Here are the new officers of the Scottish Terrier Club of America: President, Dr. T. Allen Kirk, Jr.; Vice-President, Chas. C. Stalter; Treasurer, Miss Martha Melekov; Recording Secretary, Miss Cornelia Crissey; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Wm. Morris; Delegate to the AKC, Chas. H. Werber; Governor at Large, Ralph L. Sloan; Governors, Robert C. Graham, Anthony Stamm, Col. Richard W. Weaver and Ralph H. Krueger.

While we are on the subject of the STCA, we do want to congratulate the Club on this year's Specialty in New York. The entry was the largest in quite a number of years, and Judge Peter Babisch was

all shows. Topper was Best of Winners. Marie has a young bitch now, sired by Topper which at eleven months, already has a major and a Best of Opposite Sex. This is Mairie Solitary Tootsie.

We were shocked indeed to read that the home of Stewart Gettle, Treasurer of the Scottish Terrier Club of Greater Washington D.C. was entirely destroyed by fire recently. Mr. Gettle was aroused from a sound sleep about two A.M. to find the entire place in flames. He jumped from a second floor balcony to the ground below. The Changing Scene

BACK IN THE 1950's Mrs. Caspers commented on the narrowing of Scottish Terrier bloodlines and felt it would be to the disadvantage of the breed if the time came when distinct outcrosses with desirable characteristics were not available to correct faults developing in an inbred line. At that time she was referring to the narrowing of the Alister-Necessity line to the latter's son, Ch. Fashion Hint. He and his twenty-one sons accounted for a truly impressive array of champions in England and America but, in this country at least, Fashion Hint's peak of ascendancy was reached in about 1950 at which time the influence of twenty of his sons fell off rapidly and the descendants of his son, Br. Ch. Heather Realisation, began to replace them.

Approximately forty years have

passed since Heather Necessity was whelped but it is still difficult to separate his years of production from those of his son and his grandson for they were whelped within seven years of each other. Necessity was whelped in 1929 and lived for ten years, Fashion Hint was whelped in 1929 and lived eleven years and Realisation was whelped in 1934 and lived only four. Thus their productive years overlapped to a considerable extent and all

Briefly, he was a thick-set appearing little dog, short, thick-skinned and low-built with a hard dark grey coat, a longer head than his grandsire, Necessity, and a dominating personality. lence Certificates and was best in show 22 times, making him the greatest winner in English Scottish Terrier history. He packed this marvellous career into just four years and died soon after the Birmingham show in 1937 leaving as his legacy three sons who have carried on to the present time. The modern expansion of the line is

based on these three dogs; the litter brothers, Br. Ch. Walsing Warrant and Heather Benefactor (originally registered as Walsing Wonder) and the less well known Heather Herald, who was the basis of much of the early Kennelgarth breeding.

This line is not new to us for it had its start around 1940 when Ch.

Walsing Warrant was exported to this country at the beginning of World War II. He, as you know, was the grandsire of Ch. Deephaven Red Seal, whose descendants continue as one of America's foremost producing lines. From 1939 to 1946 there were no championship shows in England and breeding activity was limited to an attempt at retaining some of the best bloodlines through the war years. In 1946 only one champion finished but by 1947 shows were resumed and twelve became champions. The six year cessation in shows is evident in the following several years when there were few champion-sired titleholders. Many confusing war-inspired names appeared such as War Loan, War Weapon, War Cloud and War Parade, the last named the sire of Walsing Winning Trick, England's first post-war male Scottish champion. Such highly important dogs as Walsing Wizard and his sons, Walsing Watchtower and Westpark Masterpiece, were not champions and therefore we have little or no data on them other than their siring records.

