Annual SCOTTISH TERRIER Issue

AS YOU might expect, there is quite a bit of Scotty news, although considerable of it consists of pictures, something we always like for we are frankly very picture conscious.

First of all, hats off to Blanche Reeg's Ch. Blanzart Bewitching, the lady that won the Group at Westminster this year after triumphing at the Specialty on the previous day. Incidentally, this was Bewitching's seventh Best of Breed at a Specialty event, others being the S.T.C.A. event in September 1956, Miami 1959, S.T.C.A. Sep-

England's greatest sire, he has produced fifteen English Champions, the sire of the year in England in 1951. In the U.S. he has sired twelve Champions and was leading sire in '59.

Under 1959, Pennsylvania 1959, Greater Washington 1959, and Louisville 1959. She has always been owner-handled, and her wins must be somewhat of a shock to those die-in-the-wool fanatics who insist that you cannot really do much show-wise with the female of the species. In other words, that it takes a male to do top winning.

Going back to pictures for a moment, there were a few that were simply impos-

One or two of the pictures that had to be held over will be handled later after the engraver has some time to do a bit of work on blocking out backgrounds, etc.

We are taking the news items just as we come across them, and this one comes from far up in the Northwest, from Mrs.

Robertson's Glad Macs Kennels of Clarkston, Washington. Her Ch. Glad Macs Masterpiece has taken three Best of Breeds at his first three shows this year, and at the end of January at Vancouver, went to second in the Group. He is the sire of the Kirk's promising puppy bitch, Balachan Galaxie, class winner at the Washington, Kentucky and Parent Club Specialties, and sweepstakes bitch winner at Kentucky at six months. The youngster was Reserve at the New York Specialty at nine months, and will certainly bear watching.

Glad to hear from the John Munros of Morristown, N. J., who tell us they have no particular news, but we are not sure we

agree. They have been showing a really lovely young bitch, a daughter of Cavalier, Easter Rose Ringlet, a granddaughter of their Jamie, and she was Best of Breed at Westchester, Reserve at Boston and Westminster. She is just now two years old, and certainly won't have any trouble in finishing. The Munros' Ch. Kinnie's Korrie of Glenmorie, hasn't been shown for sometime because she has been busy with puppies, but she should be out again this spring. If she is, you will be hearing about her.

five out of nine in 1932. England's leading Champion this year is Ch. Reanda Robas which sired three Champions. He is a black son of Ch. Westpark Deerford Baffle, owned by Carnation Farm Kennels. To date, Rio Grande has sired fifteen English Champions, twelve in the U.S., and Baffle has eight English and eleven U.S. Champions.

The Heywood Hartleys of Richmond, Va., tell us they have four Scotties which they will be showing this spring. They are Ch. Woodhart Waterloo, Woodhart Wideawake who has 11 points; Woodhart Wizard and Woodhart Waterfall.

THE WONDERFUL WIZARD

By Alice Exworthy, 273 Durant St., E. Lansing, Mich.

THIS issue of Dog News presents, as usual, a year's review of outstanding news and events in the small world of Scottish Terriers. More significantly, the year marked the end of a decade, a period long enough to accumulate sufficient data to indicate trends within the breed. Each decade writes its own story of the rise and fall of leading bloodlines in the records of the champions produced and the story of the fifties was woven around the dominance of the Fashion Hint lines and particularly the spectacular rise of the English branch of that line thru the dog, Walsing Wizard.

To refresh our minds on the background of Wizard we must go back to the war years and the very important litter brothers, Ch. Walsing Warrant and Heather Benefactor, the latter originally registered as Walsing Wonder but changed when he was later acquired by the Chapman kennels. The pair, bred by Mr. Singleton, were aired by Ch. Heather Realisation out of

Crusader and Crusader's sons, the Deep-haven dogs Red Seal, Jeffrey and Spade Flush.

Benefactor remained in England where as a puppy he acquired two Challenge Certificates and but for his tragically early end would undoubtedly have finished his

championship. To this dog Mr. Singleton bred Ch. Walsing Woven, a bitch doubly bred to the same family line possessed by Benefactor. The result of this intensive breeding was Walsing Wizard, a dominant factor in American bloodlines today.

An analysis of the fifties discloses the fact that the Heather Ambition bloodlines were well in the lead during the years 1950 thru 1952,—a lead almost entirely due to the champion descendants of Heather Aszet and Ch. Orley Ambassador. In 1953 the Fashion Hint line passed all others when it produced 23 of the year's 59 champions while Ambition descendants trailed slightly with 19. From that point the Ambition lines dropped rapidly to the present low point of only four champions in each of the years 1958 and '59. As this line faded into the background the Barty descendants moved into second place behind Fashion Hint, a position they have continued to hold for six years.

During the first five years of the decade the Fashion Hint champions were derived

almost entirely from Ch. Walsing Wizard's grandsons, the most influential being, of course, Ch. Deephaven Red Seal. This dog and his most prolific son, Ch. Gold Finder's Admiral, are now gone and already this great American line is dropping rapidly, contributing only eight champions in the past year. In 1956 the remarkable rise of the Walsing Wizard descendants began and reached the high point of 34 in 1959, half of the year's total number of champions.

Wizard sired two important sons, Walsing Watch Tower and Westpark Masterpiece, from which all his American lines are derived. The line from Watch Tower represents an intense concentration of the Walsing family line based on Ch. Walsing Whisper and from it we have all the champions which descend from the Rosehall dogs, Ch. R. Edward and Ch. R. Torrygen Tam o' Shanter. From these two dogs, of the same breeding but different litters, we have a rapidly expanding male line thru Ch. Wyrebury Worthwhile, Glendoune Gayboy and Tri. Ch. Glendoune Gauntlet.

By far the largest section of Wizard's line is that from his son, Westpark Master-

piece whose dam was Tynwald Tulip. Here was no evidence of line breeding and no repetition of blood for Tulip came from Ryeland and Rouken breeding far removed from the strength of the Walsing strain. Three sons by Masterpiece, all im-

portants, were sired by the well-known litter brothers, the champions Gantle Confident and C. Captivator, and the California dog Ch. Tartar's Bo-Pete who carried Tartar's line into the Midwest thru his son, Ch. Cian Flon Bo-Brummel. Even Tartar's own record is not at a standstill for Scotties of high quality sired by him are still coming out and his most recent champion, Revran Symphony finished as recently as 1959. Perhaps it is early to speculate on the future of this line but since half of his sons have already produced champions it seems reasonable to assume that this will be one of the strong links to Masterpiece and Wizard.

Br. Ch. Westpark Rio Grande is the second Masterpiece son to add his bit to American Bloodlines. Imported by Carnation Farms in 1955 when the Westpark kennels closed, he is producing mainly through earlier English imports such as his

ported, have made themselves felt in America and helped to swell the Wizard line of champions during the past five years. Probably the best known of the three was the California owned Ch. Yevone Tartar of Bothkennar. Tartar died

son, Br. and Am. Ch. Wyrebury Wrangler and his grandson Br. and Am. Ch. Westpark Derriford Baffle. Strangely enough, the producing lines from both of these dogs are made up almost entirely of English bred dogs, the only exceptions being Wrangler's American bred son, Ch. Crescent Hill Ace O' Spades, sire of two male champions, and Ver-Nev's Johnny Reb, sire of one. Through Wrangler's imported son, Br. and Am. Ch. Wyrebury Wilwyn, the line progresses through Ch. Special Edition and Edition's two sons, all imports. Baffle has sired nine champion sons
