From the East comes news that Blanche



Speaking of California, a great deal of work is being done by the Scottish Terrier Club of California, whose Specialty is to



Top Group winning Scottie for 1962. Wild Winter won seven Group firsts and he was BIS at the Tidewater event.



"This Specialty will be your showcase, and will be set up to display your breeding and training program. To do this requires the experience, practice and work of many dedicated people. To the one dog owner, and there are many, and they are certainly important, it will mean a first ribbon and trophy to be treasured. Specialty, Circus Rider first in Bred by Exhibitor, and Remember, pictured by the way, first in Open and Winners Bitch. We would say nice going.

Cornelia promises to do an article on breeding for us sometime this year.

Talbot County Kennel Club had a match recently and Dorothy Morris had quite a time for herself. Her Scots Delight Radiant Jewel, which by the way was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite at Baltimore, won the Terrier Group. She also had Best Puppy Bitch with Scots Delight Tuti. Great Bear with three to his credit. One BIS was won by each of the following: Ch. Bardene Black Jewel, Ch. Bardene Boy Blue, Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare, Ch. Gillisie Roger Right, Ch. Rebel Edition, Ch. Scotvale Sunshine, Ch. Todhill's Bear Necessity and Ch. Walsing Wild Winter of Barberry Knowe.

The breed did well in the groups and top Scottie Group winner with seven firsts to his credit is Ch. Walsing Wild Winter of Barberry Knowe. He was followed by Great Bear and Ch. Scotvale Sunshine with six each. Then came Ch. Gillisie Roger Right with five; Ch. Bardene Boy Blue and Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare each with four Group firsts. Ch. Rebel Edition topped three groups, and some twenty Scotties won two Groups each, with of course many more having one to their credit.



British Notes

ALTHOUGH the total entry at Cruft's did not quite equal the record made in 1961, it was up nearly 500 dogs over last year. The final total was 7,806; 4,209 Hounds, Terriers and Toys on the first day; 3,597 Gundogs and Non-sporting breeds on the second day. There were 1,033 terriers in competition and this group was headed by 128 Cairns. The Scottie entry dropped considerably from the second and third positions they have previously held. They tied with Airedales for sixth place with 61 entered. The three Poodle varieties totalled 647; Miniatures 312, Toys 283 and Standards 52. Cockers and Alsatians had the high entries of 274 for the former and 322 for the latter.

For preliminary results we are indebted to Mrs. Gladys Yates who very thoughtfully hurried them over. The winner of the Terrier group, a Lakeland, Rogerholm Recruit, went on to best in show. Although Miss Bull of the Kennelgarths was slated to judge Scottish Terriers, illness prevented her from filling the assignment and her place was taken by Mr. A. H. James (Westpark). The entry was down noticeably from the 95 of 1961 and the 82 of last year. We can only hope that the unusual severity of the winter was at least a partial cause of the drop and that

the downward trend will not continue. Mr. James' choice for the dog c.c. was Mr. Jeffs' Penvale Prolific. This is his second ticket, the first gained when he was best of breed and best in show at Belfast last September. He was sired by the wheaten, Ch. Bidfield Bix, and his dam was Brenbry Butterkisk. The reserve dog was Ch. Woodmansy Winetaster, a Wyrebury Wilwyn grandson. Mrs. Owen's Gaywyn Bonilass won the puppy class, the bitch c.c. and best of breed. She is by Ch. Kennelgarth Viking as was the bitch winner at Cruft's last year, the same owner's Ch. Gaywyn Viscountess. Reserve to Mrs. Plane's Stedplane Reanda Rainette, a four year old by Ch. Reanda Rohan. The puppy dog winner was Mrs. S. Grieve's Walsing Wild Game by Bardene Bartex ex W. Winter Weather. For those who are especially interested on this side, Ch. Bardene Bingo was entered but not present.

A quick look at English Scottie champions for 1962 shows a total of twelve, evenly divided as to sex. The male lines behind them are much the same as ours in origin but of course coming through English sons. A line from Baffie produced three, the Roschall Enchanter line also three (two from Viewpark and one from Happy Kimbo), two from Roger Rough, two from the Wrangler Wilwyn line, one bitch from an English Rio Grande line. These are all in the Fashion Hint group. One Glenview dog of the Red Robin

group completed the roll call for the year.

