Annual Issue

HERE IS THE 1965 Scottish Terrier issue of Dog News. It really marks the closing of an almost fantastic year for the breed. Show-wise it gave a wonderful account of itself, climaxed of course in early 1965 when Fanfare topped her great career by going Best in Show All Breeds at Westminster. She is one of only three Scotties and the only bitch, ever to achieve this triumph in the long history of the Westminster Kennel Club.

Other Scotties too made marvelous records: our cover dog, Ch. Bardene Bingo, won three Best in Shows and Best Opposite at Westminster, all from the Classes, and he is now of course, American as well as English Ch. Bardene Bingo. Helen Gaither's Gaidoune Kennels piled up a staggering record with its homebreds. Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear, for the second successive year, was in the top ten of all Terrier Breeds, according to the Phillips System. He was also the leading sire of this year. Six champions from his first four litters, finished in 1964, which is really quite a record.

Gaidoune had other wins during the year, and are the leading breeders. They actually bred six of the

Francis G. Lloyd Memorial Trophy for most Best of Breeds, with Ch. Anstamm Dark Venture. The Robert Charves were winners of the Ch. Sandoone Missy Lou Memorial Trophy with Ch. Charves Maggie Lauder for most Best Opposite wins. The Stamma also won the Jane C. Maloney Memorial Trophy for Best of Breed — Exhibitor or Kennel. Mr. and Mrs. Reason Krick won the Jopeca Trophy for Bred by Exhibitor wins. They certainly won this by a very easy margin, having 28 such wins with their nearest competitor having 10.

The Dorothy Casperx Memorial Trophy for Brood Bitch was a tie between two of the Gaidoune champions, Gemmy and Gidgit, and Reanda Roselime all of which produced two champions.

The Winning Trick Memorial Trophy for the Stud Dog win went to Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear. The American-Bred Bitch trophy went

We were glad to hear that Ch. Blannart Bewitching, now eight years old, is still going strong. She had four lovely puppies Christmas Day, and this of course will be her last litter. Her daughter, Bedazzle, has been doing nicely.

It was good to hear from Dr. Kirk, who of course was pleased with the win of his Ch. Balachan Gibson Girl at the Specialty in New York. She went to Best Opposite

current champions, showed eight dogs to their championships. Three of the eight top-producing bitches of the year were Gaidounes. They had other outstanding wins with other Gaidoune dogs, and all in all, closed the year with a record that certainly would be hard for anyone, including themselves, to emulate in the years to come.

The Anthony Stamma also had a great record, and won many of the annual trophies offered by the Scottish Terrier Club of America. The trophies, competition for which is only among Club Members, are listed and follow:

Their prospects for 1965 appear good in that four or five of the young Todhill offspring are ready for the shows.

Hardy Perennials

By Alice Exworthy

THE WHOLE SUBJECT OF bloodlines is a confusing one to many breeders and better left alone they think, but to others it presents a fascinating aspect of a breed's history and as such well worth the effort required to understand them and to watch them evolve. Simply stated, each line depends for its existence on those dogs which for one reason or another keep the chain from father to son unbroken. Many years must pass before it becomes clearly evident that one dog, be he champion or not, is the one who will forge this connecting link. An outstanding dog, outstanding because of his show record, his proven string ability, or both, may sire many sons or few, but in the long run only one will last. Dependent on many factors, branches of the original line die out as the years pass but there are always new ones to replace them. Chance seems to play a large part in determining which of the many will last. Breeders forsake the old proven lines to jump on the bandwagon of the latest star

and his lines, whatever they are, may then experience a sudden expansion, a sort of champion population explosion, as it were. Where and when this will happen, and whether the new ones will have lasting value can only be discovered by hindsight for bloodlines are chancey and may turn on some obscure and totally unexpected dog.

Considering the present scarcity of English imports and the disparity in the number of champions produced in England and America the bloodlines of Scottish Terriers in the two countries are remarkably similar. In both countries the bloodlines from Ch. Heather Fashion Hint dominate the scene to the extent of 60 — 70% in America and nearer 80% in England. Both Necessity and Fashion Hint were unusually prolific sires of sons but Necessity's sons finally dwindled to Fashion Hint and Firebrand of Rale, founder of England's Red Robin line. At one time Fashion Hint's producing sons in this country numbered 21 but of them all only the descendants of Eng. Ch. Heather Realisation remain. Since he is the sole link to his great sire it would seem fitting that the foundation line carry his initials but it was not set

