**T**HE first Scottish Terrier issue of DOG NEWS was published in April, 1934, and has been an annual feature ever since. Back in 1934, the famous Ch. Heather Reveller of Sporrán was sweeping the boards. He established a record for Best in Show wins that still stands. In the annual review of champions, which appeared in 1934 and which covered the previous year, fourteen were listed—six were American-bred and eight were Imports.

Fla., shows. The entries were really quite good—14 at Biloxi with Margaret P. Hynes' Ch. Shieling's Squire going from Specials to second in the group. The E. M. Dunns' Heather Homespun placed Best of Winners and Dorothy M. Tidwell's Jaunty Lad took Winners Dog.

Pensacola, Fla., had 16 entries with Relgalf Kennels' Relgalf Racketeer going through to head the breed and place third in the group. Heather Homespun again took the points in bitches.

Jacksonville had 13 entered with Mrs. Wm. Constable's Ch. Bothkennar Royal Scot placing Best of Breed and fourth in the group. Mrs. Constable's wheaten, Murray Rag Doll was Best of Winners and Emory Wolfe's Cawder Scot was Winners Dog.

From the Cedar Root Kennels of Mrs. Dudley Jones, Memphis, Tenn., comes news they are grooming Cedar Root Jezebel for some future shows. She already has seven points toward her title, and is a daughter of McTavish Stange out of Cedar Root Dinah Lee. The kennel reports a litter of two nice males

## News from the Scottish Terrier Club

THE S. T. C. A. is getting all set for a banner year in Scots. The Club is in a strong financial position and the Board of Governors are anxious to do all they can to help promote the breed, what with the expected postwar upswing just around the corner. The Winter Specialty was still a bit anemic, due to various and sundry causes, and entries at Westminster were consequently also somewhat below par. But the Club has great hopes for improvement at Morris & Essex (May 25), the Summer Specialty at Mrs. MacGregor's Estate at Rye (June 3), and the other coming events. Mr. Maurice Pollak was invited by Morris & Essex to do the breed and should draw an excellent entry. Mr. Robert Hartshorne will do the Club's Specialty and also fully deserves the confidence of the fancy.

Meanwhile, the newly appointed Standard Study Committee have already tackled the job of trying to work out a suitable revision proposal, approaching the problem with a clearer reading of the Standard in view. It is to be hoped that this committee may succeed in coming up with a satisfactory answer, because it is high time that we see an end to the present confusion and that both breeders and judges begin to interpret the Official Standard in the same manner! The present Standard is decidedly weak in that respect and badly needs clarification, here and there.

Mr. Megargee represented the Club at

a meeting of the Associated Terrier Clubs, who are planning an All-Terrier show on the day before Westminster '47. So far, seven Terrier Specialty Clubs have declared their intention to participate, including the S. T. C. A.

During the year, the Board of Governors plan to experiment with a pro-

posal to have the membership select by ballot the judge for one of the important events. Whether this will succeed or fail will depend entirely on the interest and cooperation of the Club's membership, of course. Should it fail, then there is no alternative but to have confidence in the Board's selections. If it proves successful, however, this method might eliminate a certain amount of grumbling. The fact that the Board

voted unanimously in favor of trying is, in itself, a healthy sign.

Because the A. K. C. had not completed checking all 1945 show results, the trophy standings could not be announced, as usual, at the Club's Annual Dinner meeting in February.

The membership will be kept regularly up-to-date as to what goes on by means of form letters and the Board members also keep in touch continually between Board meetings. It has been suggested to print a new breed pamphlet as soon as the question of a possible Standard revision has been definitely decided upon. Members who are not very familiar with the Club's By-Laws might refresh their memories by re-reading them in the last edition, which is now approximately six years old. Changes in By-Laws also require a two-thirds majority vote, however.

The undersigned would be pleased to receive your constructive suggestions for the new club year, as well as your news for the breed columns in the national magazines. The time has come for all Scottish lovers to get together and return our breed to its rightful place in the terrier ranks at the shows!

## Scottish Terrier Temperament

Our comments on Scottish Terrier temperament in the March issue brought forth several letters. One received from D. W. Young of San Antonio, Texas, was particularly interesting and we quote excerpts from it:

"I was very glad to see in the March issue of Dog News the comments on the lack of Terrier temperament shown by many of the Scotties at the New York Specialty Show.

"I also note it is suggested that the Standard might well include a paragraph on correct temperament and would like to add to this, the feelings of Tom Johnson of West Monroe, La., and myself, the owners of Ch. Sahib Nosegay. I believe something specific in the Standard regarding ring performance certainly would be in order and might well come under the paragraph pertaining to general condition. Such a comment, on numerous occasions, would probably prevent points going to a mousie little something with its tail between its legs, just because, for instance, it had a good beauty parlor treatment prior to being dragged into the ring.

"Tom and I are proud of the fact that when our Sahib was defeated (it was very seldom as his record will show) it was not because he was not asking for it. A Scottie has the strongest heart of them all, the traditions show, and any one of them that fails to hold up that tradition, certainly should not be allowed to progress toward a title of any kind. Perhaps it might be okay for a bitch to be a little shy out of respect to her sex (?) but a male and prospective stud—never!"

## Our Cover

**PICTURED** on our cover this month is the imported Scottish Terrier dog, Cawder Scot. He is a son of Cawder Cracksman, who is by the great Ch. Heather Realisation. His dam is Models Best, a daughter of the well known Eng. Ch. Malgen Juggernaut. Cawder Scot was imported in 1941 as a puppy by his present owner, Emory Wolfe. He came from the Cawder Kennels of W. Robertson in Glasgow.

Cawder Scot was not shown until the fall of 1945 when he was exhibited twice—at Bridgewater and Brockton, placing Winners at both events. Mr. Wolfe thinks very highly of this dog as a producer. He has been bred to some excellent bitches. Offhand we recall Ch. Walsing Winsome and Walsing Welladay, and we have heard of a