Ch. Gaywyn Viscountess led the show record for 1962. Her first certificate came at Cruft's and she wound up with nine, the last at L.K.A. in July. Ch. Bardene Bingo led the dogs with eight certificates. The three Scottie Specialty shows were won by Bingo (two) and Wirescot Penny won the third. Penny has not yet finished her championship. Two all breed shows were topped by Scotties, Belfast, by Penvale Prolific and the Nat'l Terrier by Bingo.

Two non-championship shows have been won by Scotties since our last report. The bitch, Skibo morag was best in show at Gillingham limited and Kennelgarth Dennis was best in show at High Wycombe where there were 227 dogs in competition.

Two Scottie enthusiasts from Australia will be travelling in February and March according to Mrs. Dewar's information. David Roche who acquired Niddbank Headline and his daughter, Ch. Niddbank Kirsty on his last trip expects to be present at Cruft's and his veterinary friend, Mr. Phil Cunningham who is also keen on Scotties, will leave Adelaide for America in mid-March and will be in England about mid-April for a possible five months stay. It will be interesting to note what each locates to take back in the way of Scotties. Mr. Roche is always looking for and frequently gets some of the best.

Current Scottie Champions

SEVENTY-FOUR Scottish Terriers completed their Championships since the publication of the 1962 Scottish Terrier issue of Dog News. These Champions represent those whose titles were completed and confirmed during the previous twelve months, their names having been published in the American Kennel Gazette through the February 1963 issue.

The number seventy-four is considerably larger than last year when there were some sixty-five on the list and slightly larger than 1961 when that year's Champions numbered seventy.

The calendar year 1962 was a good one for Scotties with more Championships completed and more Best in Show wins for the breed. In the previous year Scotties accounted for some nine Best in Shows and in 1962 they are among the top breeds which won ten or more such awards, Scotties having accounted for eleven.

Leading Sire

The leading sire on the current list is a tie between several dogs each of which produced three on the current list, and they include: Ch. Merrie Oaks Yodeler, Ch. Balachan Agitator, Ch. Rannoch-Dune Rajah and Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear.

Second spot is also a tie between quite a number of sires, each of which produced two Champions. They include: Ch. Woodhart Waterloo, Wyrebury Worthy, Ch. Trojan of Elm Hall, Ch. Wyrebury Worthwhile, Ch. Glad-Mac's Rolling Stone, Ch. Westpark Derriford Baffie, Ch. Blanart Bolero, Crescent Hill Doublet, Ch. Gillie Roger Right and Ch. Merrie Oaks Windjammer.

Leading Dam

The leading dam is Helen Gaither's homebred, Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussy with three on the current list. A very spe-

cial salute is due this bitch, since she has been the leading dam for the last three successive years. In that period she has produced nine Champions from three different sires. Three of them are by Ch. Edgerstoune Troubadour, four of them by Ch. Friendship Farm Diplomat and two by Diplomat's son, Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear.

Those bitches which produced two Champions on the current list and are tied for second place include: Ch. Blanart Bewitching, Balachan Blue Chip, and Crescent Hill Sequel.

Leading Breeder

The leading breeder, and by a quite sizeable margin, is Mrs. Edmund F. Mansure, who bred seven of the current Champions, a record of which she can in-



PICTURED on our cover is Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussy owned and bred by Helen B. Gaither's Gaidoune Kennels, Wheeling, W. Va. She was whelped September 30, 1956, and is a daughter of the imported bitch, Glendoune Gaibonnie, and sired by Ch. Rebel Raider.

Although a great show bitch—she came out in 1959 to finish in six weeks with four majors—it is as a producer that she will go down in history as one of the greatest bitches of all times. To date, Hussy has had only three litters totaling thirteen puppies. Two of these puppies were sold and have never been shown. Of the eleven remaining, nine are finished Champions, one of the others has eleven points, and the other should finish this year, barring unforeseen circumstances.