up that way long ago and wherever the initials ANF occur the presence of Realisation must be understood as the link in each of them. The simplest and most direct line to him is the ANF line (Alister, Necessity, Fashion Hint) which is found in America through two sons, the imported Eng. Ch. Walsing Warrant and the English dog, Heather Herald. Warrant's group includes all the Marlu Crusader and Deephaven Red Seal descendants and Heather Herald is the basis of the Roger Rough progeny which are found here in quite respectable numbers. The second line adds Walsing Wizard, a Realisation grandson and so becomes the ANFW line. In both countries the key dog on this line is Rosehall Erchanter, whose sons, Eng. Ch. Rosehall Edward and Eng. & Am. Ch. Rosehall Torgygen Tam o' Shanter furnish all the modern descendants of this branch. The Glendunces, the Viewparks and some of the Wyreburys belong here. The third line adds Wizard's son, Westpark Masterpiece, and is therefore extended to ANFWM. This Masterpiece branch has for a number of years been the most extensive in this country. In it are grouped all the Rio Grande, the

er Fashion Hint, all key dogs on which the Alister line turned in its long history. In some of her last writings Mrs. Caspers suggested that shortened form might now be more desirable and dropped the HCL in favor of the more easily used ANF.

At the close of 1964 the American lines from Fashion Hint are well out in front with 59 of the year's bumper crop of 77 titleholders falling in this group. Of all our lines one of the most interesting

from the standpoint of longevity as well as consistently high production is the ANF line stemming mainly from Ch. Deephaven Red Seal. This is an exclusively American line developed from the imported foundation dog, Eng. Ch. Waising Warrant and his son, Ch. Mariu Crusader. The latter sired the litter brothers, Champions Deephaven Red Seal and Deephaven Jeffery and a non-champion, Deephaven Spade Flush. Each established productive lines although Red Seal's far outshone the other two. As a group, including Warrant, they have accounted for 173 American champions.

Red Seal was whelped in 1945, became a champion in 1948 and sired 24 champions before his career ended about ten years later. The line has had its ups and downs over the years but it has always held up well and is now increasing with the impetus furnished by three different branches. The principle and most prolific branch comes from his son, Ch. Gold Flinder's Admiral, sire of 14 champions. Admiral's grandson, Ch.

A jet black dog just three years old, he brought with him from his mother country, a fabulous record, both as a winner in England, and as a sire. Before his importation, he had won some sixteen Challenge Certificates, and several Best in Shows.

Six weeks after his arrival in this country, he made his American debut, going from the classes to Best in Show All Breeds. He has only been shown a few times, and so far has won three Best in Shows at All Breed events, and he was Best Opposite at Westminster, all of these wins from the Open class. He now sports both his American as well as his English Championship title.

The current list of Champions appearing in this issue, shows two sired by Bingo. Both of these are English imports. By this time next year, there will undoubtedly be some American-bred Champions sired by Bingo, for we have rave notices from several people who have young litters sired by him. Scottish terriers

Leading Sire

Leading sire and by a very considerable margin, is Helen Galthier's homebred, Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear, the sire of six Champions on the current list. This record is really quite remarkable, when you consider that most of these Champions were finished before Great Bear had reached his fourth birthday.

Second spot is a tie between two dogs, Mrs. John Gilkey's Ch. Gilkey's Johnny Come Lately and the Anthony Stamms' English import, Ch. Bardene Boy Blue. Each have four Champions to their credit.

Three dogs tie for third spot, these being Shieling's Tribute, Ch. Walsing Wild Winter of Barberry Knowe and Ch. Special Edition.

Cruft's results are now available. Richmond's Christmas Ch. show held in Olympia Hall in London wound up the 1964 season. Mrs. J. de Casembroot, judging best in show, chose the Wire Dachshund, Ch. Gisbourne Inca as best of 4,056 dogs. Runner up was the Wire Fox Terrier, Ch. Gosmore Kirkmoor Tessa.

Scottish Terriers mustered an entry of 75 made up of 45 Scotties for their judge, Miss Phyllis Drummond. She found her dog c.c. winner and best of breed in the puppy class, the 19 months old, Gillis Starnum. She thought him beautifully balanced with neat ears, good neck, head and expression. His bricket is well in front (a Scottie feature which some exhibitors try to hide) and he has good ribs and powerful hindquarters. The reserve winner was the second in the puppy class, Reanda Ringold, he about the same age as Starnum. These two youngsters now hold two c.c.'s each. The decision was very close but she thought Starnum just a trifle shorter and lower to ground. The winning bitch was Miss Stevenson's Comely Hy Hazel and this is her third certificate which makes her the 13th and last champion of the year. Hy Hazel was bred and finished by her owner and this is her first champion.

