Quite a few new imports have made their debuts in the last several months. Among them is the Charles Stallers' English Ch. Waking Wild Winter. He won

seven Challenge Certificates before he was imported, and when he was only two years old, and that is really quite a feat in England. Over here he made his debut at Troy, N. Y., and won the Terrier Group, his first time out. He must be very close to the title since Troy. We are glad to have his picture in this month.

Among the other important imports is the new Champion Wychworth Winwell, owned by Dr. and Mrs. Jon A. Thomas of Newburgh, N. Y. Winwell finished at the Greater Miami Specialty in January and went clear through to Best of Opposite Sex for five points. Anne Rogers showed her to her title. It is interesting that she is the fifth champion owned by the Thomases which Ann has shown to their championship. Three of the others were homebreds, these being Highlander Red Knight, his brother, Highlander Barrister, and Worthy Addition. Scotvale Sherry, also finished by Anne, is not a homebred, and of course the latest one, Wychworth Winwell, is an import.

We were sorry indeed to hear that the Thomases lost two of their old Champions recently, these being Ch. Wyrebury Worthwhile and Ch. Highlander Trickster.

And while we are on the subject of losses, we were sorry indeed to hear that the Harry S. Hayers, of Hudson, Ohio, had lost the head man of their kennels, Ch. Goldfinder's Commander. He was 10 years old and had cancer of the throat. He came to Haycliff Kennels from the noted

He was his owners' house dog and greatly valued for his keen Scottie character and disposition. Fortunately an excellent son of his is carrying on at the kennels and his owners hope he will follow in his illustrious father's footsteps.

The Hayers are well pleased with a young sire, Haycliff History Maker, a Glendoune line, one which they say has been doing very well as a sire.

We were sorry to hear that Beryl W. Matthews, of Albuquerque, N. M., is hobbling around on crutches as a result of a fractured leg sustained the end of November. We were glad to get a picture of her new champion, Matthew's Silver Mist, her very first homebred champion. Misty is presently in whelp, so Beryl writes, the only thing she probably will be showing in the near future is her Ch. Matthews' Desert Gold. She tells us, Scotties are certainly coming up in popularity in their area, and they have had calls galore for puppies in the last few months, all of which is good news. Several owners nearby have young dogs that they are ready for spring shows, so we should be seeing some of these entries at coming events.

One of the most important specialties in the country is the Scottish Terrier Club of California event which will be held this year with Long Beach, June 24 and 25. Our Ohio friend, John Marxin, will do the

classes, Jim Trullinger the Sweepstakes. This is always a major show and a very important one, so chalk it up on your calendar.

It is always good to hear from Martha Melchow and Lorraine Davis, who own Marlcrain Kennels of Harbor City, Calif. A picture of their current Champion, Ch. Marlcrain Highlander, and also of their Ch. Marigen Blithe Spirit, appear in the issue. We were interested in learning that Ch. Marigen ain Alyx, 12-year-old dam of their Ch. Blithe Spirit, recently came to them to live out her final years. This was one of the last wishes of her deceased owner, Mrs. Catherine Glenn. Alyx' dam was that Best in Show Scottie, the late Ch. O'Darby's Hi Hope, also beloved of Mrs. Glenn. Her sire was the late Ch. Glenby Captain. We were glad to know that Ch. Marigen ain Alyx will spend her final days at Marlcrain. She couldn't find a more pleasant spot.

The Lungwitz' of Selwyn Kennels, Wichita, Kansas, have had a perfectly wonderful year. They finished their first homebred champion, then followed it up with two more champions from the same

litter, making it three in a year. Lyric, Lycee and Lyntier of Zelwyn are the three champions, and they are by Int. Ch. Werbury Wrangler out of Ch. Crescent Hill Leta. Not only did the Lungwitzs finish these champions, but they finished them with quite a bit of glory. Six times they have been in groups with their three homebreds, and five times they have received placings of one first, two seconds and two thirds.

1960 also marked a couple of other "firsts" for Zelwyn Kennels. They joined the STCA, sent one of their Scots to the west coast for showing and breeding, and they are now planning to send one to the east coast in the near future. Congratulations to the Lungwitzs and we hope all the good fortune keeps up in 1961.

Rannoch-Dune Kennels, owned by Mrs. Frank B. Brumby, of Glen Head, L. I., finished two homebred champions this year. They are Ch. Rannoch-Dune Royal Heir and Ch. Rannoch-Dune Rhia. Sorry we have no picture of either one this

month, but do hope to have one before too long.

