dene Bingo continues to roll out the Champions, and his American Champions now stand at twenty-eight, the last one being a daughter, Ch. Carnation Chaos which took final points at the recent Yakima show. Her only points were five majors, a five, and four and three point shows.

One of his 1969 Champions, Carnation Chair Boy, won three Group Firsts, at Yellowstone Valley, Galatin and Electric City.

Bob Bartos writes they have been very busy at Carnation Farms, for in addition to their Scotties, they are running a full string of Labrador Retrievers. They won in the Southern California Retriever Trial at Los Angeles, repeated the winning at Northern California the next week-end, thus qualifying their yellow Labrador, Ch. Carnation Butter Boy for the 1970 Nationals.

In the midwest, Helen Gaither's Gaidoune Kennels have had another successful year. Their Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear is now the sire of thirty-three Champions, which makes him the top living sire, and Helen feels sure that he is the only

American-bred (and homebred) that is approaching the record of Troubadour. Five Group winners in 1969 were sired by Great Bear, and at the S.T.C. of A. Rotating Specialties, the Best of Breed winner was Ch. Gaidoune A Go Go Bear.

The Best in Show winner, Ch. Gaidoune Great Marshall Bear, is another Great Bear son.

Helen tells us that over one-third of all puppies sired by Great Bear have completed their championships.

Gaidoune's English import, which is pictured, Ch. Rantin Robin of

Lakelynn, had a most successful few months of showing. He is an all-breed Best in Show winner, with numerous Group Firsts. He was Best of Breed at the Washington, D.C. Specialty in October, climaxed a short career by winning the S.T.C. of A. Specialty in New York this February. He is a beautiful silver brindle.

Gaidoune's next Champion will probably be the youngster, Gaidoune Jerry Bear. He was Best of Winners at the Specialty in New York at the age of ten months. He is a son of their Best in Show winner and Specialty winner, Ch. Gaidoune Bear (Garden) and is out of Ch. Gaidoune Tinsel Glow. She was a multiple group winner from the classes in 1969, already the dam of group winners.

Congratulations are certainly due

Ch. Gaidoune Gisèle. Ch. Gaidoune Grizzly Bear is her 10th Champion offspring, and she has several others near the title. It looks as though she will break the record of twelve won held by her dam, Ch. Gaidoune Gorgeous Hussy.

We have a couple of Gaidoune's current Champions pictured. While we are on the subject of pictures, we did have quite a few from various breeders that had to be held over since they were not current Champions. We will be using them in future issues. All the pictures in this issue are of current Champions.

Hilda G. Bigelow's Hil-Ray's kennels finished four Champions in 1969, two of them are pictured, Ch. Hil-Ray's Anchor Man, and Ch. Hil-Ray's Flare Signal. Anchor Man finished last June at the S.T.C. of A. Rotating Specialty when he was just two days past a year old. He was Best of Winners and had had several Best of Breeds on his

BRITISH NOTES

CONSIDERING THE long interval between the "Notes" of last July and the end of 1969 surprisingly few changes have taken place in English Scottie ranks. Each year there are a few outstanding

Scotties that do the bulk of the winning and the bloodlines behind them remain within rather narrow limits. Unless some prepotent sire appears changes take place very slowly over a period of years and we scarcely realize that the old is

giving way to the new. In a sense the field is wide open for a new strain to sweep the boards since Ch. Bardene Bingo was the top dog

in 1962 and '63. About that time Kennelgarth Viking and his offspring and relatives began to demand notice and are now the leading English winners. Viking was whelped November 20th, 1959 and he finished his title with little or no fanfare in 1961. His first champion, Gaywyn Viscount, was recorded in 1962 and she finished her career with a total of 14 c.e.s. in 1965. In 1967 Gosmore Eilburn Admaration, his most prominent son was acclaimed Dog of the year and was the winner of 22 certificates before he was sold to America. Viking has sired 21 English champions (8 dogs, 13 bitches) the latest being Eilburn Wonder Girl in 1969. Viking was the sire of the 1968 Dog of the Year, The bitch, Ch. Gos. Eilburn Miss Hopeful. Her sire was

a Viking son, Ch. Inverduie Scotchin. And so it goes, the majority of the winning Scotties of the past few years can claim Viking close up in their pedigrees. At Crufts this year, 22 of the placed Scotties were his direct children or grandchildren, winning among them Best of Breed, both challenge certificates and both reserve placings. The well-known judge Mr. F. Warner Hill hailed him as the sire of the Century in any breed and Mr. Stanley Dangerfield saw him as a front ranking sire, deserving of the highest honors, and the "dog of the decade."

Mrs. Mickiethwaite's Cn. Gles-ecker's Golden Nob, a son of Admaration was the winning Scottish dog at Crufts this year. Mr. Sibleton Judging, Best of Breed and best bitch was Dullison's Ch. Gos. Eilburn Miss Hopeful. This was her 20th certificate. Reserve to Golden

Nob was Mrs. Stouden's Tambrax Turpin and reserve in bitches was Mrs. Manner's Mandavil Merwyn. The Terrier group was won by a Norwich and best in show was a Pyrenean Mountain dog.

