. The bitch, Shieling's Solitaire, has been Winners twice, Best of Breed once, and on this occasion (at Detroit) she went through to a second in the group. At Cleveland, Flash went over her for Best of Winners and was then topped for Best of Breed by Ch. Shieling's Fashion Maid which the Snethens were showing for Specials Only. Fashion Maid also went on to a second in the group.
