Thus their productive years overlapped to a considerable extent and all

three produced important sons. Since the family tree of Necessity and Fashion Hint has now narrowed to Realisation as head of the line we might recall what sort of dog we might recall what sort of dog he was. Briefly, he was a powerful appearing little dog, short, thick-set, and low-built with a hard dark grey coat, a longer head than his grandaire, Necessity, and a domi-nating personality. Such highly im-portant dogs as Waising Wizard and his sons, Walsing Watchtower and Westpark Masterpiece, were not champions and therefore we have little or no data on them other than their string records.

She went on "We all know how easily some dogs slip through to the top without having come under the hands and syes of a specialist. You may say that not all specialists agree — this is true all specialists agree — this is take also — but at any rate they can claim to argue from knowledge. What I am concerned with is foreign What I am concerned with is foreign elements creeping in such as fall-ness, narrow fronts and light eyes. These do not fit into the breed anywhere and are not just a point of the standard between wars and of the standard between wars and with the new and felt that time to attack faults is when they appear and not when they get established. She ended by quoting from "three of the most throwledgeable people of the most knowledgeable people of the most knowledgeable people of the past — Mr. Cowley of the Albournes who said that a Scottie should be on the ground, that's where it should be, and Mr. Robert Chapman of the Heathers said that 'a Scottle's front legs should never look as though they came out of one hole and last, Mrs. Casperss, whose description of the dog's movement has never been bettered — 'that he should appear to be taking longer strides than he is capable of doing.'"
