That brings to mind criticisms that I've heard and that I've read in print during the past year concerning the activities of the parent club. Just why people enjoy the destruction of the buildings of others, I cannot understand. It seems to me that the proper attitude would be a constructive attitude rather than a destructive one. Certainly we are not doing the Scottish Terrier Fancy any good by cracking the parent club, either by word or in print. Personally, I feel that Charlie Stalter has done the best job that could be done under the existing circumstances. I know that he is wholeheartedly interested in the Scottish Terrier Club of America and in the entire Fancy as well. Under other circumstances we could have looked for a most active year under his administration, but we are at war, and are curtailed. It's difficult to put a show on. It's difficult for the Breeder or the interested Fancier to get to shows. Consequently, our shows have not been as successful from our standpoint as they might have been.
