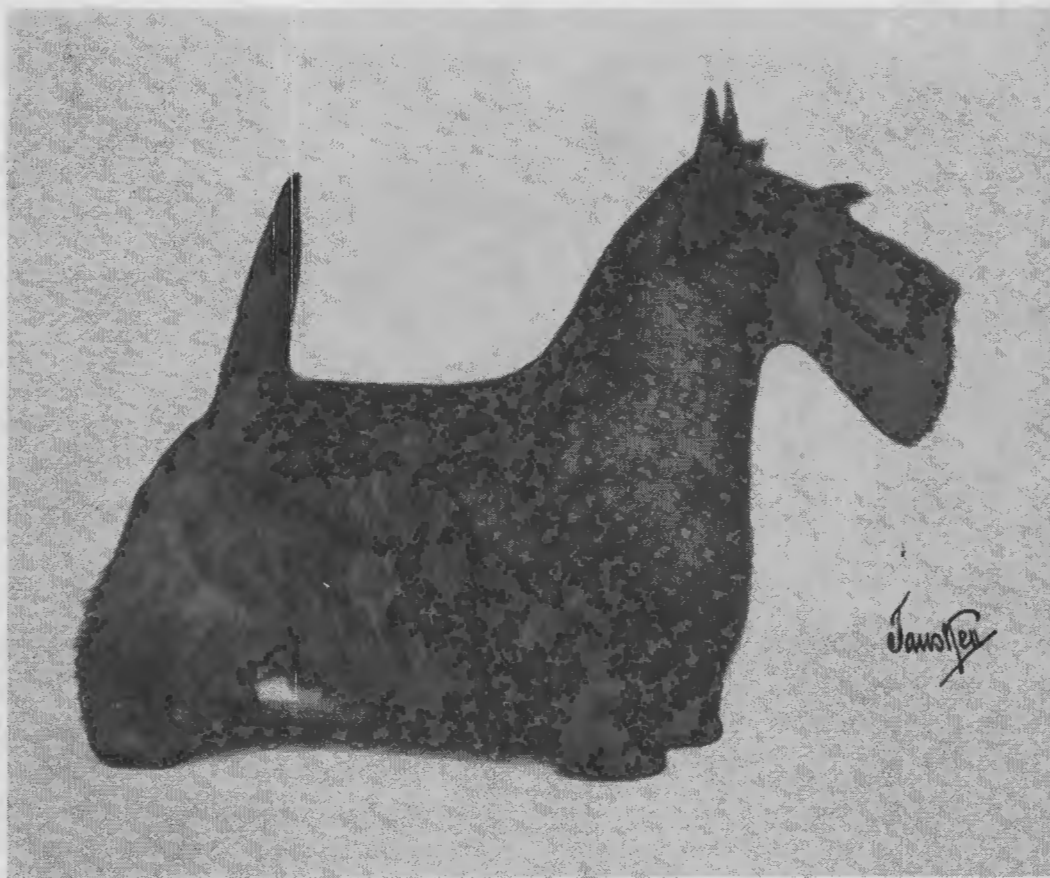

# SCOTTISH TERRIER ISSUE

WE open this Scottie issue with a salute to Carnation Farms Kennels, Carnation, Wash. They finished six champions in 1952, and bred all of them. They are the leading breeder of the year and their Ch. Deephaven Red Seal, the sire of three of these champions, plus one other, is the leading sire of the year.

Carnation won two of the three National trophies offered by the Parent Club, placing second on the third. They won the Edgerstoune Best of Breed trophy, the Gold Finder Bred by Exhibitor trophy and were second on the Francis G. Lloyd Trophy. (Won by the Stalters with Ch. Barberry Knowe

Sweepstakes at the Kentucky Specialty.

It is interesting to note that Bellflower's win at the Garden makes the fourth consecutive year that the Winners Bitch has been one bred by Blanche Reeg's Blanart Kennels. The first was Ch. Blanart Bramble, next Blanart Ballad, then Blanart Black Queen and now Bellflower. The first one was a sister to the great producer, Ch. Blanart Barcarolle, the next two were her daughters, and Bellflower her granddaughter.

