What is the Reason and the Answer to Breeder and Exhibitor Apathy?

TODAY Scottish Terriers are in the peculiar position of being one of the most popular of all the Terrier Breeds with the general public, but the interest of many breeders and the entries at the shows are steadily declining. Today it takes an all out effort to bring out fifty entries at the big Winter shows, whereas a hundred were more or less common a few years back.

What is the reason for this seeming breeder and exhibitor apathy?

Perhaps the answer can be found in some of the questions which the small breeders—the backbone of any breed—are asking all over the country. Everywhere one hears the questions: What is wanted in a Show-type Scotty? What can I do in the way of breeding to

attain such results? Where and with whom can I talk over such problems? Why is there such a difference in the various dogs which are winning at the shows?

These questions have been asked the writer all over the country by earnest groups of novice breeders who feel that it would be of great benefit if some authoritative source of information was available to them, and doubtless it would strengthen the breed if it were.

The answer to the question—"What is wanted in a Show-type Scotty?" would seem to be simple for we have a Standard and a show dog should fit it, but if it were as simple as all that there would be no further questions.

Much time and thought has been spent on the Scottish Terrier Standard but the fact still remains that it allows too much latitude for individual interpretation and it is this fact which primarily results in so many different "type" Scotties winning, instead of there being but one type as the Standard intended.

Some years ago the Scottish Terrier Club of America, published in its Year Book, an article by the well-known artist and writer, S. Edwin Megargee, which

took the Standard point-by-point and explained both by word and picture what was and what was not correct. It was by far the most lucid explanation of the breed ever written, both for the novice and the experienced breeder. We understand this is being revised somewhat and will shortly be published by the Parent Club in booklet form. If studied carefully it should do much to eliminate the variance of opinion as to what constitutes a "correct" Scottish Terrier.

The formation of new Specialty Clubs, either by states or by communities, to become affiliated with the Scottish Terrier Club of America and have a Delegate represent them on the Parent Club's Board would pave the way to accomplish many things of benefit to the breed which the Parent Club alone cannot now accomplish for geographical reasons. Such affiliated Specialty Clubs could have frequent Puppy Matches, Meetings and Get-togethers where breeders could discuss their various problems. The Parent Club could furnish or suggest speakers for the meetings.

The Parent Club could have a delegate who would attend meetings of member clubs at least once a year, more if feasible, to present the views and aims of the Parent Club, obtaining in turn local ideas which might be incorporated into the national policies.

There are many possibilities in the idea which could be worked out and which would inevitably result in greatly increased interest in the breed; in closer unity between breeders; and in more comprehensive understanding of the Parent Club's aims and endeavors. Such results would in a short time be bound to be reflected in increased entries at the shows and in a more uniformity in our show Scotties.

Perhaps the idea seems grandiose and the cost prohibitive, but if the idea is sound (and I am convinced that it is) the cost could easily be taken care of. Member clubs could pay a yearly membership fee to the Parent Club, based perhaps on the size of each Club's membership. Once the idea was organized and put into action the Delegates could work out future expansion ideas.

All of us agree, I think, that the entries at the shows are the barometer by which the public judges a breed. If, year after year, the public sees Scotty entries declining, they too will eventually lose interest, and no breed can flourish without the support of the public. It would seem that no effort would be too great that would create more interest in the breed, and the idea outlined would certainly do just that. Along with increased breed interest, I believe the idea would greatly strengthen and broaden the position of the Parent Club, and the stronger the Parent Club, the stronger the breed.

Diehard Dope

THE Eastern Dog Club show at Boston on the Washington's Birthday week end saw a bigger turnout in dogs than at either the Scottish Terrier Club of America Winter Specialty or at Westminster—13 present 13 entered as compared with 11 of 16 present at the Specialty and 12 of 13 present at the Garden. There were 18 bitches present of 22 entered, compared with 24 of 31 at the Specialty and 15 of 27 at the Garden, making Boston 3 and 4 points, respectively.

Marlu Kennels' Deephaven Red Seal, bred by Ted Bennett of Minneapolis, went all the way from first in Open Dogs to Best of Breed under Marie Stone, and placed fourth in the Terrier Group.

Red Seal, then owned by Mr. Bennett, was second in Open and Reserve Winners at the 1947 S.T.C.A. Winter Specialty under John Kemps, and repeated at the 1947 Westminster under Mrs. Stone. A son, Deephaven Citation, was third in open at the spring Specialty last year under P. K. Groves.

Best of Opposite Sex this year at Boston was Mrs. John G. Winant's Edgerstoune Hazel, Open bitch winner. Reserve in dogs was Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Stadler's Shielings Carbon Copy; Reserve in bitches, Marlu's American-bred winner, Marlu Dandy Actress. Marlu had a field day at Boston, winning three firsts and one second out of four classes in which it was represented.

