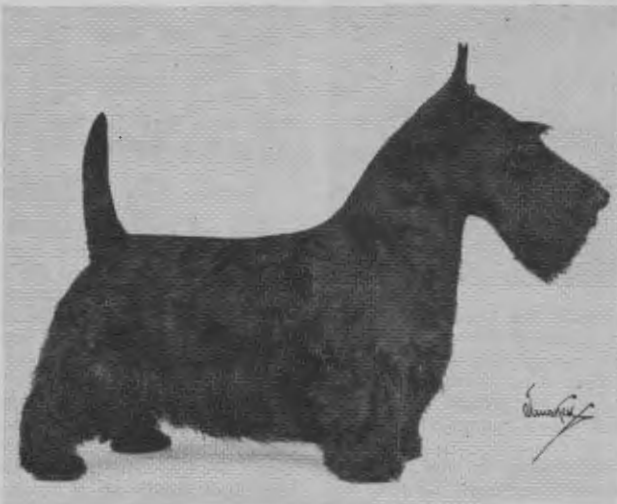

Mr. Macaulay has this to say on any possible change in the Scottish Terrier Standard: "We do not feel that any change should be made in the Standard for Scottish Terriers, except perhaps in the matter of weight, which could be made 18 to 20 pounds for females and 20 for males. The weight for males should not be increased over the 20 pounds, as after a short time we would be to where we were, when many males of great show records were on the other side of 25 pounds. We also believe that when any change is being considered it should be in collaboration with the English Standard. We do not see why there should be any difference, and any deviation from the English standard would be rather confusing on this side. The fact is, we do get many of our best Scotties from abroad and will probably continue to do so."

Negative Pattern

A good many of us do not belong to a dog club and therefore are not particularly concerned with "How not to help your associates," as set forth in this section of the February issue. A broader behavior pattern with a wider application is advanced below.

Advice in Reverse

1. Never say a good word about the other fellow's dogs. You might convey the impression that yours are inferior.
2. Always look for the 'good points in your own dogs. Tell everybody about them. Always look for faults in other dogs. Shout about them.
3. Never breed your bitches to any stud dogs but your own. There is no living stud outside your kennel that can improve your stock.
4. Be suspicious of all judges. They are either crooked or they don't know anything about your breed. Never fail to relay this information to novice exhibitors for unless forewarned they might become intelligent and enthusiastic breeders.
5. When a judge puts your dog down, don't allow him to think he is getting away with something. Bawl him out, preferably in the ring so all can hear. Or, failing that, wait until the judging is over and tell everybody, including the judge, what a lousy job he has done. In other words don't be a good loser. That's sissy stuff.
6. Be sure and tell your non-doggy friends that all dog shows are "fixed," thereby confirming their previously formed suspicions.
7. Run down the other fellow's breed. This can be done tactfully by saying, "I can't understand what you see in that breed."
8. Withhold from the novice all information that might help or encourage him. You have spent many years in acquiring a vast fund of knowledge about breeding, grooming, and showing, so why give it away for nothing?
