## Vinton P. Breese

**O**N August 12th, Vinton P. Breese, nationally known judge and columnist, passed away at the Orange Memorial Hospital, Orange, N. J., at the age of sixty-one years. Mr. Breese, whose home was in Caldwell, N. J., has been suffering from a bad heart condition for some time, and recently had canceled several judg-



ing engagements. His death nevertheless comes as a shock to all of us.

Mr. Breese, one of the most colorful figures in the entire dog world, has been judging dogs for forty years, and has been active in the field of dogs since he was a young boy in his teens. While still a stripling, he became interested in Bulldogs and owned and showed some very outstanding specimens. An artist, whose early work was confined largely to miniatures on porcelain, Mr. Breese later widened the scope of his work into large oil portrait paintings, and he immortalized many famous dogs on canvas.

His first judging assignment was in 1900 at New Bedford, Mass. Since that time he has judged every large show in the country, and on three occasions has passed out the Best in Show ribbons at the Westminster Kennel Club. Mr. Breese is survived by a sister, Mrs. Charles R. Blackly, East Orange, N. J.

One hundred and forty years ago members of the great Indian nations of the Northwest Territory assembled at a great peace fire at the present site of Greenville, Ohio. Representing the United States Government was the Great Indian fighter General Mad Anthony Wayne.

As a result of this assembly the Indians buried the hatchet and smoked the pipe of peace with their white brothers. The Indians retired to certain allotted reservations and the great Northwest Territory was opened to the white settlers.

To this historic setting the Treaty City Kennel Club invites the nation's dog fanciers to enter their exhibits at their first annual dog show to be held Saturday, October 5. The Club, being composed of exhibitors, will operate their show entirely to accommodate exhibitors. The show will open at 12:00 noon and judging will begin at 1:00 p. m. It is planned that all breed judging is to be completed not later than 5:00 o'clock p. m. with Best in Show being done at 6:00 o'clock. This five-hour judging plan will be carried out by using eight large rings under a liberal spread of canvass and by employing competent judges and efficient ring stewards. Thus exhibitors from a considerable distance will be able to leave their homes Saturday morning and after exhibiting at the Greenville Show will be enabled to get a full night's rest at Greenville's medium priced hotels. Sunday morning they will only have a short drive (37 miles) to the Dayton show over a well paved road through Ohio's beautiful autumn countryside.

**"Wrinkles"**

WITH the approach of the fall shows, many readers of this column will be interested in learning from an expert the various "wrinkles" employed in preparing a Scottish Terrier for the ring. We are again going to quote from *The Scottish Terrier* by that international authority Dorothy S. Caspersz, compiler of *Scottish Terrier Pedigrees* and Hon. Secretary of the Scottish Terrier Club (Eng.).

"There are countless makes of trimming knives on the market, some with serrated edges to the blade, some plain. The trimmer must discover for himself with which he gets the most pleasing results. Clippers have to be resorted to for shortening the hair on the skull, cheeks, and just immediately under the throat, for the simple reason they cause no pain to the dog, whereas dragging hair off these parts with a knife usually does so unnecessarily. When using clippers always work against the growth of the hair, and until proficient only use one side or corner of the clippers—say, one-sixth part of the cutting surfaces. A smoother and more even result can be obtained this way than by attacking the hair with the whole breath of cutting surface at once. Do not use clippers further back than the occiput at the top of the skull, or further back at the sides of the face than the natural line down the side of the neck where hair meets and forms a kind of frill, nor further towards the muzzle than is indicated by the sloping line of shading in the diagram. Nor is it wise to use clippers much under the throat except at the immediate bend. Below this, down the front of the neck and front of the chest of the dog, the hair should be judiciously kept in check either with a trimming knife or with finger and thumb, and be made to grade off imperceptibly into the longer hair over the shoulders and between the forelegs. The rear end of the dog and the tapering of the hair on the tail should also be treated with fingers or knife only, not clippers. Remember that wherever clippers are used, there will the hair take on a tendency to curl when and if allowed to grow, for continued clipping alters the character of the coat.

"The whole art of successful trimming lies in bringing about the apparent merging of the shorter into the longer hairs without showing any line of demarcation between the two."

# What, if Anything, Is Wrong in our Breed Today?

By John Kemps

IT IS foolish to deliberately close our eyes to the rather obvious fact that if the decline in Scottie entries should continue at its present rate, our breed will have practically disappeared from the show ring in another year or so. This is all the more surprising because the Scottie has not lost appreciably in general popularity and a considerable number are still being registered every day.

No, there isn't anything wrong with our breed, but evidently our breeders have temporarily lost their grip on the situation. That, together with the possibility that further importing may have come to a dead stop for an indefinite period, gives cause for worry and the sooner we realize that we had better get busy and do something about it, the better.

In order to remedy a bad situation, it is necessary, first of all, to be sure of the causes that brought it about and if we closely examine the gradual decline since 1936, we find that, in the first place, large numbers of local exhibitors have given up the fight. It was a process of gradual elimination and, through it, the quality in the show ring did not suffer very much. Therefore, although their absence became more and more noticeable, not a great deal of attention was paid to it. There still were plenty of others left and competition continued to be keen for a while. In fact, the Scottie was still riding fairly high on the tail-end of a boom. However, almost imperceptibly, entries continued to drop and evidently dogs that were finished were no longer immediately replaced by others. Scottie entries dropped fast in the Southwest and Southeast until, out of a possible thirty-odd shows with formerly pretty good entries, at least two-thirds now have a hard time bringing a one-point entry. The Mid-West and Northeast held up pretty well since they are strong Scottie territories with many kennels located within a small radius. It was not until the spring and summer of this year that

the "depression" suddenly descended upon the Northeast, where entries dropped 50 per cent and more, notwithstanding the fact that recent importing had been fairly heavy. The A. K. C. took notice and point ratings came down once more. It then became clear that there must be something wrong somewhere and by now many fanciers are wondering what is going on and what can be done. Some believe that others are holding back because of grievances against the selection of judges and that what they consider to be a bad situation has suddenly come to a head. Others think that it's the war and worries about the war, still others advocate more puppy shows, better and more trophies and similar things that may have a stimulating effect.

But very few seem to realize that in order to obtain larger entries there must be more good dogs available! When there are plenty of good ones in circulation, dogs of which people feel proud and for which they have paid decent prices, most of them will also show up in the ring. The fact that they don't show up is in itself convincing proof that they aren't in circulation! Which brings us at once to the real cause of the present decline: Not enough good ones are being raised! In other words, we, the American breeders, are to blame. We have lived for years off the fat of the land, but as a group we have not kept an eye on the future. We simply have become lazy and have rocked ourselves to sleep, that's all. Now, all of a sudden, we are waking up to find that by lying down on the job, by just playing around a little, we have created the present situation! Yes, let us be honest, for a change, and admit it, because if we don't admit it and continue to do nothing but blame our judges, our fellow-breeders, the show giving clubs and everyone else but ourselves, our show Scottie will, before very long, become a museum piece and a curiosity.\*

Things are not going to be easy and certainly not if we continue to strike a self-satisfied attitude. There exists, at present, a spirit of indifference among just those kennel owners who used to be the pillars of the breed. What has caused that indifference is another matter, but it isn't healthy for a breed when its fanciers decide to rest on their laurels and live on their reputation for awhile! Just think of the hundreds of wonderful matrons owned in these United States today, think of the tremendous possibilities they afford if we do the right thing by them!

It is a rather lame excuse to say that there "seems to be no market, these days." Certainly there is a market, but not for mediocre dogs at high prices!
