THE Marlu Farm Kennel's great winning Scottish Terrier, Ch. Deephaven Red Seal has been sold to Carnation Farm Kennels, Carnation, Wash. F. J. Bartos, who is kennel manager at Carnation Farm, has been on the lookout for a really top show dog and sire for sometime and he was delighted when he was able to purchase Red Seal from Mr. Pollak. He should do much to promote Scottish interest in both showing and breeding on the Pacific Coast. Red Seal, who is but four years old, already has three champions to his credit and many other winners with points. He himself has won fifteen Terrier groups and three Best in Shows. He was stripped down before being shipped to the Coast and is coming into beautiful show condition.

And it is news indeed that Ch. Deephaven Warspite is now owned by Johnny Murphy. This great dog which was owned by Marlu Farms is now past seven years of age, but he is still in wonderful shape and has the spirit of a puppy. It was Johnny Murphy who handled Warspite and did so much to bring him to the top. The two have always had a great affection for each other and Mr. Pollak states "it really gives me great pleasure to announce I have given Warspite to Mr. Murphy for I feel it is only right that he should spend the rest of his days with him." Warspite is the only Scottie that has won Best of Breed at Westminster three times straight, thus retiring the famous Robert Chapman Memorial Trophy. Although Marlu Farms have parted with these two great dogs, they have some very promising youngsters coming along and write that in due time they will be back in the shows as strong as ever.

Congratulations to Mrs. F. J. Russell of Glenby Scotties, Sun Valley, Calif. Her bitch, Ch. Glenby Bonnie, C. D., completed her championship at the Pasadena show in May, by going Best of Breed from the classes. She took her Obedience degree over a year ago and as far as we know, is the second Scottish Terrier to ever have an Obedience and Bench title. The other, also owned by Mrs. Russell, is Ch. Glenby's Miss Andrea, C.D.X. Andrea won both her Obedience titles before she finished her bench championship, this proving pretty conclusively that Obedience training doesn't spoil a Scottie for the show ring. Mrs. Russell writes she would like to see more Scotties in Obedience rings, especially more good ones.

We have just heard that Inkspot O'Donley, owned by Mrs. Gertrude M. Woodrome, Oklahoma City, was killed in a fall from a car on the way home from the 4-point Norman show, where he had placed Reserve. Inkspot was just barely eighteen months old and he made his debut just about a month before he was killed. He was Winners and Best

Opposite for three points at Oklahoma City and Best of Breed at Lawton for two points. His owner, Mrs. Woodrome deserves a great deal of credit for the in-

In the Reserve spots were Mrs. Jeannie Gillespie's Trevonne Tartar of Bothkennar and Mr. and Mrs. T. L. Roth's Tedlee's Twinkle of Roe Rob.

The Macaulays who were vacationing in California had the pleasure of seeing Melinda do her winning. Nickey Finn who handles the bitch tells us that the win completes her title.

The New England Specialty

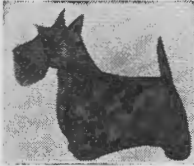

The Scottish Terrier Club of Indiana recently reorganized and is holding its Specialty show at Indianapolis on October 1st, the day before the Hoosier Kennel Club All-Breed show.
