

LAST month there was an error in reporting the Winners Dog at the Chicago Specialty. This honor went to Wm. Morris' December Boy, who has since been purchased by Marie Stone and registered Kinclaven Crofter. A Kinclaven-bred one all the way through, Crofter picked up three points at Milwaukee on Jan. 12th—so he's well on his way to the title. At the Milwaukee Specialty—and we've no catalog as yet from this show—Kinclaven Caprice took the final points for her Championship and is awaiting confirmation.

Writing in the English publication, "Our Dogs," the noted English authority, Mrs. D. S. Caspersz, has some pertinent remarks to make on the English Standard's description of Scotty coats, and we quote:

"Correspondence continues over the coat and trimming problem, and Mrs. Gabriel, amongst others, rightly draws attention to the fact that our standard of the breed has a weak spot. The more one considers it, the more one has to admit that it is a very weak spot indeed. Regarding coat, what has our standard to tell the newcomer or the novice? Simply this: "The body is covered with a close-lying, broken, rough-textured coat," which comes under General Appearance; and then this under the heading Coat: "The dog has two coats—the undercoat, short, dense and soft; the outercoat, harsh, dense and wiry; the two making a weather-resisting covering to the dog." Now, it is not difficult to see that many different constructions can be put on this description. Unless a person has seen and felt a really perfect Scotch coat, it is not easy for him to visualize from this description just what it is like. To some, the words "close-lying" and "rough-textured" do not add up. That both phrases do apply to the correct coat is not readily understood, because so many minds "close-lying" may

suggest a fitting jacket resembling that of a smooth breed while "rough-textured" does not state exactly how rough. Then when we reach the wording of the coat paragraph, alluding to the two coats, it may be easy to imagine a covering which is "harsh, dense and wiry," but there is no indication whatever as to the desired length of this harsh, dense, wiry coat. I know full well that the body of experts who revised the standard so carefully took infinite pains, and in the main if a dog complied with the standard on all counts, he could not but be a very good dog. But I agree with Mrs. Gabriel that coat has not enough mention. She writes me: "It says nothing whatever about length, or that it should not have a wave in it, nor does it mention at all whisker, or hair on legs and chest. In point of fact, the newcomer has practically nothing to go on, and at a show sees all these Dundrearies and frills, and as these dogs win they naturally think that this is how they should be."

Although the wording of the English and American standards differ somewhat, Mrs. Caspersz remarks fit our American standard as well as they do the English version. Our standard under the heading of "Coat" states: "Rather short, about two inches, dense undercoat with outer coat hard and wiry"—certainly a description that does little to draw a word picture of a true Scotty coat—nothing is said about "furnishings" nor about the proper "lay" of a good jacket, either under the heading of "Coat" or of "General Appearance."

The subject of changing standards is a perennial in all breeds and battles usually rage over some more or less technical point. In the meantime the woeful inadequacy of the wording of the average

breed standard continues. Should not the first function of any standard be to present an over-all picture of the breed—a word picture which would give a newcomer some idea of the general outline and type of the breed. The fact that "furnishings" are not mentioned in the present Scottish Terrier standard is one example of that standard's inadequacy.

Wm. Cunningham passed on an entry of 10 at the Worcester, Mass. show on December 15th, which we believe was the last Eastern show for the year. The Winners Dog, Keith P. Rogers' Mac R's Duncan went through to Best of Breed. Best Opposite to him was Mrs. Wm. Constable's Ch. Murray Rag Doll, entered for Specials. The Winners Bitch was Mr. and Mrs. Jos. W. Kelly's Edgerstoune Topic. The Reserves were the Kellys' Kelscot Dougal and Mrs. Wm. Constable's Murray Ravigote.

Keith P. Rogers of Pembroke, N. H., who owns Mac R's Duncan that went to Best of Breed at the recent Worcester, Mass. show, writes the dog is in top condition and has been improving steadily this year. Shown four times he has gone Winners Dog, Reserve, Best of Winners and now Best of Breed. He has been shown by Jim Murphy, and Mr. Roger says "I certainly believe full credit should go to Jim for the excellent job he has done in showing Duncan. Jim will be showing Duncan and a good son of Benefactor at the Specialty and the Garden.

From Opportunity, Wash., a letter comes from Dr. Wilson of the Willmoor Kennels, who tells us fanciers are working hard to make the Empire Kennel Association show on April 26th and 27th, a five pointer for Scotties. Dr. Wilson is trying for 75 Scotties this year. If hard work means anything, he will get it. Incidentally the show will offer an excellent premium list.