While Walsing Warrant's line was making a good start in America, his brother, Benefactor, was more than doing his bit in England. As a show dog his career, like his sire's, was unfortunately brief. He gained two c.c.'s while still a puppy and was best in show at Edinburgh in 1938 but did not live to attain the title he certainly deserved. As a sire, he produced the dog Walsing Wizard who in turn established two prolific lines through his sons, Westpark Masterpiece and Walsing

Watchtower. America drew heavily on the Masterpiece group by importing five of our greatest sires of the past 15 years; Tartar, Rio Grande, Wrangler, Baffie and Redmill Radiator. The strongest lines in this group as we commence a new year are Wrangler, Tartar and Baffie, in that order.

Wizard's second line from his son, Walsing Watchtower, through W. War Loan and Rosehall Enchanter has shown such increasing strength in the last few years that it may

Rosehall Torgylen Tam o'Shanter. The latter's son, Br. & Am. Ch. Glendoune Gauntlet is the source of the Viewpark line. Pilot and Vineent,

British Notes

FINAL FIGURES for Cruft's show in London showed a drop in both entries and actual exhibits. A year ago there were 8,067 exhibits and the total this year was 7,773. Top breed in actual exhibits was the Alsatian with 367. Cocker was second with 287. Next year entries will be restricted to those dogs which have won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd at any championship show.

The journals reporting Cruft's will probably not arrive in this country for another two weeks so we are especially grateful to Mrs. Yates for an advance notice of the top winners and to Mrs. Muriel Owen for added information, the judge's report and a picture of the winning Scottish brace composed of the best of breed bitch, her Ch. Gaywyn Viscountess, with Gaywyn Tessel, a granddaughter. Last year the winning brace featured Viscountess and the dam of Tessel, Ch. Gaywyn Titania. No leggy, narrow, off-type Scotties here — they look a very handsome typical pair.

Miss Betty Penn Bull judged the 61 Scots entered (11 absentees) and chose as her best bitch and best of breed, the above mentioned Viscountess. She won her first C.C. at Cruft's in 1962, was best of breed in 1965 when she annexed her 14th C.C. and this year added her 15th. A very remarkable total for a 5-year old bitch, or any bitch for that matter. Miss Bull remarked that Viscountess had never heard the term "middle-aged . . . she is the complete show-off and knows how to display her good points to perfection . . . she was in wonderful condition and bloom, is completely

satisfying to go over and is living evidence that it is possible to get a low-to-ground sturdy dog combining well-laid shoulders and good angulation in quarters, with free movement." Second in Open and

bitches, both sired by Ch. Gaywyn Matador. These were Gaywyn Tessel who topped Puppy, Maiden and Novice and Rican Felice, first in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit and Limit.

In dogs the wins were a bit more spread out. The dog winner was Ch. Reanda Ringold and this was his 12th certificate. Second in Open and reserve was Ch. Brío Cabin Boy. Miss Bull described them as "two lovely dogs which must be a great pride and pleasure to their owners. Both were on top of their form, in splendid coat and bloom and in hard condition. Both were well handled and neither gave away an inch on movement or showmanship." She said she did not intend to criticize either of these grand dogs but the verdict went to Ringold in a "photo finish." Speaking of the dog classes, she added "I look for a commanding appearance, a dog ready to stand his ground and face all comers and carrying himself with confidence and I was happy to find these important qualities in my top dogs."

The dog class winners were Brío Pickpocket, best in Puppy and Maiden, he from a later litter the same way bred as the two champions who were the reserve winners: Ellburn Esquire by Ch. Inverdule Scorchin won the Novice and Graduate class, and Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit and Limit went to Woodmansey Warrior, son of Ch. Woodmansy Wine-taster.

More of the show next month if any extra items are newsworthy. In the meantime, a quick summary of the 1965 Scottie year in England. Twelve champions finished equally divided as to sex and seven of them were sired by Ch. Kennelgarth Viking, Eng. & Am. Ch. Bardene Bingo sired two and was the

grand sire of one through his son, Viewpark Red Hackle. Ch. Reanda Kentwelle Kingpin (a Roger Rough son) accounted for one and Ch. Woodmansey Winetaster (Wrangler line) sired one.