In 1958 Hussy had her first litter sired by Ch. Edgerstoune Troubadour, containing three puppies, all of which finished for the title, these being Champions Gaidoune Gavin, Gremlin and Gigi. Mrs. W. Stewart Carter showed Gremlin and she was Winner at both the STCofA Specialty at Montgomery County and Washington, D. C.

In 1959 Hussy was bred to Ch. Friendship Farm Diplomat. It was from this litter (her second) that the two puppies were sold, the remaining four are Champions Gaidoune Gizele, Glitter, Gipsy

In 1960, Gaidoune had what they feel was the best litter ever whelped at the kennel. It was Hussy's third litter and the sire was Ch. Todhill Cinnamon Bear. There were four puppies—two have completed their titles, these being Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Bear and the young sensation, Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear. Gaidoune Gay Bear has eleven points and Gaidoune Honey Bear is just starting.

Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear is known to his friends as "Maz" for the litter was born the day the Pittsburgh Pirates won the World's Championship and Bill Mazeroski hit the winning home run, so the only male in the litter has been known as "Maz" ever since.

Maz of course has had a sensational record. He finished at Montgomery County in October 1962 (only 5 mos. ago) where he was Best of Breed from the

classes. He won two groups and a Best in Show All Breeds before he completed his title. He topped the Ohio Specialty the first time out as a Champion. To date he has won thirteen Best of Breeds at All Breed events, topped twelve Groups which surely must be some sort of a record. He has won four Best in Shows at All Breed events, plus two Specialties.

The real foundation of Miss Gaither's kennel was Hussy's dam, the imported Glendoune Gaibonnie which was imported for her by the Lenfestys in 1955. Gaibonnie came from Mr. McGill's Kennel in Ayreshire, Scotland. She finished in 1956 in about five weeks, and was then bred to Ch. Rebel Raider. There were two

puppies in the litter. Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussy and Ch. Gaidoune Brocade Babbie. Babbie is Miss Gaither's house dog and has never been bred.

In addition to the Champions, already mentioned, Gaidoune also have produced Joan Hanneppin's Ch. Gaidoune Smokey Bear, a daughter of Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear out of Fulluvit Clever Cousin which Miss Gaither had purchased in 1959. Clever Cousin is sired by Ch. Rebel Invader, a litter brother to Ch. Rebel Raider, Hussy's sire. She is also the dam of Ch. Fulluvit Honey Bear, a group winning Cinnamon Bear daughter owned by Gaidoune, and purchased in 1958.

In 1960 Ch. Glendoune Gaibonnie had her last litter sired by Ch. Gaidoune Smokey Bear. Gaidoune Gemmy is outstanding and will be in the ring when fully matured.

The current year should be the usual good one for Gaidoune. Ch. Great Bear and Ch. Gizele are always ready for Specials; Gaidoune Gay Bear and Gaidoune Genevieve each have eleven points, and Gaidoune Honey Bear just starting, has three.

All of the Gaidoune Scotties are handled and are kept at Dr. Nancy Lenfesty's Silver Ho Kennels. The puppies are whelped in the house, and live in the house until they are three or four months old, by which time they are well adjusted to just everything.

Time Of Reckoning

By Alice Exworthy

ANOTHER year in the American history of Scottish Terriers has been completed. Winners of the trophy races have been announced, the roll call of champions is a matter of record and the leading sires of the year have been named. The annual summary as each April rolls around is interesting in itself but of real significance only as we compare and relate the records of the present with those of the past. A dog may look impressive this year and be forgotten the next, either in his role as producer or as show winner. His influence on the breed may be lasting or may fade as quickly as a shooting star. He may garner the lion's share of winning ribbons but the good points which made him a winner will disappear with him unless he produces as good or better Scottish Terriers than himself. The bloodlines which have produced the year's outstanding individuals may be concentrated in a few strong dogs and bitches or may be scattered among many unproven animals. If scattered, the line spreads thin and the thinner it spreads the more unknown genetic factors there are with which the breeder must contend. If the thin spread is coupled with constant out-cross matings, the line is headed for trouble. Yes, the records of any one year are interesting but in the minds of most readers the overall picture is a hazy one composed mainly of impressions made by oft repeated names. Only in a five year survey or longer can we begin to guess at what is happening in the breed and how much real support there is behind the glamour names.