No Scottie appeared among the final leaders in the race for Dog of the Year in 1969. However, Ch. Brin Checkmate was best in show at Leeds which just won him a placing. Dog of the year was Mrs. Dullison's Wire. Ch. Gosmore Kirkmoor Craftsman with 24 points, ac-

and to him was a black Standard Poole with 13 points.

Of interest to Scottie followers is the death of Mr. T. W. L. Caspercz at the great age of 84. His first love was the Cairn Terrier of which he was a breeder and judge. He missed no words in judging critiques, never fearing to call a spade a spade. He

called the dogs as he saw them without flattery or excuse. Since the death of Dorothy he lived alone in "The Cottage" near Henley with a wheaten Scottie as his companion. Another loss in Scottie ranks occurred in the death of Miss White (Broadleaves). Her best known Scot was Ch. Broadleaves Briar Rose. Some of her friends in America may welcome news of Mrs. O'Connor (Mootie). She is over 90 and has failing eyesight but still retains her interest in Scots.

For those Americans who are toying with the idea of a summer trip to England, the date of the Club show has now been set at July 30th, the day before Windsor and will be held at Slough in the Sixagh Centre. Center where both indoor and outdoor judging facilities will be available. Arrangements for the after-show dinner have not yet been made.

three weekends with five Group 1sts and a Best in Show from the classes. He had come over from England with a terrific record. Had been "Dog of the Year" in 1967 and was a seven-times Best in Show Winner.

After completing his title in this country he was shown in Specials

and in five months of competition, frequently alternating his show appearance with his kennel mate, Eng. and Am. Ch. Gommere Gilburn Highland King. Admaration topped the breed to become the Top Scottie Winner, according to the Phillips System, for 1969. He was Best in Show three times, won eleven Group 1sts, seven seconds, five thirds and one fourth.

He is sired by England's great Winner and leading producer, Ch. Kennelgarth Viking out of Bardene Betwixt, has just reached four years of age and show-wise is just in his prime. He is handled and conditioned by Doug Bundock of Sebastopol, Calif.

He started off 1970 in great style. He was Best of Breed at Westminster this year where there were 17 Champions entered for breed competition. When it came to the Group, it was unfortunate that he was panned directly alongside the Public Address announcers' table, under a huge loud speaker for some forty-five minutes, by which time he was fed up with the whole performance.

Following Westminster he was shown at nine Shows on the Texas Circuit. He was Best of Breed at all events where he was shown, and won five Group 1sts. Following this he was shown at two California shows, Sun Maid and Sequoia, both shows with over 2,000 entries. He won the Group at both, and at one, Sequoia, we believe, was Best in Show.

Both are by their English import, Ch. Gaywyn Loyalist co-owned with Helen Gaither. The Harry Zippriches of York, Pa. own Top Rascal.

Among the new Champions is Kirk Nor Rubyat, daughter of Ch. Scots Delight Rough Rider. She won points at every show in the Tarheel Circuit except one where she was not shown. She picked up 13 points, three majors. Rubyat is owned by Judith Bonausto of Camp Springs, Maryland.

Current Champions

NINETY-Seven Scottish Terriers are on the current annual list of Champions. This is not a calendar list, but a fiscal list, representing those Scotties which have completed their Championships, same have been approved and the fact published in issues of the American Kennel Gazette from March 1969 up to and including February 1970.

Leading Sire

In first spot is Ch. Bardene Bobby Dazzler with eight Champions to his credit. Following and in second spot is Bobby Dazzler's sire, Ch. Bardene Bingo with seven Champions, and the famous Ch. Gaidoune Great Bear also has seven. These three Scotties certainly lead the parade.

There is a tie for third place between Eng. Ch. Kennelgarth Viking (in England) and Ch. Barberry Knowe Wilfdere, each having four Champions on the current list.

Following in fourth spot are four dogs each with three Champions. These are Reanda Ringold, Ch. Viewpark Red Hackle, Ch. Barberry Knowe Merrymaker and Ch. Reanda Rocksand.

Quite a number of sires produced two Champions each and they include Ch. Anstamm Dark Venture, Ch. Carnation Silver Note, Ch. Barberry Knowe Conductor, Ch. Barberry Knowe Blackjack, Ch. Firebrand's Viking Rex, Ch. Anstamm Boy Blue, Gilkey's Crackjack and Gaywyn Loyalist.

If they have been show dogs, they have probably never had the pleasure of owning a good, hard, cooked beef shin bone. Whiskers would get broken and soiled and since it was not part of the life, perhaps it has been forgotten. I have two nearly 11 years old that get a new bone every other day and such delight is rare to see. They find hours of diversion in happy gnawing.

terested in life and in good physical shape. There are sights to see and smells to be investigated and if the pace is somewhat slower than in the past, the more time to savor the joy of living.

Occasionally, unusual objects become treasures of the older Scottie. One we know whose owner received an intricate wooden puzzle as a gift, took the puzzle unto himself and enjoyed hours of pushing it around and toting it here and there.

Never forget the entertainment value of a Ride in the Car. Perhaps no longer will Angus or Heather guard the vehicle or peer in excitement thru the windows. The contentment that comes from quietly riding along, beside the loved one, is satisfaction enough.

Altho it does not fall under the heading of entertainment, the appearance of the older Scottie is frequently of some importance to him. Not for the oldest, at least in my establishment, the rigors of hand stripping but a neat clip, good combing and brushing and occasional bath.