Ch. Reanda Ringold was the leading show winner of the year with nine of the possible 24 certificates awarded to him. He was also best in show at Paington and at the Breeders and Exhibitors' speciality in London. Ch. Brio Wishbone led the bitches, winning five certificates and a best in show at Chester Ch. The three Scottish Terrier speciality shows were won by Ringold (the Breeders'), Ch. Gaywyn Emperor (the No. of Eng.) and Ryeland Right Request (the Club show).

Discussion on Type

The discussion on Scottish Terrier type continues with Miss Vas-silopulo's answer to Miss Penn Bull's feeling that all is right in the Scottie world as shown by the year's list of champions. Miss Vas-silopulo agrees that nearly all these champions measure up to what is required but would not agree that all do. She went on "We all know how easily some dogs slip through to the top without having come under the hands and eyes of a specialist. . . . You may say that not all specialists agree — this is true also — but at any rate they can claim to argue from knowledge. What I am concerned with is foreign elements creeping in such as tallness, narrow fronts and light eyes. These do not fit into the breed anywhere and are not just a point of view." She spoke of the revision of the standard between wars and compared the provisions of the old with the new and felt that time to attack faults is when they appear and not when they get established. She ended by quoting from "three of the most knowledgeable people of the past — Mr. Cowley of the Albournes who said that a Scottie should be on the ground, that's where it should be, and Mr. Robert Chapman of the Heathers . . . said that a Scottie's front legs should never look as though they came out of one hole" and last, Mrs. Casper, whose description of the dog's movement has never been bettered — "that he should appear to be taking longer strides than he is capable of doing."

There will undoubtedly be further discussion on faulty type as the new year opens with new youngsters making their bid for top honors in the show rings. Now that attention has been focused very publicly on the breed both breeders and judges will be more or less on the spot to bring out and to put up the correct type using the standard as a gauge of merit. Faults in de-

tails are one thing but the basic structure must be retained against all odds of fads and fashions which are the curse of dog exhibiting and have meant the downfall of a number of breeds.

PICTURED ON OUR cover is 1965's top winning Scottish Terrier, Ch. Gaidoune Grin and Bear It, owned and bred by Helen B. Gaither, Wheeling, W. Va. He is a son of the late great Ch. Todhill's Cinnamon Bear and his dam, Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussey, is one of Scottiedom's all-time Greats — producer of twelve Champions out of a total of fourteen puppies.

Grin and Bear It is pictured with the famed Lloyd Memorial Trophy, which he won this year and which was also won by his sire, and more recently by his full older brother, Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear. The Lloyd Memorial Trophy is awarded annually by the Scottish Terrier Club of America to the top winning Scottish Terrier in breed competition.

Grin and Bear It was the only puppy from Hussey's last litter, and it is almost a miracle that he ever survived, for at birth he was tiny, had absorbed fluid from his mother, and breathing was next to impossible.

In 1965, Grin and Bear It had a fantastically successful record. He won twenty-three Groups and tied with the English Import, Ch. Bardane Bingo for Best in Show Wins, making a total of four. He was Best of Breed at the Scottish Terrier Club of America's Speciality in 1965, and again this year, and it is noteworthy that on every occasion, when he was Best of Breed, he placed in the group.

He completed his Championship in 1964 in seven shows in seven different States. He was shown very little that year, coming out with a bang in 1965.

Great as has been his record, his owner and his all-time handler, Dr. Lenesty, are taking even greater interest in his promise as a sire. His very first litter produced three Champions, and a fourth, needs but a few points to finish. Most of his get are of course still very young, but many of them will be coming out this year. He was truly bred-to-produce as the record of both his famous sire and dam indicate.

In addition to Grin and Bear It's great record, Gaidoune had many other successes in '65. They bred four of the current Champions, thus tying for first place in the Breeder's ranks.
