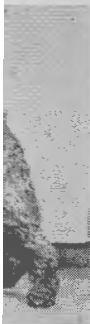

DOG NEWS

THE two English pictures of Walsing Watch Light and Walsing War Bond are interesting. They were sent us through the courtesy of their owner, W. M. Singleton. Mr. Singleton's Walsing Kennels had the pleasure of winning the English Kennel Club's first Challenge Certificate to be offered since 1939. This was at the Scottish Terrier Club's Specialty Show held in May, when Watch Light won the Dog Certificate under Mrs. Winifred Barber, and was Best in Show. War Bond is his litter brother. He was shown at the Leeds Open Show where he was Best Puppy and Best Dog, and at the New Castle Open event where he won Best in Show. The Championship show was Watch Light's first outing and Mr. Singleton has great hopes that he will continue to do well. Winning the first Certificate must have been very exciting, when one remembers that Mr. Singleton won both Certificates at the last Pre-war Championship show which was held at Harrogate on September 2, 1939. Twenty six Scotties were shown, sixteen being puppies, and ten over a year old. Ernest Jaresco judged. Best Puppy in Match was Fire Brand, an eight months old brindle owned by Robert Stewart of Chicago. This young fellow is a son of Mrs. Winant's famous Spitfire. Best Puppy Bitch was Greenock's Black Magic, shown by Dr. and Mrs. E. ZeBranek, Evergreen Park. The Open Winners were Mrs. F. G. Schycker's Ayshire Mac and Robert Stewart's Killeshandra Delight.

Many new exhibitors are coming out, and it looks like Scotties would be very strong in California from now on. Mr. Gillespie's own dog, Bothkennar Hotspur, a black brindle male that won't be a year old until September 2nd of this year, was Best of Breed at three recent consecutive shows in California, under three different judges. At Riverside, Hotspur was second in the group. Mr. Gillespie bred and handled this young dog, a son of Ch. Bothkennar Spitfire out of Ch. Edgerstoune Betty. He is a great grandson of Ch. Ortley Ambassador on both sides of his pedigree.

Deephaven Spar, owned by the Wm. J. Macaulays of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, went through to her championship in five straight shows on the Texas circuit. She was Best of Breed at the recent Skokie Valley event where the Macaulays took Best of Winners with Mac's Welton High Hopes. The Macaulays write they have two litters that look very good. One is out of Mac's Welton Pixey and the other out of Mac's Welton Victory. Both we believe, are sired by Tweed.

And there is great excitement at Kinclaven in Milwaukee. Apparently Marie Stone has hit the jackpot as far as wheatens are concerned. Kinclaven Gossip is busy with a litter of six to Wild Oats and there are four wheatens in this nest. Kinclaven Scandal Monger, bred to Classic came through with a litter of eight, five of which are wheatens. There is also a litter of three by Classic out of Kinclaven Chorine.

Scottie Show Wins

QUITE a few shows to report this month, with the best entry along the line being at the Ladies Dog Club show held at Framingham Centre, Mass., on June 22nd. At twenty shows, the breed accounted for one Best in Show and five groups, and placed in five others.

First, the Ladies Dog Club show, the entry being 33 and Capt. James Horton judging. Jos. W. Kelly's Independent Ben, entered for Specials was Best of Breed, with the Winners Bitch, Mrs. Winant's Edgerstoune Twinkle placing Best Opposite. The dog points went to the Heywood Hartleys' Woodhart Watchman.

The next day at the Framingham District Kennel Club show, also held at Framingham Center, only ten were entered, but here Independent Ben picked up steam and went on to place Best in Show All Breeds. There were 947 dogs entered at this show. Best Opposite to Ben was the Robert J. McLaughlins' Ch. Lynscof Deborah. The point winners were Woodhart Watchman and Philip Prentice's Wolscot Wireclad. Mrs. Paul Silvernail judged the breed, Dr. Chas. F. Lynch the group, and Mrs. Beatrice Godsol, Best in Show.

News from the S. T. C. of A.

During the June 3rd Specialty Show of the Scottish Terrier Club of America the 1945 Trophy Awards were announced. We quote from the secretary's message to club members:

"The Relgalf Kennels won both the Lloyd Memorial and the Best of Breed trophies, with 50 points. Mrs. Marie Stone had 28 points, Mrs. Winant, 24, and Mrs. Constable, 4. Puppy Dog trophy went to Relgalf with 21 points, Mrs. Winant had 10 points. Puppy Bitch trophy was won by Relgalf with 28 points, closely followed by Mrs. Winant with 26 and Mrs. Constable with 22. Mrs. Stone collected 4 points. The American-Bred Dog trophy went to Acton Hill with 10 points, edging out Mrs. Stone (9 points) and Mrs. Winant and Relgalf (6 points each). The American-Bred Bitch trophy went to Relgalf with 24 points, Mrs. Stone had 22, Mrs. Winant, 19 and Mrs. Constable, 14."

The day after the Specialty Show the Committee on the Standard met at the offices of the A. K. C. It was unanimously agreed that clarification of the Scottish Terrier Standard was necessary but, "nobody wanted to change the ideal Scottish Terrier." It is stated that in the proposed clarified standard considerable stress is to be laid on type, balance, soundness and temperament and that an earnest effort will be made to clarify all paragraphs, thus eliminating chances of misinterpretation. Additional paragraphs are to be written in for the guidance of both judges and breeders. The proposed clarified standard will be submitted to the membership of the club for a vote in the near future.

