on sound proven lines. I fault dog clubs, breeders and owners for ignoring it. Unless the owner knows best and demands the best in breeding, and unless the clubs encourage his desire for knowledge of the best methods, the breeder will continue to believe that exhibiting is the ONLY means of popularizing a breed. 'Taint right.

There is a whale of a lot of truth in the above. I invite discussion on this subject, with permission to print and to identify the writer. If the sole purpose of a club is to "get out an entry" that is one thing. (And I believe that is, unfortunately the main purpose at least of too many clubs). But if the objects of the club are broader than that, and include the advancement of the welfare of a breed, and the advancement of the knowledge of the members, then such club, it seems to me, is working along proper lines.
