WE ARE HAPPY to present the 1964 feature Scottish Terrier issue of Dog News, and want to thank all of you who supported it so generously with news, pictures and advertising.

Nineteen-sixty-three, the year which dogwise at least is not too far behind us, was one of the greatest years the breed has ever enjoyed. Scotties are the leading Best in Show winners among all Terrier breeds, having won twenty-four Best in Shows, these Best in Shows divided among eight different Scotties. Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare was of course, the top winner with eight Best in Shows to her credit, followed closely by our Cover Dog, Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear with seven. Ch. Matecot Roger Ring Leader and Ch. Scovale Sunshine, both captured two Best in Shows, and four other Scotties chalked up one each, these being Champions Bardene Boy Blue, Carnation Cynthia, Garb Haggis Bagpits and Weymouth Heyday Hoagy.

When it came to Group wins, Scotties were certainly the leaders, and by a ter-

rific margin. Their total number of Group firsts was 116, these Groups divided among some twenty-six different Scotties.

So many wins by so many different Scotties, is bound to impress the dog-loving public to a great degree, and there is small wonder that more Scotties were registered in 1963 than had been the case in the five previous years, probably even longer.

Scottie owners, for the most part, are show-minded, as registration figures and number of dogs shown, will prove. In 1963, some 3,847 Scottish Terriers were registered and better than 3,300 Scotties were shown in breed competition. Naturally these were not the same Scotties as

Trick—For Example

TRACING the history of a breed through its outstanding dogs is an interesting occupation but more interesting still is the guess as to which individual of a famous dog's progeny will prove to be the most lasting link in the chain of succession. The term "producing bloodline" conjures up for most people a vague idea of a glamorous name heading an imposing list of champions from which more champions are almost certain to come forth if any use of the magic names be incorporated in a breeding program. Few stop to analyze just what the head of the clan or his offspring have actually produced. Enough for most that the animal in question leads to Baffle, Winning Trick or some other familiar name. However, if

they delved a little further they might be surprised that, while the imposing line is made up of a long list of champions, few stand up to the test as producers and of those few perhaps less than half a dozen have made any noticeable contribution to the breed. As the old quotation goes "Many are called but few are chosen." Watching the lines very about as promising names disappear and new ones replace them we realize more than ever that a breed is a living thing, its course dependent on the vagaries of dogs and owners, and so constantly changing over the years.

Many unforeseen factors enter into the changing picture to influence the progress of a breed. Dogs and bitches which might have carried the banner of the leader to greater heights fail to produce or suddenly die before their promise is fulfilled. We can all recall with sadness some of these losses to the Scottish Terrier breed in both England and America. Many fall

into the wrong hands and their breeding and show potential is lost in the family pet role. As one breeder observed from the ringside "That dog is too good for So-and-so own." We have all seen our share of those also. Geographical location has a great deal to do with the spread and success of a line. But perhaps one of the

biggest factors in success is the publicity and show exposure an owner is willing and able to provide. This factor involves plain dollars and cents which not every show aspirant has in abundance. The little fellow in the game may make a worthy

contribution to the breed but he is seldom fortunate enough to breed or own one of the big names which more or less rule the breed. This factor of money is more important in America than in England for there the small breeder has much more chance to breed and show the good ones.

Very often a dog which is destined to become an outstanding producer attracts attention by siring champions almost as soon as he appears on the scene, often before the ink on his own title is dry and occasionally in spite of never assuming one. Breeders must be discerning indeed to spot this one for such a dog or bitch comes out on top by sheer merit of performance when the progeny find favor in the show ring.

At the present time no line of cham-

pions from a single source is holding up better in production records than the line from Be- & Am. Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgertrouse. In all respects this Scottish Terrier possessed the attributes we look for in a famous name. He was first of all a great showman with a career not apt to be surpassed for some time to come. Once seen he was not easily forgotten. He was handsome in his dark brindled jacket, dignified and disdainful of the ring yappers, dismissing them with a mere curl of the lip as he continued steadily on his way. His appearance and demeanor betokened the leader, a dog of which we might expect great things. He sired 23 champions, 14 dogs and 10 bitches, and from them he established a line which has increased steadily from his first champion in 1949 to the high level it has maintained since the early fifties when his sons and daughters began to make their presence felt.

Not by any manner of means did all of his 23 champions carry on however. Ten produced no champions at all nor did they appear in later pedigrees. Four

which produced no Champions directly, were involved in a small but relatively unimportant way. Eight produced from one to three champions and of course Ch. Edgertrouse Troubadour stands alone as Trick's greatest producing son and the one on which, thus far, the continuity of the line appears to depend.

On the distaff side Trick sired two daughters who became very important in pedigrees and the greatest success of both has been through a blending of their pedigrees with Troubadour or his sons. One of these daughters was a non-champion, Marlin Gutz Trick, whose influence continues to be felt through two of the most important dogs of the line, her champion sons Rebel Raider and R. Invader, which were sired by Troubadour. Raider sired Ch. Gaidouze Gorgeous Husky, dam

of a record twelve champions, including Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear, the 1963 Lloyd Trophy winner. Five champion sons in all were credited to Cute Trick, but Raider and Invader have wielded the most influence of the five. The second important daughter was Ch. Hampton Hill Whim, one of four champion sisters sired by Trick in one litter. Whim, Waap, Wit and Wave. Whim produced three champions for the Barberry Knowe kennels of which Ch. Barberry Knowe Wyndola is at present the most important for her progeny carrying on, one of her sons being Ch. Barberry Knowe Merrymaker, sire of the current top winning bitch, Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare.