Latest news from Blanart is a flash from the Washington Specialty where they won the Stud Dog

Barbican). We believe this is the first time these National Trophies have been won by any kennel west of the Mississippi. Carnation has started 1953 off in good style, by winning the group at Seattle and Portland with their class bitch, Carnation Caravel.

We also salute Dr. and Mrs. W. Stewart Carter's Ch. Edgerstoune Troubadour, the leading Scottish Terrier group winner for 1952. Troubadour won 12 groups and went on to Best in Show at 9 events. He has been handled throughout by Jake Terhune.

He won this same honor in 1951 when he won 10 groups and 4 Best in Shows.

Cornelia Crissey's Blanart Bellflower is one of the newer champions. She finished at Westminster where she was Winners Bitch. She has had a very short and spectacular career and she finished with four majors, including two Specialties. She also won the Sr.

class with Ch. Blanart Barrister. We only have a flash from this show. Paisley Hill Kennels topped it with Ch. Marlu Clincher and Jean Holfeldt captured the Brood Bitch class with Ever Miss Humpty Dumpty. Will have a full report on this next month.

The Scottish Terrier Breeders' Association will hold its third annual picnic, Member Match and Sweepstakes on Decoration Day. Last year they had 24 puppies in the Sweepstakes with Mrs. Clara Loew going to the top with Ranoch-Dune Royal Flush, a Troubadour son. Best Opposite was Blanart Bellflower, now a champion.

The Scottish Terrier Club of America are making plans for a fall Specialty show to be held Labor Day, September 7th, at the home of the Charles Stalters, Westwood, N. J. Alan Sparks who is Chairman of the Sweepstakes Committee is working on plans for a Sweepstakes to be held in conjunction with this show.

champions — Golden Princess and Cedar Root's Gaydes Gold. Both were finished by M. S. Robertson of Clarkston, Wash. and by an odd coincidence, both finished on the same day at the same show—Oakland, Calif., in March, 1952. Gold Sequin is a full sister to Ch. Golden Princess.

A note from Mrs. Charles Garthright, Oregon, Wisc. brings news that after a year of illness in the family, and finally the death of "Grandma Garthright", they are planning on more showing and breeding, and are looking forward to several spring litters.

One of the country's most important Specialty shows is that of the Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky in the fall at Louisville. This

The Scottish Terrier Club of California will hold its Specialty show in conjunction with the big Harbor Cities event at Long Beach on June 20th and 21st. We understand the trophy list is really a knockout with prizes right through third place in every class.

It was more than pleasant to get a letter from Ella Deegan Raymond of Sacramento, whose Dee-Gan Scotties were well known from 1933 on until the death of Mr. Deegan. Although most of the dogs were disposed of at that time, several were kept. Eventually Ella was married and her husband, Mr. Raymond, presented her with a wheaton Scottie as a Christmas gift in 1951. He came from Marie Stone's kennel, was bred by Dorothy Hart and is registered Pennyspent Pandemonium. He is by Ch. Bramshire Blazing Sun and his dam is Connaughton's Golden Trinket. ## 14 at Kansas City