Dorisa Barnes' Crescent Hill Scotties of Los Angeles, topped the breed at the big San Francisco show for the third successive year. This time it was with Ch. Crescent Hill Indian Scout, which Ben Brown handled, and which went through to third in the Group under Judge J. P. Hackett. Last year it was Scout, and the year before that, his sire, Ch. Crescent Hill Ace O'Spades. We also have a flash that Scout repeated his win at Orange Empire, and that the Zelwyn Kennels was Best Opposite at both events with Ch. Lycee of Zelwyn.

When we heard from Mrs. W. M. Robertson, of Clarkston, Washington in mid-February, she was all tangled up with a formal wedding. It was her son's, but she said she didn't want anybody to tell her in the future that it was only the bride's mother and her family who were up to their necks in wedding festivities. At any rate, she seemed to be enjoying it all and was delighted with the prospective new daughter. A special salute to her Ch. Glad-Mac's Rolling Stone, who is now the sire of 11 champions, and eight more of his get are on their way. With the exception of three eastern champions he sired when he was with Robert Sharp, of Ottawa, all 11 of his champions were bred in Mrs. Robertson's Glad-Mac Kennels. Many of them are Best of Breed and Group winners. His most recent litter, out of Glad-Mac's Sally, consisted of five puppies, and every single one of the five, while

Leading Sire

The leading sire is Ch. Edgerstouze Troubadour which has sired six of the current Champions. In second place are two dogs, each of which produced five Champions. They are Ch. Glad-Mac's Rolling Stone and Eng. Ch. Westpark Rio Grande. Third place is a tie between five sires, each of which produced three Champions. They include Ch. Blannet Bolero, Ch. Barbary Knowe Wager, Ch. Balachan Agitator, Ch. Carrie Captivator and Ch. Wyretury Wrangler.

British Notes

STRANGE, that the excitement of Cruft's should be felt strongly overseas but there is no doubt that the thoughts of many American dog lovers turn to the world's largest show and the events transpiring there. Perhaps the enthusiasm of the English for their own show reaches out from the pages of their dog journals—journals which are so timely, so full to the brim with news, statistics, advice and general information. Just the announcements of coach transportation from all parts of England via all the little towns along the way make one feel that if everyone is not on his way to London and the greatest show on earth, he jolly well should be. Like all such big events it is a punishing show for participants. The weather is apt to be vile, dogs go home with new, fantastic and often fatal virus complaints, owners leave with tired feet, chills and lousy to escape pneumonia, but what mat-

ter if one has the memory, the thrill and the feel of Cruft's.

Although the show is over as this is written, statistics may still be interesting. 7,892 dogs this year, an increase of 683 over last year's record show. The English are much more entry-minded than we and have many more classes in which to enter. An entry in more than one class is unusual in the U.S.A. but in England is encouraged. The Cruft's entry was 15,721 which meant a very satisfactory two classes per dog. Miniature Poodles head the list of breeds with 337, Toy Poodles second with 319 and Cocker Spaniel with 299. The three varieties of Poodles total a staggering 701. As for Terriers, in which readers of this column are most interested, the group total is 1,135, an increase of 56 over last year. 109 Cairns topped the Terrier Breeds, Wires second with 96 and Scotties a near tie with 95.

Cruft's show, started as a private affair by Chas. Cruft, was bought out by the Kennel Club when he died after the war.

Our Cover

PICTURED on our cover this month is the great winning bitch, Ch. Blannat Bewitching, owned, bred, and handled by Mrs. Blanche Keese, Wantagh, L. I., N. Y. Bewitching is a daughter of Ch. Blannat Bolero out of Blannat Bit of Bitters, whelped March 27, 1957. She is the 38th of the 40 Champions bred and/or owned by Blannat Kennels, and the first Champion, Blannat Barcarolle finished her Championship in 1949. This is actually an amazing record.

Barcarolle's six Champion sons and four Champion daughters, produced 44 Champion grandchildren and unaccounted other progeny which are now producing Champions.

Bewitching is linebred to Barcarolle. As a matter of fact, all of the Blannat dogs are, some of them having Barcarolle as many as nine times in their pedigree.

