IT was good to get a letter from Mrs. Turk Humphrey, Memphis, Tenn. bringing the splendid news that their Killshandra Cavalcade had finished for the title in April, winning the group at Nashville. He was shown in the West in March, came home for the Memphis show where he placed third in the group. The Humphreys have a litter by him out of their Brawyn Bright Future, who will start her show career this fall. There is also a litter out of Bramshire Bright Star sired by Brawyn Diplomacy. The Humphreys young dog, Brawyn Bubbling Over was Reserve to Cavalcade at four shows in April and his owners feel he will do well with just a bit more maturity.

Pictured this month is the Wm. J. Macalays' imported dog, Solitaire of Mac's Welton, who has recently completed his title. He won his points under different judges, was Best of Breed three times, placing second in the Terrier group at these same shows. He acquired one four and two three-point shows for his major wins, the four-pointer being at the Scottish Terrier Specialty in Louisville. Detroit and Denver, were his three-pointers. The Macalays are well pleased with Solitaire's puppies. Two from his first litter were shown at Morris and Essex, the bitch puppy going Reserve in 22 bitch entries. The male puppy was fourth in a class of 9. From Solitaire's second litter the Macalays kept two bitches now past four months old which show considerable promise. Solitaire is a grey brindle dog with black foreface and legs, which make him very striking in appearance.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Chicago held a Sanction Match on July 11th with Mrs. K. G. Sauer judging. Best Puppy was My Tricker of Paddywhack, bred by Dorothy Kennedy and owned by Telefor Schoeler. My Tricker is sired by Bramshire Blaze of Glory out of Paddywhack Paper Doll.

At the Chicago Club's annual meeting held on June 2nd, the following officers were elected for the coming year, President, Robert Stewart; Vice President, Mrs. Shirley Sauer; Secretary, Miss D. Audrey Bond; Treasurer, Miss Olive Becker.

Mrs. Edith Newton Jackson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F. R. Newton, Diehard breeders for more than a quarter-century of Salamanca, N. Y., died July 2 after being ill a month. Mrs. Jackson was a teacher and held a bachelor of science degree from Drexel Institute and a master's degree from New York University. Last year she was an assistant professor at Oklahoma A. M. College and before becoming ill had accepted a similar post at Washington University, St. Louis. She is survived by her parents and several aunts, uncles and cousins.

CALIFORNIA came through again. The Harbor Cities Kennel Club Show at Long Beach June 19 and 20, drew an entry of 52, made by 48 Diehards, for T. H. Carruthers III to pass on—and one of the longest exhibitor's treks on record when T. H. Snethen, of Pittsburgh, came out with four Scots. Mr. Snethen didn't go Best of Breed, his Ch. Shieling's Master Key, with five others in a hot specials class had to bow to Bryce Gillespie's Ch. Bothkennar Kilroy—but Mr. Snethen didn't fare badly. His Shieling's Minuet headed an open-

bitch class of five, then topped the 17-bitch entry for 5 points and went Best of Winners and Best of Opposite Sex. His 9-to-12puppy Shieling's Merriment was Reserve in bitches, and his Shieling's Step Swell was Reserve in dogs.

Walsing War Bond owned by Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Halloran, topped an entry of 20 dogs (3 absent) for 5 points to complete his title in eight weeks at four straight shows, the first only two

weeks after his arrival from England. Mr. Gillespie's Kilroy won the Terrier Group.

Harbor Cities set a record—for the first time in breed history a Champion, Bertha A. Russell's bitch Kinclaven Shocking, was entered in an obedience class. Unfortunately, my "legman" didn't tell me how she made out.

Additional reports on the Beverly-Riviera Kennel Club Show May 8 and 9 failed to list entry details. War Bond, as reported in the June issue, went from Winner's Dog, 4 points, to fourth in the group. Best of Opposite Sex under G. V. Glebe was R. A. and Edna Schuller's Ch. Judge's Prudence. Winners bitch, 4 points, was Mr. and Mrs. J. F. McCullough's Gwenda Mac's Laurie; she finished here. Reserve in dogs was Norman Thomas Smith's Black Angus Jeffrey, and in bitches, Mrs. Russell's Glenby Bonnie.

Entries at the Pasadena Kennel Club Show June 6 under Alf Parker dived; only 2 points in each sex. The Schuller's Ch. Judge's Prudence was Best of Breed; Best Opposite was the Winner's Dog, Mr. Smith's Jeffrey. Best of Winners was Mr. and Mrs. John Harnish's Tam Lin Silver Star. Reserve in dogs was Mr. and Mrs. F. J. Russell's Glenby Roderick; in bitches, Laura Sutherland's Miss Cocoa.

Mr. Gillespie judged at Contra Costa Kennel Club Show, Pittsburg, Calif., June 13, and found his Best of Breed in the Halloran's War Bond with Best of Opposite Sex going to the McCullough's Gwenda Mac's Toad a Wee, litter sister to Laurie and winner's bitch. Reserve in dogs was Mr. and Mrs. Charles S. Karp's novice dog (I wish I knew his name) and in bitches Mrs. Ray Stroube's O'Darby's Black Magic, was reserve bitch. Two points in both dogs and bitches.