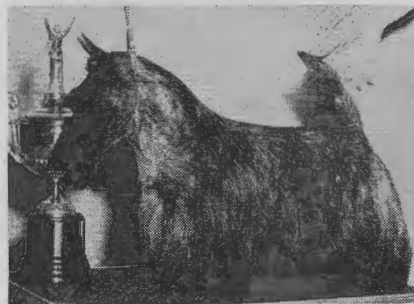

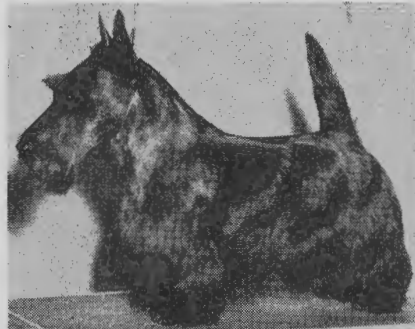

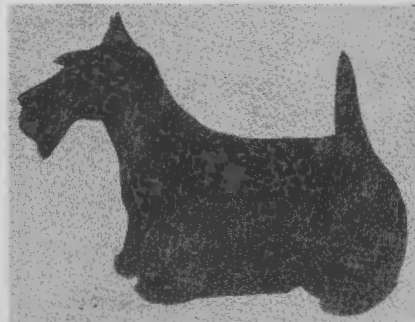

# History of the Scottish Terrier Standard

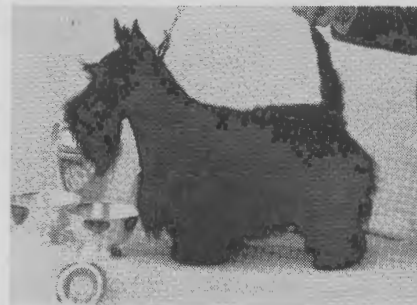

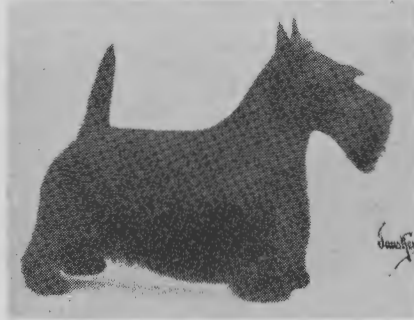

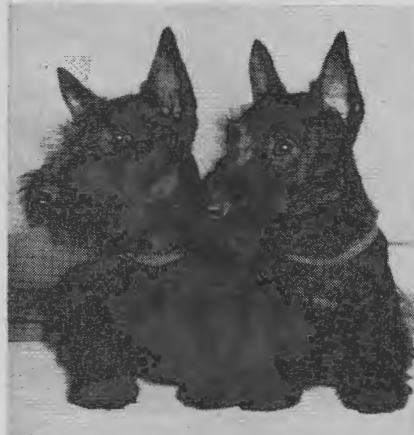

When we come to "ears" we find a really surprising happening as until that time "prick or half-prick" had been the description of

ears. We also note that the word "small" in describing ears was to be used in a relative sense and it was pointed out that ears should be in correlation to the length of head and could be too small as well as too large.

The paragraph on neck was intended to encourage more length of neck, perhaps, because the notes record the fact that there had been many Scotties with no necks at

all. We now feel that a short neck is usually the result of a straight shoulder or lack of "lay-back" in the shoulder blades. The paragraph on chest stressed the point that the brisket should be broad between

the forelegs, thus eliminating the pinched or narrow appearance.

The paragraph on "body" described a marked change for "moderately short" was substituted for "moderately long" and the contradictory description of "flat sided, but well ribbed up" was eliminated,

as was the allusion to the length of body being described as "not so long as a Skye's."

On "legs and feet" the emphasis was put on shortness of legs and

heaviness of bone, but it was the description of size in the old standard that amazed me. The standard called for a Scottish Terrier from nine to twelve inches at the shoulder with 16 to 18 pounds for a bitch and 18 to 20 pounds for a dog! I suppose the variation between a 16-pound bitch measuring 10 to 12 inches at the shoulder and a 20-pound dog measuring 9 to 10 inches

must have been very confusing to the judges, especially since both extremes were allowable under the standard. In describing general appearance in the new standard of 1925, stress was laid on the fact that a Scottish Terrier should appear very muscular and powerful and very compact. The correct measurement at shoulder was set at 10 inches and the weight at 20

pounds for both dogs and bitches.

Another improvement in description occurred in "skull." The phrase "of medium width" was now inserted in order to penalize dogs with long narrow heads as well as those with short thick skulls.