It is interesting that descendants of Ch. Blannat Barcarolle have been Winners or better at every single Westminster show since 1950. Starting that year, Blannat Bramble was Winner Bitch; in '51 it was Ballad, Best of Winners and Best Opposite; '52, the same wins for Black Queen; '53, Winner Bitch for Bellflower; '54, Best of Winners for Bolero. All of these became Champions and all carried the Blannat prefix. In 1955, Winner Bitch and Best of Winners was Ch. Mar Eli's Makr Mine Manhattan; from 1956 on, all of the Winners carried the Blannat prefix. That year, Buttessutch was Winner Bitch; in '57, it was Breakaway; '58, Best of Winners, Bewitching; '59, Bottoms Up was Winner Dog and Best of Winners; in '60, Bewitching was Best of Breed and won the group, and this year she repeated both wins and Blannat Barcoe's Dutchess was Winner Bitch, completing her title. She made it with four consecutive majors—Winner Bitch at the STCA Specialty in October; the Washington Specialty that same month, and the STCA Specialty and Westminster this February. Clifford Hallmark handled Dutchess.

Bewitching's record, limited to the

largest Specialty shows and top All Breed shows from coast to coast, includes seven Best in Shows, twelve Best of Breeds at Specialty shows, twenty Group firsts, four seconds and two thirds. She has won forty Best of Breeds. For 1960, Bewitching is listed in the top ten All Breeds and is second in the Terrier top ten, according to the Phillips rating for all dogs exhibited.

And now some news from Blannat that is not so pleasing. Due to the fact that part of her property has been taken over by the State for an Expressway, it is necessary for her to sell her home and the experts to curtail her breeding and exhibiting activities quite sharply within the next year. She

The Role of British Scotties in America

By Alice Eaworthy, 273 Durand St., East Lansing, Mich.

READERS of the Scottish Terrier section of *Dog News* may sometimes feel that considerable space is being given over to English dogs and activities, space that might be devoted to American affairs and American dogs in which they are, naturally, more interested. There are a number of reasons for the spotlight on England, chief among them the fact that however much we may think of American champions as purely American products the truth is that English Scotties are and always have been

making itself felt by the early fifties and while new blood had come in, champions were not yet being produced to any great extent. In the first five years of the fifties many truly American lines appeared and the preponderance of English bred dogs moved to the third generation in championship pedigrees. The total of English dominated lines just about balanced the American and imports continued at a low ebb.

Now we have completed another five year period, 1956-1961, and a comparison of the first and the last year can be made. It is a remarkably even period, with no violent ups and downs apparent but, percentage-wise, gentle trends can be detected. Imports are increasing and champions sired by English dogs have risen from 21% to 29%. Those sired by American dogs are down from 78% to 70% of the year's total.

Five years ago there were fourteen champions representing Br. Ch. Alboune Barty and of these, eight could be con-

part and parcel of the majority of our champions. True, we no longer have the flood of imports which dominated both our show rings and our breeding programs from the earliest days and through the nineteen-thirties. The war ended that phase of American Scottish Terrier history. During those war years imports slowed to a mere trickle, only 27 dogs and bitches in the entire decade of 1941 through 1950. The trickle, however, included such dogs as Reimull Radiator, Walsing Winning Trick, Trevone Tartar and Gillie Wrockwardine Sirius, all of them American champions by 1950 and all destined to have an important influence on American bloodlines.

It seems scarcely possible but it is true that during the years of heavy imports very few American lines were formed, that is, lines composed entirely of dogs bred in this country for three generations or more. There were some, of course, but they seldom reached even four per year until they staged a sudden upswing in 1951. The dearth of imports during the war was just

considered as truly American bred as any lines we have ever had. The first and longest line hinges on Diehard Toby, a dog whose American ancestry extended back five generations to Br. Ch. Alboune Brigand, a Barty son. The second and more recent line comes through Ch. Blannat Bolero and reaches back four generations to Br. and Am. Ch. Heather Reveller, a Barty grandson. Both Bolero and Toby are carrying on five years later and in 1961 were credited with ten additional champions which ad-

vanced these American lines two generations.

The remaining champions in the Barty group, six in 1956 and fourteen in 1960, belong to Winning Trick's line. His name is now appearing in the second and third generations and will soon be absent from 3-generation pedigrees, making this another American line. The chance of new English blood in this group is slim indeed for in Trick they sent the last of its top representatives. However, England still has non-champion descendants of Barty as well as one champion which appeared last year, Kennelgraf Great Scot, a grandson of Ch. Glenrae Prince Charming. Great Scot may be the last champion of the line but Eng-

lish breeders, being what they are, who know what they may pull out of the pot for the future.

