Chihuahuas

IN this contribution, I am in a reminiscent trend, recalling my very first show, when I had the pleasure of meeting a breeder from



the east with beautiful griffons, and papillons. This experienced lady, evidently noticing my being a novice, came up and gave just that bit of encouragement and

advise that was an incentive to me. She complimented the soundness of the Chihuahuas, as compared with some she had seen previously.

Later on, as I attended show after show with Ch. Perilla, which proved such an attraction, I learned more thoroughly the full meaning of her statements. From that very show on, I heeded that qualification in the show dog, and I have ever been thankful to this lady. I have seen just the type referred to, and when comments arise regarding soundness, it is always my pleasure to stress on that.

I plead to all breeders and to the exhibitors that mark of quality, that plays such an important part in the make-up of every good dog, whether it be our tiny Chihuahuas or the largest of all breeds, as one editor puts it, "They are brothers under the skin."

At a recent show, it was my extreme pleasure to meet with a most interesting young veterinarian, just out of school, who talked on the good, the necessity, and the worth of the dog shows in improving the breed of dogs. In this gathering of just three veterinarians, and with Dr. Leonard W. Goss, of Ohio State University, I feel my first lesson on this point was again a topic.

One must pay heed to such authority as Dr. Goss, and a talk with this experienced per-

son would be a treat for the breeder, the exhibitor, and judges. I feel that my attending that show was well worth my efforts.

And so it is with all shows, we profit by them not by the two fold, but by the dozens.

And to the Chihuahua fancy, you will have an opportunity to see the breed, as possibly never before, when you attend the specialty in Chicago on November 21, 22 when there will be the largest gathering of this breed in the history upon the show bench. The members of this club in selecting Harry Osborne to officiate, were not wrong in their good judgment, for I am advised that four other clubs have sought the services of this gentleman. Attention has been called many times, to his placings in the group, when it has been noticed that our breed, secures his fullest consideration.

A report has been received that the Chihuahua, La Oro Jengibre, won the group at a recent show, and this again points that these little fellows are winning new hearts, as has been the predictions of many years by those who have seen its climb to popularity.

Our trophy committee certainly has done a good task in securing such useful prizes for the November show, and to my knowledge, the first memorial offered is in memory to Ch. Si Si Oro Principe, by a person who felt his passing far greater than even your writer. This little sire headed a kennel, producing as true to type and consistent as one could wish for.

Records show that to date there are nine finished the title, with another with just three points to make, and with grandsons with just a few points to go, especially those on the west coast, and the one mentioned above just having won the group.

It is Chihuahuas of his potency that breeders cannot overlook, and in his passing, a loss to the breed is affected. But as the law of nature rules, "the best of friends must part" and so be it.

By the time this contribution is in your hands, we will be upon the dates with but one task to do, and that is make our entries for the big event of which so much has been written. Successful Spaniel Trials Are Held at St. Charles, Ill.

THE second licensed field trials of the Cocker Spaniel Club of the Middle West were run recently on the Crane Estate at St. Charles, Ill. The trials started at 9 a.m., the puppy and novice stakes being run in the morning, using pigeons as game. After lunch the open all-age stakes for cocker and springer spaniels were run, using pheasants. All the dogs entered in the open all-age stakes were given water tests, using ducks.

The work done by the cockers this year was a considerable improvement over their work of last year and the judges awarded the winner of the open stake a championship point. The cocker open all-age was captured by Robinhurst Hewer, owned by Hugh Parker of Greeley, Iowa, while Cabby G, owned by Stewart O. Sowle of Rockford, Ill., was second; Bishop's Zella of Home Park, owned by J. Paul Bishop, third; and Hey Day of Barrie, owned by James E. Coston, fourth. Certificates of merit went to second, third, and fourth.

The open all-age for springers was won by Busy Bruning of Ashaba, owned by A. P. Moecher of Aurora, Ill., with Billy Bruning of Ashaba, owned by Jack Svendsen of Chicago in second place. Third came Flambeau Duke, owned by J. C. Irvine. The second and third place winners received certificates of merit. In both stakes, the dogs placing passed their water tests.