Twenty-six puppies appeared at the S.T.C.C. match under Gordon Campbell. The T. L. Roth's dog (unidentified by my correspondent) won the 2-to-6 class, with Tam Lin Kennels and Kenbrick Kennels' Tam Lin Kenbrick Sassy Best of Opposite Sex. In the 6-to-12 class Mr. Gillespie's dog Bothkennar Super Chief went best, with best opposite going to Mrs. Beverly Lamont's sister of Junior, not identified. Mr. and Mrs. H. D. Fuller won best litter.

Down in Buenos Aires, Scots made a fine showing at the thirty-ninth annual show of the Kennel Club of Argentina June 5 and 6, with a turnout of eight under Charles J. H. Ferguson, former Californian of Olivos, a suburb.

Gleniffer Union Jack, an import from Britain owned by William G. Gammie, was Best of Breed and won the Certificado de Aptitud de Campeón (championship certificate) and second in the group.

Mr. Ferguson's Inverglenn Kennels Cup for best Argentine-bred went to Ikhatza de Gure Echea, winner of the young dogs (12-to-30 months) class, owned by Mrs. W. H. van Deurs, and sired by her British import, Ch. Heather Selection. Winner of the 6-12 puppy dog class was Gleniffer Scot, by Union Jack, and owned by Miss Anna Gammie, daughter of Mr. Gammie. His brother, Scottie of Caledonia, owned by James G. Drysdale, placed next. Following Ikhatza, was Squire of Caledonia, owned by Vidal Johai. Union Jack topped the adult-dog class and beat Mrs. van Deurs' two-time C.A.C. winner, Braemer High Jinks, best adult bitch, after a red-hot battle. Mr. Ferguson stated the decision was very close. Behind Union Jack was Maria N. Shaw's Johnny de San Jose. Joy Law-Gisiko's Joy's Choice headed the young-bitch class.

The Argentine Dichard population was increased by seven when Hibank Land O'Heather, bred by Mr. and Mrs. F. R. Newton, Salamanca, N. Y., whelped at the Inverglenn Kennels of the Fergusons just a week after she arrived by air. Mated to Ch. Walsing Whirlaway of Tam Lin, Heather had eight puppies but a runt faded out, leaving two dogs and five bitches, and a battle amongst Argentine fanciers as to whom the surplus bitches would go. Argentina is primarily a hunting-dog nation, but Dichards are beginning to catch on, and Mrs. van Deurs, vice-president of the K.C.A., plans to go to Great Britain shortly, to visit Scottish Terrier kennels and obtain a stud and bitch.

About the only encouraging thing in the fancy in the East during the last month (June) is that fanciers are showing puppies again. On the other hand, at two shows nobody had a bitch entered in the open class.

At the Greenwich Kennel Club Show June 12 at Armonk, N. Y. S., Edwin Megargee had an entry of six dogs, five bitches and one special, all present. The Marlu Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Red Seal was Best of Breed and first in the group (under Thomas Mullins), beating such noted winners as Mr. and Mrs. William Fox's Kerry, Ch. Deed's Show Off; Mr. and Mrs. James A. Farrell Jr's Smooth Fox Terrier, Ch. Foxden Satsuma; Mrs. Leonard Smit's Wire, Ch. Trucote Emblem, and Mrs. Edward P. Alker's Welsh, Ch. Bodie's Temptation, Best in Show June 27 at Perth Amboy.

Best of opposite sex was Mrs. Blanche Reeg's bitch Blanart Barcarolle, of spring specialty fame, that went up from American-bred class of three and got two points 2nd Best of Winners. Reserve was Edward F. Moloney's puppy winner, Gold Finder's Romance. Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Stalter's fine puppy, Barberry Knowe Duplicate won two points in dogs with Reserve going to their open winner, B. K. Rascal.

The next day at the Long Shore Kennel Club event at Westport, Conn., Red Seal was second in the group under Mrs. H. Hotchkiss Neal. Caswell Barrie, the breed judge, had an entry of six dogs, four bitches and a special, and found his Best of Opposite Sex in his Winner's

Bitch the Stalters' Barberry Knowe Betty, with Reserve going to Mr. Moloney's Gold Finder's Romance. His Gold Finder's Kilroy, open-dog winner, took the dog points, (two) and went Best of Winners. Reserve was the Stalters' puppy, B. K. Duplicate.

Mrs. Seth Malby had nine dogs (one absent), three points; eight bitches (two absent), and one special to pass on at the Staten Island Kennel Club show transplanted June 27 to Perth Amboy, N. J. Again Red Seal was second in the group, under Mrs. Watson J. Hoos Jr., and Mrs. Reeg's Blanart Barcarolle, American-bred winner and Best of Winners, was Best of Opposite Sex. 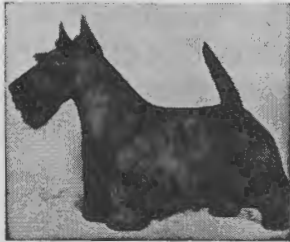