The Fashion Hest group which is producing the bulk of modern champions in both countries has changed considerably in five years as far as America is concerned. In 1956 Ch. Deephaven Red Seal's line had become almost entirely American since its English source, Br. Ch. Walsing Warrant, had retreated to the fourth, fifth and sixth generations in twelve of the thirteen champions listed. Red Seal was responsible for nearly half of the total champions of that year. In 1960 the line can claim only three champions, all males. It may survive but henceforth will be far removed from its English progenitor, Walsing Warrant. One other predominantly American line still carries on in a small way, that of Ch. Regal Rebel Leader. It too is now far from its English begin-

ning which was Gillie Dictator, a 1940 champion. All other champions in the Fashion Hest group are, with one or two exceptions, descendants of Walsing Warrant. Starting with 1956, Wizard's descendants increased rapidly to a high of 34 in 1959, with Rio Grande and Trevone Tartar as its top producers.

The Ambition group has reversed itself in five years although production remains about the same—seven in 1956 and six in 1960. In the earlier year they came principally from Br. & Am. Ch. Ordeley Ambassador with Ch. Shieling's Signature and Ch. Catterthun Model trailing. None of these three appeared in 1960, Ambassador's place having been taken by Br. & Am. Ch. Gillie Wrockwardine Sirius with Heather Asset trailing.

Stepping back to take a broader look at England's role in the production of American Scottish Terrier champions it seems amazing that she has continued to supply so much foundation stock, not only to the U. S., but to Australia, Africa and the Continent as well. She has only her own small country and a 50% lower registration of stock to draw on, yet our history shows that as one American line originating with an English dog fades, another takes its place. When we remember that nearly half of our imports are litters which support the male lines but do enter into statistics, the influence of the few males becomes even more remarkable.

The trend in the next five years should be interesting to watch. Most certainly the Barty group will have to sink or swim on its American continuity for England has dim prospects of supplying another Winning Trick. In the Fashion Hest group the old mainstays have been dropping out one by one but new ones are coming in bringing new lines from

Shielding Kennels, owned by the Southens of Devilsville, N. Y., have a new import that will be show soon. This is Reanda Roodier, by Ch. Reanda Rohan, ex Reanda Rioletta; and Rioletta is also the dam of Eng. and Am. Ch. Reanda Rheola, winner of many Best in Shows and Scottish Terrier Specialties. Shielding Kennels are well satisfied with a new litter of five by their Ch. Kentwells Kadet out of Rheola. These are still youngsters, of course, and probably won't be out for

Shielding has ever had. Congratulations to Shielding on winning the trophy for 1960 for Best American Bred Dog, Ch. Shielding's Dignity, Best of Breed at the Terrier Specialty last year at Toronto, it mainly responsible for this win.

And speaking of the annual awards, the Lloyd Memorial Trophy, for the most Best of Breeds during the year, was won by Blanche Roge with Ch. Blazart Bwitiching, and this was the second year in a row that "Witchies" won the honors.

Dog and Puppy Bitch Trophy. These wins are awarded for winning the most in classes throughout the year, competition being required.

Carnation Farm Kennels, Garnation, Wash., have a great producing bitch in their Carnation Dark Lady. From three different litters sired by Eng. Can. and Am. Ch. Westpark Derriford Baffle, she produced Ch. Carnation Dark Star, Ch. Carnation Warrior and Carnation Challenge, recently Best of Winners at the Big Golden Gate show. Bred to Eng. Ch. Westpark Rio Grande, she produced Ch. Carnation Dark Model and Carnation

Modelle. From her various litters there are several others of Champion quality, still to be shown. Dark Lady is a great granddaughter of Ch. Desphaven Red Seal through Ch. Goldfinder's Alzimir on her sire's side, and she is out of a Red Seal daughter.

Speaking of Rio Grande, he sired five of the current list of Champions, and two of his get need only one point to finish. His current Champions bring his total of U. S. Champions to 17, and Rio Grande is still regarded as England's top sire.

Kennels are indeed blessed when they have a line of good producing bitches and Helen Gaither's Gaidoune Kennels seems to have just that. Her Ch. Gaidoune Gaidoune, an English import, produced two Champions in her first litter sired by Ch. Kebei Raider. One of them is the current Ch. Gaidoune Brocade Babbie. The other, on the list last year, is Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Husay, and Husay is the dam of three Champions on this year's list, all out of one litter sired by Troubadour. In 1960, Husay had an outstanding litter by Ch. Toothill's Cinnamon Bear, and Gaidoune a December litter by Gaidoune Smokey Bear, a Cinnamon Bear son. It will be interesting indeed to watch these litters.