At Providence Feb. 29, Mrs. Winant's Ch. Edgerstoune Pepper, was third in the group, being topped by the new Welsh import, the Strathglass Kennels' Flornell Vogue, and the Sealyham, Croglin Kennels' well-known winner, Ch.

Croglin Commando. The noted Wire Fox Terrier, English Ch. Chief Barmaid, owned by the Benrook Kennels, the Airdale, Ryan's and Robert's Ch. Airline

Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Icelow, Muhlenberg Park, Reading, Pa., have purchased the dog, Ch. Sheffscot Selectman from Miss Julie M. Sheffield, New Canaan, Conn. Miss Sheffield has been forced to discontinue breeding and showing for a time because of her critical illness. She is now a patient at Doctors Hospital, New York. Her many friends are hoping that she will soon be at ringside again and will be able to resume breeding; the fancy, in my opinion, needs more serious breeders and good sports like Julie.

Walsing War Bond litter brother of Eng. Ch. Walsing Watch Light, which won his seventh best-in-show at Stockton, England, January 31, has been purchased from W. M. Singleton, Darlington, by Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth L. Halloran, Kenbrick Kennels, El Monte, Calif.

War Bond will be flown to America in time to make his American debut at the Specialty show of the Scottish Terrier Club of California, held with the Los Angeles Kennel Club event April 24-25.

War Bond is by Walsing Welldoer, a great wartime winner and stud force and litter brother to Ch. Walsing Welladay, one of the Blitz Refugee bitches which founded Mr. Singleton's "American Branch." Welldoer is by Eng. Ch. Heather Fashion Hint ex Eng. Ch. Walsing Wellborn. War Bond's dam is Walsing Waterfleet, by Walsing Watch Tower ex Stedfast Lyall. Watch Tower is by Walsing Wizard, a great son of the sensation Heather Benefactor that was termed at his show debut just before the war "a second Heather Realisation," which died after winning two Challenge Certificates at his first two shows. Benefactor was a litter brother to Eng. Ch. Walsing Warrant of Marlu. Wizard's dam was Eng.

W. M. Singleton was elected president of the Scottish Terrier Club (England) March 4, filling the vacancy caused by the death of W. L. McCandlish June 29, 1947.

The Washington State Scottish Terrier Club is busy preparing for its show July 25 and is aiming for an even larger entry than the forty of the five-point 1947 event. A prominent Mid-West breeder

has accepted its invitation to judge, and the club is awaiting A.K.C. approval to announce his name.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky has tentatively set the date of its Specialty for Sunday, October 31, and is compiling a group of trophies which it hopes will be even more outstanding than last year's. The club plans again to feature "Southern Hospitality" which last year included a buffet dinner the evening before the show for exhibitors at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Stewart Carter, Louisville.

Mrs. Earl Humphries, Pewee Valley, Ky., has acquired Ch. Marlu Milady's Beau and Ch. Deephaven Variation, and their mating has produced a promising litter of seven. Marlu Milady's Beau was bred by Victor Hunter and is by Ch. Edgerstone Latest Deal out of Marlu Milady's Slipper, dam of Ch. Strangford Lady, and was Winners Dog at the S.T.C.A. 1947 spring Specialty, while owned by Marlu Kennels. Variation, a great bitch formerly owned by Klintiloch Kennels, Elkhart, Ind., is by Heather Asset ex Deephaven Dahlia, another top producer.

Reviewing the situation in the East during the year since the last Scottish Terrier issue from the stand-point of breeding to improve Dichards, some things stand out, I believe, as warning signals.

First, I do not believe that quality in dogs has been maintained; there have appeared a few top dogs, but the average has been disappointing—and it is the average that counts as far as the breed itself is concerned.

Bitches have been much better, I think, but again there appears a tendency toward smallness which was noted a few years ago. No one, I believe, wants a flood of doggy bitches, but how often has it been said, "if only there was a shade more of her, all around, what a great bitch she'd be!"

I'd like to urge all breeders to pay more attention to "balance" and to forget fads and fancies. For example, in recent years we have seen a preoccupation with extremely long heads—and I've been guilty, too. Yet too often with such heads we get very poor bite, and too often lack of stop and eyes entirely foreign to that true small, almond-shaped, deep-set, "varminty" eye which gives a Scot its distinguishing expression. Without that expression, it is just "a black dog."

I realize that the new Standard has deleted faults which older—and perhaps wiser—breeders considered so important, never the less, these faults cannot be disregarded, if we are to maintain the high quality of our breed.

The Standard, quite properly, stresses true Terrier character and fire, but unfortunately, I think, fails to define it, and there are too many who appear to believe that this means a dog which comes into the ring leaping and snarling, trying to attack everything in the ring.

There is nothing, to my mind, more beautiful and striking than a good male which poses himself (without being propped up and spraddled out by his handler), striking a natural pose, fire in eye and snarling defiance to his competitors BUT never once breaking pose.
