

ALL TERRIERS

Wires

We understand that the two Wildoaks' American bred Terriers that have recently completed their English championship are being used extensively at stud by some of the leading British breeders. This is quite a compliment for our cousins across the water to pay to our American bred Wires. For a long time the English Terrier fanciers and judges have been rather patronizing in their attitude toward the American breeders when they visited this country. They were apt to tell us that the greater numbers of shows in England, the shorter distances one had to travel for stud services, the fact that the English were past masters in caring for puppies, all proved the English Terriers' superiority.

For my own self, and I come from across the water—I have never seen why the Americans could not turn out as good a Terrier as the English, and I think we are doing so right now. One point that the Englishman does surpass us in is this:

In England, if a Terrier comes from really fine producing stock, he is sure to be used at stud, whether or not he is personally a champion. In the States, Americans simply will not use a Wire that cannot win.

England breeds dozens of Wires to our one, so the law of averages is in her favor but I believe that right now we are breeding just as good Wires here in America as are being bred in England. They are not breeding Weltona Frizzettes over there every day.

Anyone who frequents the shows will have to admit that the American bred stock is way ahead of what was formerly benched. I do not believe that it is necessary to go abroad to get a good Wire to head a kennel. Recently a famous Terrier man of wide experience returned from England with not one dog. He said he had taken in a number of the best championship shows, and in his own words said, "There's nothing over there good enough to go on top in America just now."

I believe that the Wildoaks dogs are just the outriders of a regiment, and that

before long, especially if we can get the quarantine law fixed up, there will be many more American bred travellers to take their share of honors at the English shows, and incidentally to sire their share of English puppies.

Radio Dog Club Continued by Popular Demand

New Program Started over WOWO

His experience has been wide and varied and he will bring dog owners many helpful facts regarding the care and feeding of dogs.