And speaking of top producing bitches, Ch. Fran-Jean's Bridie Mollie, owned by the T. Allen Kirk, Jr., of Roanoke, Va. is the dam of their latest Ch. Balachan Arch Duke. He is the fourth son for Mollie to win his Championship from her first three litters. Arch Duke is on the current list, as is another of Mollie's sons, Ch. Balachan Advocate.

At the end of 1960 the Kirks retired their famous winning Ch. Balachan Agitator, winner of 13 Best of Breeds and the sire of three Champions. In 1959 and 1960, Agitator shared as the male half of the Kirk team, which won the Jane C. Moloney Memorial Trophy for Best of Breed wins from the S. T. C. of A. He was top male dog on the list of competitors for the Lloyd Trophy in 1960, second only to Bewitching, the winner.

ONLY once in a blue moon does a bitch of any breed achieve Championship status in more than one country, produce Champion progeny in more than one, and, most important of all, earn the enviable reputation of being a "laster." Dogs, yes. We expect more of them and the majority of imported English male Champions live up to our expectations. Bitches are a different matter. While it is generally conceded that the over-all quality of show bitches is apt to be higher than that of males, it is equally true that their show careers are usually short, for once titles are acquired, their greatest value lies in their worth as producers. Time and puppies seldom enhance the physical attributes of the Scottish Terrier matron; therefore when one does perform creditably on all fronts, as has Tri Ch. Glendoune Gaytime,

it is fitting that we pay her proper tribute. Gaytime, or "Marie" as she is informally known, was bred by Mr. R. H. McGill and whelped in Ayrshire, Scotland in May of 1952. Her extended pedigree is a notable example of the in-breeding to one male line which many British breeders practice with such outstanding success. Her sire, Glendoune Gregor, and her dam, Glendoune Gaiety, were both out of Br. Ch. Glendoune Enchantress. Moreover, their sires were the half-brothers Tri Ch. G. Gauntlet and G. Graphic, both sons of Br. and Am. Ch. Rosehall Torrygen Tam o' Shanter. It is in the third generation,

however, that the concentration of bloodlines becomes evident when we note that each of the four lines originates with the dog Rosehall Enchanter, a descendant in direct male line from the most productive source of Champions today, that of Wizard, Benefactor and Realisation. Enchanter's sire, Walsing War Loan, brought in additional strength on the distaff side for he possessed a terrific concentration of the blood of Mr. Singleton's famous foundation bitch, Ch. Walsing Whispes.

Gaytime acquired her English title in June, 1953 and was a good winner at non-Champion events as well. While in Scotland, she was bred to Glendoune Gayboy, a dog which also carried Rosehall Enchanter on the four lines of the third generation. This mating produced Br. Ch. Brimstone

where he has sired two American Champions, Highlander Red Knight and H. Barrister.

In 1956, Gaytime was imported by Lucille Portwood and it jointly owned by her and by Evelyn Sanders of East Lansing, Michigan. Once again bred to Glendoune Gayboy, she arrived just a few weeks before her whelping date. An air trip from Scotland is a taxing one at best and her spirits on the way were far from the gaily her name might suggest. Sagging with the weight of the imminent pup, bewildered and somewhat disconcerted by new surroundings, strange folk gathered round, not one with a familiar Scottish burr in his voice, she took refuge in the aloof dignity inherent in her breed. one Champion resulted, Sandbarb Gay Blade.

Rested all the following spring and summer, she was so full of spirit and in such excellent condition that her owners decided to give her a whirl at Canadian shows. Shown there eight times, she won two groups and finished her Canadian Championship in October, 1960. A small number of male Scotties have annexed a triple title, but available records disclose only one other bitch which has accom-

plished this feat, Ch. Walsing Waterlily in 1941.

By the fall of 1960, Gaytime was eight and one-half years old but since she looked better than at any time since her arrival here and was behaving like a two-year old she was again brought out at seven fall shows and was Best of Breed at six, including the Spec. of No. Ohio with 34 Scotties present. She had one group first, two seconds and one third. In the ring she was exuberant to the point of being difficult to handle and was ever ready to take on any challenger rash enough to offer Gaelic insults. In view of her excellent physical condition, she has recently been bred for her final litter to her grandson, Sandbarb Sabre Dance, who has 11 points toward his Championship.