During the past five years (1958-1962) 352 Scottish Terrier dogs and bitches have become American champions. Through these years the male lines have been narrowing constantly until now there are only two major lines and one minor line, whereas, ten years ago there were four major lines and one minor. At the same time, if you have kept track of the leading sires of the year, you will note truly dominant dogs in the remaining

lines are scarce. Tartar, Red Seal, Rio Grande with his descendants Wrangler and Baffie of the Fashion Hint group and Trick, Troubadour and Bolero of the Barty group sired record numbers of champions during their careers but their day is over and the present scene lacks dogs of their stature.

To determine what is happening within each large group stemming from Fashion Hint or Barty (the only two now important to us) requires a breakdown on the basis of key dogs. At first glance the sorting of such an array of names as American records present appear to be a bewildering and complicated task but actually they fall into line quite easily and naturally once key dogs are established. Father to son production continues within compar-

atively narrow limits. Each year weak branches from the main lines die out and can be eliminated from further consideration. Here again, gains and losses do not show up in a year's tabulation, the trend is gradual and the changing picture on the basis of several years of watchful waiting is revealing and sometimes very surprising.

Since the Fashion Hint group is the largest and the most important in both England and America the analysis may well start there. Of the 352 champions in-

involved in this five year summary, 211, or roughly two thirds of the total, belong to this group. Over half of the 211 are descendants of two English sons of Walsing Wizard, namely, Westpark Masterpiece and his half brother Walsing Watch Tower. And there we have our first and largest sub-group neatly broken off and ready for us to follow into the realm of names familiar in our present day pedigrees. From Masterpiece we have only three key dogs to consider, all of them imported and each heading an important American branch from the main line of Walsing Wizard. The three are Br. Ch.

Westpark Rio Grande, Am. Ch. Trevone Tartar and Am. Ch. Reimill Radiator. From W. Watch Tower we have a smaller predominantly English group which comes to us through the two sons of Rosehall Enchanter, namely, Br. Ch. Rosehall Edward and Br. Ch. R. Toryglen Tam o' Shanter. That completes the first and largest block of names and taking them one by one, we shall see how they are faring and where their strength and weakness seems to lie.

Rio Grande can well be our first choice since he has the largest following through his son, Br. & Am. Ch. Wyrebury Wrangler and his grandson, Br. & Am. Ch. Westpark Derriford Baffie. With Rio Grande himself comes our first surprise for while he has sired 19 American champions (7 dogs and 12 bitches) in the last five years none of these has contributed further champions! His male line in America is still being carried by Wrangler and Baffie. The distaff side has produced nothing through his many champion

daughters. Two non-champion daughters have each produced a champion, Short-Scot Sans Souci and Walsing Winter Rose, dam of Br. & Am. Ch Walsing Wild Winter, but there Rio Grande's story ends at the moment.

Br. & Am. Ch. Wyrebury Wrangler's chart is the most active and promising of The Rio Grande descendants since the last four years show consistently high production through several strong lines. Wrangler and his sons have contributed 31 champions in this period, 17 dogs and 14 bitches, a good healthy balance. His most productive line is through his son, Br. & Am. Ch. Wyrebury Wilwyn and is continuing through Wilwyn's sons, Ch. Special Edition and the English dog, Wyrebury Worthy. This group of dogs, all English bred, is responsible for 17 champions. Wrangler's only productive American bred line rests with his son, Ch. Crescent Hill Ace o' Spades with six champions to his credit, 5 dogs and 1 bitch. Unfortunately for Special Edition's record he has sired only four dogs thus far and one of these has been exported to

Canada. However, the greatest activity in Wrangler's line has come in the last two years and there is plenty of time for more Wilwyn imports to appear and for some of Wrangler's miscellaneous sons to carry on.

Br. & Am. Ch. W. Derriford Baffie's chart somewhat resembles that of his grandsire, Rio Grande. Half of the 24 champions attributed to him were sired by Baffie himself. The remainder have come through five miscellaneous sons, all English bred. Only Ch. Erin's Juggernaut has established a line in a small way through champions of Mel-Jean breeding.

His record of three is the largest of the group. In spite of 18 champion dogs in Baffie's group the establishment of continuing lines from them is practically non-existent.