SORRY space won't permit us to cover in detail all the shows in the last several weeks. We have catalogues on 22 events which came in since the last issue, mostly June shows. Several of the entries along the line were most noteworthy, and certainly the breed made a marvelous showing in the groups. Only one show failed entirely in entries, and of the remaining 20, the breed accounted for five groups and placed in 17—a bang-up record, we would say. Mrs. K. A. Youngstrom's Redbart Kendrick was Best in Show All Breeds at the Durham, N. C., event.

The group winners were Dr. and Mrs. R. A. Kast's Ch. Milson Christopher Robin at the Mid-Hudson event; Aragon Kennels' Ch. Kleiglight of Aragon at the South Bend and Skokie shows, and Justin McCabe's Ch. Erin's Beau Brummel at Columbia, Mo., and the Fort Atkinson, Wis., event.

At the brace of shows held at Framingham Centre, Mass., on June 22 and 23, there were entries of 41 at both events. The Ladies Dog Club, the first show, found Milson Christopher Robin placing fourth in the group, with the Winners Bitch, J. L. Downs' Charles River June, placing Best Opposite. The dog points went to L. A. Carpenter's Tirvelda Domino's Chief. At the second show, the Framingham District Kennel Club, Miss Martha Reed's Ch. Dune O'Boy was Best of Breed and fourth in the group and J. L. Downs' Ch. Charles River Blazing Beauty was Best Opposite. The point winners were Samuel Kolow's Monty and Edw. H. Brown's Feather.

Boarding at Mr. William Koehler's kennels in Claremont, California, are two Bullterriers which served with the U. S. Army Air Forces. These dogs were trained for service by Mr. Koehler himself while serving with the Army at San Carlos, California, as the only civilian trainer. Both were enlisted on April 10, 1943. One, "Duke of Wellington," was honorably discharged in September, 1944. The other, "William the Conqueror" (Bill), served until April 10, 1946. Bill was the TOP war dog at San Carlos. It is really amazing to see these dogs work. After having been idle as far as war work is concerned for some months between the time of discharge and the time Mr. Koehler very recently took them to board, they had forgotten none of their training, and snapped to attention on Mr. Koehler's command and went through their paces like the veterans they are. the kidneys, extending smoothly to the slightly arched croup.

Withers well pronounced and forming highest part on body. Chest with sufficient spring of ribs, reaching deep to the elbow. Brisket full, but not too broad. Belly well tucked up, extending curved line with chest. Loins wide and muscled, hips sufficiently broad. Tail clipped short to first or second joint.

FAULTS: Roached back, depressed back, too long or too short or too narrow in back. **POSITION OF WITHERS LOWER THAN THAT OF CROUP.** Loins or hips not spacious enough, lack of muscular development. Chest too narrow, shallow or barrel shaped. Brisket too prominent, too flat or too narrow. Belly too much drawn up, tail set too low, or too high, tail clipped too long, lack of forechest.

FOREQUARTERS: Shoulder blade and upper arm should meet at an angle of at least ninety degrees and not more than one hundred and ten degrees. Pro-

portion of shoulder and upper arm should be like one to one.

Legs seen from the front and side perfectly straight and parallel from elbow to pasterns, with round bones, muscled and sinewy. In a normal position the elbow should touch the brisket.

Pasterns firm, with an almost perpendicular position to the ground.

Paws well arched, compact and cat-like.

FAULTS: Shoulders too loose, too steep (too short), overloaded with muscles. Weak pasterns, paws turning in or out. Bones too heavy or too light. **FRENCH FRONT, BOWLEGGED FRONT,** front too narrow or too wide. Paws too long, flat or splayed (rabbit feet). Too much gap between elbow and brisket and/or forechest. Elbow turning out. Dew claws.

HINDQUARTERS: Upper shanks long, sufficiently wide and well muscled on both sides of thigh, with clearly defined knee (stifle). Hocks, while at rest, should stand perpendicular. Upper shanks, lower shanks and hocks parallel to each other, also wide enough apart to fit in with a properly built body. The hip bone should fall away about thirty degrees from the spinal column. The upper shank should be at right angles with the hip bone. Croup well filled out. Cat paws, like on front legs, turning neither in nor out.

FAULTS: Fine or slightly muscled hindlegs. Steepness or lack of angulation, or excessive angulation. Lack of knee development, position of hocks not perpendicular. Shanks too narrow and not parallel. Cow hocks, or too prominent hocks, hips too wide or too narrow. Diagonally slanting or excessively rounded croup. Toes turning in or out. Lack of balance with forequarters. Flat feet.

GAIT: His gait should be free, balanced and vigorous. When moving swiftly, he should throw his hindlegs at least as far as his front legs.

FAULTS: Lack of drive, stiffness, looseness, excessive back motion, throwing front or rear legs, or both, in or out. Not covering enough ground with rear legs.

COAT, COLOR AND MARKINGS: Smooth haired, short, hard, thick and close lying. Grey undercoat on neck permissible. Black, brown or blue, with rust-red, sharply defined markings, appearing on all legs and paws, forechest, throat and muzzle, above each eye and below tail.

FAULTS: Hairs too long, too soft, too thin, wiry or wavy. Undercoat visible through outer coat. Color not distinct. Straw colored and splashed markings, not enough or too large markings, white on chest, exceeding half-inch square.

NOTE: Faults in capital letters are MAJOR FAULTS evidencing degeneration of the breed.
