THERE were 13 entered at the Bucks County show, with the Winners Dog, Mrs. D. M. Herr's Barberry Knowe Mac Tavish going through to Best of Breed and second in the group. Best Opposite was the Winners Bitch, Mrs. Seth Malby's Rampant Fairy Magic.

The Trenton, N. J. show had 17 entered, with Marlu Farm Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Warspite taking Best of Breed and second in the group. Best opposite was the Winners Bitch, Mr. and Mrs. W. Sheldon Winans' Cabrach Craig, and the dog points went to the Chas. C. Stalters' Barberry Knowe Style.

Ch. Deephaven Warspite repeated his Best of Breed win at the Delaware County show, where the entry was 19, and he went on to third in the group. Best Opposite was the Winners Bitch, Rampant Fairy Magic and the dog points went to Barberry Knowe Mac-Tavish.