Am. Ch. Trevone Tartar's productive years have continued over a longer period of time than those of any other members of the Masterpiece group. In fact, his record for the last five years was another surprise for, with 30 champions, it approximates Wrangler's. At present the mainstay of the group is Ch. sons, led by Ch. Balachan Agitator with six. The latter's six include five bitches and in 1962, Tartar's line produced no dogs but six bitches. In addition to Captivator, a less well-known dog, Ch. Clan Ebon Bo-Brummel did his bit by contributing three sons and two daughters. In the last two years Tartar's chart has been dominated by daughters and it will take another few years to see whether the trend is up or down.

After the Rio Grande and Tartar groups we have left only one minor branch from Masterpiece which came through an imported son, Ch. Reimill Radiator. There are 15 champions from this source, 12 of them from one son, Ch. Glad-Mac's Rolling Stone. The remaining three derived from a brother, Ch. Glad-Mac's Sailor of Seaglen. So far there has been no continuation from Rolling Stone's sons and only a very brief one from Sailor through his son, Ch. Rear Admiral of Seaglen. This line can be considered at a standstill at the present time.

This completes the summary of the American descendants of the Wizard-

Masterpiece line and we turn to that of Walsing Watch Tower, his half brother. This group has come to us through Rosehall Enchanter and Enchanter's two sons, Br. Ch. Rosehall Edward and Br. Ch. R. Toryglen Tam o' Shanter. Edward's line is the stronger of the two and its mainstays are Glendoune Gay Boy with nine champions in his line, Am. Ch. Wyrebury Worthwhile following closely with six and the comparative newcomer Br. Ch. Happy Kimbo with three. Toryglen Tam o' Shanter's line comes entirely through his son Tri Ch. Glendoune Gauntlet who is represented over here principally by View Park English dogs, Pilot and Vincent, who have done so well through the Kennelgarths in England, and through an American son, Killesandra Black Knight, a dog who deserved to be a champion but never made it.

The foregoing block of 144 champions represents the total of American champions claiming descent from Walsing Wizard through his sons, Westpark Masterpiece and Walsing Watch Tower in the

last five years. A quick review may serve to clarify their present status and keep them separate in the reader's minds before we go on to finish the Fashion Hint group as a whole.

(1) Rio Grande's progeny are not following through and his score was zero in 1962.

(2) His son, Wyrebury Wrangler, has many continuing lines on both the male and family side and continuation looks promising.

(3) His grandson, W. D. Baffie has dropped rapidly since his high in 1958 and while champions by him are still appearing, continuation is slow.

(4) Tartar has many sons, eight in all, which are producing champions but the distaff side is getting stronger and what the next few years will show is anyone's guess.

(5) The Enchanter group is a strong one all through and new champions coming over from England where there are many Viewparks, Glendounes and Wyreburies seem to indicate a healthy growth for the future.

This turned out to be a more lengthy review than was at first intended and to give due consideration to the remainder of our Fashion Hint descendants and to the Barty contingent this will necessarily have to continue next month. Bear in mind, in case you question some of the figures, that part of the record of the older dogs may go back before 1958 and that the figures given here come within the compass of the last five years only. We are not concerned with totals as much as with trends in this survey.

Registrations for all dogs in England totalled 145,489 last year and Scotties did not place among the top twenty breeds. Cairns, West Highlands and Fox Terriers (Wire) did place among the twenty in that order. Miniature Poodles held top place of all breeds. The 1962 registration figures in America topped the half million mark for the first time as 516,000 dogs of all breeds were registered. Here too, Poodles were in the lead although it is assumed that the figure of 123,185 includes all three varieties. Figures on Scotties are not yet available for either England or America.

Following up on the airing of the problem of night blindness in Irish Setters, the Irish Setter Clubs of England and Scotland voted overwhelmingly to have the registrations of some 300 dogs descended from two known carriers of this hereditary disease cancelled. Considering the terrific loss involved it takes courage to vote cancellations on such a large scale. The matter has been referred to the Veterinary Medical Committee and they will try to arrive at a solution to the problem which will be less drastic than complete cancellation of all descendants.
