Mr. Kemps announcement stated the Standard remains unchanged, but is now in the hands of a new Committee headed by Mr. Pollak.

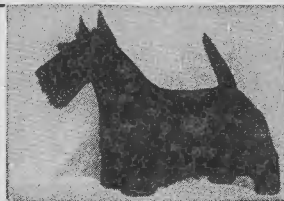

This is certainly not desirable Terrier temperament and one wonders if breeders should not give the matter considerable serious thought, perhaps to the point of writing something definite about temperament into the Standard.