Miss Drummond felt that the bitch had bodied up well and was showing better. She has a hard coat, good eye and expression and moved well. Her sire is Ch. Kennelgarth Viking and her dam is Brackenscroft Hazel Honey, a sister to the recent champion bitch, B. Rye and Dry. The reserve bitch was Gaywyn Blackberry, another by Viking.

One sad note at the Richmond show, Miss M. C. Gibbs collapsed and died in the ring as she was showing her bitch, Skibo Moran. Another death occurring over the holidays was that of Mr. Meyer, Americana who have visited the Reanda kennels or purchased Reanda dogs will be sorry indeed to hear of his death in hospital on December 27th. I am sure that Scottie breeders here all join in extending our sympathy to Mrs. Meyer and hope that she will be able to continue the operation of a Scottie kennel as successful as this one has been.

breeds present with a total of 372. Numerically speaking, there were no terriers among the top ten breeds. The terrier group was headed by 137 Cairns, with 98 Wire Fox Terriers in second place and 81 Scotties in third. Mrs. K. M. Ross (Niddbank) judged Scotties and for her placings we are indebted to Mrs. Yates. Details of the show and the judge's report will, we hope, be here in time for the next issue of Dog News.

In the meantime, a look at the winning dogs and bitches from the standpoint of their background is worth more than a passing glance. In the puppy dog class of eleven the first three place winners were Gillis Starnum, Brio Cabin Boy and Brunnoch Michael in that order and all three were sons of Ch.

Kennelgarth Viking. Cabin Boy then topped two other classes and Michael was first in Maiden Dog. Not a bad record for Viking but the winning bitches were really startling. Every winner in the eight bitch classes. From Puppy to Open was sired by Viking and many of the second place winners were also by him. This lineup is so unusual that it seems to justify a closer look. Again in the puppy class the first and second place winners were the litter sisters by Viking, Gillisie Highland Lass and Kennelgarth Gillisie Delightful. The latter then went on to win first place in the Maiden and Novice classes. Second to her in Novice was Gaywyn Norma, also by Viking. The next two classes, Graduate and Post Graduate went to the puppy, Gillisie Highland Lass and second was again Gaywyn Norma. Highland Lass next won the Minor Limit with Gaywyn Castanet, another Viking daughter second. The Limit class was won by Gaywyn Bozetta and the too is by Viking. Winner of the Open class, the c.e. and best of breed was, as you may have heard, Ch. Gaywyn Viscountess.

tess whose first certificate came at Cruft's in 1962 and her 14th, fittingly enough, at Cruft's in 1965. The reserve bitch was the puppy, Gillisie Highland Lass. All of the above mentioned Gaywyns were out of different bitches and the Gillisie litter consisting of Starturn, Highland Lass and K. Gillisie Delightful were litter mates out of the Bingo daughter, Ch. Gillisie Principal Girl. A fourth member of this remarkable litter, Gillisie Macnab, was second in Novice dogs and a fifth, entered but not shown, is Gillisie Scotch Mint, owned by Mrs. A. B. Dallison who has won fame with the great Wire bitch, Gosmore Kirkmoor Tessa. The litter was bred by Messrs. Gill and McShane. Altogether this was a breathtaking show for Ch. Kennel-

garth Viking and it is the more remarkable since this was a large show with plenty to choose from among 80 Scotties. This will be one judge's critique awaited with interest.

Citation is a more devious one than the Admiral-Diplomat combination and comes through dogs not as well known nor as prolific in champions, but nevertheless it is a direct father to son sequence which through five generations arrives at the present stage represented by Ch. Gilkey's Johnny Come Lately, sire of eight champions to date and winner of last spring's California Specialty show.

Ch. Marlorain Dark Seal was one of Red Seal's last champions to finish so his branch is the most recent and the closest of the three to the source. Like Johnny, he too has sired eight champions to date.

Carnation Farms where Red Seal spent his last days have several good sons which could conceivably carry on for a long time, especially Ch. Carnation Chanter, sire of the handsome Ch. C. Silver Note.

The question has been asked as to why we should place any emphasis on a Red Seal line when he is now so far back as to seem meaningless in modern pedigrees. With the exception of Marloraire Dark Seal perhaps the influence of the dog himself is more or less lost in a welter of outcross breedings. But, meaningless or not, his line is a part of American Scottish Terrier heritage. It was unmitigated through the years by foreign imports and bears no relation to any other Fashion Hint line, one uniquely his own. In 1964 it produced 20 champions, the highest of any group on the Fashion Hint chart and appears to be off to a fresh start through the three branches mentioned above. Barring accidents to the basic dogs or a lack of male progeny (not evident at this time), the two "Bears", Johnny and Dark Seal should strengthen a line which has endured for over twenty years and produced 140 champion descendants.