Ch. Edgerstoune Troubadour sired 35 champions, a record for the breed. Seventeen of them have failed to produce any champions, 17 have produced one to five and one, Ch. Trojan of Elm Hall, stands out with eight. However, this is still an active and a recent line which will be constantly changing so that some of those now on the inactive list may well alter the picture at any time. Troubadour was fortunate in having a number of producing sons, chief among them being the champion brothers Rannoch-Dune Rogue and R. D. Royal Flush, the two brothers

mentioned above, Rebel Raider and Invader, Ch. Falluvit Festive Flong, Ch. Trojan of Elm Hall and just this year, a

promising newcomer, Ch. The Laird of Scots Guard.

Probably everyone interested in Scot-

tish Terrier breeding records recognizes most of the names encountered in pedigrees involving Trick and Troubadour but it is doubtful if many appreciate the extent to which their descendants permeate and infiltrate present day pedigrees. Nearly one third of those from #1000 on trace to them, so line, family or both and the percentage has been holding steady. In numbers of champions produced, only the whole of the Fashion Hint-Rio Grande line, and that includes Wrangler and Baffle, still exceeds Trick's line and that by the small margin of ten.

Although Winning Trick was bred to England he left no progeny there so that nothing has been contributed from that source since his own importation. For that reason his line is entirely American in development, whereas in the case of the Rio Grande and Roschall Zuchanten lines a great many of the good sires connected with them have been and still are being imported. For this reason and because of his own illustrious record as a showman and a producer of champions which continue to carry on his name with prestige, Winning Trick seemed to be the dog most worthy of a closer look in the annual which has for so many years been dedicated to the Scottish Terrier.

Scottish Terrier Champions

SIXTY-FIVE Scottish Terriers completed their Championships since publication of the 1963 Scottish Terrier issue of Dog News. The list is of course a fiscal one, covering those Scottish Terriers which completed their titles and had them confirmed and published in the issues of the American Kennel Gazette from March 1963 through February 1964 inclusive.

Undoubtedly there are other Scottish Terriers which have completed their titles in the last several weeks, but since their names were not as yet published in the Gazette when we went to press, these new Champions will head the 1965 list.

Leading Sire

The leading sire with four Champions to his credit is Ch. The Laird of Scots Guard. Several dogs are in second spot, having sired three Champions each and these include Ch. Shieling's Dignity, Ch. Trojan of Elm Hall, Ch. Blarney Bolero, Ch. Wychworth Windfall and Ch. Bardene Boy Blue.

Those sires which produced two Champions each include Ch. Westpark Derris-

Our Cover

PICTURED ON our cover is the famous Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear, owned by Helen Gaither's Gaidoune Kennels, Wheeling, W. Va. With him is the Lloyd Memorial Trophy which he won this year and which is awarded annually to the top winning Scottish Terrier in breed competition. This trophy was first offered in 1921, and this year "Max" won it with more points than any other Scot in any year. As a matter of fact, he is one of the top winning Scotties of all times.

At three years, to date, and in just over a year of showing, he has won ten Best in Shows All Breeds, topped three Specialty events and won thirty-six Group firsts. He was a Best in Show winner from the classes, and was Best of Breed at Montgomery County in 1962 under the late George Hartman. This was the Specialty of the Scottish Terrier Club of America, there was an entry of 85 and Max came up from the classes. It is interesting he has been shown in some sixteen different states, not confined to any one section of the country, and has won under both Specialists and All-rounders.

Sired by Ch. Todhill's Ginniman Bear, winner of the Lloyd Memorial Trophy in 1957, his dam is the record-holding producer, Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Honey, dam of twelve Champions out of a total of thirteen puppies whelped in three litters. Great Bear and his Champion sister, Gay Bear, were shown as a brace six times in 1963, and were Best Brace in Show five times, Best Terrier Brace at Boston.

"Max" is one of nineteen Champions bred at Gaidoune Kennels since 1957. Beside being an outstanding show dog and sire, he and Ch. Honey Bear are the house dogs and pets of his handler, Dr. Nancy Lenefsky. All of the Gaidoune Scotties live and are under the care of the Doctor and her Manager and Assistant, Joan M. Harrold.

A Great Show Dog—A Great Producer

pense all doggy folks feel while waiting
for reports of important shows, they will
now be in time for inclusion in our own
annual Scottish Terrier issue in April.

This year Cruft's record as the largest
dog show in the world was shattered once
again when 8,277 actual dogs were en-
tered, nearly 500 more than last year.
Alakians led all the breeds with 360 in
competition. Miniature Poodles were sec-
ond with 300 and Cocker Spaniels third
with 293. The three varieties of Poodles
mustered the astonishing figure of 630
compared with 189 for the three varieties
entered at New York's Westminster.
Cairns as usual topped the Terrier Group
with 145. Smooth Fox Terriers second
(81), Wire Fox third (78), Staffordshires
fourth (72) and Scotties fifth (70). Best
in show was the English Setter, already
named Dog of the Year of 1963, Ch. Sil-
bury Soames of Maduvalle. Winner of the
Terrier group was the Wire, Ch. Gomare
Kirkson Tessa, best in show winner at
Manchester last year.

Mrs. I. F. Simpson (Challacombe Scot-
ties) judged the breed and it was refresh-
ing to see a newcomer, Glenellen Clar-
Crest, take the dog c.c. and best of breed.
He is a seventeen months old light bridle
by Ch. Reanda Kentwelle Kinpin, a

The year ended with only seven champions finished, six bitches and one dog—the lowest year in point of championships made in post-war Scottish Terrier history. No one sire stands out since each of the seven was sired by a different dog but it is interesting that four of the sires were Kennelgarth dogs, Jupiter, Lance, Eros and his son, Viking. Perhaps 1964 will see many more good young males coming to the fore but to date the list is not too promising.
